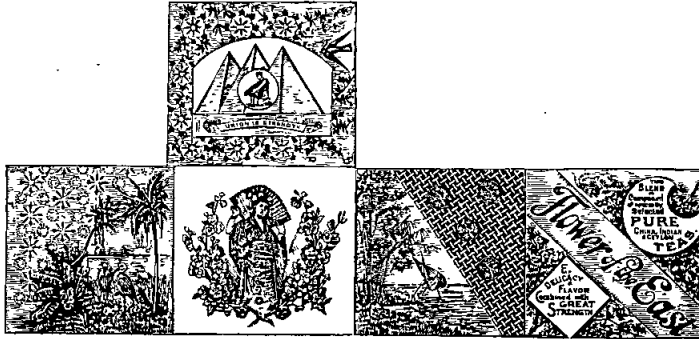

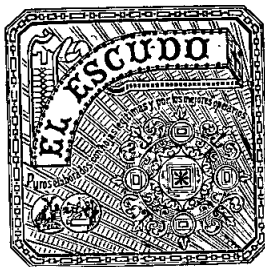

REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO TEMPORARY UNCLASSIFIED SCHOOLS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of June, 1892.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for determining the qualifications to be possessed by and the salaries and allowances to be paid to teachers of temporary unclassified schools; for determining the nature of the buildings which may be used or erected for temporary unclassified schools, and for determining the conditions under which temporary unclassified schools may be converted into classified State schools; and may at any time repeal, alter, and amend the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal all previous regulations with regard to the establishment of temporary unclassified schools and the employment of teachers therein, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

TEMPORARY UNCLASSIFIED SCHOOLS.

1. In thinly-peopled districts, a temporary unclassified school may be established in any locality where it is probable that an average attendance of ten scholars will be maintained; provided that there is no existing State school at which such scholars could attend, and provided that suitable school premises can be obtained at a reasonable rental, not exceeding £7 10s. per annum.
2. The buildings which may be used or erected for temporary unclassified schools shall be such as contain not less than eighty cubic feet of space for every child in average attendance, and have sufficient means of warming, light, and ventilation, and shall be approved by the Minister.
3. Any temporary half-time unclassified school which has not for six consecutive months maintained an average attendance of seven children, or any full-time unclassified school which has not for a like period maintained an average attendance of ten pupils, may be closed.
4. If the average attendance at any temporary unclassified school for six consecutive months has been twenty or more, the Minister will direct that it become a classified school, provided that it appears, from the number of children attending, that such average attendance is likely to be maintained, and that suitable school accommodation for the attendance is available.
5. When the average attendance at any classified State school for six consecutive months has been less than twenty, and is likely so to continue, and it is not desirable or practicable to make it a classified part-time school, the Minister will notify to the classifiers that it is his intention to make such school a temporary unclassified school, and such order will take effect forthwith if there be no teacher in charge of the school, and, if there be a teacher, from the date of his transfer to a classified school, or of his electing to remain in the school.
6. Permits to teach in temporary unclassified schools will be granted to persons who possess the following qualifications:— They must be of good character, sound health, and of not less than eighteen years of age; and, further—
 - (1) Hold the licence to teach or any higher certificate under the Education Department; or
 - (2) Satisfy an inspector of schools that they are able to impart elementary instruction; and
 - (a) Hold an approved certificate of qualification from the Committee of Council on Education, or from any recognised board or department of education in any British possession; or
 - (b) Have passed the Victorian Public Service examination (clerical division); or
 - (c) Have passed in the full course of free instruction in State schools; or
 - (d) Have passed the matriculation or any higher examination of a recognised university, English and arithmetic being two of the subjects passed in; or
 - (e) Have passed a satisfactory examination held by the department in reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, elementary science, and history.

After the 30th June, 1892, applications from persons holding only the literary qualification specified under 6 (2) (b) (e) will not be recorded for employment.
7. A register of the names of persons who are applicants for such schools will be kept, in which the names will be entered in order of precedence, according to qualification, and date of application.
8. As vacancies occur in temporary unclassified schools, the Minister will, from time to time, appoint persons whose names are entered in this register.
9. All such appointments will be temporary, and may be terminated by one month's notice on the part of either the Minister or the teacher, or by the Minister without notice in case of misconduct, inefficiency, or neglect of duty by the teacher.

10. The fixed salaries of teachers of temporary unclassified schools will be at the rate of £75 per annum for males, and £60 per annum for females, and, in addition, a sum equal to one-half the amount of the fixed salary will be obtainable by way of retires, to be determined as in the case of classified schools.

11. Teachers of temporary unclassified schools will be paid maintenance allowance for performing the services in connexion with the school buildings, &c., for which teachers of classified schools are paid a maintenance allowance.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks; and shall make an Order in Council accordingly: And it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks with or without alterations or additions

or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;

(b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly or, with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Euroa Shire Council, for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose of carrying out a scheme of water supply for the township of Violet Town, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply; and doth hereby order and appoint as follow:—

(1) The construction of the said waterworks.

(2) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Euroa for the time being and one other commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Two thousand eight hundred and fifty pounds sterling (£2,850), for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing at the north-west angle of section 12, township of Violet Town, parish of Shadforth, being the intersection of Mitchell and Shifner streets; thence easterly by Shifner-street to the North-Eastern Railway line; thence south-easterly by Ashburn-street to its intersection with Murray-street; thence south-westerly by Murray-street to the south angle of allotment 15, section D; thence north-westerly by the south-western boundary of said allotment 15 to High-street; thence south-westerly by High-street to its intersection with Mitchell-street; thence northerly by Mitchell-street to the Honeysuckle Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek about five chains; thence further north by Mitchell-street to the commencing point.

Portion II.—All the land required for the purposes of an offtake weir on the Honeysuckle Creek adjoining allotment 33D, parish of Boho; thence a strip one chain wide in a general northerly direction along Honeysuckle Creek, through allotments 64, 34C, 34B, 34A, the Honeysuckle pre-emptive right, and 37B, parish of Boho; thence through allotment 8, section F, and along road in a general north-westerly direction to the service basin in or about allotment 5, township of Violet Town, parish of Shadforth; all the land required for the aforesaid service basin; thence one chain along road running north-westerly to the Trust boundary.

All of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan deposited in the Office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

(5) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of an offtake weir on Honeysuckle Creek, a main pipe, thence to a service tank, pipes thence to Violet Town, and the reticulation of that township.

(6) That the name of the Trust shall be the Violet Town Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 1,657 children, viz., 859 boys and 798 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. In the month of April, 1,297 births were registered, or 360 less than in the month under review. The births were 443 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 107 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 607, viz., 326 of males and 281 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 1,050, or 173 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in April by 38, and were below the average of May during the previous ten years by 26; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below that average by 201.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.37, and of deaths registered 1.23.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 70.2° on the 15th, and the lowest was 35.9° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (53.2°) was half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.0°) took place on the 25th, and the least range (6.4°) on the 2nd. The mean daily range was 15.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.352 inches on the 24th, and the lowest was 29.574 inches on the 2nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.036 inches) differed from the average by a small fraction only.

Rain fell on 9 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.58 inches. The average rainfall in May during the previous ten years was 2.00 inches, or about two-fifths of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed only 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 32 per cent. in May, 1891; 31 per cent. in May, 1890; 33 per cent. in May, 1889; 37 per cent. in May, 1888; 32 per cent. in May, 1887; and 32 per cent. in May, 1886.

Thirty-five deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a planter, aged 75, died of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a fruiterer, aged 75, of cystitis; a miner, aged 76, of pneumonia; a laundress, aged 76, of enteritis; a female, aged 76, of jaundice; a labourer, aged 77, of pneumonia; a female, aged 78, of phthisis; a gentleman and a female, each aged 78, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 79, of syncope; a carpenter, aged 79, of prostaticitis; a male of unknown occupation, aged 80, of pericarditis; a miner, aged 81, of apoplexy; a carpenter, aged 81, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of cancer; a female, aged 82, of cerebral softening; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 83, of apoplexy; a female, aged 93, of pericarditis; a female, aged 93, of congestion of the liver; a contractor, and a female, each aged 75, a male of unknown occupation, aged 77, a female, aged 79, a hawker, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a dentist and two females, each aged 82, a carpenter, aged 83, a female, aged 86, a female, aged 89, and two females, each aged 91, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 24 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, 5 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A tilemaker, aged 15, a van-driver, aged 33, a commercial traveller, aged 36, and an engine-driver, aged 59, died of injuries resulting from falls; a labourer, aged 25, a shunter, aged 26, and a seaman, aged 30, were passed over by railway trains; a female, aged 50, and a comb manufacturer, aged 62, by vehicles; a groom, aged 26, died of injuries consequent on being thrown from a horse; a jockey, aged 18, of fracture of the spine—how caused not stated; a male child, aged 6, of burns, and a female infant, of scalds; a waiter, aged 42, and an auctioneer, aged 50, were drowned in the River Yarra, a seaman, aged 35, in Hobson's Bay, a male of unstated occupation, aged 55, in the Moonee Ponds Creek; a male cook, aged 68, was found drowned at South Melbourne; five female infants, aged 17 days, 1 month, 12 weeks, 3 months, and 6 months respectively, were overlain; and a carpenter, aged 18, died of suffocation. The homicidal death was that of a female infant, who was strangled at birth, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a wine merchant, aged 60, who shot himself, an accountant, aged 59, who cut his throat, a sawyer, aged 34, and a marble mason, aged 47, who poisoned themselves, and a labourer, aged 57, who strangled himself. The case of execution was that of a plumber, aged 37, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol for the murder of his wife at Windsor.

One hundred and thirty-eight deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 66 in the Melbourne Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 183, of which 90, or 49 per cent., were of males, and 93, or 51 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 126 were under one year of age, 28 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 424. Of these, 236, or 56 per cent., were males, and 188, or 44 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 25 were between twenty and twenty-five, 32 were between twenty-five and thirty, 38 were between thirty and thirty-five, 36 were between thirty-five and forty, 38 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 36 were between sixty-five and seventy, 30 were between seventy and seventy-five, 16 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

In May, as compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 77 to 37. Under this head, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 28 to 9, those from diarrhoeal diseases from 21 to 6, those from influenza from 6 to 1, and those from whooping-cough from 8 to 3. On the other hand, deaths from diphtheria increased from 6 to 11, and deaths from scarlet fever from 2 to 3. Diphtheritic croup, classed as a complaint of the respiratory system, caused 4 deaths in May, but not one death in April.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREASURY GARDEN.

WHEREAS by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the regulations made by the said Board on the 26th day of March, 1888, in respect of the Treasury Garden, and doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the garden who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall interfere with, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, birds, fish, or any property in the garden, or throw stones or other missiles, or beat carpets, or commit any nuisance, or light fires in the garden, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or seats in or around the garden, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
4. No person other than those in the employ of or authorized by the Board of Land and Works shall bring into the garden any horse or other animal, except as provided in clause 5, or any vehicle, or enter plots of ground enclosed for plantations or other purposes.
5. No person shall bring into the garden any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.
6. No person shall offer for sale in the garden any merchandise or article of any description.
7. Cricket, football, or other games or sports shall not be played or take place in the garden.
8. Preaching in the garden or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected, shall not be permitted.
9. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the garden shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, and to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF BRANKEET.

WE, Robert Stanley, John King, and Thomas Brown, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Brankeet, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1890*, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 4 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—

LEAGHUR AND MEERING IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as may be adopted and fixed by the Trust's officers.
2. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust, upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land, indorsed or approved by such owners.
3. All applications for the construction of irrigation outlets shall be dealt with by the Trust.
4. Only one outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to three hundred and twenty acres, and one for every additional three hundred and twenty acres, or fraction thereof, except in such cases where the Trust may order otherwise, or the full cost of construction of the said outlet is paid by the applicant, or the said outlet is constructed by the applicant at his own expense, with the permission of the Trust, subject to the approval of the engineer to the Trust.
5. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant, subject to the approval of the engineer to the Trust.
6. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied by such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier, or any other person, in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust, in writing, and under the supervision of the engineer or other responsible officer.
7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre, including gardens, one-fourth of which shall be paid on making application for the water, and the balance within a month after the water has been delivered.
8. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. And the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays, as well as on ordinary working days.
9. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by persons authorized by the Trust, and no person who is not so authorized shall, under any circumstances (unless he obtain permission from the chairman of the Trust), open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.
10. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.
11. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding, for any offence, the sum of Ten pounds.

RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION No. 5.

Regulation for graduated rate by the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under the "Water Act 1890."

WHEREAS the moneys received during the year 1891 by the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust were not sufficient to provide for the payment of the sums due by such Trust to the Board of Land and Works for the payment of the interest due upon the loan contracted by such Trust, and for all the other lawful expenses incurred by such Trust in the control and management of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

And whereas it is anticipated that the moneys receivable by the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust during the year 1892 will not, without a rate, be sufficient to meet the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the said Trust of the year 1892, and it is therefore necessary to make a rate to meet as well the said deficiency in the revenue of the year 1891 as the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the year 1892. And whereas, by an Order made by the Governor in Council on the 28th day of April, 1892, the district of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was divided into three divisions, numbered and named in said order:—

1. The No. 1 Division;
2. The No. 2 Division;
3. The No. 3 Division;

with the several boundaries to such divisions set out in the said Order.

And by the said Order in Council it is directed that: the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the construction and maintenance of their works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied differentially as between such said divisions, and to determine that the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the works constructed, wholly or in part, for the benefit of such divisions respectively, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

That the respective rating in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said divisions shall be—

The No. 1 Division	One shilling.
The No. 2 Division	Sixpence.
The No. 3 Division	Sixpence.

And whereas the Commissioners of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust have, in accordance with the said recited Order in Council, determined for the several purposes authorized in the said Act to make the rate set out in the following Regulation, and have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, submitted such rate and regulation for the approval of the Governor in Council, who has, by Order in Council made on the 28th day of April, 1892, given his approval to same, and such approval was published on the 6th day of May, 1892, in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

Now therefore the Commissioners of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers, and for the several purposes authorized by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the Order in Council of the 28th day of April, 1892, do, upon this 17th day of May, 1892, make the Regulation to which the Governor in Council has given his approval by Order in Council as above recited by the Regulation following, that is to say:—

The rate hereinafter specified is that which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the aforesaid divisions shall pay in respect of the term of one year from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December, 1892, on all lands and tenements according to the municipal valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements during the said year, that is to say:—

- On rateable property within the No. 1 Division a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of such valuation;
- On rateable property within the No. 2 Division a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation;
- On rateable property within the No. 3 Division a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the 1st day of January, 1892, and shall be payable on the 1st day of July, 1892.

Such person or persons appointed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to collect and recover said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 5, was made by the Commissioners of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 17th day of May, 1892.

REGULATIONS FOR FREEZING OR PRESERVING IMPORTED MEAT IN BOND.

(Section 19, *Customs Act 1890*.)

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, viz.:-

The freezing or preserving of meat in bond will be allowed for exportation under the following conditions, viz.:-

1. The building shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

2. The proprietor or occupier, with two sureties, shall enter into a bond for such sum as the Commissioner may direct that all stock or carcases or portions thereof received shall be duly accounted for.

3. The proprietor or occupier shall provide at his own cost all such locks and weighing machines as the Collector of Customs may require, and a suitable locker's office, and shall keep same in good repair.

4. The stock or carcases or portions thereof on import shall be dealt with under the Regulations for the transmission of stock or carcases or portions thereof under bond, duly entered at port of import with two extra copies of warrant, viz., one for warehouse-keeper and one for locker, and these copies are to be forwarded with the transire to be dealt with at the works.

5. The stock or carcases or portions thereof having arrived at the freezing or preserving works shall be at once placed within the premises, and the number of stock or carcases or portions thereof so placed shall be indorsed upon each copy of entry, such indorsement being signed by the proprietor or occupier as well as by the Officer of Customs.

6. All frozen or preserved meat must be duly entered out, prior to shipment, as goods ex warehouse.

7. The hours of attendance shall be the same as at the other bonded warehouses, but if any extended time be required the same may be allowed by the Collector. The charge made for the attendance of an officer during ordinary bonding hours shall be at the rate of 2s. per hour, and for any time beyond the hours specified the charge shall be as laid down in the Regulations for Overtime for Lockers.

8. On the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December in each year, stock shall be taken, books balanced, and the duty on deficiencies (if any) paid to the Collector of Customs by the 4th of the following month.

REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF STOCK OR CARCASSES OR PORTIONS THEREOF THROUGH VICTORIA UNDER BOND.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, viz.:-

Stock or carcases or portions thereof imported into Victoria at Border Stations, and intended for export at Melbourne, will be allowed to travel by rail under bond, subject to the following conditions:-

1. The stock or carcases or portions thereof on importation are to be duly entered, and the full amount of duty paid on deposit at the port of entry, or the duty may be provided for in the manner set out in clause 2 hereof.

2. In lieu of depositing the duty, applications in respect of stock or carcases or portions thereof to import without payment of duty will be allowed for a period not exceeding seven months. The applicant shall declare that these Regulations will be duly observed by himself or his agents, and shall deposit with the Secretary for Trade and Customs a guaranteed cheque of sufficient amount to cover the duty on such stock or carcases or portions thereof as they may wish to import for export purposes, or may enter into a general or particular bond, with two approved sureties, providing for the payment of such duty in the event of the stock or carcases or portions thereof in respect of which the bond is given not being duly accounted for.

3. The importer's representative in Melbourne is required to make application to the Inspector of Drawbacks, Melbourne, for an officer to attend to the discharge of the stock or carcases or portions thereof from the trucks.

4. All such stock or carcases or portions thereof shall be untrucked under the supervision of an Officer of Customs.

5. Live stock intended for export as such (except horses) is to be duly entered out and shipped under Customs supervision not later than four days from arrival in Melbourne, at the expiration of which period duty is to be paid on the stock remaining unexported (if any).

6. Stock or carcases or portions thereof for freezing or preserving purposes must be accounted for to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs within six days.

7. Horses may be transmitted through Victoria under bond, and duly exported under Customs supervision, within a period of seven months from the date of importation thereof, at the expiration of which period duty is to be paid on the portion remaining unexported (if any).

8. The landing waiter's warrant for export shall bear upon the back thereof a declaration by the exporter that the stock or carcases or portions thereof mentioned in said warrant were untrucked at Newmarket, or Newport freezing works, or such other place as may have been approved by the Collector, and on such a date.

9. If a deposit has been made a refund of such will be given upon production of the coast despatch duly registered and signed by the Collector, Melbourne.

10. The Regulations of 5th December, 1889, and 17th February, 1890, are hereby cancelled.

Note.—Attention is specially directed to Regulation No. 3, and importers are requested to observe that stock must be entered at such times as will admit of the Regulations being carried out.

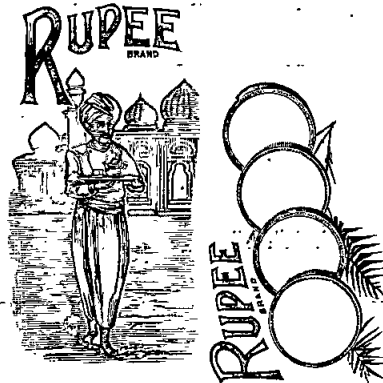

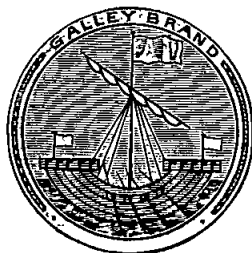



BY-LAWS.

SECTION I.—CONSTITUTION.

I. The name of the Association is "The Young Men's Christian Association of Melbourne."

II. The Association is based upon the declaration which was adopted at the Paris Conference of the Y.M.C. Associations of all lands, in October, 1855, and is the bond which unites Y.M.C.A.'s throughout the world. This declaration, known as the "Paris Basis," is as follows:—

"The Young Men's Christian Association seeks to unite those young men who, regarding the Lord Jesus Christ as their God and Saviour according to the Holy Scriptures, desire to be His disciples in their doctrine and their life, and to associate their efforts for the extension of His kingdom amongst young men."

SECTION II.—OBJECT.

III. The object of the Association is the improvement of the spiritual, intellectual, social, and physical condition of young men.

SECTION III.—MEMBERSHIP.

IV. The Association shall comprise active, associate, sustaining, and honorary members, but active members only shall be entitled to hold office, and only active members and others qualified under By-law XI. shall be entitled to vote at business meetings of the Association.

V. The qualification for active membership shall be as follows:—

Any man over 16 years of age, who is a member in good standing of any evangelical church or body which holds the doctrine of "Justification by faith in Christ alone," may upon signing an application (in a form approved by the board), and having obtained the indorsement in writing of two active members, and paid his subscription, be admitted by the board as an active member.

VI. The qualification for associate membership shall be as follows:—

Any man over 16 years of age of good moral character upon signing an application (in a form approved by the board), and paying his subscription may be admitted by any committee appointed by the board, to inquire into applications for membership.

VII. The qualification for sustaining membership shall be as follows:—

Any person, firm, or company, subscribing to the ordinary revenue of the Association not less than Five guineas annually, or such other minimum sum as the board may from time to time determine, shall become a sustaining member, and shall have the privilege during the year in which such subscription is given of nominating a member or members to the extent to which such subscription shall cover the fees for such nominees, to the privileges and advantages offered by the association to members, provided such nominees qualify themselves under By-laws V. or VI.

VIII. Any person paying, in one sum, ten years' subscription in advance may be admitted by the board (while qualified in accordance with By-laws V. or VI.) an active or associate member for life.

IX. Honorary members may be elected at any meeting of the Association by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the members present, such meeting having been called in accordance with By-law XII., and shall be entitled to the privileges of active or associate membership according to their qualifications.

X. The subscription for active and associate members shall be One guinea sterling per annum, payable yearly or half-yearly, in advance. Youths between 16 and 18 years of age shall pay only half-a guinea.

XI. No member or other person contributing a less sum than £100 per annum shall have the right to vote at any business meeting of the Association unless qualified as an active member under By-law V.

XII. The subscriptions mentioned in the foregoing by-laws shall entitle members to admission to the rooms of the Association, and the use of the parlor, reading-room, and library, but not to gymnastic or secular class instruction, or to admission to meetings held in the rooms by persons or bodies other than the Association. Active members enjoy in addition the rights mentioned in By-law V.

SECTION IV.—MANAGEMENT.

XIII. The business of the Association shall be conducted by a board of management, which shall consist of a president, a senior vice-president, six vice-presidents, and nineteen members, such board shall be elected by the members, who, by the provisions of these by-laws, are qualified to vote, and shall have power to elect from its own members an honorary secretary and honorary treasurer.

XIV. The board shall have power in any year *honoris causa* to appoint a president (if not elected by the members at the annual meeting), and one or more additional vice-presidents, not exceeding three in all, who shall hold office only until the next succeeding annual meeting.

XV. The president shall cease to hold that office each year immediately after the annual meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election. The retiring president shall be senior vice president during his successor's occupation of the presidential office. Should the senior vice-president cease to be a member of the board he shall vacate his office, and the board shall appoint one of its members to the office for the period during which the person so vacating it would have held such office had he continued a member of the board.

XVI. The annual meeting of the Association shall be held on the last Thursday of the month of July in every year. At such meeting all elections to the board shall take place, and a financial statement be presented. At the same meeting at least one-third part of the elected officers and members of the board shall go out of office, but may nevertheless be re-elected, and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. All candidates must be nominated in writing by two active members of the Association, and such nomination with the written consent of the candidate shall be lodged with the general secretary at least seven clear days before the annual meeting. All elected members of the board shall hold office until their successors are elected.

XVII. If any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the president of the Association, or be absent without leave from four consecutive meetings of the board his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may temporarily appoint thereto some active member of the Association until the next annual meeting for the election of the board when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire in addition to those who by the provisions of By-law XVI. are required to go out of office, but shall be eligible for re-election. In such case the member elected to fill the vacancy shall hold office for the residue of the term of the member whose office originally became vacant.

XVIII. The board shall have power to elect and employ a general secretary and such other officers as may be required, and to fix, and from time to time alter, the remuneration to be paid to such officers. All persons so appointed must be qualified as active members, and shall only hold office during the pleasure of the board.

XIX. The board may from time to time make such regulations for the conduct of its own proceedings for the appointment, government, and duties of the committees, officers, and agents of the Association for the control of its funds and property, for the proper carrying out of the object of the Association, for the control and management of the gymnasium, and for defining the rights and privileges of the various classes of members as it may deem necessary. Any such committee may be so appointed to consist of members of the board and of the Association or otherwise as the board may think fit.

XX. Any regulation may be repealed, altered, or varied by the board as it may from time to time think fit. All regulations shall be exhibited on a notice board in the rooms of the Association for one calendar month before the same shall come into full force and effect. No regulation shall be inconsistent with any by-law of the Association.

XXI. Any member guilty of improper conduct or disobedience to these by-laws or the regulations may be dealt with in such manner as the board may decide, provided that any member so dealt with shall have the right of appealing to the Association, by giving written notice to the board within one month after the decision of his intention to appeal. Such appeal shall be dealt with at the first business meeting of the Association (whether special or general) after such notice has been received.

SECTION V.—MEETINGS.

XXII. All meetings of the Association shall be convened by advertisement, and by notice suspended in one of the rooms of the Association, and shall be opened and closed with devotional exercises. Fifteen active members, three of whom shall be members of the board, shall constitute a quorum. Special meetings of the Association for the transaction of necessary business may be convened by direction of the board, or, at the written request of ten active members of the Association, by the president. The notices of all meetings of the Association exhibited in the rooms shall state the business of such meetings, and if for election to any office, shall include the names of the candidates for the same. No member shall have more than one vote.

SECTION VI.—MEMBERS.

XXIII. Active and associate members may, subject to these by-laws and the regulations of the Association, introduce friends to the reading or refreshment rooms of the Association, and persons so introduced may, on entering their names and addresses in a book kept for that purpose, or on obtaining a visitor's ticket, visit and use such rooms for a period not exceeding one month. Persons so introduced will be required to observe the by-laws and regulations of the Association, and to show their visitor's ticket when required; any infringement hereof shall disqualify them from further exercise of the privilege.

SECTION VII.—SEAL.

XXIV. The seal of the Association shall be in the custody of the general secretary, and shall only be affixed, by him with the authority of the board, and such affixing shall be attested by one member of the board and the hon. treasurer. The board shall have power by regulation to provide for any contingency that may arise owing to either the general secretary or treasurer, or both of them, from any cause not being available for the purpose required by this by-law.

SECTION VIII.—BY-LAWS.

XXV. No alteration shall be made in By-laws Nos. IV., V., XI., and XXV., except with the unanimous consent in writing of all the active members of the Association.

XXVI. Any of these by-laws, with the exception of those mentioned in By-law XXV. may be altered by the board, provided such alteration is subsequently confirmed by the vote of two-thirds of the active members present at a meeting convened for the purpose of considering such alteration, and provided that there shall be at least 60 active members present personally or by proxy at such meeting, and provided further that the advertisement calling the meeting, shall state that it is called for the purpose of altering the by-laws, and that full particulars of the proposed change be exhibited in prominent parts of the rooms of the Association, for four weeks immediately preceding the holding of such meeting. No alteration shall have any force or effect until confirmed as aforesaid.
