The births of 1,470 children, viz., 771 boys and 699 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. In the month of May, 1,659 births were registered, or 189 more than in the month under review. The births were 253 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 84 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 614, viz., 355 of males and 259 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 856, or 139 per cent. The deaths were more than those in May by 7, and exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 45; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 113.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2'99, and of deaths registered 1'25.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63'6° on the 7th, and the lowest was 34'6° on the 14th. The mean temperature of the month (51'2°) was half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26'4°) took place on the 14th, and the least range (5'5°) on the 3rd and 4th. The mean daily range was 11'0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30'405 inches on the 13th, and the lowest was 29'986 inches on the 8th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30'019 inches) differed from the average by a fraction only.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 1'29 inches. The average rainfall in June during the previous ten years was 1'99 inches, or seven-tenths of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 58 per cent., and females 42 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 27 per cent. to that mortality, as against 34 per cent. in June, 1891; 33 per cent. in June, 1890; 37 per cent. in June, 1889; 34 per cent. in June, 1888; 33 per cent. in June, 1887; and 30 per cent. in June, 1886.

Forty-six deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were registered during the month. Of these, a labourer, a bricklayer, and a female, each aged 75, died of bronchitis; a wool-classer, aged 75, of strangulation of the bowels; a labourer, aged 75, was accidentally killed on a railway line; a seaman, aged 76, died of cancer; a shoemaker, aged 76, of pneumonia; a soldier, aged 77, of syncope; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 77, was suffocated by food; a saddler, aged 78, died of apoplexy; a female, aged 78, of intestinal obstruction; a clerk, aged 78, of gallstones; a widow, aged 79, of paralysis; a dealer, aged 79, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 79, of senile gangrene; a labourer, aged 79, of heart disease; a farmer,

aged 79, of bronchitis; a hawker, aged 80, of apoplexy; a carpenter, aged 80, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman and a master mariner, each aged 80, of syncope; a fisherman, aged 80, of nephritis; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a sailor, aged 83, and a male of unknown occupation, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a butcher, aged 84, of cystitis; a gardener, aged 85, of cancer; a female, aged 86, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 87, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 88, of bronchitis; a bootmaker and a female, each aged 76, a gardener and two females, each aged 77, a mangle mason, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a widow and a seamstress, each aged 82, a barometer maker, aged 83, a blacksmith and a female, each aged 84, a fruit dealer, aged 85, a female, aged 90, and a female, whose age is stated to have been 101, of old age.

Thirty-eight deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 33 were set down to accident and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 75, was killed on the Coburg railway line; a boy, aged 7, a market gardener, aged 27, and a wool-classer, aged 28, were passed over by vehicles; a messenger, aged 16, a mail cart driver, aged 32, a surgeon, aged 42, a bricklayer, aged 57, a cabman, aged 59, and a fruiterer, aged 65, died of injuries consequent on falls; a labourer, aged 30, through coming in contact with an electric wire; an ironmoulder, aged 24, of injuries received whilst playing football; a male infant, aged 1 year, and a male child, aged 11 years, of fracture of the skull; a female, aged 63, of fracture of the thigh—how caused not stated; a boy, aged 11 months, of hæmorrhage from wounds; a male child, aged 1 year, a female, aged 5, a watchman, aged 46, a female, aged 52, and a groom, aged 59, of injuries caused by burns; a clerk, aged 28, was poisoned by an overdose of chloroform; a female, aged 42, by swallowing an irritant poison; a female, aged 43, and an accountant, aged 70, were drowned in the River Yarra, a female, aged 54, at St. Kilda, a gentleman, aged 72, in a bath; a newly-born female infant, a female infant, aged 1 day, a male and a female infant, each aged 2 months, were overlain; an engineer, aged 47, and a labourer, aged 77, were suffocated by food. The suicidal deaths were those of an engine-cleaner and a female, aged 23 and 49 respectively, who poisoned themselves, the former with opium, the latter with strychnine; an engine-cleaner, aged 23, who drowned himself, a customs officer, aged 49, who hanged himself, and a wheelwright, aged 23, who shot himself.

One hundred and fifty-five deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 76 in the Melbourne Hospital, 22 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 167, of which 97, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 70, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 124 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 447. Of these, 258, or 58 per cent., were males, and 189, or 42 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 35 were between twenty and twenty-five, 34 were between twenty-five and thirty, 43 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 34 were between seventy and seventy-five, 24 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 22 were upwards of eighty.

The month of June was particularly fatal to child-bearing women, as many as 15 having died as against only 3 in the previous month. The number of children registered as born alive in June being 1,470, it follows that 1 mother died to every 98 births. Under the head of miasmatic diseases, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 9 to 12, and deaths from diphtheria from 11 to 15. No death, however, in June, but 4 deaths in May, occurred from diphtheritic croup; neither was any death in June caused by scarlet fever or whooping cough, whereas 3 deaths were set down to each of these complaints in May.

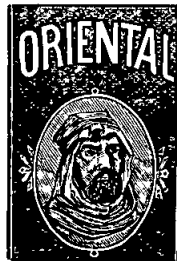

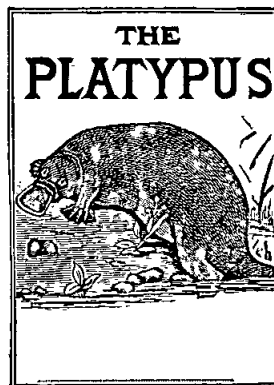

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE RECEIPT AND DISBURSEMENT OF DEPOSITS RECEIVED WITH APPLICATIONS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS AND MINERAL LANDS AND WATER-RIGHT LICENCES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has by Order made on the 18th day of July, 1892, substituted the following Regulations relating to the Receipt and Disbursement of Deposits received with Applications for Leases of Auriferous and Mineral Lands and Water-right Licences in lieu of those made by Order in Council of the 21st day of January, 1867, which have been revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. A record shall be kept in the books of the Warden's Office of the date and purport of all notices which appear in the *Government Gazette* in relation to leases or licences and applications for leases or licences in the division, and the Warden's Clerk shall be responsible for correctly recording all such notices immediately after publication thereof as aforesaid.

2. The Warden's Clerk shall pay in every day to his revenue account, to be kept in such bank as the Treasurer shall direct, all sums received as deposits from applicants or objectors up to the moment of paying in such moneys. Under all circumstances this should be done. The Warden's Clerk, as a collector of imposts, shall pay over all such moneys to the receiver of revenue, at such place and at such times as the Treasurer shall direct; and in his statement of collections shall credit such moneys to Trust Fund, Public Leasing Account. Where, however, the Warden's Clerk is also a receiver of revenue, the amounts lodged as aforesaid are to be brought to account in the public account on the day of their receipt. The Warden's Clerk shall prepare a return on the form under Clause 19 of General Regulations of all such deposits, including fines and forfeitures, which return shall be handed in or transmitted with his statement of collections to the receiver of revenue.

3. As regards disbursements, the Warden's Clerk shall, as often as occasion may require, forward to the office of the Minister of Mines a properly prepared and certified account on the Form 5, provided for the purpose, for the payment of any amount he may require to disburse from any deposit in favour of the person to whom it is payable, and, when approved, it will be transmitted for payment through the Treasury, at such receipt and pay office as may be indicated on the account.

4. On receipt of examined survey accounts, or any directions for payments to be made out of deposits of applicants and objectors, the Warden's Clerk, under the instructions of the Warden, shall at once prepare the accounts for the proposed disbursements.

5. As soon as the Warden shall have notified to the Office of Mines that a lease has been duly executed by the lessee or a licence delivered to the licensee, and the rent and fee paid, the Warden's Clerk shall, under the instructions of the Warden, prepare and cause to be completed an account to enable the applicant to draw the available balance of his deposit.

6. If the refusal to grant a lease or licence be notified in the *Government Gazette*, the Warden will, unless he receive instructions from the Office of Mines to a contrary effect, forthwith direct the clerk to take steps to prepare and cause to be completed an account for the disbursement to the applicant of the available balance after payment for the survey or any other costs which may be chargeable to the applicant's deposit. The account is then to be forwarded to the Secretary for Mines.

7. As regards objectors' deposits, the clerk, after he has received the Warden's instructions to close the Court of Inquiry, shall prepare and cause to be completed accounts for refund to the depositors, unless costs to the applicants have been awarded out of the objector's deposit, in which case the refund will be subject to such award.

8. The Warden's Clerk is required to act promptly on all instructions for disbursements, and if in doubt as to the proper disposal of any deposits, after the applications in connexion with which they were received have been finally dealt with, he will apply to the Warden, who, if necessary, will refer to the Office of Mines for the directions of the Honorable the Minister of Mines in the matter.

9. The Warden's Clerk shall transmit to the Office of Mines monthly, on or before the 10th of the following month, a statement of the balances at credit in connexion with each application, as shown by his books at the close of the previous month. In the event of his non-compliance with this instruction, and failure to give a satisfactory explanation of the delay, his salary or allowance will be stopped and an officer may be sent to investigate his accounts.

10. When costs to the Crown are ordered to be paid out of the deposits lodged under the Leasing and Water-right Regulations, accounts are to be prepared and forwarded to the Secretary for Mines transferring the amount from Trust Fund to Revenue under the head of "No. 8.—Fines, Costs, &c., Mining Leases, &c."

Health Act 1890.

TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.

A By-law of the Town of Warrnambool, numbered 61, for regulating the management of closets and privies, &c., and for deodorizing night-soil, and providing for the removal thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Town of Warrnambool, in the name and on behalf of the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the said town,

and for the purpose of carrying such Act into execution within their jurisdiction, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said town of Warrnambool.

2. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished.

3. Instead thereof, every closet shall be furnished with a double-service pan, the pan to be George Lance and Son's patent, or such other pan as the said council may from time to time approve of.

4. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart.

5. Every occupier or person in charge or having the management or control of any house, dwelling, school, licensed public-house, factory, workshop, or any other building or premises within the said town, shall provide the aforesaid pans, and shall also keep or cause to be kept in every privy or closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material suitable for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all such night-soil which may be deposited to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to deodorize the same.

6. The nightman duly licensed by the said council shall be employed by such occupier or person as aforesaid for the removal of such night-soil, and the said occupier or person shall not contract with any other person for the removal of the same.

7. Such occupier or person as aforesaid shall pay to the said Council of the Town of Warrnambool for the removal of the said night-soil where one to three pans are in use Sixpence (6d.) per pan for each time it is emptied; where four to eight pans are in use, Fivepence (5d.) per pan each time it is emptied; where nine to fifteen pans are in use, Fourpence (4d.) per pan each time it is emptied; where sixteen or more pans are in use, Threepence (3d.) per pan each time it is emptied, or such other sums as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council.

8. No closet or privy door or trap shall abut on, open in or into any street, lane, or right-of-way.

9. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings but not less than Five shillings, and a further penalty not more than Two pounds but not less than Five shillings, for every day during which such breach shall continue.

Health Act 1890.

BOROUGH OF FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON.

A By-law of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington, made under section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered ten (10), for securing the healthfulness of the district and of its inhabitants.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Municipality of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington do hereby make a By-law, and do hereby order as follows:—

No person shall place, carry, or have in any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle, shall be in contact with, or be liable to be in contact with, such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

If any person shall commit a breach of the provisions of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, provided that the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1892 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July:—

- (1) On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house and tenement during the said year, the sum of Twenty shillings.
- (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every one thousand gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of the water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or in the event of there not being any contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, and plastering; the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter but not exceeding one-half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement, or by measure, shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust this 30th day of June, 1892, and the seal of this said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach.

4. When water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, viz., all pipes three-quarters of an inch, except where a special agreement is made.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables, or for manufacturing purposes.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing the house-walls or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, except by the written authority of the Trust; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes, or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Before any such licence being granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

9. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), heads, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- (6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fixed plugs. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall, at all times, be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from an officer of the Trust that such pipes require repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

18. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of supplying or feeding the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

19. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

20. The service-pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main.

21. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

22. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

24. In the construction of these Regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Longwood Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS by the 54th section of the *Patents Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make any arrangement with the Government or Governments of any Australian colony or with the Government of the colony of New Zealand or of the colony of Fiji for the mutual protection of inventions, and that the provisions of the now reciting section shall apply only to such of the colonies aforesaid to which the Governor from time to time, by Order in Council, declares them to be applicable:

And whereas by the 31st section of the *Trade Marks Act 1890* it is enacted amongst other things that if the Governor in Council is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government of any British possession for the mutual protection of trade marks, and that the provisions of the now reciting section shall apply to such of the British possessions with respect to which the Governor from time to time, by Order in Council, declares them to be applicable:

And whereas the Governor in Council has made arrangements with the Government of the colony of New Zealand for the mutual protection of patents and trade marks:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that all the provisions contained in section 54 of the *Patents Act 1890* shall apply to inventions in respect of which application for protection has been made in the colony of New Zealand, and that the provisions of section 31 of the *Trade Marks Act 1890* shall apply to trade marks in respect of which application has been made in the colony of New Zealand or which is entitled to protection in such colony:

And in further pursuance and exercise of the power and authority aforesaid, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, it is ordered that this Order in Council shall take effect from and after the 1st day of August next.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulations No. II. (Staff, Salaries and Allowances) and No. XX. (Training) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof respectively, viz.:-

II.—STAFF, SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES.

1. No person shall be employed in a classified school as head teacher, assistant teacher, or relieving teacher unless he shall hold a certificate of competency or a licence to teach.
2. Staffs will be allotted and salaries paid in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890*, and the schedules thereto.
3. The number of teachers employed in any school will be increased or reduced from time to time as the average attendance for the two months immediately preceding may render necessary; but, in cases where the attendance has been reduced by the prevalence of sickness or other exceptional cause, a longer trial may be given before the staff is reduced.
4. In the case of a new school, a staff of teachers will be allotted upon the expected attendance at the school.
5. In addition to their salaries, head teachers of day schools will be paid monthly allowances for maintenance expenses, according to the following scale, from the 1st August, 1892:—

The average attendance during the six months ending the 30th April and 31st October in each year will be generally adopted as the basis for determining the allowances from 1st July and 1st January respectively next ensuing; but in cases where exceptional fluctuations in attendance have occurred, the average attendance of any other month or months may, with the sanction of the Minister, be adopted.

6. In consideration of the above allowances, the head teacher will be required—

- (a) To have the floors of all the school-rooms, class-rooms, porches, out-offices, &c., properly swept and thoroughly scrubbed out, the walls brushed down, and the paint washed with sufficient frequency to keep the rooms clean and healthy. To keep all eaves, spouting, down-pipes, and iron tanks free from leaves and dirt, and all drains clean and free from stoppages.
- (b) To provide water for the use of the children for drinking and washing; also soap and towels.
- (c) To keep the chimneys and windows clean, and all locks, latches, &c., to doors and cupboards, and glass in windows, in proper repair.
- (d) To keep properly emptied, disinfected, and attended to the pans in earth-closets, and the cesspits where there are no earth-closets.
- (e) To provide pens, penholders, ink, slate-pencils, chalk, sewing materials, and all stationery (except copy-books).
- (f) To provide fuel for warming the school-rooms, and to keep them properly warmed.

All articles must be provided, and the duties specified must be performed, to the satisfaction of any officer of the Education Department who may be authorized by the Minister of Public Instruction to visit and examine the schools. On leaving a school, the teacher will be required to furnish an acknowledgment from his successor that he has received everything in proper order.

7. An allowance of 2s. 6d. per meeting will be made to head teachers of State schools in which Boards of Advice hold their meetings; and in consideration of such amount they will be required to provide lights and fires when necessary, and to supply pens, ink, &c.

8. Whenever and so long as the teaching staff of a school is reduced below its proper strength by the death, resignation, absence on leave, or the transfer of any assistant employed in a school, the head teacher may, subject to the approval of the Minister, employ the senior first-class pupil teacher on the staff who has served not less than twelve months from the date of his promotion to the first class to act as temporary junior assistant, provided that the number of assistants in the school is not by such employment of a pupil teacher in excess of the number allowed by the Seventh Schedule of the *Public Service Act 1890*.

9. Whenever and so long as the teaching staff of a school is reduced below its proper strength by the death, resignation, or absence on leave of a pupil teacher, or by the withdrawal of a first-class pupil teacher to act temporarily as assistant or head teacher, the head teacher of the school may, subject to the approval of the Minister, appoint a temporary pupil teacher in the stead of each pupil teacher so withdrawn. The salary payable to each such temporary pupil teacher will be that payable to fourth-class pupil teachers.

XX.—TRAINING.

1. The training institution will consist of a training college in Melbourne, and of district training schools, not exceeding twenty in number, in various parts of the colony. The members of the training institution will be a Superintendent, who will be principal of the training college, a vice-principal of the college, lecturers, associates, and students.

2. Training will be conducted in the training college in Melbourne by the principal and the other officers of the college, and in the district training schools by the associates.

3. The district training schools will be such State schools as shall be determined under regulations framed under section 68 of Act No. 1133; and the head teacher for the time being of each such school will hold the office of associate so long as his school continues to be a branch of the institution.

4. The course of instruction in the training institution will be free, and will extend over two years, the first of which will be passed in a district training school, and the second in the training college.

5. Associates will be required to train and adequately instruct all students placed in training with them by the Department, and to provide for their receiving, outside of the ordinary school hours, not less than six hours' instruction per week in the subjects prescribed for study during the first year's course. They will also be required to train in the practice of teaching any teachers who may be temporarily transferred to their schools for that purpose.

6. Each associate of the training institution will receive a fixed sum of £50 per annum, and £10 for every student whom, after not less than six months' instruction in his school, he qualifies for admission to the second year's course of training.

7. Students will receive allowances as under:—

- (a) If paid as pupil teachers and residing at home, £5 per annum in addition to their salaries.
- (b) If residing at home and not paid as pupil teachers, £35 per annum.
- (c) In all other cases, board and lodging free of cost.

8. Every student will be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for four years after the termination of his studentship to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.

9. The course of instruction in the training institution will be as under:—

During the first year's course students will be required to attend regularly the meetings of the schools to which they are attached, and to take part in the ordinary work of the school for at least half of each day, or for a greater portion, at the discretion of the head teacher. The time not employed in actual teaching will be devoted, under the direction of the head teacher, to the study of the subjects prescribed above.
11. Students will, at the end of their first year, be examined in the subjects prescribed for study during the first year's course, and those who pass a satisfactory examination will be admitted to the second year's course.
12. Students who fail to pass a satisfactory examination at the end of their first year may, at the discretion of the Minister, have their studentships suspended or forfeited altogether.
13. During the second year's course students will be required to attend lectures at the training college in the subjects in which

they must pass in order to obtain a trained teacher's certificate, including Music and Drawing, and in Gymnastics, Drill, or Needlework, and such other subjects of the course as the principal may direct. Students will also from time to time attend and teach classes at the practising schools.

14. At the end of their second year, students will be examined in the subjects prescribed during the second year's course, and a trained teacher's certificate will be awarded to those who pass in the subjects numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7, and show such proficiency as may be required in the subject numbered 6 (Music), and obtain a total of 350 marks. (In estimating this total, no credit will be given for less than 25 per cent. of marks in any subject.) Students admitted to the training institution prior to 1st January, 1892, may be awarded a trained teacher's certificate without passing in Singing and Drawing, provided that they satisfy the examiners that they have made reasonable progress in those subjects.

15. Students who fail to pass for a trained teacher's certificate after being two years in training may, at the discretion of the Minister, have their studentships continued for a further period, not exceeding six months.

16. Students who fail to pass in all the subjects prescribed for the completion of the first or second year's training, but who have passed in those which form part of the examination for the certificate of competency, may receive the certificate of competency on passing at one examination in the remaining subjects required for such certificate.

17. Students will be liable to dismissal from the training institution for idleness or misconduct.

18. The Superintendent will periodically inspect and report on the district training schools, and the students therein, and will furnish an annual report to the Minister on the training institution generally.

19. All examinations of students will be conducted under the direction of the Inspector General.

20. Persons other than students may, on payment of a fee of £6 6s., be admitted to the second year's course of instruction, or, on payment of a fee of £2 2s., to the course of instruction at the training college in the Theory and Practice of Teaching.

21. Such persons must be at least eighteen years of age, of good character, must satisfy the principal of the college that they are qualified to profit by the lectures, and must undertake to comply, while in attendance, with the rules of the college.

22. Such persons may be suspended from attendance at the lectures, or may be required to discontinue the course for repeated unpunctuality, absence from lectures, or breach of the rules of the college.

23. Persons who have paid the fees of £6 6s., and complied during two consecutive half-years with the conditions prescribed by clause 13 for students, will be admitted to the final examination for the trained teacher's certificate without further payment.

24. Persons who have paid the fee of £2 2s. will, on production of a certificate signed by the principal stating that they have complied during two consecutive half-years with the rules of the college as to attendance at the lectures in Theory and Practice of Teaching, and at the practising schools, be admitted without further payment to the final examination in Theory and Practice of Teaching.

25. Persons other than students, who either pass the final examination for the trained teacher's certificate or that in Theory and Practice of Teaching, will be awarded special certificates, stating what subjects they have passed in, and to what extent they have been trained; but such special certificates will not render the holders eligible for employment in State schools.

26. Persons who have obtained such special certificates may be awarded the Department's trained teacher's certificate, on producing satisfactory evidence that they have passed at some examination or examinations of the Department, or of the Melbourne University, in all the subjects in which students in training are required to pass during the whole of their course in order to obtain the same certificate, and that such examinations were of at least equal difficulty with those passed by students.

No. 1246) it is amongst other things enacted that whenever it appears to the Governor in Council that it will no longer be profitable to mine for gold within fifty feet of the surface of any unalienated lands of the Crown, being auriferous lands within the meaning of the *Land Act 1890*, he may, after proper inquiry and recommendation by the Warden, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, declare any such lands to be "worked-out auriferous lands." Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, after proper inquiry and recommendation by the Warden, doth hereby declare the Crown lands described hereunder to be "worked-out auriferous lands" within the meaning of section 22 of the *Land Act 1891* aforesaid, that is to say:—

WORKED-OUT AURIFEROUS LANDS IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF TALBOT.

Three hundred and forty acres, more or less, county of Talbot, municipal district of Talbot, being the several portions hereinafter described, viz.:—
