

SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

By-law No. 7.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and of every other power and authority enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Maffra, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, hereby order and direct as follows:—

- 1. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Maffra, and in allotment 39H, portion 40A, allotment D of section 40, and allotments 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, and 47, all in the parish of Bundalaguah, county of Tanjil.
- 2. Section 5 of By-law No. 1, made by the Local Board of Health of the Shire of Maffra, shall be and the same is hereby repealed as regards that portion of the Shire of Maffra to which this by-law shall apply.
- 3. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, once at least in every two weeks, shall cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, or place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such
- premises.

  4. When any person is licensed or authorized by the Council of the Shire of Maffra to remove night-soil, such person shall be employed to remove same, and no other person shall remove same; and no occupier or person having the management or control of any premises shall contract for the removal of night-soil with or permit or cause same to be removed by any unlicensed or unauthorized person.
- or unauthorized person.

  5. Every closet shall be provided by the occupier or person having the management or control of the premises on which such closet is erected with a pan, and such pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or other material to be approved of by the said council, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet; and any pan becoming useless or worn out shall be replaced by such occupier or person by a new pan.
- 6. The council may, on the recommendation of the health officer and inspector of nuisances, exempt any premises from the operation of this by-law.
- 7. If any person commits a breach of or fail to observe or perform any of the provisions of this by-law, such person shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Tenpounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for every day such offence is continued after conviction.

SIR.—I have the honour to inform you that a circular (a copy of which is enclosed herewith) has been sent to all Commissioners for Taking Affidavits who are officers of the Public Service, or who hold any appointment under the Government.

In calling the attention of the members of the legal profession to this circular, the Honorable the Chief Justice desires it to be understood that the officers referred to are and were originally appointed as such Commissioners for the convenience of the legal profession and the public, and the objectionable practice which, as the Chief Justice has been informed, has grown up of Commissioners claiming as a right to have affidavits connected with their own particular offices sworn before them is one subversive of that independence and propriety in an officer which is necessary for the proper discharge of public duty.

It is of course intended that any officer may take any affidavit which does not fall within his consideration judicially or quasi-judicially.

SIB,—I am directed by the Honorable the Chief Justice to inform you that it is, in his opinion, undesirable that officers in the Public Service who are Commissioners of the Supreme Court for Taking Affidavits should be permitted to accept and retain fees for affidavits relating to matters with which it is the officer's duty to deal, or in regard to which he has any quasi-judicial discretion or functions.

The Chief Justice therefore directs that no Commissioner now appointed, or who may hereafter be appointed, being an officer of the Public Service or holding any appointment under the Government, shall charge or accept for his own use and benefit any fee for taking any oath, declaration, or affirmation, or marking any exhibit intended or proposed to be used in any matter over which such officer has quasi-judicial control, or in regard to which he has any judicial functions or duties to discharge.

which he has any judicial functions or duties to discharge.

It has further been brought to the Chief Justice's notice that it is undesirable for Commissioners who are officers of the Public Service to make any charge to or accept any fee from any officer of Customs, member of the Police Force, or any other officer or person in or for the Public Service acting in the execution of his official duty, or for or on behalf of Her Majesty, for any oath, declaration, or affirmation, or for marking any exhibit intended or proposed to be used on the Public Service.

Commissioners who are members of the Public Service will therefore be good enough to take notice accordingly, and, not-withstanding any contrary inference which it is understood some Commissioners have drawn from the wording of the circular of the 30th May, 1890, abstain from charging or accepting fees under such circumstances.

His Honour has directed that in future any instance of a Commissioner acting in contravention of this intimation shall be brought under his notice.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Defences and Discipline Act 1890 it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, after, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and addition to the Financial and Store Regulations of the Defence Department (that is to say):—

The rates of pay and number of drills set down for the Ambulance Corps, and published in the Government Gazette No. 86, of the 23rd June, 1883, are hereby cancelled.

To Rates of Pay (General) for Artillery, Field Company of Engineers, and Infantry, published in the Government Gazette as aforesaid, add "Ambulance Corps."

PART VII., STORES.—SECTION I., GENERAL REGULATIONS, ORDNANCE STORES.

After para. 166, add the following:-

166A. When Government rifles or carbines have become damaged or unserviceable in any other way than by fair wear and tear, or have been lost through negligence, the corps or person responsible will be required to pay the cost of the same, allowance being made according to the period during which the arm has been on intro-

The life of a rifle or carbine will be fixed at ten years' constant issue. During the first two years no allowance will be made, but for each successive year during which the arm has been in use one-tenth of the cost of repairs will be allowed; for example, if the damage has occurred at the end of the third year of issue seven-tenths of the cost of repair will be charged, and so on until completion of the tenth year, after which the cost will be borne by the State.

When a new barrel has been fitted, the rifle will be considered as new from the date of re-issue.

If in the opinion of the Commandant culpable negligence shall It in the opinion of the Commandant chipaole negligence shall be proved in the case of arms on issue, it shall be in his power to order the full or any proportionate value to be paid irrespective of the ago of the weapon, but not less than half price will be charged for any article wilfully or carelessly lost or damaged, although it may have been in use for the prescribed period of

Tampering with arms, such as filing sights, using on them or any part of them emery or other forbidden substances, will be considered culpable negligence and will be charged for accord-

WHEREAS by the 47th section of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, numbered 1091, it is enacted that any municipal council may, if it think fit, from time to time make, alter, and repeal by-laws in and for the municipality for, inter alia, permitting shops of any particular class (not included in the third schedule to the said Act), on obtaining a licence to keep open after the hours in the said Act mentioned, and during such hours as shall be specified in such licence, provided that a petition certified to by the municipal clerk as being signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within the municipal district shall have been previously presented to such municipal council. ### BY-LAW No. 76.

A By-law of the City of Ballaarat, made under section 191 of the Local Government Act 1830, and numbered 76, for regulating the Traffic and the Hours during which and conditions on which Traction and Locomotive Engines and Rollers impelled by Steam or Electricity may proceed over any road within the City Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat order as follows:—

1. The proprietor shall provide a man to go ahead of each engine with a red flag by day and a red light by night, to warn traffic at each crossing, also to notice and warn the driver of any horses in vehicles standing in street without protection.

2. That engine shall stop at crossings until any near traffic

2. That engine shall stop at crossings until any near traffic shall be cleared.

3. That engine shall pull to near side of street and stop until any funeral or public procession shall pass.

4. The name and address of owner to be printed in legible letters on some conspicuous place on near side of engine.

5. The engine shall be allowed to travel over all streets in the city except the following, viz.:—

Lydiard-street, between railway and Dana-street.

Armstrong-street, between Mair and Dana streets.

Doveton-street, between Mair and Dana streets.

Drummond-street, between Macarthur and Dana streets.

Sturt-street, between Grenville and Ascot streets.

Wendource parade or road right around the lake.

6. The engine shall not travel on the Tramways Company's line or track or on 18 inch parallel outside the rails, but may cross it when necessary at right angles.

7. Engines may cross any of the prohibited streets when necessary, but must adhere to the rules of warning traffic before doing so.

doing so.

8. The engine whistle must not be used within any of the streets.

9. Engines with farm produce to be allowed to go in and stand in the City Hay Market between the hours of Five p.m. and Seven a.m., but shall not be allowed within the Hay Market between the hours of Seven a.m. and Five p.m. 10. Engines with any other loading than farm produce, or without loading, not to be allowed within the City Hay Market at any time without special permission from the mayor.

11. The mayor shall have power to grant special permission for engines to travel over any of the prohibited streets.

12. Any person offending against this by-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

13. That no bridge shall be used except that at Mair-street and Sunny Corner.

13. That no bridge shall be used except that at main-screec and Sunny Corner.

14. That no engine shall draw more than three trucks or waggons, the aggregate weight of which must not exceed twenty (20) tons.

15. That a licence-fee of Ten pounds (£10) per annum shall be paid for each engine used on the streets of the City Municipality.

THE following are the by-laws of the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind adopted at a meeting of its subscribers, held in the Town Hall, Melbourne, on 12th September, 1892, after incorporation as required by the provisions of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1890.

By-Laws.

Title. 1. The Institution shall be called The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

Objects.

2. The institution shall be conducted on general protestant principles, and its objects be to impart an education of a religious, general, and industrial character to the youthful blind of the colony of Victoria, with a view of making them good citizens and self-supporting. It is not, however, an asylum for the homeless or imbecile, or an hospital for the sick, and no responsibility as to the care of these can be undertaken by the board of management.

Members and their Privileges.

3. Members shall consist of annual subscribers and life governors.

4. Every subscriber of £1 or upwards yearly shall, in the year for which such subscription is paid, be a member,

5. The following shall be entitled to life governorship, viz.:—

Donors of £20 or upwards in one sum.

Hon. treasurers of any concert or entertainment given in aid of the funds of the institution, when the net profits of such concert or entertainment shall amount to £20 or upwards.

upwards.
One executor or executrix of any will by which £20 or upwards is bequeathed to the funds of the institution.
The council of any city, town, borough, or shire, or any company, club, or other association contributing £20 or upwards may nominate one of its members for life

governorshp.

6. Every member or life governor shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

7. Every yearly subscription shall be payable in advance, and every yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of the first payment, but no first payment shall entitle any member or life governor to a vote at any general meeting held within one month from the date of such payment.

8. Except as hereinafter provided, all members and governors shall be eligible as members of the board of management.

### Meeting of Members.

9. An annual meeting of the members of the institution shall be held in Melbourne, in the month of July, at which a report of the proceedings of the previous year shall be presented, together with an audited account of receipts and disbursements, and at which the board of management, honorary officers, and auditors for the ensuing year shall be elected. Special meetings of the members may be called by resolution of the board of management, or on a requisition being made to them by not less than twenty members. twenty members.

#### Board of Management.

10. The board of management shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and nine members, who shall be elected from the members at the annual general meeting.

11. On the second Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the board of management shall go out of office (but may nevertheless he re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. If any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, or addressed to the chairman of the board of management, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the board of management, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the board of management, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1890, are required to go out of office.

12. The honorary officers as above specified shall hold office for one year, and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be eligible for ro-election; and should vacancies occur during the year, the board of management shall fill such vecancies for the remainder of that year.

13. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the board of management, or in the profit thereof, or in work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such board provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. 15. The board of management shall meet for the transaction of business monthly. Four members of committee shall form a quorum. The meeting shall be held on the second Thursday of each month at Four o'clock p.m.

16. The board of management shall, at their first meeting after every annual meeting of the members, elect from amongst themselves a house committee of three, and a finance committee of three. The president, vice-presidents, and the honorary treasurer shall be exofficio members of all committees.

### House Committee.

17. The house committee shall, under the direction of the board of management, deal with matters of detail or urgency, and shall meet from time to time as necessity may occur.

18. Two members shall form a quorum.

### Finance Committee.

19. The finance committee shall consist of the treasurer for the time being and two other members of the board, and shall meet before the monthly board meeting to examine all accounts and recommend their payment if correct.

### Honorary Treasurer.

20. The honorary treasurer shall supervise the finances of the institution, and shall cause its moneys to be deposited in such bank as the board of management may direct, to the credit of the institution. He shall pay all accounts passed by the board by cheque on the bank, which must be countersigned by the secretary. He shall also check the vouchers of such payments from time to time.

23. As far as possible all articles required for the use of the institution shall be supplied by contract. Tenders for supplies shall be invited at stated periods, particulars of which shall be duly recorded in the minute book.

### Superintendent and Secretary.

Superintendent and Secretary.

24. The superintendent shall live in the institution, and shall not be absent except on necessary occasions. He shall have the entire management of the scholastic and domestic arrangements, and the immediate superintendence and general control of the entire establishment. He shall engage and dismiss all servants, direct and control all paid officers and teachers, and, shall have power, in cases of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any such officers, pending the decision of the board of management, and if necessary to hire temporary substitutes for officers thus suspended.

25. He shall see that the house and grounds are kept in a state of cleanliness and order, shall have all minor repairs attended to at once, and shall inspect the food of the immates, and see that it is properly prepared, and of good quality. He shall also superintend the industrial department, and shall keep an inventory of the property of the institution and be held responsible
