GRANT OF £135 AS A REWARD FOR AN IMPROVED MACHINE FOR DIGGING POTATOES.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the grant of One hundred and thirty-five pounds as a reward for an improved machine for digging potatoes.

1. A sum not exceeding One hundred and thirty-five pounds (£135) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved machine for digging potatoes.
2. The reward shall be payable only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall more efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform the work of digging, lifting from the ground without bruising or cutting, and place in rows or heaps potatoes ready for bagging.
3. Such machine must be an improvement on any machine for the same purpose which has been used in Australia. It must also be of easy draught and the construction sufficiently simple to readily admit of adjustment and repairs. The cost must be within the means of any ordinary farmer.
4. One or more trials shall be made of the machine at such place or places, and at such times, as the Minister may direct.
5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.
6. The Minister of Agriculture may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines.
7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and thirty-five pounds (£135), to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.
8. Persons intending to compete must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture not later than the 30th November, 1893.

TO OFFICERS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE WHO ARE COMMISSIONERS OF THE SUPREME COURT FOR TAKING AFFIDAVITS.

THE subjoined Circular, directed by the Honorable the Chief Justice, is published for the information of officers concerned :-

Prothonotary's Office,
Melbourne, 1st August, 1893.

SIR,—I am directed by the Honorable the Chief Justice to inform you that it is, in his opinion, undesirable that officers in the Public Service who are Commissioners of the Supreme Court for taking affidavits should be permitted to accept and retain fees for affidavits relating to matters with which it is the officer's duty to deal, or in regard to which he has any quasi-judicial discretion or functions.

The Chief Justice therefore directs that no Commissioner now appointed, or who may hereafter be appointed, being an officer of the Public Service or holding any appointment under the Government, shall charge or accept for his own use and benefit any fee for taking any oath, declaration, or affirmation, or marking any exhibit intended or proposed to be used in any matter over which such officer has *quasi-judicial control*, or in regard to which he has *any judicial functions or duties to discharge*.

It has further been brought to the Chief Justice's notice that it is undesirable for Commissioners who are officers of the Public Service to make any charge to or accept any fee from any officer of Customs, member of the Police Force, or any other officer or person in or for the Public Service acting in the execution of his official duty, or for or on behalf of Her Majesty, for any oath, declaration, or affirmation, or for marking any exhibit intended or proposed to be used on the Public Service.

Commissioners who are members of the Public Service will therefore be good enough to take notice accordingly, and, notwithstanding any contrary inference which it is understood some Commissioners have drawn from the wording of the circular of the 30th May, 1890, abstain from charging or accepting fees under such circumstances.

His Honour has directed that in future any instance of a Commissioner acting in contravention of this intimation shall be brought under his notice.

THE lights and beacons to lead in over the bar, lead across with a minimum depth at low water of $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet. The tidal signals exhibited give the depth of water across the bar on this lead.

In addition to the above-mentioned original lead, which is continued, the south channel has been marked and lighted, carrying a depth of $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet at low water. These marks are as follows:—

An obelisk beacon—white with red top—placed on outer beach 240 feet S. 61° E. from light-house. Two triangular white beacons with vertical black stripe in centre placed on the sands off the North Head.

Directions to enter.—Bring the obelisk and light-house in line, bearing N. 61° W., and steer in, passing a red buoy on the star-board hand, until the triangular beacons bearing about N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. are in line; keep the latter in line, passing a black buoy on the port hand, until the beacons of the "Bar Lead," bearing S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., are in line, when they are to be kept so, and a vessel will proceed as usual.

By night a red light is shown from the obelisk beacon, which is to be kept in line with the main light at the lighthouse until the lights on the triangular beacons, the nearer of which is a red light, are in line. The latter will then be kept in line until the white lights of the Bar Lead are in line, when a vessel will proceed as usual.

By using this channel 2 feet more water will be carried than in the old straight lead over the bar, but mariners are cautioned that the leads take a vessel close to the outer beach, and that great care must be exercised to avoid getting to the westward of the second lead.

RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION No. 6.

Regulation for graduated rate by the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under the *Water Act 1890*.

WHEREAS the moneys received during the year 1892 by the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust were not sufficient to provide for the payment of the sums due by such Trust to the Board of Land and Works for the payment of the interest due upon the loan contracted by such Trust, and for all the other lawful expenses incurred by such Trust in the control and management of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

And whereas it is anticipated that the moneys receivable by the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust during the year 1893 will not, without a rate, be sufficient to meet the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the said Trust of the year 1893, and it is therefore necessary to make a rate to meet as well the said deficiency in the revenue of the year 1892 as the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the year 1893.

And whereas by an Order made by the Governor in Council on the 28th day of April, 1892, the district of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was divided into three divisions numbered and named in the said Order:—

1. The No. 1 Division,
2. The No. 2 Division,
3. The No. 3 Division,

with the several boundaries to such divisions set out in the said Order.

And by the said Order in Council it is directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the construction and maintenance of their works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied differentially as between such said divisions, and to determine that the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the works constructed, wholly or in part, for the benefit of such divisions respectively, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

That the respective rating in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said divisions shall be—

The No. 1 Division ...	One shilling.
The No. 2 Division ...	Sixpence.
The No. 3 Division ...	Sixpence.

And whereas the Commissioners of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust have, in accordance with the said recited Order in Council, determined for the several purposes authorized in the said Act to make the rate set out in the following Regulation, and have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, submitted such rate and regulation for the approval of the Governor in Council, who has, by Order in Council made on the 28th day of April, 1893, given his approval to same, and such approval was published on the 6th day of May, 1892, in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

Now, therefore, the Commissioners of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers, and for the several purposes authorized by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the Order in Council of the 28th day of April, 1892, do, upon this 6th day of March, 1893, make the Regulation to which the Governor in Council has given his approval by Order in Council as above recited by the Regulation following, that is to say:—

The rate hereinafter specified is that which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the aforesaid divisions shall pay in respect of the term of one year from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December, 1893, on all lands and

tenements according to the municipal valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements during the said year, that is to say:—

On rateable property within the No. 1 Division, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of such valuation.

On rateable property within the No. 2 Division, a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

On rateable property within the No. 3 Division, a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the 1st day of January, 1893, and shall be payable on the 1st day of May, 1893.

Such person or persons appointed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to collect and recover said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 6, was made by the Commissioners of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 6th day of March, 1893.

RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

REGULATION No. 7.

1. The Regulation made by the Trust on the 8th day of October, 1890, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of January, 1891, and numbered 2, is hereby repealed.

2. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land may be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges, of form and pattern approved by the Trust, and fixed under the direction and to the satisfaction of the officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

3. No irrigation outlet or other outlet from any of the Trust's channels or works shall be constructed until the owner of the land to be supplied from such outlet has entered into an agreement with the Trust for the purchase of water sufficient to pay for the construction of such outlet in two years.

4. Every outlet required shall be constructed by the Trust except as hereinafter provided, and the cost of such outlet shall be borne by the owner of the land in the manner provided for in the last preceding clause.

5. Every outlet used for irrigation purposes shall have a proper gauge fixed therein to indicate the quantity of water passing through such outlet.

6. Any person who shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without the written authority and (in that case) without the supervision of its authorized officer, or in any manner other than that authorized by such officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre; and one inch on an acre shall be deemed to be 4,000 cubic feet of water measured by the gauge.

8. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a lesser quantity of water than is equal to the value of One pound; and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

9. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities on which it will be delivered to him.

10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authority of the Trust or of its engineer or any person acting under his instructions.

11. Any person not being duly authorized as in the last preceding clause who shall open any irrigation outlet, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

12. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust or waste or defile the water contained therein, and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

13. In the event of the Trust being unable from failure of the works or from any other cause to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage which may have been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

14. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding for any offence the sum of Five pounds.

RATING REGULATION No. 5.

REGULATION for the making of a Rate, under section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made payable for the year 1893, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1893, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1893.

2. Such rate is made payable on the 1st day of August, 1893.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and recover the said rate.

REGULATION No. 6.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The form of measurement shall be determined by the Trust.

2. Every outlet required in addition to those provided free of cost by the Trust shall be borne by the occupier of the land.

3. Any person who shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without the written authority of the Trust, and in that case without the supervision of the authorized officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

4. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by gravitation from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes, which shall include the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, and gardens, unless a garden irrigation right is taken out, shall be—for crops of all kinds and of fallow land, for each watering Fourpence per inch per acre or any fractional part of an acre, and 2 inches shall be deemed a watering; for the irrigation of grass land by gravitation water, Threepence per inch per acre or for any fractional part of an acre, 2 inches to be deemed a watering, shall be the charge or rate for each watering. No charge shall be made for the filling of tanks by gravitation water. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by pumping from the works of the Trust, for irrigation purposes, including the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, and gardens, unless a garden irrigation right be taken out, shall be for each watering Sixpence per inch per acre or any

fractional part of an acre, and 3 inches shall be deemed a watering. Tanks when filled by water pumped shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings for each tank for each filling or partial filling.

5. *Garden Irrigation Right.*—The rate or price to be paid for the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, or gardens (for each owner or occupier may take out a garden irrigation right), for the period from the 1st day of January, 1893, to the 31st day of December, 1893, inclusive, or for any portion of the said period, shall be for water delivered either by gravitation or by pumping, for the first or one acre or any fractional part of an acre Sixpence per inch, and 40 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation; for the second acre or fractional part of an acre Sixpence per inch, and 30 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation; and for each additional acre or fractional part of an acre Sixpence per inch, and 20 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation.

6. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of gravitation water than is equal to the value of Five shillings, or of pumped water to the value of Ten shillings; and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

7. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him, whereupon, and before the delivery of the water shall be proceeded with, he shall pay to the Secretary to the Trust, or other officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose, the sum of money to which the quantity of water to be delivered to him will amount at the rate or price set forth in clauses 4 and 5 of this regulation.

8. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances, open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

9. Any person not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust who shall open any irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

10. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

11. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust, in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

12. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

13. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

Make any order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally appointing or authorizing such Trust, body, or persons;

Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust, body, or persons;

And whereas it is expedient to amend the Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1890, by which the Dry Lake Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was constituted:

NOTE.—During the second quarter of 1893 the registered births numbered 9,555, and the registered deaths 3,841; thus the former exceeded the latter by 5,714, or about 150 per cent. As compared with the corresponding quarter of 1892, the births in the quarter under notice were more numerous by 59, whilst the deaths were fewer by 225.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 18,240, but the recorded departures by sea numbered as many as 19,753, the apparent net loss by emigration being thus 1,513. Unrecorded departures, however, estimated at 1,710, being taken into account, the actual loss is found to have been greater than this, viz., 3,223.

The net increase of population during the quarter was 2,491, viz., 508 males and 1,983 females. During the previous quarter the net increase was only 455, made up by a gain of 1,208 females, less a loss of 753 males.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 12,844, viz., 9,928 of males and 2,916 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of June would have been 1,183,163, viz., 617,484 males and 565,679 females.

During the quarter the recorded arrivals from were greater than the recorded departures for New South Wales by 363 and Tasmania by 1,282. On the other hand, the recorded departures for exceeded the recorded arrivals from the United Kingdom by 1,979, Western Australia by 367, South Australia by 321, New Zealand and the South Seas by 279, Queensland by 132, and Foreign Ports by 80.

According to an official return published in New South Wales, the population of that colony is estimated to have numbered 1,211,630 on the 30th June, or 41,311 in excess of the population of Victoria at the same date.

The births of 1,242 children, viz., 646 boys and 596 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. In the month of June, 1,411 births were registered, or 169 more than, in the month under review. The births were 5 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 295 less than that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 823, viz., 458 of males and 365 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 419, or 51 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in June by 192, and exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 219. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 78 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.62, and of deaths registered 1.73.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 60.0° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 31.0° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (43.3°) was half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.2°) took place on the 30th, and the least range (5.8°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 12.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.361 inches on the 31st, and the lowest was 29.456 inches on the 21st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.926 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Rain fell on 17 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.32 inches. The average rainfall in July during the previous ten years was 2.23 inches, or about an eleventh of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 4 days during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 50 per cent. to that mortality, as against 29 per cent. in July, 1892; 33 per cent. in July, 1891; 38 per cent. in July, 1890; 37 per cent. in July, 1889; 32 per cent. in July, 1888; and 30 per cent. in July, 1887.

Forty-two deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of phthisis; two females, each aged 75, of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 75, of nephritis; a blacksmith, aged 76, of phthisis; a female, aged 76, of hemiplegia; a stereotyper and two females, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a miner, aged 76, of uremia; a gentleman, aged 73, of valvular heart disease; a gentleman, aged 78, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 79, of apoplexy; a draper, aged 79, of nephritis; a female, aged 80, of syncope; a farmer, aged 80, of concussion of brain—how caused not stated; a labourer and a widow, each aged 81, of bronchitis; a commission agent, aged 82, of syncope; a female, aged 82, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 82, of disease of bladder; a male of no occupation, aged 83, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 84, of paralysis; a female, aged 86, of pneumonia; a hairdresser, aged 87, of apoplexy; a watchman, aged 87, of disease of the heart; a labourer and a gentleman, each aged 75, two females, each aged 79, a female, aged 82, a female, aged 83, a gentleman and a female, each aged 85, a female, aged 86, a laundress, aged 87, a female, aged 90, a bootmaker, aged 93, a female, aged 96, and a male of no occupation, said to have been aged 102, of old age.

Twenty-three deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which seventeen were set down to accident, three to homicide, and three to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 15, and a female, aged 17, were passed over by railway trains; a seaman, aged 26, a carpenter, aged 27, a gentleman, aged 34, and a labourer, aged 34, died of injuries resulting from falls; two labourers and a seaman, aged 26, 36, and 45 respectively, were killed by the breaking of a jib crane; a farmer, aged 80, died of concussion of the brain—how caused not stated; a male infant, aged 9 months, was scalded to death; a female infant, aged 1 year, was poisoned by drinking kerosene; a labourer and a farmer, aged 29 and 46 respectively, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two male infants and one female infant, aged 1 month and 2 and 5 months respectively, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two male infants and one female infant, aged 1 month and 2 and 5 months respectively, were overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born male infants and one new-born female infant, who were smothered, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a gentleman, aged 24, who shot himself; a solicitor, aged 32, who cut his throat; and a carpenter, aged 53, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and sixteen deaths, or 14 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 15 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Infant Asylum, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 415, of which 232, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 183, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 163 were under one year of age, 149 were between one and two, 61 were between two and three, 32 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 408. Of these, 226, or 55 per cent., were males, and 182, or 45 per cent., were females; 35 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 33 were between sixty-five and seventy, 42 were between seventy and seventy-five, 20 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 22 were upwards of eighty.

One hundred and eighty-six deaths were set down to measles in July, as against 42 in June and 2 in May. Only 28 of these in the month under notice were from measles simply, that complaint having been complicated in 95 cases with pneumonia, in 26 with bronchitis, in 17 with congestion of the lungs, in 11 with convulsions, and in 1 case by each of the following:—Epilepsy, apoplexy, diarrhoea, pulmonary solidification, enterocolitis, spinal meningitis, nephritis, and dentition. There were 6 other cases of measles set down, not as causes of death, but as complications of complaints by which death was caused, such complaints being whooping-cough in 5 instances and syncope and septicaemia after confinement in 1 instance. Twelve deaths in all were set down to whooping-cough in July as against 4 in June, 6 deaths to scarlet fever as against 2, 3 deaths to diphtheria as against 1, but only 3 deaths to typhoid fever as against 17. Deaths from diseases of the respiratory system, of which an increase from 67 to 163 was reported last month, increased still further to 171 in the month under review.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in the first seven months of 1893, and of the four previous years:—

ROYAL VICTORIAN INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND. Incorporated 1892.

THE following are the by-laws of the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind adopted at a meeting of its subscribers, held in the Town Hall, Melbourne, on 12th September, 1892, after incorporation as required by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

BY-LAWS.

Title.

1. The Institution shall be called The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

Objects.

2. The institution shall be conducted on general protestant principles, and its objects be to impart an education of a religious, general, and industrial character to the youthful blind of the colony of Victoria, with a view of making them good citizens and self-supporting. It is not, however, an asylum for the homeless or imbecile, or an hospital for the sick, and no responsibility as to the care of these can be undertaken by the board of management.

Members and their Privileges.

3. Members shall consist of annual subscribers and life governors.

4. Every subscriber of £1 or upwards yearly shall, in the year for which such subscription is paid, be a member.

5. The following shall be entitled to life governorship, viz.:—

Donors of £20 or upwards in one sum.
Hon. treasurers of any concert or entertainment given in aid of the funds of the institution, when the net profits of such concert or entertainment shall amount to £20 or upwards.

One executor or executrix of any will by which £20 or upwards is bequeathed to the funds of the institution.

The council of any city, town, borough, or shire, or any company, club, or other association contributing £20 or upwards may nominate one of its members for life governorship.

6. Every member or life governor shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

7. Every yearly subscription shall be payable in advance, and every yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of the first payment, but no first payment shall entitle any member or life governor to a vote at any general meeting held within one month from the date of such payment.

8. Except as hereinafter provided, all members and governors shall be eligible as members of the board of management.

Meeting of Members.

9. An annual meeting of the members of the institution shall be held in Melbourne, in the month of July, at which a report of the proceedings of the previous year shall be presented, together with an audited account of receipts and disbursements, and at which the board of management, honorary officers, and auditors for the ensuing year shall be elected. Special meetings of the members may be called by resolution of the board of management, or on a requisition being made to them by not less than twenty members.

Board of Management.

10. The board of management shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and nine members, who shall be elected from the members at the annual general meeting.

11. On the second Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the board of management shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been in office for the longest time, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. If any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, or addressed to the chairman of the board of management, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the board of management, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the board of management, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, are required to go out of office.

12. The honorary officers as above specified shall hold office for one year, and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be eligible for re-election; and should vacancies occur during the year, the board of management shall fill such vacancies for the remainder of that year.

13. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the board of management, or in the profit thereof, or in work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such board provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the board shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter under the consideration of the board in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

14. The board of management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers, frame regulations for the management of the institution, the same not being repugnant to the general by-laws, present a report to the annual meetings of subscribers, and manage the institution generally.

15. The board of management shall meet for the transaction of business monthly. Four members of committee shall form a quorum. The meeting shall be held on the second Thursday of each month at Four o'clock p.m.

16. The board of management shall, at their first meeting after every annual meeting of the members, elect from amongst themselves a house committee of three, and a finance committee of three. The president, vice-presidents, and the honorary treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all committees.

House Committee.

17. The house committee shall, under the direction of the board of management, deal with matters of detail or urgency, and shall meet from time to time as necessity may occur.

18. Two members shall form a quorum.

Finance Committee.

19. The finance committee shall consist of the treasurer for the time being and two other members of the board, and shall meet before the monthly board meeting to examine all accounts and recommend their payment if correct.

Honorary Treasurer.

20. The honorary treasurer shall supervise the finances of the institution, and shall cause its moneys to be deposited in such bank as the board of management may direct, to the credit of the institution. He shall pay all accounts passed by the board by cheque on the bank, which must be countersigned by the secretary. He shall also check the vouchers of such payments from time to time.

Auditors.

21. The annual meeting in July shall elect two gentlemen, not being members of the board of management, as auditors for the ensuing year.

22. The auditors shall make a quarterly examination of the books of the institution, and shall at the close of the year examine the annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual meeting of members.

Tenders for Supplies.

23. As far as possible all articles required for the use of the institution shall be supplied by contract. Tenders for supplies shall be invited at stated periods, particulars of which shall be duly recorded in the minute book.

Superintendent and Secretary.

24. The superintendent shall live in the institution, and shall not be absent except on necessary occasions. He shall have the entire management of the scholastic and domestic arrangements, and the immediate superintendence and general control of the entire establishment. He shall engage and dismiss all servants, direct and control all paid officers and teachers, and shall have power, in cases of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any such officers, pending the decision of the board of management, and if necessary to hire temporary substitutes for officers thus suspended.

25. He shall see that the house and grounds are kept in a state of cleanliness and order, shall have all minor repairs attended to at once, and shall inspect the food of the inmates, and see that it is properly prepared, and of good quality. He shall also superintend the industrial department, and shall keep an inventory of the property of the institution and be held responsible for the whole.

26. He shall order and receive the stores and supplies as furnished by contract from the tradesmen, and shall see that they are of proper quality and quantity, and shall not suffer any waste, or allow any provisions or other property to be taken from the premises.

27. He shall conduct the correspondence, clerical and financial business of the institution, and shall cause proper and detailed accounts of its business to be kept, with such accounts and books as shall show the state of the various industrial departments, and all details relating thereto, and such other books or forms as may be from time to time required by the board of management for the development of the institution.

28. He shall arrange for the inmates to attend Divine Service, either at the institution or at some neighbouring church, every Sunday, weather permitting.

Matron.

29. The matron shall live in the house, and shall not leave it without the consent of the superintendent, and shall attend to his directions; she shall have the superintendence of the female domestics and inmates, and enforce personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to order on their part; she shall see that the girls are properly washed and clothed; she shall daily inspect all beds, and see that they are properly made and kept clean; also superintend the proper cooking of the food.

Assistant Secretary.

30. The assistant secretary shall, in all matters, act under the direction of the superintendent, and take charge of the institution in his absence. He shall keep all books and accounts, and have charge of all moneys received at the institution, which he will bank daily to its credit.

Liabilities of Officers.

31. The superintendent, and other paid officers receiving moneys, shall be required to give a policy of a guarantee society or company as security for rendering a just and true account of all moneys received by them on behalf of the institution. The premium of such policy to be paid by the institution.

32. No officer shall be responsible for any moneys not actually received by him, or be in any way answerable for the accounts, receipts, neglects, or defaults of any other officer.

Common Seal.

33. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the office of the superintendent, and shall be guarded by two different locks, the key of one to be kept by the honorary treasurer, and the other by the superintendent, and must only be opened when both are present. It shall not be affixed to any deed, instruments, or writing, except by order of the board of management, at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

Subordinate Officers, Teachers, and other Employés.

34. The subordinate officers, teachers, &c., shall carry out such duties as may from time to time be specified in the regulations, a copy of which shall be signed by each officer on his or her appointment, and shall obey the orders of the superintendent, and report to him all cases of irregularity on the part of the inmates, and generally assist him in maintaining order and discipline in the institution.

Pupils.

35. The pupils shall consist of three classes, viz.—Free, assisted, and paying.

36. Applications for admission of pupils must be made on forms supplied by the institution, and no pupil may be admitted unless the said forms have been filled up to the satisfaction of the board of management and the hon. medical officers.

37. Pupils can be received only for the current year ending 31st December next after admission. In the preceding month of November in each year renewed application must be made by their parents or guardians, when they may be re-admitted for one year if approved by the board of management. Failing such application it shall be deemed that they decline the further aid of the institution.

38. No pupil shall be admitted under the age of seven or over fifteen years, but under special circumstances it shall be competent for the board of management by resolution to receive persons over the age of fifteen years as day pupils (non-resident) in the manufacturing department for a period not to exceed five years.

39. A guarantee must be given by the parents or guardians of pupils, before admission, that they will resume charge of them whenever required to do so, which guarantee must be renewed yearly, on application for re-admission.

40. While in the institution pupils are to be under the absolute control of the board of management, and of their responsible officers, and be amenable to such discipline and punishment as may be considered necessary by them.

41. Pupils shall be retained only during good behaviour. Disorderly, disobedient, and unmanageable pupils, as well as those who are or may become mentally deficient, must make way for those likely to be benefited by the educational course.

42. In the case of all free pupils, the parents or guardians shall make a statutory declaration to the effect that owing to the poverty of their circumstances they are quite unable to contribute anything towards their support; and that such declaration shall be indorsed by two responsible persons in whom the board of management may have confidence.

43. In all cases of assisted inmates, the parents or guardians shall sign a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay more than the amount specified in the application papers, such declaration to be indorsed by two responsible persons in whom the board of management may have confidence.

44. In all cases of paying pupils parents or guardians shall give a guarantee for the quarterly payment in advance of the necessary fees.

45. In all cases parents or guardians shall provide pupils with clothing as specified in list printed in annual report.

46. Any of the inmates disobeying the orders of the superintendent, matron, or other officers, or otherwise transgressing the regulations of the institution, shall be subject to punishment, to be administered by the superintendent, with a light cane in cases of boys under sixteen, or by seclusion for a period not to exceed eight hours in any one day in cases of female pupils. Pupils over sixteen shall be dealt with as may be approved by the board of management, and in the event of continued misconduct—intemperance, &c.—the offender shall be dismissed.
