EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS FOR LICENCE AS SHORTHAND WRITERS.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Macedon Waterworks Trust, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust, when the supply is not by meter, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell such water to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take and carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, or cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall lay any pipe or communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. Wrought galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No services of a longer bore than half-inch to properties valued under £25 per annum will be permitted, but those properties which are valued at £25 and over per annum will be allowed a three-quarter inch service.

7. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after receiving notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off such service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to be run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

9. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe of the Trust with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding, or supplying the same with water without first affixing such approved self-acting valves as may be directed by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of offence from the Trust. All water-troughs must be fixed with self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

10. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

11. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

12. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offenders from the payment of the water rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890* or these Regulations.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil-pipe, water-closet, or other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be used or contrived, so that the water supplied to

him by the Trust is, or is likely to be, wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation or otherwise however, or contaminated, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noisome or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. No person shall be authorized to lay service-pipes or make any fittings or connexions and attach the same to any service-pipes of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already laid and connected with the pipes of the Trust, unless he can be proved to be a competent person.

15. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to the directions of the Trust's officer, and any dispute between the parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or to the exact meaning of the general conditions of this Regulation, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

16. In the event of the Trust permitting any person to use a hose for irrigation or other purposes, he shall be required to have a meter to determine the quantity of water used, and he shall pay the Trust at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons.

17. Any person guilty of any offence against these Regulations, not otherwise specifically provided for, shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, in addition to being liable to make good any damage or loss sustained by the Trust.

The above Regulations, from 1 to 17, were agreed to at a meeting of the Trust held this 16th day of September, 1893.

MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1893.

THE Commissioners of the Macedon Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following. The following rates are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Waterworks Trust area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Macedon Waterworks Trust on 16th September, 1893, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY
TRUST.

REGULATION No. 7.

THE Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the provisions conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation for the supply of water:—

1. This Regulation shall, notwithstanding anything contained in any previous regulations, be the regulation under which all water supplied by the Trust's works will be dealt with and distributed in the Trust district.

2. For purposes of identification, the two main channels in the district shall be known as the right and left channels, the right channel being from the bifurcation along the Gunbower Creek to Blain's, the left channel being from the bifurcation on the west side of the Barr Creek to the end at S. W. Taylor's, passing Wm. Craig's, Koroop.

3. The best and earliest possible notice that water will be available for irrigation and other purposes on an approximate date will be given to occupiers by the Trust officers.

4. All applications for water must be lodged in the Trust's application boxes, which are fixed at three mile distances along the main channel, at least ten days before the supply will be available. All such applications to be made on the forms to be obtained from the Trust office or officers, and must be signed by the persons requiring the water.

5. Payment for the supplies of water required must be made to the water bailiffs before the water is turned on, and in no case will the water be turned on or supplied unless such payment shall have been made previously.

6. The water bailiffs shall be the judges of the quantity of water necessary to be supplied to irrigate a given area of land to a given depth, and in no instance shall any contention of under supply be entertained by the Trust.

7. Irrigation will commence from the headworks end of the district, and will be continued up to the end of the main channels. Branch and distributary channels will be taken in their rotation of position, and irrigation further on the main channel will be stopped until the holdings commanded by such branch and distributary channels have been supplied.

8. During the gravitation supply period, water will be run through the channels from end to end at periodical intervals, and during the pumping season as often as and when deemed necessary or desirable by the Trust.

9. In the event of any occupiers missing their turn of supply after due notice shall have been given they must await the next supply in the channel, as in no case will the water be delayed or turned back to satisfy the requirements of any person or persons not ready or willing to take it when available. This provision is absolute, in the interests of irrigators in the district generally.

10. For garden supplies, as provided by separate regulation, occupiers will be allowed to open their occupation sluices when water is in the channel, but in no case to touch or interfere with channel stops.

11. Only those gardens that have been previously paid for must be watered, and occupiers will be held responsible for seeing that only the area paid for is irrigated.

12. On water being first supplied to any garden, the water bailiff will take a note of the area for which permission to irrigate is applied for, and will report to the resident engineer. Should it be found that the privilege of taking water for gardens is in any case being abused, the person offending will be promptly served with notice to discontinue opening his sluice, and if such notice be ignored such person will be liable to law for interfering with Trust property, and will be prosecuted as provided by the Water Act.

13. Applications for garden irrigation rights, and for permission to irrigate gardens the first time, must be made on the forms to be had from Trust office or officers, and must be signed by the persons requiring same.

14. Private channels and banks must be approved as to capacity and strength by the resident engineer or bailiffs, and in the event of private channels or banks being insufficient in capacity or strength, in the opinion of the engineer or bailiffs, the supply in any case in question will be cut off until the necessary alterations or additions shall have been made.

15. Special private channels for the supply of gardens shall be under the supervision of the resident engineer, and should he deem any such channel to be of inordinate size or capacity for the purposes he shall report to the Trust, who will decide as to the extra payment to be made therefor. This clause is intended to provide against private garden channels being used as reservoirs or tanks, and to prevent waste of water.

16. Tanks or dams are in every case to be filled at a time when a supply is available for irrigation by gravitation, and except under exceptional circumstances tanks or dams will not be filled when water is being pumped.

17. During the pumping season water will not be turned into swamps or creeks, but will, as far as possible, be confined to the Trust channels.

18. Should any public or private roads be flooded through irrigation operations, the water bailiff may direct that sufficient check banks be turned up to keep the water within bounds, and he may shut the sluice until such is done. If on this account any occupier should lose his turn of the water he must await the next regular supply.

19. Applications for pumped water will not be entertained by the Trust until, in its discretion, sufficient time has elapsed to prove that all possible use has been made of the gravitation water, and it shall not be as a duty or charge on the Trust to start the pumps, or continue them, or re-start them, if they consider that any occupier or occupiers applying have neglected to take the opportunity of utilising, to the fullest extent possible, the gravitation water when available.

20. The Trust will not be held liable for inability to supply water when required. All possible precautions will be taken to ensure each occupier a regular supply of water, both for irrigation and stock and domestic purposes; but in the event of the supply falling short, or the works breaking away, or if, from other cause, the Trust is unable to make water available, they decline absolutely to accept any personal or corporate responsibility or liability.

21. The prices for water by gravitation, by pumping, and for irrigation, garden, stock, and domestic and other purposes, will be fixed by the Trust from time to time by a special regulation, but nothing in any such special regulation shall be taken as nullifying or amending any of the provisions of this regulation, unless the same is particularly specified.

22. Occupiers must provide tanks for stock supplies, as the Trust do not intend that the channels shall be used for watering stock, and if it is found that any occupier is in the regular habit of watering his stock at the channels, instead of making and filling a tank or tanks, the water to that part of the channel may be shut off.

23. The outlets, or occupation sluices, for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers (except by the express written sanction of the engineer), excepting authorized occupiers of gardens, shall open any such outlets or occupation sluices, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

24. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent landowners, damage to works on adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

25. In all cases where water is being supplied the delivery will be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

26. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlets, junction sluices, or stops, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels, or works, excepting as hereinbefore provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

27. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

28. In the event of the Trust being unable, from failure of the works, or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of any moneys which have been paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage which may have been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

29. Any person desirous of erecting a fence across any channel belonging to the Trust shall make application for permission to do so to the Trust, and permission may be given, but only on the condition that the applicant provide and erect at his own cost suitable gates where directed by the engineer; the fence shall also be approved of by the engineer, and both it and the gates shall be erected under the engineer's direction.

30. Any person being or to be supplied with water out of any irrigation or occupation outlet or sluice, should such outlet or sluice be on the same side of the channel or the open track near the channels, and along which the Trust officer may travel, shall build a crossing or bridge to be approved of by the engineer over any channel or excavation that may have been or may be made to convey water from the said sluice to the boundary of the land being or to be supplied with water, and in the event of this not being done when ordered by the engineer or by his authority, the supply of water may be summarily cut off.

31. Garden irrigation rights must be paid for at the times application is made for the said rights.

32. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against, or breach of this agreement, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

33. A copy of this Regulation will be posted to every occupier in the district, and every such occupier will be expected to make him or herself acquainted therewith. Ignorance of the regulation for the supply of water will, therefore, not be accepted as an excuse for any omission or offence.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England in the Diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of the *Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-sixth day of September, 1893, and the following is the form in which such Statement of Trusts has been allowed:—

Description of land.—All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement one acre three roods twenty-three perches, county of Tanjil, township of Maffra, being allotments 8, 9, 10, and 11 of section 18: Commencing at the west angle of allotment 7; bounded thence by roads bearing respectively N. 43° 31' W. four chains, N. 46° 30' E. three chains fifty-one links, east two chains five links, and S. 43° 30' E. two chains fifty-nine links to allotment 7 aforesaid; and thence by that allotment bearing S. 46° 30' W. five chains to the point of commencement.

Names of trustees.—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

Power of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange all or any part of such land, subject to the approval of the Bishop of Melbourne for the time being, or, during the absence of the Bishop from the Diocese or the vacancy of the See, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs thereof. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be used for the purpose for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To be paid to the Bishop or administrator aforesaid, to be applied to such purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Melbourne as may, by such Bishop or administrator, acting under the advice of the Council of the Diocese, be from time to time deemed desirable.
