Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 30 in the

FACTORY OF MESSRS. CONNELL, HOGARTH, AND Co., TEA BLENDERS, FLINDERS-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of three weeks from the 27th May inst., upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than three females for more than fifty-four hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

No. 1106, Part I., sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION.**LICENCES FOR THE EXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO CUT TIMBER ON CROWN LANDS.**

There may be issued, subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule hereto, licences conferring the exclusive right to cut timber in specified portions of Crown lands not exceeding in any instance 1,000 acres in extent.

All licences issued conferring the exclusive right to cut timber shall be for a term not exceeding one year.

The amount of licence-fee shall be fixed in each case by the Minister, and shall be paid in advance in respect of the whole period for which the licence is issued.

It shall not be necessary for the licensee, or any person employed by him in or about such land, to hold any other licence to cut timber within the area licensed.

The non-compliance with or the non-performance of any of the obligations specified in the licence shall render such licence null and void.

Schedule.
CONDITIONS.

1. No tree of less diameter than 24 inches shall be felled.
2. No greater number of trees shall be felled than is required for the current supply of the mill.
3. All trees felled and not delivered at the mill at the expiry of the licence shall revert to the Crown.
4. No tree on the block under licence shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
5. The licensee shall protect saplings and young seedling indigenous trees, and neither he nor any other person shall depasture goats on the block under licence to him or cultivate any part of such block.
6. Within the period of one month from the felling of any tree, the portion thereof not required for use shall be so disposed of by the licensee as not to encumber the ground.
7. The licence-fee amounting to _____ shall be paid in advance on the _____ day of _____ One thousand eight hundred and ninety-_____ to the Receiver and Paymaster at _____ or to any other officer who may be authorized to collect the same.
8. The licence shall be produced by the holder thereof when asked so to do by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
9. Non-compliance with or non-performance of any of the foregoing conditions shall render this licence null and void.

10. This licence shall be in force for one month from the date hereof, and then from month to month at the same rental, until either the licensee shall have given notice in writing of intention to abandon the licence, or until such licence shall be revoked by the Hon. the Minister.

11. The saw-mill shall be erected within the boundaries of the area, on a site to be approved by the Crown lands bailiff.

12. The licensee may employ fallers and haulers, and no more, at any one time, on this area during the currency of this licence.

NOTE.—During the first quarter of 1892 the registered births numbered 9,305, and the registered deaths 4,669; thus the former exceeded the latter by 4,636, or 99 per cent. The births exceeded those in the first quarter of 1891 by 1,013, and the deaths exceeded those in that quarter by 181.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 21,507, but the recorded and unrecorded departures (the latter being estimated) numbered as many as 24,092. The loss by excess of departures over arrivals was thus 2,585.

From the date of the census (5th April, 1891) to the end of the quarter under notice, the allowance for unrecorded departures was 5,143, viz., 3,966 of males and 1,177 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of March would have been 1,164,872, viz., 610,316 males and 554,556 females.

During the quarter, the recorded arrivals from were greater than the recorded departures for Queensland by 125, Tasmania by 2,266, New Zealand and the South Seas by 108, and Foreign Ports by 61. On the other hand, the recorded departures for exceeded the recorded arrivals from New South Wales by 1,648, South Australia by 626, Western Australia by 432, and the United Kingdom by 528.

KOONDROOK PUBLIC CEMETERY.—REGULATIONS AND SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Koondrook Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

THE KOONDROOK CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES IN PURSUANCE OF THE "CEMETERIES ACT 1890."

1. The rules and regulations numbered 1 to 32 shall be the rules and regulations of the Koondrook Cemetery, and after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette* all rules and regulations and fees heretofore made shall be rescinded.

2. That the office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order in the form of Schedule A obtained, and the fees, where not remitted, paid.

4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act and shall be paid at the time of making application for any order.

5. A Burial Right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

6. A Permit, Schedule D, will on application of the holder of a burial right and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.

7. Any application for ground exceeding twelve feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.

8. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a grave or vault shall be permitted to construct same. Subject to the approval of the trustees every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.

9. Any tomb, monument, or material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected or re-placed by the owner.

10. No person other than the owner or his agent duly authorized in writing shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure unless by special direction of the trustees.

11. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

12. Any grave may on approval of the trustees be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for herein.

13. Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.

14. Notice of any burial shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

15. Before a private grave shall be re-opened the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.

16. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited at the Trust office a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and in case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery verified copies of such certificate and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.

17. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be on week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m., May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

18. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

19. Hearses and mourning carriages only are allowed within the cemetery, and the drivers are to observe such directions of the trustees, their officers and servants as may be found necessary from time to time for the regulating of the traffic.

20. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead plate with the distinguishing number of the order for burial stamped thereon.

21. No catacomb or wooden erection shall be allowed within the cemetery.

22. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.

23. Licensed exhumations shall be made between the hours of Six and Eight a.m., and in all cases of exhumation the trustees may, where necessary, impose special conditions, any non-compliance therewith being a breach of these rules.

24. An additional fee, according to the circumstances of the case, shall be paid for any exhumation or sinking involving extra labour.

25. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

26. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless by authority of the trustees first had and obtained.

27. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

28. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year, but the trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers and servants, to remove from the cemetery all persons misconducting themselves or violating the rules of propriety or decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection or tree, shrub, flower, or border, or otherwise infringing the Act 1072, or any Act made or to be made amending the same.

29. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or special authority from the trustees.

30. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

31. Sculptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, or railing, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions and epitaphs, shall obtain licences in the form of Schedule E from the trustees.

32. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

First. That the said piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said _____ heirs or representatives solely as a burying place, and that no other use shall be made thereof.

Second. That no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be erected or placed on said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

FITTINGS AND CONNEXIONS FOR THE DIAMOND DRILLS.

1. The contractor must provide all necessary tools and labour, and also all material where not otherwise specified in the Schedule, for fully completing all work which may be ordered, and he shall, as soon as finished, deliver such work at the nearest railway station, or at any other place not exceeding a distance of one mile from his workshop, which may be indicated by the officer in charge. Each delivery must be accompanied by an invoice or delivery note in duplicate. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods shall have been approved of by the officer in charge. The contractor shall, in every case, immediately after despatching any goods to the Department or to any of the drills, send or give notice to the officer in charge of the time of despatch, of the place where such goods have been forwarded, and the number of the order for the same; failing which being done, the contractor will be liable to have his contract cancelled without further notice, at the option of the Secretary for Mines.

2. The contractor will be required to furnish, in duplicate, any accounts he may have against the Mining Department in the prescribed form, accompanied by the orders for the goods, and receipts from the persons for whose use the same have been supplied; each account must include all the goods mentioned in the order.

3. The contract will be for such articles or repairs as may be ordered from the 1st July, 1892, to 30th June, 1893. All material and workmanship in connexion with this contract are to be of the very best description, and to be to the entire satisfaction of any officer who may be authorized by the Minister of Mines or Secretary for Mines to act on behalf of the Department of Mines in connexion with this contract, and such officer (herein designated the officer in charge) shall have full power to reject any articles he may deem to be not satisfactory or not in every way suitable.

4. When any order shall have been given to the contractor, he must use every despatch in getting the work done; if he do not, or if the work or material be not to the entire satisfaction of the officer in charge, it shall be optional with such officer in charge to cancel such order and get the work required done wherever he shall think fit, at the contractor's risk and expense; and any extra expense so incurred over the contract price will be deducted from any moneys due to the contractor. The officer in charge shall be the sole judge as to whether the contractor is using all necessary despatch in getting the work done, and as to whether the work or material is of the very best description. On the contractor receiving any portion of drills, machinery, or tool for repairs or otherwise from any of the drills, or from any other source, he must, in every case, send a receipt for the same to the officer in charge.

5. When any work is required that does not appear in the Schedule, offers may be obtained in the usual way without in any way infringing this contract.

6. As soon as possible after the contract is signed, the Department will lend the gauge-taps and nuts to the contractor for fourteen days, when the contractor must return them to the Department, having first made gauge-taps and dies for his own use at his own expense. The Department will require the contractor to make standard gauges for all necessary work at his own expense. The contractor must also make duplicate gauges for his own use and at his own expense.

7. When goods shall be ordered of a size not exceeding one-quarter of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price for such goods shall not be more than that quoted in the Schedule. In cases, however, where the size required shall be more than one-quarter of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price specified in the Schedule for the next larger size will be paid to the contractor.

8. It will be competent for the Secretary for Mines on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of one month.

9. The contractor must deliver to the Department all gauges, patterns, and all old material, at least fortnightly; failing which, it will be in the power of the Secretary for Mines to cancel the contract without further notice.
