2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the supersion of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.

3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in each of such work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

TOWN OF NORTHCOTE.

BY-LAW No. 7.

A By-law for preventing the contamination of fruit, vegetables, butter, or other food, or any case or receptable customarily used for the reception and carriage thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Northcote order as follows:—

No person shall place, carry, or have in any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter, any fruit, vegetables, butter, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, butter, or other food, or such case or receptacle, shall be in contact with or be liable to be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

For every offence against the provisions of this by-law the offender shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not less than Five shillings (5s.) nor more than Ten pounds (£10).

Health Act 1890. SHIRE OF ALBERTON.

BY-LAW NO. 2.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for nozious trades, slaughter-yards, de., for regulating management of carth-closets and privies, and for regulating the removal and final deposit of night soil and offensive matter.

THE Council of the Shire of Alberton, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and every other power enabling them in this behalf and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 2 of the said council, that is to say:—

- 1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.
- 2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the town-ship of Foster, in the shire of Alberton.
- ship of Foster, in the shire of Alberton.

 4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said township of Foster shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all flith, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

 5. The occupier of any land in the township of Foster on
- the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

 5. The occupier of any land in the township of Foster on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-stye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.
- 6. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or-cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet or privy on or bolonging to such premises.
- 7. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, or place for reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, and approved by the council. And, where a nightman is appointed by the municipal authorities, such nightman only shall be empowered for the removal of night-soil.
- 8. All night-soil or other offensive matter shall be removed to and deposited in such places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and trenched into friable soil in a layer not exceeding six inches thick, and covered over with at least one foot of clean earth.
- 9. Every closet shall be furnished with two pans, which shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly rivetted and soldcred, with handles and a tight-fitting lid, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and there shall be one tight-fitting lid suitable for both pans.
- 10. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, line, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.
- receptacle.

 11. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient decolorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same. and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.
- 12. The council hereby make a charge of One shilling per pan per week on every householder within the township of Foster, for the weekly removal from his premises of night-soil by the council or its contractors.
- 13. Stringent supervision will be exercised by the council over all depôts for the disposal of night-soil.
- 14. For keeping free from noisom matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, de., for regulating management of earth-closets and privies, and for regulating the removal and final deposit of night-soil and offensive matter.

 The Council of the Shire of Alberton, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the Health Act 1820, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 3 of the said council, that is to say:

 1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

 2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

 3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Yarram Yarram, in the Shire of Alberton, within the boundaries heroin described:—Commencing at a point in the southern boundary of allotnent 38, parish of Yarram Yarram, twenty chains cast of the road forming the western boundary of the said allotment; thence northerly by a line parallel to the said road sixty-six chains; then by a line parallel to the said river to its junction with the North Tarra Creek; thence by the North Tarra Creek to its intersection by a line parallel to the road forming the western boundary of allotment 52, and twenty chains distant therefrom; thence south-easterly by the said line fifty-five chains; thence south seventy-five chains to the southern boundaries of allotments 37 and 38 to the commencing point.

The occupier of every house and premises within the said township of Yarram Yarram shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

 5. The occupier of any land in the township of Yarram Yarram on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-stye shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

the the occupier. In the same hand present and the same shall be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet or privy on or belonging to such premises.

7. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, or place for reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, and approved by the council; and, where a nightman is appointed by the municipal authorities, such nightman only shall be empowered for the removal of night-soil.

8. All night-soil or other offensive matter shall be removed to and deposited in such places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and trenched into friable soil in a layer not exceeding six inches thick, and covered over with at least one foot of clean earth.

9. Every closet shall be furnished with two pans, which shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, with handles, and a tight-fitting lid, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and there shall be one tight-fitting lid suitable for both pans.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, asbes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deviderizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deoderizing material sufficient to theroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

11. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

12. The council hereby make a charge of One shilling per pan per week on every householder within the township of Yarram Yarram for the weekly removal from his premises of night-soil by the council or its contractors.

Stringent supervision will be exercised by the council over all depôts for the disposal of night-soil.

14. Every person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 75 of the Water Act. 1890, do make the following Regulation respecting Fishing, &c., in Lake Marma:—

No. 38.-FISHING IN LAKE MARMA.

1. No person shall use in Lake Marma any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary.

1. No person shall use in Lake Marma any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary, or partly stationary, in any way or manner for the purpose of taking fish.

2. No person shall angle for or remove, or take from the said lake, any fish which may be therein during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in each and every year.

3. No person shall angle with or use more than two artificial baits of any kind whatsoever upon or in the said lake at one and the same time, save and except artificial flies. That no person shall angle in said lake with more than two hooks covered with live bait at one and the same time.

4. No person or persons shall be allowed to catch fish in the lake between the hours of Nine p.m. and Four a.m.

5. No person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever in the said lake for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot; or for any other purpose whatsoever.

6. All persons catching any fish in the said lake under four ounces in weight shall forthwith return the same to the lake.

7. No person shall remove or take away, or cause or procure to be removed and taken away, from the said lake any ova or spawn without the consent of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust being first obtained.

8. No person shall angle for, or by any other means endeavour to take, fish from the said lake on any Sunday.

9. Any person detected in leaving any weight, stone, tin, or other obstacle at the bottom of the lake shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

10. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to each fish in the said lake unless previously licensed so to do. Such licences shall be issued to applicants at the discretion of the engineer of the Trust, at the following rates:—

For each licence to persons of twenty years of age, Two shillings per annum.

For each licence to persons of twenty years of age and over, Four shillings per annum.

For each licence to persons of twenty years of age and over, Four
