ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Eight hundred and one thousand five hundred and seventy-four pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and ninety-four.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**n pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revoke in part the Proclamation bearing date the 2nd day of October, 1893, so far only as the same relates to the appointment of Thursday, the 12th day of October, 1893, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of St. Arnaud; and in pursuance of the provisions contained in the said Act and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I do hereby appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

TUESDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Rutherglen and the Southern Riding of the Shire of Tungamah, and as a Bank Holiday at St. James;

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Lancefield;

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH, AND THURSDAY, THE 12TH DAYS OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as Public Holidays throughout the Borough of Eaglehawk and the Shire of Marong;

THURSDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Kara Kara, and as a Bank Holiday at Telford;

WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Majorca, Rutherglen, Talbot, and Wangaratta, and the Shires of Chiltern, North Ovens, and Tullaroop, and as a Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of Rutherglen;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Deakin, and as a Bank Holiday at Euroa and Kyabram;

MONDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Stawell;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the North and North-east Ridings of the Shire of Wimmera;

FRIDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

as a Bank Holiday at Nagambie;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Majorca and Talbot and the Shire of Tullaroop, and as a Bank Holiday at Maryborough;

THURSDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Bank Holiday at Colac.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.
