COMPANIES, ETC., CARRYING ON BUSINESS IN THE GERMAN PROTECTORATES.

(BESONDERER ABRUCK.)

Die lang erwartete Veröffentlichung der Beschlüsse des Kolonialraths in der Frage der Gestaltung des kolonialen Gesellschaftsrechts ist in dem deutschen Kolonialblatt vom gestrigen Tage erfolgt. Die Beschlüsse lauten:

A. Juristische Personen des Auslandes, in sofern sie Erwerbsgesellschaften sind, insbesondere Aktiengesellschaften und Kommanditgesellschaften auf Aktien, bedürfen zur Ausübung ihres Geschäftsbetriebes innerhalb des Schutzgebietes der Genehmigung der Regierung.

Es sollen Anordnungen getroffen werden, damit dieser Grundsatz unverzüglich auch in den deutschen Interessensphären in Kraft gesetzt werde.

B. Ausländische Gesellschaften (A) haben vor ihrer Zulassung im Schutzgebiet den Nachweis genügender Mittel (genügenden werbenden Kapitals) zu erbringen.

C. Ausländische Gesellschaften (A) haben eine Zweigniederlassung in demjenigen Schutzgebiete zu begründen, in welchem sie Zulassung zum Betriebe beantragen. Nach dem Ermessen der Regierung kann die Bestellung eines Vertreters und die Begründung eines Gerichtsstandes im Schutzgebiet als genügend erachtet werden.

D. (1) Die von den eingeborenen Häuptlingen gewährten Befugnisse öffentlich rechtlicher Natur sind nicht als rechtsbeständig anzuerkennen. Insbesondere gilt dies für:

- (a) ausschliessliche Wege- und Eisenbahnkonzessionen,
- (b) Handelsmonopole,
- (c) das ausschliessliche Recht zum Bergbau,
- (d) die Verleihung von Bergwerksberechtigungen und Rechten an Grund und Boden über das gesammte Gebiet eines Stammes oder einen grösseren oder unbestimmten Theil desselben.

2. Sofern die Regierung Rechte der vorstehend unter 1 a—d beschriebenen Art einer Erwerbsgesellschaft einräumt, muss die Ausübung solcher Rechte unter der Form einer in Deutschland oder im Schutzgebiet nach deutschem Rechte begründeten Gesellschaft erfolgen."

Es ergibt sich aus der Prüfung der vorstehenden Beschlüsse, dass der Kolonialrath mit zwei verschiedenen Fragen befasst war. Diese Fragen lassen sich aus seinen Antworten rückwärts etwa in folgender Weise konstruieren:

1. Unter welchen Voraussetzungen sind ausländische Personengemeinschaften, welche die Form von Gesellschaften mit beschränkter Haftbarkeit ihrer Mitglieder haben, zum Geschäftsbetriebe in den Schutzgebieten zuzulassen?

2. Was kann als möglicher Gegenstand der Konzessionserteilung durch die eingeborenen Häuptlinge betrachtet werden, und inwieweit ist mithin die Regierung zur Anerkennung derartiger Rechtsgeschäfte verpflichtet?

Die Beschlüsse unter A bis C beantworten die erste, die unter D die zweite Frage.

Was die ausländischen Gesellschaften betrifft, so scheiden zunächst alle Gesellschaften, welche nicht Erwerbszwecke verfolgen, z. B. die Missionsgesellschaften, von der Betrachtung aus. Es wird angenommen werden dürfen, dass für die Stellung dieser Gesellschaften es keinen Unterschied macht, ob ihre Angehörigen zur Beschaffung ihrer Bedarfsgegenstände mit den Eingeborenen in Tauschhandel treten oder behufs Erzielung der letzteren zur Arbeit gewerbliche Niederlassungen gründen, vorausgesetzt, dass diese Betriebe thätlich den eigentlichen Zwecken der Mission dienen. Von den Erwerbsgesellschaften scheiden ferner die offene Handelsgesellschaft, sowie die einfache Kommanditgesellschaft aus. Im Uebrigen sollen ausländische Gesellschaften zum Geschäftsbetriebe innerhalb der Schutzgebiete nur mit Genehmigung der Regierung zugelassen werden. Es entspricht dieser Grundsatz dem in Preussen von Alters her bestehenden Recht, welches durch die Reichsgesetzgebung ausdrücklich aufrecht erhalten worden ist. Die Ausdehnung dieses Grundsatzes auf die Schutzgebiete rechtfertigt sich ohne Weiteres, wenn erwogen wird, welchen Einfluss das unkontrollirte Eindringen fremder Gesellschaften mit grossen Kapitalien auf die Gestaltung des wirtschaftlichen Lebens der noch unentwickelten Schutzgebiete auszuüben geeignet ist. Man braucht hierbei nicht nur an die Gefahren zu denken, welche der Festigung der wechselseitigen Beziehungen zwischen dem Schutzgebiete und dem Reiche erwachsen können. Eine unmittelbare Schädigung der Entwicklung unserer Schutzgebiete würde zu besorgen sein, wenn die Möglichkeit bestände, unter Benutzung der leichteren Formen ausländischer Gesetzgebungen in den Schutzgebieten mit der Gründung von Gesellschaften vorzugehen, denen die solide Grundlage fehlt und deren Zusammenbruch auf Jahre hinaus wirtschaftliche Unternehmungen in den Schutzgebieten in Misskredit bringen würde. Es wird andererseits erwartet werden dürfen, dass die Regierung für die Zulassung ausländischer Gesellschaften nicht Bedingungen aufstellen wird, welche das ausländische Kapital von der wünschenswerthen Bethheiligung an der wirtschaftlichen Erschliessung der Schutzgebiete abschrecken könnten.

Wie zwischen diesen widerstrebenden Interessen die Mitte zu finden sein wird, lässt sich durch allgemeine Vorschriften im Voraus nicht näher bestimmen. Der Kolonialrath hat eine weise Zurückhaltung geübt, wenn er in dieser Beziehung nur zwei Punkte besonders erwähnt hat. Die Regierung soll einmal vor der Zulassung ausländischer Gesellschaften den Nachweis genügenden werbenden Kapitals fordern. Sie soll zweitens darauf sehen, dass die Gesellschaften in dem Schutzgebiete stets in einer Weise vertreten sind, welche ihren Gläubigern das Risiko und die Weitläufigkeiten erspart, die mit der Verfolgung von Rechtsansprüchen im Auslande verbunden sind.

Die zweite Frage ist nicht mehr eine Frage des Gesellschaftsrechts. Es handelt sich vielmehr allgemein um die Frage der Gültigkeit der Konzessionen der Eingeborenen, ohne Unterschied, ob sie an Inländer oder Ausländer, an Einzelpersonen oder Gesellschaften ertheilt worden sind. Die Art, in der viele dieser Konzessionen erworben sind, ist sattsam bekannt.

Gegenstand der Verleihung sind oft die werthvollsten Herrschafts- und Eigentumsrechte, Landstriche von der Ausdehnung von Königreichen, die gesammten Mineralschätze eines Landes und ausschliessliche Berechtigungen der mannigfaltigsten Art gewesen. Der Kolonialrath ist mit Recht der Ansicht gewesen, dass die Schutzherrschaft des Reiches als eine Art Vormundschaft über die Eingeborenen zu betrachten ist, die in ihrem Verkehr mit Weissen nicht als handlungsfähig angesehen werden können. Einer der ersten Akte der Regierung in den Schutzgebieten ist dementsprechend auch der Erlass von Bekanntmachungen gewesen, wodurch die Gültigkeit der Rechtsgeschäfte zwischen Eingeborenen und Weissen über Grundeigenthum, Bergwerksberechtigungen und dergl. an die Genehmigung der Regierung geknüpft wurde. Fraglich blieb es nur, wie es mit derartigen Rechtsgeschäften aus der Zeit vor der Erklärung der Schutzherrschaft gehalten werden sollte. Ein Versuch zur Regelung dieser Frage ist in dem Abkommen mit England vom vorigen Jahre gemacht worden, wo zwischen Konzessionen, die Souveränitätsrechte zum Gegenstand haben, und solchen, welche die Erlaubnis zum Handelsbetrieb oder zum Bergbau enthielten, oder die Abtretung von Grundeigenthum betrafen, unterschieden worden ist. Zwischen Deutschland und England ist damals vereinbart worden, dass die Ausübung von Souveränitätsrechten allemal von der Zustimmung der schutzherrlichen Regierung abhängig sein müsse. Ein Blick auf diese Abmachungen lässt die Tragweite der Beschlüsse des Kolonialraths zu der zweiten Frage erkennen.

Der Kern derselben liegt darin, dass der Kolonialrath nicht nur in der Verleihung ausschliesslicher, monopolartiger Erwerbsberechtigungen, sondern auch in der Abtretung des Eigentums an dem gesammten Stammesgebiet oder an unverhältnissmässig grossen oder ungenügend abgegrenzten Theilen des Gebietes einen Verzicht auf Hoheitsrechte sieht, den die Regierung als rechtsgiltig anzuerkennen nicht gehalten ist. In der That liegt in derartigen Erwerbungen gewissermassen eine Okkupation des betreffenden Gebietes. Offenbar widerspricht es dem Begriffe der Oberhoheit eines Staates, wenn in dem dieser Oberhoheit unterstellten Gebiet die Angehörigen eines anderen Staates Eigentums- und Nutzungsrechte besitzen, welche weit über die Grenze der Möglichkeit der wirtschaftlichen Verwerthung durch Einzelpersonen hinausgehen und die Entwicklung des Landes vollständig in die Hand dieser Besitzer legen. Wer das Eigentum an dem ganzen Lande hat, hat damit auch die Herrschaft über dessen Bewohner und bestimmt deren gesellschaftliche, gewerbliche und politische Entwicklung. Sind Inländer die Erwerber eines derartig ausgedehnten Besitzes, so tritt das Widerspruchsvolle einer solchen Gestaltung nicht so offenbar hervor. Der Art nach ist es dasselbe. Es leuchtet daher ein, dass bei den Beschlüssen unter (d) die Unterscheidung zwischen Inländern und Ausländern nur insoweit hervortritt, als der Regierung empfohlen wird, in den Fällen, wo sie nach Lage der Verhältnisse sich bewegen findet, Konzessionen derartigen Inhalts anzuerkennen, als Bedingung hinzustellen, dass die zur Uebernahme der Konzession zu bildende Gesellschaft unter deutschem Recht stehen muss. Unwillkürlich erinnern wir uns hierbei daran, dass die Regierung seiner Zeit einer unserer Kolonialgesellschaften die Genehmigung zu einem für sie nicht unvortheilhaften Verträge über die Abtretung des grössten Theils ihres Kolonialbesitzes versagt hat, wie es heisst, weil die Erwerber Ausländer waren. Der Kolonialrath hat sich mit seinen Beschlüssen auf denselben Standpunkt gestellt.

Extract from the *North German Gazette* of 16th August, 1891.
(TRANSLATION.)

The long-expected publication of the decisions of the Colonial Council with regard to the law respecting colonial companies appeared in yesterday's *Deutsche Colonial Blatt*.

The decisions are as follows:—

- (a) Foreign corporations, in so far as they are commercial companies, particularly joint stock and *commandite* companies, must obtain the permission of the Government in order to carry on their business within the protectorate.

Regulations will be made to put the same principle in force, without delay, in the German spheres of interest.

- (b) Foreign companies (a) must produce proof of sufficient means (viz., sufficient capital) before they can obtain admission to the protectorate.

- (c) Foreign companies (a) must found a branch in the protectorate in which they ask for permission to carry on business.

It rests with the Government to decide whether the appointment of a representative and the acquisition of a legal status shall be considered sufficient.

- (d)—1. The authorizations of a public legal nature granted by native chieftains are not to be recognised as valid.

This regulation especially holds good for—

- a. Exclusive concessions for roads and railways.
- β. Commercial monopolies.
- γ. Exclusive mining rights.
- δ. Concessions of authorizations to carry out mining works, and of rights to the soil and ground, over the whole territory of a tribe, or over a greater or undefined portion thereof.

2. In case the Government admits the rights of a commercial company of the nature described above in 1, a, β, γ. The exercise of such rights must be under the form of a company founded according to German law in Germany or the protectorate.

From a consideration of the above decisions, it appears that the Colonial Council was engaged upon two different questions.

These questions may be deduced from the answers as follows:—

1. Under what conditions are foreign communities of people bearing limited responsibility to be permitted to carry on business in the protectorates?
2. What can be considered as a possible subject for the granting of concessions on the part of native chiefs, and to what extent is it incumbent on the Government to recognize such legal businesses?

The decisions from (a) to (c) answer the first; those under (d) answer the second.

With regard to foreign companies, all those who do not carry on business for profit, e.g., missionaries, do not come into consideration.

It may be gathered that it makes no difference to the position of these companies whether their members barter with the natives in order to procure their necessities, or whether, with a view to educating them to work, they found trading settlements, provided that these businesses actually serve the objects of the mission. Open trading companies differ from industrial companies, as also from *commandite* companies.

In fine, foreign companies are only to be permitted to carry on business in the protectorate with the consent of the Government.

This carries out the old Prussian maxim which has always been upheld by the Legislature.

The extension of this maxim to the protectorate is at once justified when it is considered how the uncontrolled influx of foreign companies with large capital would influence the development of economic life in the as yet undeveloped protectorate.

One has not only to consider the dangers which might arise to the fixing of the relations of exchange between the protectorate and the empire.

The immediate damage to the development of our protectorate would have to be anticipated, if there were a possibility, by availing ourselves of the easier forms of foreign legislation in colonies, of our beginning to found companies, deprived of a solid basis, and whose collapse would for years bring economic undertakings in the protectorate into discredit.

It may be imagined further that the Government will not establish regulations with regard to the admittance of foreign companies which will frighten away foreign capital from the desirable participation in the economic development of the protectorate.

How the medium will be found between these conflicting interests cannot further be gathered from general regulations. The Colonial Council has made a wise reservation, even though with regard to this it has only established two points.

The Government, before admitting foreign companies, shall demand proof of sufficient working capital. It shall secondly make sure that those companies are always represented in some way in the protectorate, which will spare to the creditors the risk and consequences which are connected with the prosecution of legal claims in a foreign country.

The second question is no longer a question of the right of a company.

It refers much more to the general question of the validity of the concessions of the natives, regardless of whether they are granted to foreigners or not, to single individuals or companies.

The manner in which many of these concessions have been obtained is sufficiently well known. Subjects of concession have frequently been the most valuable rights of sovereignty and possession, stretches of territory as big as kingdoms, the entire mineral produce of a country, and exclusive rights of innumerable description.

The Colonial Council justly concluded that the protectorate of the empire is to be looked upon as a sort of guardianship over the natives, who in their dealings with white men cannot be looked on as capable of trading. One of the first acts of the Government in the protectorates, therefore, has been the publication of decrees, whereby the validity of negotiations between the natives and white men with regard to possession of land, mining rights, &c., are subjected to the approval of the Government.

It remained a question how to deal with such legal negotiations concluded prior to the declaration of the protectorate.

An attempt to decide this question was made in the agreement with England of last year, whereby a difference was made between concessions having sovereign rights as their object and such as contain permission to carry on trade or mining operations.

Between Germany and England, it was at that time decided that the exercise of sovereign rights should ever be dependent on the consent of the protecting power.

A glance at these decisions enables one to note the bearing of the decisions of the Colonial Council on the second question.

The kernel of the decisions lies in this, that the Colonial Council sees, not only in the granting of exclusive rights and monopolies, but also in the giving over of the rights to the territory of the tribe or to improporionately large or insufficiently bounded portions of territory, a renunciation of sovereign rights which the Government is not to look upon as valid.

In such instances, as a fact, the acquisition is tantamount to occupation of the district in question. It is self evidently in opposition to the conception of the sovereign right of a state when, in the territory which is subject to its sovereign authority, the members of some other state possess rights of use and property which render entirely out of the question the economic expansion by private persons, and place the development of the country entirely in the hands of this proprietor.

He who has possession of the whole territory has also the sovereignty over its members, and determines their social, economic, and political development.

Should others than foreigners become the proprietors of such an extended possession, the objections to such a state are not so apparent, though actually the position is the same.

It thus appears that, with regard to the decisions under (d), the difference between foreigners and non-foreigners only becomes evident when the Government is recommended, in those instances where, according to the circumstances of the case, it feels it incumbent on itself to recognise concessions of this character, to establish as a condition that the company to be formed to carry on the concession must be subject to German law.

We are unconsciously here reminded that the Government once refused to one of our colonial companies their consent to a by no means disadvantageous agreement for the handing over of the larger portion of their colonial possession, because those who would acquire it were foreigners.

The Colonial Council in its decisions has placed itself on the same footing.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF RIPON.

By-law No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into operation, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. Every pan or other moveable receptacle provided by any householder for the reception of night-soil shall be constructed of suitable impervious material, and shall be provided with handles, and the capacity of every such pan and receptacle shall not exceed three cubic feet.

2. No person shall remove or contract for the removal of night-soil except by permission and with the authority of the council of the Shire of Ripon.

3. Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

4. This by-law number 4 shall only apply to and have operation in that part of the Shire of Ripon situated within the boundaries of the township of Beaufort.

5. This by-law shall come into operation from and after the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

The above by-law was passed by the council of the Shire of Ripon on the 5th day of November, 1891, and was confirmed by the said council this 7th day of January, 1892, and the seal of the council affixed hereto in the presence of—

By-Law No. 4 UNDER THE "HEALTH ACT 1890."

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, and 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 4, for regulating the mode of carriage of, and precautions to be observed in, carrying meat to or from abattoirs or butchers' shops or premises, and for preventing the placing or carrying of any fruit, vegetable, or other food on any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter as described in this by-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo make the following by-law:—

1. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board, and after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to, and have operation within, the municipal boundaries of the city of Bendigo.

3. From and after the date of this by-law coming into operation, no person shall bring or cause to be brought into the city of Bendigo, or carry or cause to be carried through the streets or roads thereof, in any cart or other vehicle, any butchers' meat or carcasses of meat, unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed and covered as that the rays of the sun and the rain and dust are not allowed to fall on, or be capable of reaching, such meat or carcasses of meat.

4. The covering or screen for protection of such meat shall be kept in a cleanly state to the satisfaction of the City Health Inspector or other officer of the council.

5. Proper sitting accommodation shall be provided for the driver of any such cart or other vehicle.

6. No person shall place, carry, or have in any cart or vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle, shall be in contact with, or be liable to be in contact with, such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

7. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
