IN THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, and bearing date the 4th day of September, 1893, notifying my assent, in Her Majesty's name, on the date named, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, intituled "An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of Lines of Railway from Dimboola and Boort," and do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

EXAMINATIONS OF MASTERS AND MATES.

NOTICE TO CANDIDATES AND INSTRUCTIONS TO EXAMINERS.—
COMPASS ADJUSTMENT.

THE Marine Board of Victoria directs the attention of candidates to clauses Nos. 45 and 58 of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," which require amongst other things that candidates shall "give written (and oral) answers to practical questions on the effect of the ship's iron upon the compasses, the method of determining the deviation and compensating same by magnets and soft iron"; and the said Board notifies that on and after the 1st March, 1894, all candidates for Certificates of Competency as Masters of Foreign-going Ships will be required to prove by means of a "Deviascope":—

(1) Their knowledge of the laws of the deviation and the tentative method of compass adjustment; this proof will take the place of the written answers and sketches illustrative of the question No. 19, "Examination 7" (*vide* Appendix G attached to the said Regulations).

(2) That they understand the practical application of the answers given by them to any of the other questions on Form "Examination 7" that the Examiner in the course of the examination may consider necessary.

From the same date all candidates for Extra Masters' Certificates, or for the special examination in the laws of the deviation of the compass (*vide* clause 92 of the aforesaid Regulations and Appendix H thereof) will be required to prove by means of a "Deviascope":—

(1) Their knowledge of the tentative method of compass adjustment.

(2) That they actually possess a good knowledge of what they have written, by showing that they are acquainted with the practical application of the answers given by them to any of the questions in the Compass Deviation Syllabus that the Examiner in the course of the examination may consider necessary.

In all cases where a candidate passes the examination by means of the "Deviascope" the Examiner will note the words "Passed Deviascope" on the examination papers of the candidate.

The following is a reprint of a statement of the present method of Tentative Compass Adjustment, issued by the Board of Trade and adopted by the Marine Board, as Appendix Q to "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates."

APPENDIX Q.

The Tentative Method of Compass Adjustment as generally practised by Compass Adjusters in Ships of the Mercantile Marine.

BEFORE describing the practice, it will be as well to briefly state the co-efficients used to express the different magnetic forces:—

Co-efficient A	represents a constant quantity.
" B	" semicircular deviation due to fore-and-aft magnetic forces.
" C	" semicircular deviation due to transverse magnetic forces.
" D	" quadrantal deviation due to horizontal induction in soft iron.
" E	" quadrantal deviation due to horizontal induction in soft iron unsymmetrically distributed.

Signs and Effects of Co-efficients A, B, C, D, and E.

Co-efficient A represents a constant deviation of the same nature and amount, on all points of the compass; + A signifying easterly, and - A westerly deviation.

Co-efficient + B represents an attraction towards the ship's head, and causes easterly deviations with ship's head in the eastern semicircle of the compass, and westerly deviations in the western semicircle, attaining a maximum value on the east and west points, decreasing to zero on north and south points, by compass.

Co-efficient - B represents an attraction towards the ship's stern, and causes easterly deviations with ship's head in the western semicircle, and westerly deviations with ship's head in the eastern semicircle, with a maximum value on the east and west points, decreasing to zero on the north and south points, by compass.

Co-efficient + C represents an attraction towards the starboard side of the ship, and causes easterly deviations with ship's head in the northern semicircle, and westerly deviations in the southern semicircle, attaining a maximum value on the north and south points, decreasing to zero on the east and west points, by compass.

Co-efficient - C represents an attraction towards the port side of the ship, and causes westerly deviations with ship's head in the northern semicircle, and easterly in the southern semicircle, attaining a maximum value on the north and south points, decreasing to zero on the east and west points, by compass.

Co-efficient + D gives easterly deviations with ship's head between N. and E., and S. and W.; and westerly deviations between S. and E., and N. and W.

Co-efficient - D gives results exactly the reverse to + D.

NOTE.—Both + D and - D have a maximum value on the four quadrantal points; and become zero on the cardinal points; by compass.

Co-efficient + E gives easterly deviations with ship's head between N.E. and N.W., and S.E. and S.W.; and westerly deviations between N.E. and S.E., and N.W. and S.W.

Co-efficient - E gives results exactly the reverse to + E.
NOTE.—Both + E and - E have a maximum value on the cardinal points, and become zero on the four quadrantal points, but are usually very small in amount in compasses placed in the middle line of the ship.

Heeling error.—The heeling error arises partly from vertical induction in transverse iron, and iron vertical to the ship's deck, and partly from the vertical component of the sub-permanent magnetism of the ship. In the Northern Hemisphere in the majority of cases the N. point of the compass needle is drawn to windward or the high side of the ship, with, as a rule, a maximum heeling error on N. and S. points, and zero on E. and W. points, by compass. If the compass is not properly placed in the ship there may be a sensible heeling deviation on E. and W. courses.

Tentative Corrections.

To correct co-efficient C.—With ship's head north or south, magnetic, place a bar magnet (or more than one if necessary) horizontally and exactly athwartship, either on the deck or on any convenient platform, with its centre on the fore-and-aft line passing through the centre of the compass card, placing its red or marked end to starboard if the N. point of the needle deviates to the starboard side, or to port if it deviates to the port side of the ship, moving the magnet to or from the compass until it points correctly.

NOTE.—The deviation represented by co-efficient C varies inversely as the earth's horizontal force, providing the iron is symmetrically arranged on each side of the compass.

To correct co-efficient B.—With ship's head east or west, magnetic, place a bar magnet (or more than one if necessary) horizontally and exactly parallel to the fore-and-aft midship line of the ship, either on the deck or on any convenient platform, with its centre on the athwartship line passing through the centre of the compass, the red or marked end of the magnet being directed aft if the N. point of the compass needle deviates towards the stern, or forward if it deviates towards the bow, moving the magnet to or from the compass until it points correctly.

NOTE.—The co-efficient B consists of two parts; one is due to the permanent magnetism of the ship, which varies inversely as the earth's horizontal force; the other to vertical induction in soft iron, which varies as the tangent of the dip. As ships in the merchant service are rarely built with a view of providing a satisfactory position for the standard compasses, it is very difficult in many ships to find a position for it where it will not be affected by vertical iron. It follows, therefore, that if this deviation be compensated, as is customary, by a fore-and-aft permanent magnet instead of by a vertical soft iron bar, the poles of the magnet may in some cases require to be reversed in high southern latitudes.

To correct co-efficient + D.—With ship's head on one of the quadrantal points, magnetic, the + D is generally corrected by boxes of small chain, cylinders of soft iron, or soft iron globes, placed athwartships on the same level, and at equal distances, on the port and starboard sides of the compass, with the centre of their mass on a level with the compass needle, move them to or from the compass till the needle points correctly.

To correct co-efficient - D.—Co-efficient - D, which is of very rare occurrence, is corrected by placing the above correctors on the fore and aft sides of the compass.

NOTE.—When once the co-efficient D is properly corrected by soft iron it is correct for all magnetic latitudes, provided the distribution of the iron in the ship is not materially changed, and provided the magnetism of the soft iron has not been affected by the compass needles. With short needles having small magnetic power, such for instance as Sir Wm. Thomson's, there will probably be no change, but when the needles are long and powerful, one-half the original D may be expected to return when approaching the magnetic equator. See Admiralty Manual, 1882, page 96, as follows:—"When a compass with long and powerful needles is employed, soft iron correctors placed very near it become magnetized by induction according to the power of the needles, and the resulting correction will not remain strictly perfect in all latitudes."

To correct heeling error.—The heeling error is corrected for any given magnetic latitude by placing a vertical magnet exactly under the centre of the compass card, with its N. or red pole uppermost if the heeling error is to windward or to the high side of ship, or its S. or blue end uppermost if to leeward or to the low side of ship, moving the magnet to or from the compass until the heeling error is corrected.

NOTE.—The heeling error due to the permanent part of the magnetism varies inversely as the earth's horizontal force, and consequently is greatest in high latitudes, diminishes as the ship approaches the magnetic equator, and increases again, still retaining the same name, as the ship recedes from the magnetic equator in the Southern Hemisphere. The heeling error due to transverse and vertical soft iron decreases as the ship approaches the magnetic equator, where it is zero, and is of a contrary name in the Southern Hemisphere. It is probable that the poles of the vertical magnet may require to be reversed in high southern latitudes.

A divided scale should be marked or fitted outside the tube or some other convenient place, so as to show the proper position for the correcting magnet as found in any given magnetic latitude, and the same recorded as a guide for approximately placing the magnet in position on any subsequent voyage in the same locality.

Candidates should understand that the object of tentative adjustment is to bring the deviations within manageable limits, and also to equalize the directive force of the needle so far as is practicable on all courses; but no system of adjustment whatever is sufficiently reliable in character to absolve the navigator from the necessity of using every precaution, and especially of ascertaining the deviation on every available opportunity by observations of the sun by day and the other heavenly bodies by night:

Marine Act 1890.

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNMENT OF PILOTS.

WHEREAS by section 60 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may make and alter or repeal rules and regulations for the management and government of pilots, and for the order in which they shall perform their services, and generally for all matters relative to the efficient discharge of their duties:

And whereas it is desirable to repeal Regulations Nos. 6 and 7 of the regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th June, 1890, and also Regulation No. 5, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 11th September, 1891:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the aforesaid regulations from the date hereinafter specified, and doth make the following amended regulations in lieu and to be read in substitution thereof, viz.:

Pilot Stations.—There shall be two pilot stations, namely:—The "Inner Station," which shall mean the anchorage inside Port Phillip Heads; and the "Cruising Station," which shall extend from Port Phillip Heads to a distance seawards of fifteen (15) miles from a point midway between Port Phillip Heads on a line bearing north-east by north and south-west by south, with Zealey Point bearing from the extremity of such line north-west by north and Cape Schanck east three-quarters north.

The southern boundary of the cruising station shall extend in an easterly direction from the extremity of the line as aforesaid until Arthur's Seat bears north-east a quarter north, and thence towards the shore. All bearings are magnetic.

Vessel on Cruising Station.—The respective stations shall, when practicable, be taken up by each pilot vessel in regular rotation for a period of nine (9) days; provided that at all times a pilot vessel shall be kept cruising outside Port Phillip Heads within the limits of the cruising station as hereinbefore defined.

Pilots on Cruising Station.—When first going on the "Cruising Station," the pilot vessel on duty thereat shall be supplied with a complement of six (6) pilots, and every endeavour shall be made by the company to keep up the said number of pilots on board such vessel.

These regulations shall form portion of the pilot regulations now in force and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1893, on which date Regulations Nos. 5, 6, and 7, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

The foregoing amended regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this eighth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

WHEREAS by the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations generally for carrying out the provisions contained in any Part of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.**PART I.—VILLAGE COMMUNITIES.**

1. No land containing head-races, tail-races, or channels conveying water for mining purposes shall be set aside for the purposes of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* unless such head-races, tail-races, or channels shall have been excised therefrom.
2. The Minister may appoint officers of the Public Service stewards under the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893*, whose duty it will be to keep plans of the Village Community Settlements under their charge and note thereon all applications received and granted. It will also be their duty to receive keep a record of and report upon all applications for Village Community allotments, supervise the occupation thereof, and report thereon to the Minister from time to time as may be required.
3. Applications for Village Community allotments must be made personally to the steward in charge of the settlement in which the allotment is situated, and shall be in the form "A" hereto. Each applicant shall satisfy the steward that he is a fit and proper person to hold a permit or lease.
4. The steward shall immediately on application being made as aforesaid make such inquiries from the applicant and others as he may deem necessary.
5. The steward shall forthwith note such application on his plan of the settlement referred to, and shall immediately forward the application, with his report thereon, to the Secretary for Lands.
6. On approval of an application a permit in the form "B" hereto will be issued to the applicant forthwith. The rental under such permit shall be 6d. an acre per annum payable half-yearly.
7. Monetary aid under section 32 of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* can be applied for by the permissive occupant in need of such aid on form "C" hereto, which shall be lodged with the steward of the Village Community Settlement in which the applicant holds an allotment. Such aid may be given in instalments not more frequently than once a month.
8. The steward shall forthwith forward to the Secretary for Lands the applications for cash advances, together with a report of the nature and value of the improvements upon the allotment or allotments to which such applications refer.
9. No advance will be granted for an amount exceeding the value of the "substantial improvements of a permanent character" which shall have been effected upon the allotment or allotments to which the application for such loan refers. Such advance will be forwarded in the form of a postal note payable to the applicant or applicants only.

10. Settlers on a Village Community Settlement having a committee of management for the purposes of the Act may, subject to the approval of the Board, make such rules not being inconsistent with the said Act as may be mutually agreed upon.

11. The rules so made shall be registered by the Board, and if any settler in a Village Community represented by such committee neglects to comply with or wilfully violates any of such rules, the Board may consider him as not a fit and proper person within the meaning of the Act to hold a permit or lease.

12. Advances may be made to the treasurer or secretary of such committee, and such advances shall be apportioned *pro rata* so as to be a charge upon the allotments held by the settlers represented thereby; Regulations 7, 8, and 9 shall apply thereto.

PART II.—HOMESTEAD ASSOCIATIONS.

13. Applications by any association or society for a block of land to be set apart for occupation by the members of such association or society shall be in the form "D" hereto, and shall be made to the Secretary for Lands by the secretary of such association or society. Every such application shall be accompanied by a receipt from a Receiver of Revenue for the registration fee (Two shillings and sixpence) for each member of such association or society.

14. Each member of such association or society shall be required to make application in the form "E" hereto before the issue to him of a permit to occupy any allotment.

15. At the request of the secretary of any association or society a permit to occupy in the form "B" hereto will be issued to a member of such association or society with respect to the allotment for which he has applied as aforesaid.

16. Regulations 7, 8, 9, and 10 of these Regulations shall apply to applications for advances by members of any association or society.

17. If any member of any association or society neglects to comply with or wilfully violates the rules of such association or society, the Board may consider such person as not a fit and proper person within the meaning of the Act to hold a permit or lease.

"Commanding officers, when preparing their requisitions for the year's supply, will show the amount of free ammunition expended from the previous year's supply remaining on hand on the 30th June, and such amount will be taken into consideration when the requisitions for the current year are being dealt with."

The births of 1,422 children, viz., 765 boys and 657 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. In the month of July, 1,242 births were registered, or 180 less than in the month under review. The births were 91 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 219 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 710, viz., 398 of males and 312 of females; the births thus about doubled the deaths. The deaths were fewer than those in July by 113, but exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 79. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 68.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3·00, and of deaths registered 1·50.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65·5° on the 12th, and the lowest was 33·5° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (51·4°) was 8° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26·6°) took place on the 1st, and the least range (4°) was on the 2nd. The mean daily range was 14·9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·556 inches on the 11th, and the lowest was 29·383 inches on the 29th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30·039 inches) was a fraction of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 16 days, the amount of rainfall being 1·709 inches. The average rainfall in August during the previous ten years was 1·55 inches, or about the sixth of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 42 per cent. to that mortality, as against 29 per cent. in August, 1892, 41 per cent. in 1891, 41 per cent. in 1890, 36 per cent. in 1889, 30 per cent. in 1888, and 36 per cent. in 1887.

Forty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a tailor, aged 75, died of syncope; a farmer, aged 75, of heart disease; a male of unknown occupation, aged 75, of cystitis; a carpenter, aged 75, of rheumatism; a saddler, aged 75, of apoplexy; a widow, aged 76, of rheumatic gout; a saddler, aged 76, of cancer; a gardener, aged 76, of purpura; a male of unknown occupation, aged 76, of valvular disease of the heart; a master mariner, aged 77, of diabetes; an ironmonger, aged 77, of syncope; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of bronchitis; a dealer and a labourer, each aged 77, died suddenly, the actual cause of death not being stated; a female, aged 78, died of syncope; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a clergyman, aged 79, of apoplexy; a female, aged 79, of congestion of the lungs; a sawyer, aged 79, of nephritis; a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a hatter and a missionary, each aged 81, of heart disease; a female, aged 81, of pneumonia; a female, aged 82, of apoplexy; a commercial traveller, aged 83, of paralysis; a herdsman, aged 83, of cerebral congestion; a lady, aged 84, of syncope; a labourer, aged 84, of bronchitis; a gardener and a female, each aged 86, of heart disease; a male of unknown occupation, aged 88, of fracture of the femur—how caused not stated; an ex-civil servant, aged 76, a cabinetmaker, a labourer, and a teacher, each aged 78, two females, each aged 79, a brewer, aged 80, a carpenter, a railway contractor, and three females, each aged 81, three females, aged 82, 84, and 88 respectively, a sawyer and a labourer, each aged 89, and a female, aged 94, of old age.

Twenty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which fifteen were set down to accident, four to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A cook, aged 23, died of injuries consequent on a fall; a jockey, aged 23, of injuries received whilst riding; a carrier, aged 34, of injuries to the liver and kidneys; a male of unknown occupation, aged 88, or fracture of thigh—how caused not stated; a male of no occupation, aged 62, of hæmorrhage after teeth extraction; a male infant, aged 1 month, a boy, aged 2 years, a girl, aged 6, and a carpenter, aged 59, of burns; a boy and a girl, aged 1 and 2 years respectively, of syncope caused by swallowing an unknown irritant; a boy, aged 10, a male of unknown occupation, aged 40, and a collector, aged 65, were found drowned in the River Yarra, and a painter, aged 27, in the Saltwater River. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born male and one new-born female infants, who were smothered, and a new-born female infant who was drowned, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a driver, aged 29, who drowned himself, and a commercial traveller, aged 64, who poisoned himself.

One hundred and thirty-seven deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—44 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 13 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 13 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 7 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 5 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 300, of which 170, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 130, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 147 were under one year of age, 85 were between one and two, 41 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 12 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 410. Of these, 228, or 56 per cent., were males, and 182, or 44 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 31 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 36 were between fifty-five and sixty, 38 were between sixty and sixty-five, 32 were between sixty-five and seventy, 29 were between seventy and seventy-five, 25 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 24 were upwards of eighty.

One hundred and sixteen deaths were set down to measles in August, the falling off as compared with the previous month being 70. Of the deaths from measles in the month under notice, 14 were caused by that complaint simply; whilst the measles were complicated with pneumonia in 65, bronchitis in 16, tubercular meningitis in 6, congestion of the lungs in 5, whooping-cough in 3, and gastric and typhoid fever in 3 cases; also in each of 4 cases by one or other of the following:—Phtisis, diarrhoea, convulsions, or syncope. Deaths from other miasmatic diseases also decreased in numbers in August as compared with July, viz., scarlet fever from 6 to 1, influenza from 2 to 1, whooping-cough from 12 to 7, diphtheria from 3 to 1, and typhoid fever from 3 to 2. Nine deaths of child-bearing women occurred in August, or 1 such death to every 155 births registered.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in the first eight months of 1893, and of the four previous years:—
