INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

**W**HEREAS by section 39 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1200) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make regulations for the purposes therein specified: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is further enacted that after the first meeting of the Country Fire Brigades Board all regulations as to any country fire district shall be prepared by such Board and submitted to the Minister for approval prior to being made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Regulations following have been prepared by the Country Fire Brigades Board, and submitted to the Minister for approval in the manner provided by the now in part recited Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations made by Order in Council of the 28th day of April, 1892, that is to say:—

ALTERATIONS IN REGULATIONS.

*For ensuring discipline and good conduct amongst members of brigades, and for ensuring their speedy attendance with engines, fire escapes, and all necessary apparatus and implements on the occasion of any alarm of fire, and generally for the maintenance of brigades in a due state of efficiency.*

SUPERINTENDENT OF DIVISION.

Clause 12 is rescinded.

DUTIES AT FIRES.

In clause 17 the word "superintendent" is excised.

PRACTICES.

In clause 19 the word "superintendent" is excised.

CORRESPONDENCE, RETURNS, AND REPORTS.

In clause 23 the item "Monthly Report of Inspections to be furnished by Superintendent on the 1st of each month" is excised from the list of returns, forms, and reports to be furnished to the Country Board.

*For dividing the metropolitan district, or any country district, into sections or divisions, and for establishing stations and companies or divisions of brigades.*

BRIGADES TO HAVE DEFINED DISTRICTS.

In clause 2 the words "superintendent of the division" are rescinded, and the words "chief officer" are substituted therefor.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS

*For prescribing the uniforms to be worn by the various grades and classes of firemen when on duty.*

UNIFORMS.

The working uniforms of registered firemen will be provided by the Country Board, and shall consist of a coat, belt, hose spanner, and cap, for brigades classed A, B, C, and D, and in addition to these articles a helmet will be provided for each member of brigades classed E, F, G, H, I, and J.

The four principal officers of brigades classed A, B, C, and D will be furnished with helmets as well as caps. All ranks will require to supply their own trousers, which must be of the regulation pattern mentioned hereafter.

**Coat.**—To be made of stout scarlet cloth (with the exception of the Ballarat City and Sandhurst No. 1 Brigades and Geelong Salvage Company, which are to be made of stout blue cloth), double-breasted, extra long reefer, with turned-down collar. Four brass buttons about 6 inches apart to be sewn on each side of coat, and each button to bear the impressed design of a cross with five stars therein over the letters C.F.B. in script characters.

**Officers' coats** to be of the same quality cloth and pattern as the men's.

**Chief officer's coat** to be of a dark-blue cloth, but single-breasted, and somewhat similar in pattern. To be braided in front and back and hooked.

**Trousers.**—To be provided by all ranks themselves. To be made of a dark-blue or black stout woollen material, the outer seams to be piped with scarlet piping or a stripe of scarlet cloth, the piping or cloth to be the width the brigade may decide, but it must be uniform for the men in any one brigade.

**Peak Caps.**—The caps worn by all ranks to be made of scarlet cloth, the material and shade to be the same as the coats, with braiding on seams and sides, French or American army pattern. The caps worn by firemen to have single stripes of white braid; those worn by officers under the rank of lieutenant to have double stripes of white braid; and those worn by captains and lieutenants to have double stripes of gold lace braiding.

The chief officer's cap to be of a similar pattern and design, with double stripes of gold lace braiding, and the letters C.O.C.F.B. worked in gold lace in front.

**Badges.**—All ranks will wear a cloth badge on the left arm of the coat with the name of the brigade and the rank held. A badge somewhat similar in pattern to be worn by all ranks in the shape of an armlet when attending fires not in regulation uniform. The badge to be carried ready for use when engaged in civil pursuits. Captains and lieutenants will wear a pair of scale epaulettes of brass, one on each shoulder, which they are required to supply themselves. The chief officer will wear the letters C.O.C.F.B. on shoulder-straps of coat.

**Helmets.**—The four principal officers in brigades classed A, B, C, and D will wear leather helmets, and all ranks in brigades classed E, F, G, H, I, and J will wear similar leather helmets.

GENERAL.

The uniforms are to be kept perfectly plain and free from ornaments, and no additions or alterations of any description will be allowed to be made to any part of the uniforms without the consent of the Country Board having been previously obtained. Any fireman infringing this regulation will be severely dealt with.

All ranks when turning out to regulation practices will do so fully uniformed with the articles supplied by the Board. Captains must see that the uniforms are properly cared for by the officers and men.

Receipts must be obtained in duplicate from each fireman for the uniform supplied to him, one to be sent to the chief officer for filing at head quarters, and the other to be retained by the brigade.

Firemen are expected to use every reasonable care in preserving the uniforms; but any damage other than that unavoidably caused at a fire or regulation practice or parade will have to be made good by the fireman.

The uniforms are only lent to brigades, therefore every fireman must return the articles supplied to him when leaving the brigade or district, or on demand at any time by the captain of his brigade or the chief officer of Country Fire Brigades, and deliver them to the said captain or chief officer, as the case may be; failing doing so within seven days from date of demand, the fireman or person withholding the uniforms shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5), and shall in addition to the penalties named herein be further liable for and shall pay the cost of the uniform.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
