ORDER LXXIX.—continued.

ADDITIONAL RULES AND ORDERS FOR THE REGISTRARS OF THE
PRINCIPAL PROBATE REGISTRY IN IRELAND, IN NON-CON-
TENTIOUS BUSINESS, FOR CARRYING OUT THE PROVISIONS OF
THE COLONIAL PROBATES ACT 1892, MADE THIS 26TH DAY OF
JANUARY, 1893.

98. Application to seal a grant of probate or letters of adminis-
tration or copy thereof under the *Colonial Probates Act 1892* may
be made in the Principal Probate Registry by the executor or
administrator or the attorney (lawfully authorized for the pur-
pose) of such executor or administrator, either in person or
through a solicitor.

99. Such application must be accompanied by an oath of the
executor, administrator, or attorney in the form in the Appendix
or as nearly thereto as the circumstances of the case will allow.

100. The Registrars are to be satisfied that notice of such
application has been duly advertised. (Form of advertisement
in Appendix.)

101. On application to seal letters of administration the ad-
ministrator or his attorney shall give bond (in the form set out
in the Appendix) to cover the personal estate of the deceased
within the jurisdiction of the court. The same practice as to
sureties and amount of penalty in bond is to be observed as on
application for letters of administration.

102. Application by a creditor under section 2, sub-section 3, of
the *Colonial Probates Act* is to be made by summons before the
Judge; supported by an affidavit setting out particulars of the
claim.

103. In every case, and especially when the domicile of the
deceased at the time of death as sworn to in the affidavit differs
from that suggested by the description in the grant, the Regis-
trars may require further evidence as to domicile.

104. If it should appear that the deceased was not at the time
of death domiciled within the jurisdiction of the court from
which the grant issued, the seal is not to be affixed unless the
grant is such as would have been made by the High Court of
Justice in Ireland.

105. The grant (or copy grant) to be sealed and the copy to be deposited in the registry must include copies of all testamentary papers admitted to probate.

106. When application to seal a probate or letters of administration is made after the lapse of three years from the death of the deceased, the reason of the delay is to be certified to the Registrars. Should the certificate be unsatisfactory the Registrars are to require such proof of the alleged cause of delay as they may think fit.

107. Special or limited or temporary grants are not to be sealed without an order of the Judge.

108. Notice of the sealing in Ireland of a grant is to be sent to the court from which the grant issued.

109. When intimation has been received of the resealing of an Irish grant, notice of the revocation of, or any alteration in, such grant is to be sent to the court by whose authority such grant was resealed.

110. The affidavit for Inland Revenue, pursuant to the Customs and Inland Revenue Acts 1880 and 1881, shall be transmitted to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue as if the person who applied for sealing under the *Colonial Probates Act 1892* were a person applying for probate or letters of administration.

111. The affidavit for Inland Revenue, and accounts and schedules forming part thereof, shall be in such form as may be prescribed by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury.

(Note.—The affidavit to be used will in fact be Form A, with some few modifications to suit the circumstances.)

COLONIAL PROBATES ACT 1892.

Order of 1st February, 1893.

The Right Honorable Samuel Walker, Lord Chancellor of Ireland, by and with the advice and consent of the undersigned Presidents of the Divisions of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland), and with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, doth hereby and in pursuance and execution of the powers given by the *Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act 1877*, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, order and direct in manner following:—

(1) The fees hereunder written are fixed and appointed to be taken in the Principal Probate Registry in respect of applications under the *Colonial Probates Act 1892*, in addition to any fees payable under the existing Table of Fees in non-contentious business.

For affixing the seal of the court to any grant of probate or letters of administration, with or without will annexed, or copy thereof, in order to its becoming in force for property in Ireland, such fee as would be payable in respect of a grant originally made in Ireland for property equal in amount to the property in Ireland which is to be effected by the probate or other instrument to which the seal of the court is to be affixed.

(2) The existing fee for affixing the seal of the court to an English grant is hereby amended as follows:—

On and after the 1st of February, 1893, for affixing the seal of the court to any grant of probate or letters of administration, with or without will annexed, or to any exemplification of probate or letters of administration with or without will annexed, under seal of the court of probate in England in order to its becoming in force for property in Ireland, such fee as would be payable in respect of a grant originally made in Ireland, for property equal in amount to the property in Ireland, which is to be effected by the probate or other instrument to which the seal of the court is to be affixed, except as under:—

COMMISSARIOT OF EDINBURGH.

RULES OF COURT MADE BY THE SHERIFF OF THE LOTHIAN AND PERIBLES FOR REGULATING THE PROCEDURE AND PRACTICE IN THE SHERIFF COURT OF EDINBURGH IN CONNEXION WITH THE COLONIAL PROBATES ACT 1892 (55 VICT. CHAP. 6).

Edinburgh, 9th June, 1893.

WHEREAS by the said Act, entitled *An Act to provide for the recognition in the United Kingdom of Probates and Letters of Administration granted in British Possessions* (20th May, 1892), it is enacted, section 2 (5), that "Rules of Court may be made for regulating the procedure and practice, including fees and costs in Courts of the United Kingdom, on and incidental to an application for sealing a probate or letters of administration granted in a British possession to which this Act applies"—The Sheriff enacts and ordains as follows:—

1. When any probate or letters of administration granted by a Court of Probate in any British possession to which this Act applies is produced along with a copy thereof in the Sheriff Court of Edinburgh, it shall be sealed by the commissary clerk with the seal of office of the Commissariot of Edinburgh.

Provided—

(1) That a duly stamped inventory, with relative oath in the ordinary form modified to suit the circumstances, has been exhibited in said court, which inventory, after being recorded, shall be transmitted to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue; but it shall not be necessary to record along with said inventory any testamentary writings of which a copy is deposited in terms of the Act.

(2) That in the case of letters of administration, caution has been found to cover the estate in Scotland given up in such inventory, and that such caution shall be subject to the same rules as regards restriction thereof, the terms of the bond and otherwise, as are applicable to caution for executors dative.

(3) That no application has been made under sub-section 3 of section 2 of the Act, or that such application has been disposed of, and that any such application shall be by petition to the sheriff.

2. The oath to the inventory shall set forth the domicile of the deceased at the time of his death; and where, on any ground, it may appear doubtful whether the person or persons in whose favour the grant of probate or letters of administration has been made, would be entitled to confirmation in Scotland, such grant shall not be sealed without the special authority of the sheriff.

3. The commissary clerk shall, by a note on the document sealed, set forth that it is sealed under and in terms of the *Colonial Probates Act 1892*, and the amount of the estate in Scotland, and such note shall be dated and signed by him.

4. The ordinary fees shall be charged for examining and recording the inventory and oath; the fees chargeable for sealing probates and letters of administration shall be the same as those chargeable for granting certificates on English and Irish probates and letters of administration; and the fees chargeable for bonds of caution shall be the same as those chargeable for bonds of caution for executors dative.

AMENDED REGULATIONS AS TO THE QUALIFICATIONS AND FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS OF FORE-AND-AFT RIGGED HOME-TRADE SAILING SHIPS NOT EXCEEDING ONE HUNDRED TONS GROSS REGISTERED TONNAGE.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the conduct of examinations of persons desiring to obtain certificates of competency as masters and mates, as to the qualifications to be possessed by such persons, and for the issue of certificates of competency thereto:

And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 4th day of July, 1890, make such Regulations as aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulations Nos. 66, 67, and 68 of the "Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of July, 1890, and also to make amended Regulations in lieu thereof:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the Regulations numbered as aforesaid from the date hereinafter specified, and doth make the following amended Regulations in lieu, and to be read in substitution thereof, viz:—

MASTER.

66. A candidate for examination for a certificate of competency as master of a fore-and-aft rigged home-trade sailing ship not exceeding 100 tons gross registered tonnage must be not less than twenty years of age, and must have served five years at sea as a deck hand in sailing vessels of not less than 15 tons gross registered tonnage, and must prove that he has served in such capacity at least twelve months within the three years immediately preceding the date of his application to be examined.

67. A candidate will first be examined as to his ability to accurately distinguish colours, and he must subsequently pass an examination in navigation and seamanship as set forth in the following regulation.

68. *Examination.*—He must write a legible hand, and have a knowledge of notation and the first four rules of arithmetic. He must be able to take a bearing by compass, and be conversant with the use of Mercator's chart, and be able to find on either a true or magnetic chart the course to steer and the distance from one given position to another to find the ship's position on the chart from cross bearings of two objects; from two bearings of the same object, the course and distance run between taking the bearings being given; and also the distance of the ship from the object at the time of taking the second bearing; and he must be able to properly keep a ship's log. He must give satisfactory answers as to the management of fore-and-aft rigged home-trade sailing vessels under all conditions of weather, and as to the dunnaging and stowing of cargo generally. He must have a thorough knowledge of the rule of the road as regards both steam-ships and sailing vessels, their regulation lights and fog and sound signals. He must be able to describe the signals of distress and the signals to be made by ships wanting a pilot, and the liabilities and penalties incurred by the misuse of such signals. He must be able to mark and use the lead and log lines. He must also understand the use and management of the rocket apparatus in the event of his vessel being stranded. He must also have a knowledge of the character of the lights and dangers within the limits of the home trade, and answer any questions appertaining to the duties of a master of a fore-and-aft rigged home-trade sailing ship not exceeding 100 tons gross registered tonnage which the examiner may consider necessary to put to him.

These Regulations shall form portion of the "Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1893, on which date Regulations 66, 67, and 68, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board, held this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

WHEREAS by the *Justices Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time after the passing of the said Act make, and when made, rescind, alter, and add to rules in relation to the matters in the said Act mentioned: And whereas it is necessary to make further rules with regard to persons suing and being sued in a representative capacity and for other purposes: Now therefore I, the Governor in Council aforesaid, do hereby make the following rules (that is to say):—

Trustees, &c., may sue and be sued without joining persons beneficially interested.

Trustees, executors, and administrators may sue and be sued on behalf of or as representing the property or estate of which they are trustees or representatives; but the Court of Petty Sessions may at any stage of the proceedings for the purpose of protecting the interest of the persons possessing the equitable right to the property, the legal estate of which is vested in such trustees, executors, or administrators, or any of them, and either upon the application of any party or any person possessing the equitable right not a party, or without any application order any of such persons to be made parties to the complaint either in addition to or in lieu of such trustees, executors, or administrators, or any of them.

Order that distress shall be levied on the goods of testator, &c.

Where an order is made by a Court of Petty Sessions against any person as an executor, administrator, trustee, or assignee, such order shall be that the debt or damage and costs or costs only (as the case may be) shall be levied of the goods of the testator's, intestate's, or insolvent's estate (as the case may be.)

Professional costs.

Notwithstanding anything in rule number 29, made on the 4th day of August, 1890, no defendant shall be liable to pay the sum of Ten shillings therein mentioned for professional costs unless the name and address of the legal practitioner who has prepared and obtained the summons are written or printed on the summons served on the defendant.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART III., MILITIA FORCES.—SECTION II., REGULATIONS.

Paragraph 12 is hereby cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

"12. *Monthly attendance at parades.*—Every member of the Force shall attend in each month at least two parades or drills, of which one shall be a daylight parade, except in June, July, and August, when they will be evening parades. Any member of the Force failing to attend the required number of parades or drills in any month, unless on leave, shall be at the end of each month deemed to have been absent without leave within the meaning of these Regulations."

Paragraph 19 is hereby cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

"19. *Parades, whole-day or half-day.*—Whole-day parades will be ordered by the Commandant, who shall call at least four of such in each year on public holidays. Half-day parades shall be held on half holidays, and will be ordered by Commanding Officers; but no half-day parades shall be called during the months of June, July, and August, and not more than three (3) shall be called during any other month of the year (except for musketry practice) without the sanction of the Commandant."

PART VI., RESERVES.—SECTION II., MILITIA RESERVE.

Paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, and 7 are hereby cancelled, and the following are substituted therefor:—

"1. *First-class reserve, how composed.*—The Militia Reserve will consist of (a) all members of the Militia passed to the Reserve after completing three years' service in the ranks, and (b) of such men now serving in the Reserve, or who may now or hereafter be serving in the Militia, who have been effective in the Militia for a period of not less than one year as 'trained soldier,' and elect to join it, provided that they are recommended by their Commanding Officer and approved by the Commandant. Every member shall receive a retaining fee, the amount being determined by the number of parades set forth in para. 2; but in no case will he be entitled to payment for attending more parades than are fixed therein. This amount shall be due on the 1st July annually, provided that he has been classed as effective in the Reserve on the 30th June preceding.

"2. *Effectiveness and pay.*—A member of the Militia Reserve, in order to be classed as effective and to be entitled to pay, must attend four days at the annual training, and three half-day parades, and three night drills; or if he does not attend the four days training, twelve half-day parades, and three night drills, and must undergo the course of gunnery or musketry as prescribed by the Commandant. The necessary attendances for such course to be included in the above parades. The rate of pay for whole-day and half-day parades and night drills shall be the same as laid down for the Militia Active List from time to time.

"3. *Bonus for attendance at annual training.*—Members of this Reserve who are classed as effective will receive an additional sum of 10s. as bonus if they shall have attended the four days' annual (or Easter) training.

"4. *Musketry and gunnery courses, when dispensed with.*—The courses of musketry and gunnery may be dispensed with in the case of men joining the Reserve who have undergone the ordinary course with their corps during the year.

"7. *Fine for non-effectives.*—Any member of the Reserve failing to become effective shall be liable to be fined 15s., and to be discharged."

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Kiata Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE KIATA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

1. All the charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.
3. Order for interment to be given at the office of the trustees on the previous day, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
4. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under the direction of the surveyor or other officer, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
5. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
6. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.
7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contain the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
8. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
10. No burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary before the funeral enters the cemetery.
11. Any public grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees, as per scale of charges.
12. In the case of it being desired to exhume any body, the same shall only be done on the production, at the office of the trustees, of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and at such hours and on the payment of such charges as the trustees may determine.
13. In case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery or burial ground, a verified copy of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf must be produced at the office of the trustees and the usual fees paid before such re-interment.
14. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
15. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
16. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.
17. No person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.
18. No person other than the owner or his agent duly authorized in writing shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatsoever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the trustees.
19. The secretary or other officer so directed shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

20. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

21. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected there; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

22. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

23. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

24. The rules and regulations shall commence and take effect on and after their publication in the *Government Gazette*.
