I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Forty-seven thousand one hundred and seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two and ninety-three and the sum of One million three hundred and fifty-three thousand two hundred and ninety-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and ninety-four.”

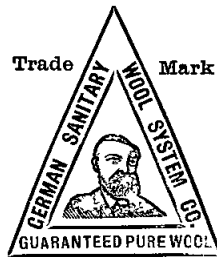

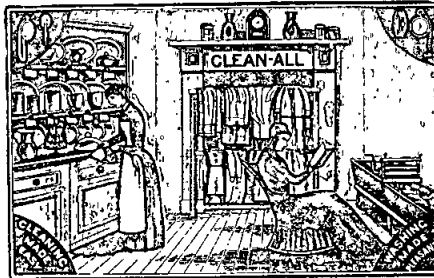

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Fee Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other

examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

BY-LAW NO. 3 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Borough of Eaglehawk, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 35, 251, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 3, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet-pans, house and yard rubbish, for maintaining and preserving the cleanliness of public and private drains and channels, and other matters named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk make the following by-law:—

1. By-law No. 2 made by the Local Board of Health under the powers contained in the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and of other powers, shall be and is hereby repealed, except as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Eaglehawk.

4. The Council may exempt any premises within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Eaglehawk from the operation of this by-law on the recommendation of the health officer and the inspector of nuisances.

5. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises within the said borough, shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed, without delay, in covered, non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced, when necessary.

6. Every such occupier or person shall, at least once in every week, cause the contents of these receptacles to be removed, and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor or depot provided by the borough council.

7. Every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in any street or lane, and shall cause them to be removed or replaced from time to time as often as occasion shall require, and shall be responsible for the emptying and the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

8. Every such occupier or person shall provide and maintain on their premises a proper closet or privy building, constructed with openings or flues to supply ventilation, and the floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the adjoining ground, and shall be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth, ashes, or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleaning the same.

9. Every such occupier or person shall furnish and provide for their respective closets a suitable galvanized iron pan with proper handles, and such pan may be of the following dimensions, viz., 15 inches wide and 14 inches deep, but no pan shall in any case exceed the capacity of 2 cubic feet.

10. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a plentiful supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan to be sufficiently covered with such deodorizing material to thoroughly deodorize the contents of the pan.

11. At least once in every week, or so much oftener as may be necessary and as the borough council may from time to time direct, the pan shall be emptied by the nightman employed by the borough council, and the night-soil removed be either rendered inoffensive in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the borough council, or be trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the borough council and covered with earth to a depth of not less than 9 inches.

12. No closet door or trap for removing the pan shall abut or open upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width, and no pan shall be removed or emptied and the contents conveyed through the streets of the borough except between the hours of Twelve o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock a.m. and except they be enclosed in an air-tight cart.

13. Every such occupier or person shall not employ any persons for the removal of night-soil, save those authorized by the borough council for the purpose, and no other person shall remove any night-soil except in cases where exemption is granted.

14. The occupier of any land within the Borough of Eaglehawk on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yards, cattle-sheds, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to, in the case of horse, cow-yard, or cattle-shed manure, 2 cubic yards, and in the case of pig-sty manure, 1 cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by order of the borough council at the expense of such occupier.

15. Nothing contained in this by-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier or person having the management or control of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being so used, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the borough council or local board of health, or to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

16. The occupier of any premises within the Borough of Eaglehawk used for the purposes of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause all rubbish, blood, offal, bones, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter, produced or accumulated thereon, to be removed at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the borough council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and generally shall cause the said premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to do so the offensive matter may be removed by order of the borough council at the expense of such occupier.

17. No such occupier or person shall deposit any rubbish, yard sweepings, or filth of any kind upon any land, street, lane, drain, water-channel, or place other than the depôts provided for the deposit of such by the borough council.

18. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, and not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the borough council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the borough council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Borough of Eaglehawk this twentieth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

THE NATIMUK AND GOROKE RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT AND THE NATIMUK AND GOROKE RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS I, John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., by an Order in Council made the 12th day of June, 1893, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th day of June, 1893, announced my intention to constitute, under the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, the land hereinafter described a Railway Construction District under the name, style, or title of the "Natimuk and Goroke Railway Construction District": And whereas no petition has been received by me praying that such railway district be not constituted, or praying that the line of railway from Natimuk to Goroke authorized by the *Natimuk and Goroke Railway Construction Act 1893* be not constructed: Now therefore I, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the said *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* and the *Natimuk and Goroke Railway Construction Act 1893*, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, hereby by this my Order constitute the land hereinafter described a Railway Construction District under the name, style, or title of the "Natimuk and Goroke Railway Construction District": And I do hereby constitute a Trust for the said Railway Construction District consisting of twenty-four (24) trustees, being the members for the time being of the municipal councils of the municipal districts of Arapiles, Kowree, and Lowan.

WOOL RATES.

If detailed weight lists are furnished by the Commissioners for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station. Unless rebate sheets are rendered within two months of date on which wool is consigned, no claim will be recognised.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE MOYSTON COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of July, 1893, the Managers of the Moyston Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of October and the 1st day of April in every year:—

For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer, Five shillings per annum.
For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Seven shillings per annum.
For every sheep, One shilling and fourpence per annum.
For every goat, One shilling and fourpence per annum.
Progeny under the age of six (6) months of stock legally depasturing on the common, Free.

4. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

5. During the months of October and April in every year, or as soon thereafter as possible, all owners of stock on the common shall be required to muster such stock in their own yards or in some other convenient place, to be determined by the managers, within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving notice in writing so to do, and to assist in branding them with the common brand, horses only being exempt from branding.

6. Previous to the depasturing of stock on the common the owners thereof shall register the same with brands and descriptions in a book to be kept for the purpose, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previously to the branding of such stock.

7. All stock depastured on the common, if not registered, branded as required, and duly paid for, shall be liable to be impounded by the managers.

8. No entire animal shall be depastured on the common without the written permission of the managers.

9. When any animal is affected with any contagious disease the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve (12) hours after receiving notice so to do from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put on the common without the special permission, in writing, of the managers.

10. After due notice has been given, the managers shall, at the owner's expense, be at liberty to remove all diseased animals from the common, and also at the owner's expense to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the common.

11. No person shall cart away water from any dam on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
