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PROHIBITION OF THE SUPPLY OF ARMS, AMMUNITION, AND EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for communication to your Government, copies of a Regulation passed by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific to take the place of the Regulation No. 1 of 1884, entitled "A Regulation to Prohibit the Supply of Arms, Ammunition, and Explosive Substances to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands."

This Regulation has been approved, and I request that your Government will take such steps as may be considered necessary for making it public.

The Regulation previously in force will be found among the papers printed for the use of the Federal Council, copies of which accompanied Lord Knutsford's despatch of the 9th of August, 1889.

A REGULATION

(Made in the name of and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's Assistant High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879)

TO PROHIBIT THE SUPPLY OF ARMS, AMMUNITION, AND EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

(L.S.)

1. IN this Regulation the expression "Western Pacific" means and includes any of the following islands or places, namely:—

(1) The Groups of Islands known as—

- The Union Islands.
- The Phoenix Islands.
- The Ellice Islands.
- The Gilbert Islands.
- The Solomon Islands, not included in the German Protectorate.
- The Santa Cruz Islands.

(2) All other islands in the Western Pacific Ocean (with the exception of the Tongan and Samoan Islands) not being within the limits of the colonies of Fiji, Queensland, or New South Wales, and not being within the jurisdiction of any civilized power.

The expression "the waters of the Western Pacific Islands" means the waters within three miles of any of the islands or places included in the Western Pacific Islands.

The word "arms" means every kind of firearms and any part or parts of firearms.

The word "ammunition" means every kind of ammunition for firearms and any material for the preparation thereof.

The expression "explosive substance" means gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, gun-cotton, blasting-powder, and every other substance used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion.

The word "native" shall mean and include any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean other than a person of European descent.

2. British vessels within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands shall not carry arms or ammunition. But this prohibition shall not be held to prevent or forbid the carriage by any such vessel for the protection of the same and of the persons therein, and otherwise for the ordinary lawful purposes of such vessel, of arms and ammunition in quantities not exceeding those herein specified, viz.:-

One rifle or shot-gun and one pistol for every member of the crew of such vessel, whose names shall be on the articles, and for every *bond fide* passenger (other than a native) on board such vessel.

One hundred rounds of ammunition for every such rifle, shot-gun, or pistol on board.

Cannons or swivel guns forming part of the ordinary equipment of any such vessel, together with one hundred rounds of ammunition for every such gun.

The carriage of arms and ammunition as cargo, consigned to, and intended only for the use of, a person (other than a native) resident within the Western Pacific Islands, shall be deemed to be an ordinary lawful purpose of such vessel, provided always that the total amount of arms and ammunition carried on board such vessel shall not exceed the above-specified quantities.

3. British subjects within the Western Pacific Islands shall not give, sell, or otherwise supply any arms, ammunition, or explosive substance to any native.

4. Any British subject who shall carry or aid or abet the carriage of any arms or ammunition in any British vessel within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands, except as permitted by this Regulation, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

5. Any British subject within the Western Pacific Islands who shall give, sell, or otherwise supply, or aid, or assist in supplying, any arms, or any single firearm, or any ammunition, or explosive substance, to any native, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

6. Any person guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to punishment as follows:—

(1) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour, and with or without a fine not exceeding Ten pounds; or

(2) A fine alone, not exceeding Ten pounds, without any imprisonment.

7. Regulation No. 1 of 1884, intituled "A Regulation to Prohibit the Supply of Arms, Ammunition, and Explosive Substances to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands," is hereby repealed; but any offence against such Regulation committed before the coming into force of this Regulation may be dealt with and shall be punishable as if such Regulation were still in force.

8. This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and may be cited as "The Arms Regulation, 1893."

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

It is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 1st December, 1892, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from the 27th November to the 1st December inclusive.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province, and no person whose name is already on any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners, who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain from the Chief Secretary letters of naturalization before doing so, or before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors.

Explosion on the s.s. "Hazel Branch."

THE following report, received from the Marine Board, Adelaide, is published for the information of ship-owners, masters, and agents in Victoria.

An inquiry was held at the Marine Board Offices, Port Adelaide, on the 19th September, 1893, into the circumstances attending an explosion on board the steam-ship *Hazel Branch*, by which the boatswain, Thomas Gerard, lost his life.

From the evidence taken, it appears that the vessel left Port Adelaide on the 6th September, with 1,390 tons sugar (original cargo), bound for Melbourne, and when in lat. 37° 30' S. and long. 138° 50' E., at 2.40 p.m. on 7th September, 1893, during a heavy gale the boatswain went down the chain locker in the forepeak, where some drums of W. B. Dick and Co.'s (London) patent paint were stowed, taking a naked light in order to see whether anything was adrift in the forehold. The composition having leaked had generated a gas, and upon contact with the light an explosion immediately took place, which burst open both bows, smashing the stem, blowing the collision bulkhead into No. 1 hold, and lifting both steel decks from their side-fastenings and other considerable damage. The fore-hold began at once to fill, and the vessel to become unmanageable. With great difficulty the master brought the vessel to Port Adelaide, as the gale then blowing was too severe to proceed, arriving there on the 9th September, and proceeding into harbor for discharge of cargo and repairs to vessel. The composition not being marked dangerous was not treated as an explosive, and no one on board was apparently aware of the dangerous nature of it.

The Board are of opinion that the explosion was caused by the leakage of gasoline from drums of anti-fouling composition (thinings) mixing with the confined air of the forepeak, so causing an explosive mixture which was ignited by the naked flame of a lamp carried by Thomas Gerard, boatswain of the *Hazel Branch*. The Board find that the explosion was accidental, and that no blame is attachable to the master or officers of the steamer. The Board will recommend the Board of Trade, London, to promulgate a warning to mariners as to the future safe carriage and storage of these and similar compounds, and the proper ventilation of the compartments in which they are carried.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1894.
5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

**LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1894.**

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July:—

- (1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.
 - (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the time being, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.
2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every one thousand gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the event of their being no such contract Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, or plastering, the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than one-quarter but not exceeding one-half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

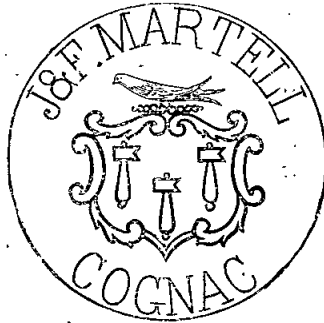

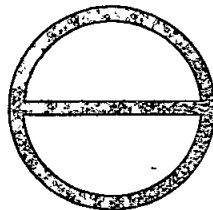

NATHALIA AND PICOLA RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST.

REGULATION NO. 1—FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST AND GENERALLY FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of October, 1893.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act, for the purposes following :—

“(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened ;

“(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act ; and

“(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act.”

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Nathalia and Picola Railway Construction Trust, make the regulation following, viz. :—

1. *First meeting.*—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.

2. *Time and place of meeting.*—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as an absolute majority of the Trust may from time to time appoint or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.

3. *Quorums of meetings.*—There shall be present at least seven members from the municipal council in such construction district at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of six members, exclusive of the chairman.

4. *Chairman.*—The chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as chairman so long as he shall remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.

5. *Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.*—Any vacancy in the position of chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting. Provided that in the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a chairman, the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be chairman, who shall hold office so long as he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.

6. *Vice-Chairman.*—In the absence of the chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a vice-chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

7. *Special meetings.*—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any seven members, addressed to the chairman ; but no such special meeting shall be held unless seven clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

8. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

9. *Meetings, notice of.*—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last known place of abode of each member, seven clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

10. *Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting ; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings ; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman.

11. *Order of business of meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. *Addresses to the Governor in Council.*—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

13. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given to the secretary, and by him read at the close of the meeting at which they are handed in, excepting notices under sections 40 and 41 of this regulation, which may be given to the secretary within nine (9) days of the next meeting of the Trust after such business lapses.

14. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

15. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

16. *Motions to be moved in order.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

17. *Motion to be moved by member giving notice.*—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

18. *Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.*—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

19. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

20. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with his subject.

21. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

22. *No motion to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

23. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

24. *Mover of motion.*—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

25. *Motions, &c., how decided.*—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

26. *Resolutions how revoked or altered.*—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

27. *Priority of members.*—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

28. *Members to stand while addressing Trust.*—Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

29. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

30. *Members not to digress.*—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on members shall be deemed highly disorderly.

31. *Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.*—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

32. *Members called to order to sit down.*—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

33. *Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.*—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

34. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

35. *Members may demand documents.*—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

36. *One amendment only to be discussed at a time.*—One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon.

37. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

38. *No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded or any other order of the day may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

39. *Protests.*—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

40. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

41. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

43. *Meetings of committees.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman or of any two members of the committee.

44. *Petitions.*—No petitions shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day. And every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

45. *No debate shall take place upon petitions.*—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

46. *Secretary.*—The secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust or of any committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and two members, and countersigned by the secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the collector and supervise his accounts, as provided for under these regulations.

47. *Treasurer.*—The treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

48. *Collector.*—The collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay to the treasurer or secretary all moneys received by him at least twice in each week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the treasurer or secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the secretary; and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

49. *Appointment, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the construction district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

50. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

52. *Common seal.*—The secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the chairman, a member, and secretary.

53. *Suspension of rules.*—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

54. *Penalty.*—Any person guilty of a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Richard Richardson, Her Majesty's Minister of Railways for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE ELTHAM CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Eltham Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least twelve working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, injure tombstones or fences, or do any other wilful damage.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 115.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

No passenger shall be entitled to re-book or take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of continuing his journey in the same train as that in which he shall have arrived at such station; but the Station-master may if he thinks fit allow a passenger to re-book on payment of the difference between the fare from the starting station and the re-booking station and the fare from the starting station to the station of final destination.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LEXTON.

WE, John Gordon Robertson, Richard Holton Grayling, Robert Martin, Robert Kettle, and Alexander McDonald, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of Public Recreation in the township of Lexton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by the 136th section of the *Land Act 1890*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except for training and exercising horses, and on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions fees as hereinafter specified may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or out names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—
For the admission of every adult, such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding Five shillings.
For the admission of every saddle-horse, exclusive of rider, such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding One shilling.
For the admission of every carriage, cart, or vehicle drawn by one horse, exclusive of passengers, such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
For the admission of every additional horse in the last case, Sixpence.
For the admission of every horse for training or exercising, such a sum as the committee of management may determine not exceeding One pound per annum.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WE, Matthew Lang, Ronald Macrae, James Alexander McWilliam, John Stocks, Patrick Scally, John Haswell McWilliam, and Crawford Harvie, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Race-course and Recreation purposes at Terang, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and also for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—
(1st) The stand enclosure.
(2nd) The remainder of the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, seats, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the 1st and 2nd divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for racing, shall be as follows:—
For the admission of every adult to the 1st division, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Seven shillings and sixpence.
For the admission of every adult to the 2nd division, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
10. No person shall, after the 1st day of October, 1893, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portion of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

- (a) That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the committee of management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Terang Racing Club, or by those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of Two pounds two shillings.
- (b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the committee of management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Terang Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

By-Law No. 1.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, made under Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered One, for the purpose of adopting certain provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890* the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho do order as follows:-

That the following provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*, with certain alterations as herein set forth, be adopted (that is to say):-

Clauses 7, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 25, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, and 42 of Part I.

Clause 6 of Part II.

Clauses 9, 11, and 14 of Part VIII.

Clauses 2 and 3 of Part IX.

Clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 41, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 53, 54, 55, 56, and 57 of Part XI. (that is to say):-

PART I.—STREETS AND FOOTWAYS.

Porticos, Projections, &c.

7. Repairs, &c., of Porticos.—Penalty.—Every owner or occupier of any building against or in front of which there is any portico shall keep the same clean and in good repair; and it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to any such owner or occupier to clean or repair such portico if and as the same may require; and every owner or occupier who neglects or refuses within seven days after the service of such notice to effect such cleaning and repair shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he fails to effect the same.

Spouts and Drains from Houses, &c.

12. Spouts, &c.—Drains, &c.—The owner or occupier of every house or building in, adjoining, or near to any street or road, within seven days after service of a notice by the council for that purpose, shall put up a shoot or trough of the whole length of such house or building, and shall connect the same either with a similar shoot on the adjoining house or building, or with a pipe or trunk, to be fixed to the front or side of such first-mentioned house or building from the roof to the ground, to carry the water from the roof thereof in such manner that the water from such house or the shoot or trunk fixed thereto, or from any portico or projection therefrom, will not fall upon the persons passing along the street or road or flow over the footway, but so that no such pipe or trunk be an obstruction to the safe and convenient passage along the footway, and shall construct or lay from and in continuation of such pipe or trunk to the water channel a gutter, hereinafter called channel, at the outer edge of the footway, and through, under, and transversely to the footway, such covered drain or trunk for carrying such water to such channel as may be authorized or directed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall hereafter keep in good condition every such shoot, trough, pipe, drain, and trunk, and every such drain or trunk shall be constructed, laid, and repaired subject to the inspection of such officer as the council appoint in that behalf; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day that he so makes default.

13. Drains for the Discharge of Surface Water from Land.—Penalty.—Every owner or occupier of land in, adjoining to, or near any street or road, if such land is so situated that the surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall, within seven days next after the service of notice by the council for that purpose, construct and lay from such point upon such land being near to the footway as is specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise, and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway, to the said channel and through, under, and transversely to the footway, and keep in good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the like inspection as in the last preceding section mentioned respectively; and in default of compliance with such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he makes default.

14. Regulations.—It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):-

For regulating the materials and the size, the level and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise, in like manner, and so, if they please, that such size be variable, according to the discretion of such officer as the council may hereby direct.

Crossings over Footways and Channels.

15. As to Horses and Vehicles crossing, &c., Footways, &c., save by made Crossing.—Penalty.—Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or any water channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

16. Notice of Making Crossing.—If any land fronts to, adjoins, or abuts upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or

to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land desires that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and gives a notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describes the land in question, and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council appoint for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards, in like manner, maintain the same.

17. Specification.—Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing be made shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

19. Nature of Crossing where there is a Street Curb.—In streets or roads in which at the site of any such proposed crossing there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall have on both sides a curb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part, and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned curb, and such curb shall approach to and join the street-curb in gentle curves outwards, and such crossings shall be of such width, and the surface thereof so far as the footway extends shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway as has been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof.

25. Repair of Crossing.—Penalty.—If any crossing be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same for seven days after notice from the council to that effect neglects properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing remains so unrepared a sum of Forty shillings, and the council may, if they see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

Depositing Building Materials, Excavations, &c.

29. Unlawfully Depositing Building Materials in Street.—Penalty.—Every person who throws or lays any building or other materials, or building rubbish, or puts up, constructs, or erects any stage, scaffolding, hoarding, or fence in, upon, across, or over any street, road, footway, channel, or public place, save in lawful execution of the powers given by this subdivision, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for each day during which such matter or thing, or any of it, or any part thereof, is suffered to remain in or upon such street, road, footway, channel, or public place.

30. Notice of Intention to Build, &c.—Every person intending to build, put up, or take down, or cause to be built, put up, or taken down, any building, wall, or other structure, or any fence, or altar or repair, or cause to be altered or repaired, the outward part of any such building or other structure, whether in any of such cases over or under ground, or to make any hole within ten feet of any street, road, or footway, shall give notice in writing of such his intention to the council, and in such notice shall describe the intended work, and the height, depth, extent, and position thereof, and whether or not it be necessary for the execution of the said work that a scaffold or stage be constructed, or that buildings or other materials, or building rubbish, be deposited upon or in the footway or street adjoining, or in front of such structure or hole, and for what time it will be necessary that such stage or scaffolding, or such materials deposited, be so kept or continued, or that such hole remain open, together with such other particulars touching such intended work as such person may see fit.

31. Penalty for Commencing, &c., Work without Notice.—Penalty.—No person shall execute or begin or continue to execute any such work as in the last preceding section mentioned without having given to the council such notice as therein provided, or until the expiration of forty-eight hours after giving the same; and every person offending against the provisions of this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day upon which he so offends.

32. Licence for Depositing Materials, Scaffolding, &c.—Licence-fee.—It shall be lawful for the council, having received any such notice as aforesaid, to grant, if it seem to them fit, to the person having given such notice, upon payment by him of the sum of Five shillings, a licence in the appointed form, under the hand of the municipal clerk, authorizing such person to construct such stage and scaffolding as the proper officer of the council to be appointed in that behalf require or permit, and to deposit building and other materials and building rubbish upon or across in each of the cases aforesaid so much of the footway adjoining or in front of the site of the intended work, and so much of the street or road adjoining such footway, and to keep and continue the said stage, scaffolding, and materials, or rubbish so constructed or deposited respectively for such time respectively as may seem fit to the said council and be specified in the said licence; and the council may, if it seem fit, renew such licence or grant a fresh licence to such person from time to time, and such person may thereupon from time to time do the said acts according to the tenor of such licence.

33. Hoarding and Fence.—Every person intending to build, or take down, or cause to be built or taken down any building or other structure, whether over or under ground, or to alter or repair, or cause to be altered or repaired, the outward part of any such structure within, in any of the cases aforesaid, ten feet

of any street, road, or footway, or who may have a licence for constructing any stage or scaffolding, or depositing any building or other materials or building rubbish upon or across any footway, street, or road, shall, before beginning to execute such work or to do such act, cause to be put up so as to separate from the street or road, and from the remainder (if any) of the footway, so much of the premises where the work is to be executed as fronts the site of such work, and the area upon which, according to the licence, such stage or scaffolding is to be constructed, or such materials or rubbish are to be deposited, such sufficient hoards or fences, together with such convenient platform or hand-rail, if there be room enough, to serve as a footway for passengers outside of such hoard or fence as may be respectively approved by such officer as the council may appoint in that behalf, and shall continue such hoard or fence with such platform and hand-rail as aforesaid standing in good condition to the satisfaction of such officer during the time limited as aforesaid in the said licence or the last renewal thereof, and for such longer time as the public safety or convenience requires; and shall in all cases in which it is necessary, in order to prevent accidents, cause the same to be sufficiently lighted from sunset to sunrise, and shall remove such hoard, fence, platform, and hand-rail, and make good the footway and the street or road within a reasonable time after the provisions of this section have been fulfilled.

34. Penalty for not Putting up, Lighting, &c., Hoarding.—Penalty.—Every person who executes, or begins or continues to execute any such work as in the last section mentioned, or who, being licensed thereto, constructs, or begins, or continues to construct any such stage, scaffolding, or deposits or keeps deposited any such material or rubbish upon or across any footway, street, or road, without in any of the cases aforesaid putting up such hoard or fence, or such platform with such hand-rail as aforesaid, or continuing the same respectively standing and in good condition as aforesaid during the time aforesaid, or without keeping the said hoard, fence, platform, or rail, and each part thereof respectively while the same are standing, sufficiently lighted from sunset to sunrise, or without removing the same within such reasonable time as aforesaid, or without making good the footway and the street or road after such removal, shall for such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every day while such default is continued.

35. Removal of Scaffolding, &c.—Penalty.—Every person licensed as herein mentioned to construct any stage or scaffolding, or to deposit any materials or rubbish, shall remove within a reasonable time after the time limited as aforesaid in such licence, or in the last renewal thereof, all such stage, scaffolding, material, and shall make good the footway and the street or road; and if any such person fails in any such case to comply with this section he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every day while such default is continued.

36. Street, &c., not to be Obstructed, &c.—Nothing herein contained shall render it lawful to construct any stage or scaffolding, or to deposit any materials or rubbish, or to put up any hoarding or fence, platform, or hand-rail as aforesaid, or all or any of them, so that the same may extend or be across or over or upon any street or road further from the inner edge of the footway than one-third of the whole breadth of such street or road, or in any case so as to render the street or road, exclusive of the footways, impassable for carriages, or so as to obstruct the channel.

37. Council may Remove, &c., in certain cases and Recover Expenses.—If any person who ought under this By-law to remove any matter or thing, or to make good any footway or street or road, fails so to do, whether or not such person has been convicted of an offence under this subdivision, the council may remove such matter or thing, or make good such street, road, or footway, and may recover the expenses of so doing from the person so making default before any justice.

Lighting, &c., of Obstructions generally.

38. Persons laying Materials or making Hole, whether by authority or not, to Light, &c., same.—Penalty.—When any building materials, rubbish, or other things are laid or any hole made in any street, road, or footway, whether the same be done by order or authority of the council or not, the persons causing such materials or other things to be so laid, or such hole to be made, shall at his own expense cause a sufficient light to be fixed in a proper place upon or near the same, and continue such light every night from sunset to sunrise while such materials or hole remain, and such person shall, at his own expense, cause such materials or other things and such hole to be sufficiently fenced and enclosed until such materials or other things are removed, or the hole filled up or otherwise made secure; and every such person who shall fail so to light, fence, or enclose such materials or other things or such hole, shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day while such default is continued.

39. Penalty in like case for Non-removal.—Penalty.—In no case shall any such building materials or other things, or such hole as last mentioned respectively, be allowed to remain an unnecessary time, under a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be paid for every such offence by the person who, whether by order or authority of the council or not, causes such materials or other things to be laid or such hole to be made; and in any such case the proof that the time has not exceeded the necessary time shall be upon the person so causing such materials or other things to be laid or causing such hole to be made.

Houses, &c., Encroaching on Street, &c.

40. Houses built so as to Encroach on Street, &c.—Penalty.—If any person erects or places any house or other building, or any part thereof, upon, over, or across any public street or road or footway or channel, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day while the same so continues.

Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c.

41. Cattle at large on unenclosed Land.—Penalty.—If any cattle are found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, or upon any street or road without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody or in a pound; and any justice, if such owner be not known upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of 24 hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses (to be estimated and assessed by the justice) of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. Cattle at large in Streets.—Penalty.—If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding ten shillings, and if such cattle by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees, and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

PART II.—WATERWORKS, DRAINS, ETC.

6. Obstructing, &c., Culverts, &c.—Penalty.—Whosoever obstructs or damages any culvert or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council by way of compensation for any such damage such further sum not exceeding Ten pounds as the convicting justice may order.

PART VIII.—NUISANCES, ETC.

Nuisances of various kinds.

9. Regulation as to keeping Swine.—Penalty.—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing by limits to be set forth therein portions of the municipal district in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine; and if any person keep any swine within any such prescribed limits he shall forfeit for every day during which he so offends a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Private Slaughter-houses.

11. Licences for Private Slaughter-houses where no Public Slaughter-houses.—Except it be by some Act of Parliament otherwise expressly provided, it shall be lawful for the council (if the council have not as yet provided abattoirs within the municipal district and duly notified the same as ready for public use) to license, upon payment of a sum not exceeding Two pounds as may be appointed by regulation in that behalf, such slaughter-houses (not being in any case within one mile from the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne or the town of Geelong) as they from time to time may think proper for slaughtering cattle, and every such licence shall be in force until the thirty-first day of December in the year for which such licence is granted.

14. Regulations.—Penalty.—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

- For the licensing (where the council are empowered to license) and for the registering and inspection of all private slaughter-houses;
- For appointing, subject to the limits herein prescribed, the fees for licences and registration;
- For preventing cruelty in such slaughter-houses;
- For keeping the same in a cleanly and proper state, and for removing the filth at least once in every twenty-four hours, and requiring them to be provided with a sufficient supply of water;
- For confining the use of licensed slaughter-houses to the slaughter of any particular kinds of animals.

And every person offending contrary to any such regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further sum not exceeding Ten shillings for every day during which such offence continues after such conviction.

PART IX.—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

2. Damaging Trees.—Penalty.—If any person wilfully and without the authority of the council cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done be not to the amount of One shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Removing Soil, &c., from Public Places.—Penalty.—If any person without the authority of the council break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds:

PART XI.—REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. General conduct of Business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. Minutes of Meeting.—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. Order of Business at Meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (ii.) Reading of letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (iv.) Ordinary business (opening tenders, &c.).
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Orders of the day (motions), including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (vii.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Officers' reports.
- (x.) Notices of motions.
- (xi.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Divisions.—Whenever a division is demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. Addresses to Governor.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then six clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. Notice of Motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. Petitions.—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Order of Moving Motions on Notice.—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. Absence of Councillor giving Notice.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. Motions for Address or Petition.—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the movers at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Order, &c., of Debate.—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order has been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Nature of Motion to be stated.—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. Motion how Withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. Motion to be Seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. Mover of Motion.—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. Designation of Councillors.—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles—namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor (as the case may require).

18. Priority of Councillors.—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. Chairman Addressing Council.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. Councillor not to speak twice.—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. Points of Order.—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. Councillors not to Digress, &c.—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Councillors to Apologize for Disorderly, &c., Expression.—Whenever any councillor makes use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. Councillor called to Order.—A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Councillor guilty of Offence.—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Strangers.—Any person not being a councillor who, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, is guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who does not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Call of Council.—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse, to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Councillor may demand Documents.—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. Voting.—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. Question how Declared.—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. Motions, &c., to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. Second Amendment.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. Effect of rejection of Words in Original Motion.—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. Effect of negating Amendment.—If an amendment be negated, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at the time.

35. Mover of Motion to have Right of Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. Motion for Adjournment.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negated, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Protests.—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest is given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such notice may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

41. Meetings of the Committee.—The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

43. Petitions to be Respectful.—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

44. Councillors to Affix their Names.—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Petitions to be in Writing.—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. To be Signed by Petitioners.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity or sickness.

47. No Letters, &c., to be Attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Presentation of Petition.—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. Appointments, &c., of Officers.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice has been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the municipal district, inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.

50. Salaries of Officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

53. Miscellaneous.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

54. Treasurer to disburse Moneys in certain cases.—It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as are required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of five pounds.

55. Common Seal.—The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a locked box by the municipal clerk, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council and the secretary, or, in the absence of such chairman, unless two councillors and the secretary be present.

56. Suspension of Rules.—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given; and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

57. Penalty.—If any person be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.
