I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to provide for the establishment of Village Communities, Homestead Associations, and Labour Colonies.”

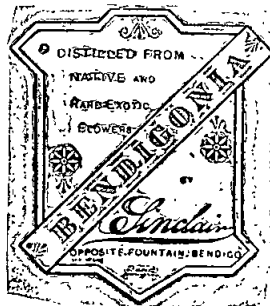

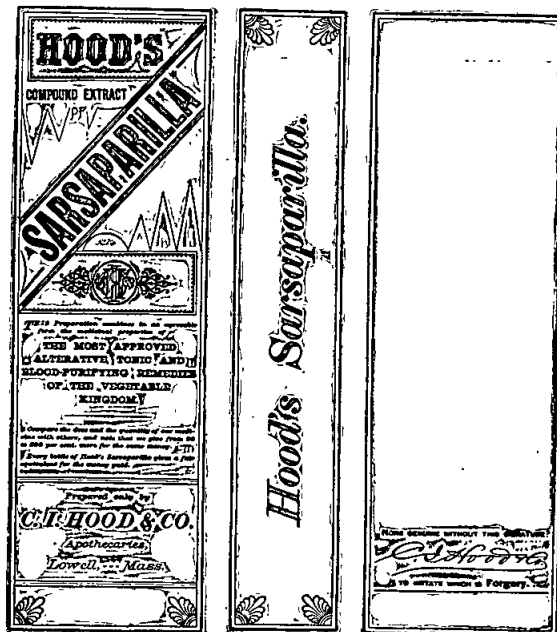

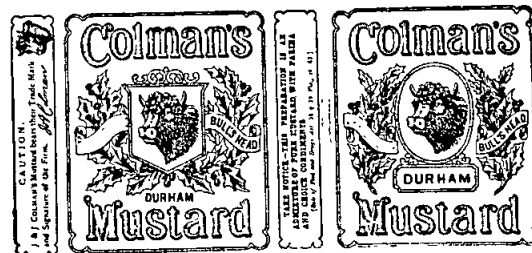

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1082) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind such regulations as may be necessary or expedient for the carrying out of the provisions of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation No. 3 of the Regulations made under the said Part of the said Act, and bearing date the 3rd day of February, 1891, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, such rescission and such new Regulation to take effect on and after the 1st day of September, 1893 (that is to say):—

3. Any person desirous of manufacturing tobacco in quantities not exceeding Fifty thousand pounds weight annually must make application in writing to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the approval and appointment of premises as a tobacco factory, ground plan and full description of which must accompany such application. A bond in the sum of Five hundred pounds, or five separate bonds in the sum of One hundred pounds each, must be executed by the proprietor or occupier of such tobacco factory, together with two sufficient sureties, to be approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, for the security of the duty due on any tobacco which may be deposited in such factory, and for the due and faithful observance of the terms, conditions, and requirements of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, and of the regulations now in force or hereafter to be made thereunder. An annual fee of Five pounds, payable quarterly in advance, shall be paid by the proprietor or occupier of such tobacco factory to the Collector of Customs, Melbourne, or other person appointed to receive the same.

And the Honorable James Campbell, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Drawback Regulations and Schedules thereto, the full amount of duty paid may be allowed as drawback on the exportation of goods subject to *ad valorem* duty mentioned in such Schedules, provided that the provisions of Regulation No. 2, Clause C, be complied with.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

ROYAL VICTORIAN INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND.
Incorporated 1892.

THE following are the by-laws of the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind adopted at a meeting of its subscribers, held in the Town Hall, Melbourne, on 12th September, 1892, after incorporation as required by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

BY-LAWS.

Title.

1. The Institution shall be called The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

Objects.

2. The institution shall be conducted on general protestant principles, and its objects be to impart an education of a religious, general, and industrial character to the youthful blind of the colony of Victoria, with a view of making them good citizens and self-supporting. It is not, however, an asylum for the homeless or imbecile, or an hospital for the sick, and no responsibility as to the care of these can be undertaken by the board of management.

Members and their Privileges.

3. Members shall consist of annual subscribers and life governors.

4. Every subscriber of £1 or upwards yearly shall, in the year for which such subscription is paid, be a member.

5. The following shall be entitled to life governorship, viz.:-
Donors of £20 or upwards in one sum.

Hon. treasurers of any concert or entertainment given in aid of the funds of the institution, when the net profits of such concert or entertainment shall amount to £20 or upwards.

One executor or executrix of any will by which £20 or upwards is bequeathed to the funds of the institution.
The council of any city, town, borough, or shire, or any company, club, or other association contributing £20 or upwards may nominate one of its members for life governorship.

6. Every member or life governor shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

7. Every yearly subscription shall be payable in advance, and every yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of the first payment, but no first payment shall entitle any member or life governor to a vote at any general meeting held within one month from the date of such payment.

8. Except as hereinafter provided, all members and governors shall be eligible as members of the board of management.

Meeting of Members.

9. An annual meeting of the members of the institution shall be held in Melbourne, in the month of July, at which a report of the proceedings of the previous year shall be presented, together with an audited account of receipts and disbursements, and at which the board of management, honorary officers, and auditors for the ensuing year shall be elected. Special meetings of the members may be called by resolution of the board of management, or on a requisition being made to them by not less than twenty members.

Board of Management.

10. The board of management shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and nine members, who shall be elected from the members at the annual general meeting.

11. On the second Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the board of management shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. If any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, or addressed to the chairman of the board of management, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the board of management, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint

thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the board of management, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, are required to go out of office.

12. The honorary officers as above specified shall hold office for one year, and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be eligible for re-election; and should vacancies occur during the year, the board of management shall fill such vacancies for the remainder of that year.

13. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the board of management, or in the profit thereof, or in work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such board provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the board shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter under the consideration of the board in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

14. The board of management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers, frame regulations for the management of the institution, the same not being repugnant to the general by-laws, present a report to the annual meetings of subscribers, and manage the institution generally.

15. The board of management shall meet for the transaction of business monthly. Four members of committee shall form a quorum. The meeting shall be held on the second Thursday of each month at Four o'clock p.m.

16. The board of management shall, at their first meeting after every annual meeting of the members, elect from amongst themselves a house committee of three, and a finance committee of three. The president, vice-presidents, and the honorary treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all committees.

House Committee.

17. The house committee shall, under the direction of the board of management, deal with matters of detail or urgency, and shall meet from time to time as necessity may occur.

18. Two members shall form a quorum.

Finance Committee.

19. The finance committee shall consist of the treasurer for the time being and two other members of the board, and shall meet before the monthly board meeting to examine all accounts and recommend their payment if correct.

Honorary Treasurer.

20. The honorary treasurer shall supervise the finances of the institution, and shall cause its moneys to be deposited in such bank as the board of management may direct, to the credit of the institution. He shall pay all accounts passed by the board by cheque on the bank, which must be countersigned by the secretary. He shall also check the vouchers of such payments from time to time.

Auditors.

21. The annual meeting in July shall elect two gentlemen, not being members of the board of management, as auditors for the ensuing year.

22. The auditors shall make a quarterly examination of the books of the institution, and shall at the close of the year examine the annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual meeting of members.

Tenders for Supplies.

23. As far as possible all articles required for the use of the institution shall be supplied by contract. Tenders for supplies shall be invited at stated periods, particulars of which shall be duly recorded in the minute book.

Superintendent and Secretary.

24. The superintendent shall live in the institution, and shall not be absent except on necessary occasions. He shall have the entire management of the scholastic and domestic arrangements, and the immediate superintendence and general control of the entire establishment. He shall engage and dismiss all servants, direct and control all paid officers and teachers, and shall have power, in cases of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any such officers, pending the decision of the board of management, and if necessary to hire temporary substitutes for officers thus suspended.

25. He shall see that the house and grounds are kept in a state of cleanliness and order, shall have all minor repairs attended to at once, and shall inspect the food of the inmates, and see that it is properly prepared, and of good quality. He shall also superintend the industrial department, and shall keep an inventory of the property of the institution and be held responsible for the whole.

26. He shall order and receive the stores and supplies as furnished by contract from the tradesmen, and shall see that they are of proper quality and quantity, and shall not suffer any waste, or allow any provisions or other property to be taken from the premises.

Matron.

29. The matron shall live in the house, and shall not leave it without the consent of the superintendent, and shall attend to his directions; she shall have the superintendence of the female domestics and inmates, and enforce personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to order on their part; she shall see that the girls are properly washed and clothed; she shall daily inspect all beds, and see that they are properly made and kept clean; also superintend the proper cooking of the food.

Assistant Secretary.

30. The assistant secretary shall, in all matters, act under the direction of the superintendent, and take charge of the institution in his absence. He shall keep all books and accounts, and have charge of all moneys received at the institution, which he will bank daily to its credit.

Liabilities of Officers.

31. The superintendent, and other paid officers receiving moneys, shall be required to give a policy of a guarantee society or company as security for rendering a just and true account of all moneys received by them on behalf of the institution. The premium of such policy to be paid by the institution.

32. No officer shall be responsible for any moneys not actually received by him, or be in any way answerable for the accounts, receipts, neglects, or defaults of any other officer.

Common Seal.

33. 43. In all cases of assisted inmates, the parents or guardians shall sign a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay more than the amount specified in the application papers, such declaration to be indorsed by two responsible persons in whom the board of management may have confidence.

44. In all cases of paying pupils parents or guardians shall give a guarantee for the quarterly payment in advance of the necessary fees.

45. In all cases parents or guardians shall provide pupils with clothing as specified in list printed in annual report.

46. Any of the inmates disobeying the orders of the superintendent, matron, or other officers, or otherwise transgressing the regulations of the institution, shall be subject to punishment, to be administered by the superintendent, with a light cane in cases of boys under sixteen, or by seclusion for a period not to exceed eight hours in any one day in cases of female pupils. Pupils over sixteen shall be dealt with as may be approved by the board of management, and in the event of continued misconduct—intemperance, &c.—the offender shall be dismissed.
