Factories and Shops Act 1890.

for a period of three months from the 1st September inst., upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than sixty females for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

- (4) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.
- (5) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (6) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

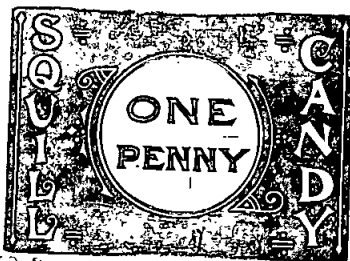

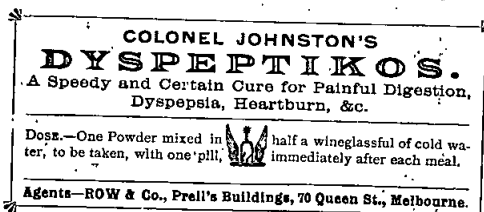

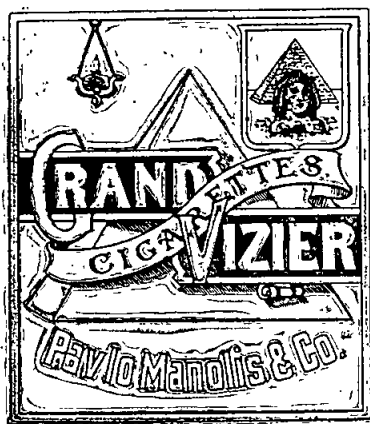

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Railways Act 1890*, do hereby make the following By-law for the issue of free passes, and all By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

The following alteration shall be made in By-law No. 111:—

For the clause of the above-mentioned By-law which reads—"Pensioners and Officers who have retired after fifteen years' service. No more than one pass to be issued in a year, nor for a longer period than fourteen days. This concession to extend to their wives, and to be available for one specified return journey only," the following shall be substituted, viz.:—

"Pensioners. No more than two passes to be issued in a year, nor for a longer period than seven days each. The concession to extend to their wives, and to be available for one specified return journey only."

*Defences and Discipline Act 1890.***VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—ALTERATION OF FINANCIAL AND STORE REGULATIONS.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of September, 1893.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Financial and Store Regulations of the Defence Department (that is to say):—

PART I., PAY OF PERMANENT FORCES.—SECTION II., PERMANENT MILITARY FORCES.—SUB-SECTION II., PERMANENT SECTION, SUBMARINE MINING COMPANY.

Para. 26, under heading "Minimum pay for Sappers," cancel "7s. per diem," and substitute "6s. per diem." Also add the following foot-note:—

"On and after the 1st September, 1893, recruits will receive pay as follows:—

On enlistment, 6s. a day.
After two years' good service, 6s. 6d. a day.
On re-engagement, 7s. a day.

PART VII., STORES.—SECTION III., ALLOWANCE OF AMMUNITION AND STORES FOR INSTRUCTIONAL PURPOSES.

To para. 190, after "Martini-Henry, Revolver, Morris-tube, and Francotte ammunition," add—

"Commanding officers, when preparing their requisitions for the year's supply, will show the amount of free ammunition unexpended from the previous year's supply remaining on hand on the 30th June, and such amount will be taken into consideration when the requisitions for the current year are being dealt with."

PART VIII., BARRACKS AND QUARTERS.—SECTION I., CARE OF BARRACKS AND QUARTERS AT MELBOURNE.

After para. 240, add—

"240A. On receiving notice from any occupant of quarters that he is about to vacate the same, the Barrack Master will have the record of the gas meter in such quarters taken, and the account rendered to the officer concerned."

And the Honorable Robert Reid, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
