DESTRUCTION OF WATER-PIPES AT HESKET.

THIRTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD AND FREE PARDON TO ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS on the night of Saturday, the 22nd, or in the early morning of Sunday, the 23rd July last, ten fifteen-inch earthenware water-pipes, which were lying on Heskett boundary road at Heskett, were apparently maliciously destroyed: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Ten pounds (in addition to a Reward of Twenty-five pounds offered by the Romsey Shire Council) will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the arrest and conviction of the offender or offenders, and that His Excellency the Governor will extend Her Majesty's Free Pardon to any accomplice in the offence who will give the required information, provided the informant is not the person who actually caused the damage.

FIRE IN LITTLE MALOP-STREET, GEELONG.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.

EAST, AT JANIEMBER EAST.

WE, David Coutts, Donald Craig Laird, and William Bissett, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Janiember East, at Janiember East, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, goats, sheep, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
