TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 1st December, 1892, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from the 27th November to the 1st December inclusive.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province, and no person whose name is already on any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners, who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain from the Chief Secretary letters of naturalization before doing so, or before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO LICENCES TO CUT, CONSTRUCT, AND
USE RACES, DRAINS, DAMS, AND RESERVOIRS.*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of October, 1893.*

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Mines Act* 1890 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and such Regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the Regulations previously made under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act and which relate to licences to cut, construct, and use races, drains, dams, and reservoirs, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof; provided always that the previous Regulations, which are rescinded by this Order, shall continue to have full force and effect until the coming into operation of the Regulations hereby made, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS RELATING TO LICENCES TO CUT, CONSTRUCT, AND USE RACES,
DRAINS, DAMS, AND RESERVOIRS UNDER THE MINES ACT 1890.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of these Regulations, the word "race" shall mean an artificial channel for distributing water from any reservoir or other deposit, or from any head of water, whether such race be formed by cutting and excavating the ground or by boxes or troughs connected together. The word "drain" shall mean any channel or passage, artificial or otherwise, through or by means of which water is supplied to any reservoir or other deposit, or to any head of water. The word "dam" shall mean an artificial earthwork or stone or wooden wall, formed and used for retaining water in a reservoir. The word "reservoir" shall mean a place where water is stored and retained by artificial embankments or walls. The expression "source of supply" shall mean any spring, lake, pool, river, stream, or creek, or any other depository of water. The word "applicant" and the word "person," where it refers to an applicant, shall mean a person proceeding to obtain any such licence as last aforesaid. The expression "the warden" shall mean the warden acting for the time being in the division or part of the division of a mining district in which the land in respect of which the licence shall be applied for shall be. Words importing the singular shall be taken to include the plural, and the plural the singular.

The calculation of "days" for doing any act shall be exclusive of Sundays, Good Friday, and Christmas Day.

REQUIREMENTS PRELIMINARY TO THE ISSUE OF LICENCES.

2. Any person intending to apply for a licence must, in case the intended application shall be for a race or drain, erect or cause to be erected along the course of the proposed race or drain posts not less than three inches square, sunk at least one foot three inches in the ground, and standing at least two feet six inches in height above the surface of the ground, and distant not more than twenty chains from each other; and also in every case where the water for such race is proposed to be taken from any spring, lake, pool, river, stream, or creek, a post not less than three inches square, standing at least two feet in height above the surface of the ground, at every point where the water is proposed to be diverted from any such river, stream, or creek, and a similar post at every point at which he shall propose (as by his application hereinafter mentioned he shall be bound to do) to return or convey the water so taken into the same or some other lake, pool, river, stream, or creek; and in case the application be for a reservoir, he must erect such posts of not less than the first-mentioned height at the principal angles of or some other conspicuous spots on the boundary of the ground proposed to be used for such reservoir; and all the posts herein referred to shall be maintained in their places until the application shall be granted or refused. Every such post must be painted white on all sides thereof for a space of six inches from the top, and a letter or figure, not previously used by any other applicant for a licence under the *Mines Act* 1890, be legibly painted in black on the white painted part of one of the sides of each such post, the same letter or figure to be used on all such posts. Provided that if the lands in respect of which the licence shall be applied for shall have been demised, and if the applicant shall be prevented by or on behalf of the lessee from erecting such posts, then and in such case it shall be sufficient if such applicant shall mark out the land as near to the mode herein in that behalf prescribed as the circumstances will permit. The applicant must also publish in a newspaper circulating in the district, or nearest to the district, in which such land shall be situated, or if two or more such newspapers shall circulate equally near thereto, then in any one of them, and in that one of such newspapers which shall be published next after the time when such posts shall have been erected, a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto marked "A"; and shall also post a copy of such notice at the post-office nearest to the said land, or if there shall be a police court nearer to the said land than such post-office, then at such police court; and shall also post a copy of such notice on the warden's or mining surveyor's or mining registrar's office nearest to the said land.

3. The applicant must then, and previously to the time of making his application, deposit with the clerk of the warden, or, if there be no such clerk, with the clerk of the petty sessions holden nearest to the land about to be applied for, the sum of Ten pounds, to be appropriated, to such extent and in such manner as the Minister of Mines shall direct or approve, towards the expenses of survey and other expenses which may be incurred by or on behalf of or by direction of the Crown in connexion with such application, and of any costs to the objectors (if any) or any other person or persons, such payments to be made by the said clerk according as the Minister of Mines shall direct; and such clerk shall give to the applicant a receipt for the said sum in the form in the Schedule hereto annexed marked "B." Any portion

of such sum which shall remain after the payment of such expenses shall be returned to the applicant; but if the application be withdrawn or abandoned, or if the applicant shall neglect or refuse to take delivery of the licence, then the whole sum, after the payment of any such expenses as aforesaid, shall, unless a special order to the contrary be made by the Minister of Mines, be forfeited.

APPLICATION FOR THE LICENCE.

4. The applicant shall, after the advertisement has appeared in the newspaper and the notices have been posted as aforesaid, and within seven days after erecting posts, address to the Minister of Mines, and leave with the warden, an application, and two copies thereof, in the form of the Schedule hereto marked "C," and shall also leave therewith the receipt in the next preceding clause hereof mentioned, together with (if the application be for a reservoir or a dam) sketch-plans and sections, on the scale of twenty feet to one inch, showing the proposed situation of the dam or reservoir, and the proposed mode of construction of the works connected with the said reservoir; and the warden shall, as soon thereafter as it may conveniently be done, enter or cause to be entered, in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, a copy of such application, numbered according to the order in which it shall have been received, with a memorandum of the day and hour of such receipt, and such day and hour he shall also indorse upon such application.

OFFICIAL SURVEY.

5. Upon the receipt by the warden of such application and copies, and of the receipt for the money to be deposited as aforesaid, the said warden shall give to a mining surveyor one of the said copies, and shall direct such surveyor to proceed to the proposed site of the race, drain, dam, or reservoir, and survey the same, and furnish such warden with a report in relation to the said application; such report shall contain a description of such site, and a statement as to the intended course of such race or drain, and the intended area and boundaries of such dam or reservoir, the probable supply of water for such race or reservoir, the plan proposed for obtaining such supply, whether it is proposed to take or divert water from any and what source or sources of supply, and, if so, setting forth in what quantity and how far the points of diversion, return, and conveyance in the next preceding clause hereof mentioned, or any of them, are or is fit and proper, whether the same or any of them should be disallowed or altered, and, if so, the reason of such surveyor therefor, and whether there is existing any other race, drain, dam, or reservoir, which could or might be affected by the race, drain, dam, or reservoir the licence for which shall be applied for, and also whether the Crown lands forming the proposed site for such race, drain, dam, or reservoir have or have not been demised under the provisions of any Act of Parliament, and shall also, at the same time, furnish to such warden a map of the part of the district within which the said site shall be situate, showing the proposed position and form, as nearly as may be, of the dam or reservoir, or the proposed course of the race or drain with such proposed points of diversion, return, and conveyance as aforesaid, and in such manner as that the same and such position and course may be capable of ascertainment by reference to some fixed points in such district. And in case the said surveyor shall be of opinion that the proposed mode of constructing or supplying with water the race, drain, dam, or reservoir, the licence for which shall be applied for, would injuriously affect any other race, drain, dam, or reservoir, he shall state in his said report in what manner such injurious effect would be produced, and whether there are any and what facts within his knowledge which lead him to consider that the applicant knew or had reason to believe that such injurious effect would be produced, provided that the said surveyor shall obtain so far as he can, and give to the Minister of Mines, all such further information, and make such further plans and surveys relative to such application as the said Minister shall require.

6. The said mining surveyor shall, after having obtained such direction as aforesaid, proceed, with all reasonable speed, to carry out the same, and he shall also ascertain by inspection whether or not the posts erected by the applicant are sufficient to indicate the ground in respect of which the licence shall be applied for, and if he shall think that additional posts should be erected, he may order the same to be erected, and they shall accordingly be erected by such applicant, and the said surveyor shall affix at such convenient places as he shall think requisite on the line of the proposed race or drain, or on the site of the proposed dam or reservoir, notices dated the day of the completion of the said survey, in the form in the Schedule hereto marked "D," containing the name and address of the applicant, or each of the applicants, and the other matters mentioned in the said schedule; and also, as soon as he conveniently can after having made the survey, post a notice, similar to the notices hereinbefore mentioned, save so far as altered as directed by the said schedule, and dated of the same day as the notice to be posted on the ground as aforesaid, on the outside of his own office, and of the post-office nearest to his office, or if there shall be a police court nearer to his office than such post-office, then of such police court; and such notices shall be effectually secured by the surveyor in the places where they shall have been affixed.

7. In the event of applications being made for any such licences which, if granted, would be inconsistent, or would interfere with each other, or could not be beneficially held concurrently, that one of such applications as shall have been first marked out by posts as required by Clause 2 shall be first considered, and in case any two or more of such applications, it shall be in the discretion of the Governor in Council to which of the applicants the licence shall be granted.

OBJECTIONS.

8. Any person objecting to the issue of any such licence must, in order to have his objections considered, within twenty-one clear days after the date of the notice posted on the land by the surveyor as aforesaid, lodge with the warden, and deliver to the applicant, at the address stated in such notice, notice in writing, signed by him, and stating his address, of his objections against the issue of such licence.

9. Every person so objecting shall, at the time of his lodging with the warden the notice of his objections, deposit with the clerk of the warden, or if there be no such clerk, with the clerk of the petty sessions holden nearest to the land in respect of which the licence shall be applied for, the sum of Five pounds, to be disposed of by such clerk in such manner as the Minister of Mines shall direct, in payment of all expenses to which the applicant may without, in the opinion of such Minister, sufficient reason be put by reason of such objections, in case such objections shall not be prosecuted, or shall fail; and such clerk shall give to the person or persons making such deposit a receipt in the form of the Schedule hereto marked "B"; and in case there shall be no such expenses, or, if there shall be any, then subject to the payment thereof, the said sum shall be refunded to the persons objecting.

INQUIRY INTO APPLICATIONS AND OBJECTIONS.

10. After the expiration of the said twenty-one days, the warden shall, in case no objections shall have been lodged, forward the application to the Minister of Mines; but if any such objections shall have been lodged, the warden shall proceed to hold, at a time and place to be named by him, and of which two clear days' notice in writing shall be given by him to the applicant, or to each of the applicants, and to the objector or each of the objectors, an inquiry into the truth of the particulars stated by the applicant and objector. Provided, however, that the warden shall not hold the said inquiry unless there shall have been delivered to him, on or previous to the day fixed for the inquiry, the receipt in the next preceding clause mentioned; and the warden shall have power to adjourn every such inquiry to any other time and place. Provided that if several persons unite in one objection, notice to any one of them shall be sufficient.

11. At such inquiry the warden shall take evidence in relation to the application and objections; and on the second of the two days which shall next follow after such inquiry, he shall forward to the office of the Minister of Mines the application and objections thereto, and the evidence taken by him as aforesaid, together with the sketch-plans and sections to be left with, and the report and map to be furnished to him, as hereinbefore mentioned; and also a report to be drawn up by him containing his opinion on the application, the objections, and the evidence.

12. Every applicant who shall require the same shall be permitted, at any reasonable time before the warden shall have forwarded the documents to be so forwarded by him as aforesaid, to take a copy of the report and map, and to examine the said evidence, and to make, or cause to be made, a copy thereof, for his own use and guidance; and every such applicant shall also be entitled to obtain from the warden, at his own expense, a copy of the warden's report.

THE LICENCES.

13. Upon the receipt by the Minister of Mines of the documents to be forwarded to him by the warden as aforesaid, the Governor in Council will, on consideration thereof, and of all objections (if any) to the granting of such application for a licence, as well as those forwarded by the warden (if any), as also any others which may be tendered to him, either refuse the application or grant the same as he shall see fit, and it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to determine whether the application shall be granted as applied for, or modified as he shall think fit, and subject so far as he shall order to the provisions hereof.

14. The licence to be granted in pursuance of the determination of the Governor in Council shall not be issued until after the expiration of one month from the time of a notice of the intention to issue the same appearing in the *Government Gazette* and in some newspaper circulating in the district within which the land is situate.

15. Every licence shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto marked "E," or as near thereto as the nature of the purpose for which the same shall be required will permit, and shall bear date the day of the execution thereof by the Governor.

16. The licence will be transmitted to the warden to whom the application shall have been delivered or such other warden as the Minister of Mines shall choose, at whose office the same may be obtained, who shall deliver the same to the applicant, or such person as shall be duly authorized to receive the same, upon his application therefor at any time within a period of sixty days from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a notification that the licence is awaiting delivery, and upon production of a receipt from a receiver and paymaster for the fee of One pound and the first year's rent.

17. Upon receiving the licence the warden shall, as soon after as he can conveniently do so, unless in the meantime the licensee shall apply for and obtain delivery of the licence under the provisions of the next preceding clause; give notice of such receipt, and shall request the attendance at his office of the licensee to take delivery of the licence; and should the licensee fail to comply with the requirements of the before-mentioned clause the warden shall return the licence to the Minister of Mines, who shall act in the matter thereof as he shall think right; and should the licensee comply with the requirements of the said clause, the warden shall, as soon after as he can conveniently do so, notify the Secretary for Mines of such compliance.

18. If any application for a licence shall be withdrawn, or if there shall be a failure by the licensee to comply with the requirements of the preceding clauses, the Governor in Council may declare the application for a licence abandoned, or declare the licence forfeited, as the case may be; and the Secretary for Mines shall thereupon, as well as if any licence applied for shall have been refused by the Governor in Council, cause a notification of such abandonment, forfeiture, or refusal, as the case may be, to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and thereupon all right, title, and interest of the applicant for a licence, or of the licensee to, or in respect of, the ground in respect of which a licence has been applied for or granted, shall cease, and the ground shall be open to persons holding miners' rights or business licences, or to applicants for a lease or licence under the *Mines Act* 1890, as if no licence in respect of the said ground had ever been applied for or granted; but so, however, as not to interfere with or in anywise prejudice or affect any rights or interests under miners' rights or otherwise existing at the time at which such application shall have been made in the land or water which was intended to be affected by such application. And if any licence shall be forfeited for any other cause, the said Secretary shall notify such forfeiture in the *Government Gazette* as aforesaid, and the ground which was affected by such licence shall be open to the holders of miners' rights or business licences, or to applicants for a lease or licence under the *Mines Act* 1890.

19. All costs and expenses incurred by or on behalf of or by direction of the Crown, by reason of the withdrawal or abandonment of any application for a licence, shall be considered expenses within the meaning of the third clause hereof.

20. The land which will be permitted to be used under a licence for a race shall not exceed an area of four acres for every mile in length of such race, and no land bordering on any dam or reservoir shall be used by or for the benefit of the licensee for any other purpose than that of collecting, retaining, or storing water. Provided that in case the licence shall be for a race, if by reason of any natural impediment it shall be impracticable, or attended with unforeseen difficulty or expense, to cut the same according to the line originally designed therefor, it shall be lawful for the licensee, having first obtained the permission of the Minister of Mines, to deviate in the cutting of such race so far from such originally designed line as shall be necessary to avoid the effects of such impediment.

21. The term for which any licence shall be granted shall be determined in each case according as the Governor in Council, from a consideration of the circumstances in each such case, shall think fit, but such term can in no case exceed fifteen years.

22. The rents to be paid shall be as follows :—

For every race, such sum as shall be considered proper, having regard to the quantity of water and the expenditure necessary.

For every reservoir, such sum per annum for every million gallons of water as may be right, having regard to the capacity of the reservoir.

The above rents to be paid yearly in advance.

Provided always that the Governor in Council may at any time during the term for which a licence is granted, upon sufficient cause being shown, waive and dispense with the payment of the full rent reserved in such licence for and during such period as there may, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, not be sufficient water to supply the quantity mentioned in the licence. Provided further that the reduction in the rent of such licence shall be proportional to the actual quantity of water available for the supply of the race, but shall not in any case exceed one-half of the annual rent reserved in such licence.

23. The licences shall be subject to the conditions to be contained therein, and if at any time there shall be a breach of or non-compliance with such conditions the Governor in Council may order that a licence shall be forfeited, and a notification of such forfeiture shall be published in the *Government Gazette*; and thereupon all right and title of the licensee to or in respect of the ground in respect of which the licence shall have been granted shall cease, and such licensee remaining on the said ground or in the use of the race or reservoir the subject of the licence shall be considered a trespasser, and may be dealt with accordingly.

24. Licensees to cut races for the taking and using of tail-water for the purposes authorized by the sixty-fourth section of the *Mines Act* 1890 will be granted, and the several provisions aforesaid will be applicable to such licences.

25. In any case where, at the time of the coming into force of these Regulations, a race shall be held under a miner's right, or under miners' rights, or a consolidated miner's right, or a miner's right issued to an incorporated company, a licence under the sixty-fourth section of the *Mines Act* 1890, and subject so far as such regulations can apply to the conditions aforesaid, will be granted to the owner or owners of such race on his or their, or such company, proving his or their or such company's title thereto, to the satisfaction of the Minister of Mines, but subject, however, to any water-rights legally existing at the time of the making of such grant; provided, however, that no person or persons or company shall be entitled to such grant, unless he or they shall have applied to the Minister of Mines therefor within the time in that behalf specified in the *Government Gazette*, for the mining district in which the said race shall be situate.

TRANSFER OF LICENCES.

26. Any person to whom any such licence shall have been issued shall be at liberty to transfer the same to any other person, provided that he shall give notice of such transfer to the Minister of Mines. Every such transfer shall be effected by an instrument in writing, signed by the transferor in presence of and witnessed by a justice of the peace, and shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto marked "F," and every person to whom any such transfer shall be made shall be subject to these Regulations as fully as if the licence had been originally granted to himself.

COMPENSATION FOR INJURY.

27. In any case in which an application shall be granted to cut or construct any race, drain, dam, or reservoir, in or upon any land demised under the provisions of this or any other Act now or hereafter to be in force, or occupied by virtue of a miner's right or business licence, and if the licensee shall enter upon such land the warden shall, on complaint being made by the said lessee of the land or holder of miner's right or business licence, give notice in writing to the licensee and the lessee of the land, or the holder of the miner's right or business licence, as the case may be, to appear before him at a time and place to be named in such notice, and shall then and there receive such evidence as may be tendered to him and as may be pertinent to such inquiry, and shall decide what shall be the amount of the compensation to be paid by the applicant.

PERSONS ENTERING ON LAND APPLIED FOR SUBSEQUENT TO APPLICATION.

28. If any person shall subsequently to the making of any application under these Regulations, whilst the same is under consideration, enter upon or occupy any Crown land for which such application has been made, such occupation or entry shall not operate, save at the will of the Governor in Council, to prevent the issue of a licence to the applicant.

29. These Regulations shall come into force at the end of twenty-one days after the same shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*; but they shall not apply to or in any way affect any application for a licence made and not determined at the time of the coming into operation of these Regulations, but such application may be carried on and determined as if these Regulations had not been made.

If the drainage of any area through which the race indorsed on the plan hereon and therein coloured red shall be cut shall be more than adequate for the supply of the water authorized to be taken by the licensee and if a licence shall at any time be granted to any other person to cut and use a race to be supplied with water from the same area the Governor in Council or the Minister having for the time being charge of the mining interests of the colony shall have the right to require the several licensees to construct and they shall on such requisition at their joint cost construct a reservoir to be approved by some person appointed by the Governor in Council for the purpose of the storage of the water of such area in sufficient quantity for the supply

of the races held by the several licensees aforesaid and in case any third fourth or other subsequent such licence shall be granted in respect of the water of the same area of drainage the same being more than sufficient for the races then supplied therefrom the Governor in Council or the Minister having for the time being charge of the mining interests of the colony shall also have the right upon any such subsequent grant being made to require all the persons then holding such licences to construct if not theretofore constructed and they shall on such requisition at their joint cost construct such reservoir or if there shall have been theretofore constructed then to enlarge and they shall on such requisition enlarge the same so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of the storage of water in sufficient quantity for the supply of all the races in respect of which licences shall have been granted within such area such construction or enlargement to be approved of by such person as the Governor in Council shall appoint for the purpose. Provided that if at any time the water derived from such area shall have become diminished to a quantity less than sufficient for the supply of all the races then existing and in use the several licensees shall be entitled to use such water in the order of priority of dates of their respective grants. Provided also that if on the occasion of any such construction or enlargement of a reservoir the parties bound under the provisions hereof to effect the same shall not agree as to the proportion of the expense to be borne by them respectively the Governor in Council shall be entitled to fix such proportion.

If within a drainage area within which one or more than one race shall already have been cut another licence to cut a race shall be granted the Governor in Council shall have the right to require the licensee or licensees for such one or more than one race at his or their cost alone to construct or enlarge such reservoir as before mentioned and for the purpose therein mentioned instead of requiring the same to be done by him or them jointly with the person to whom such other licence shall have been granted and the licensees so required shall construct or enlarge such reservoir accordingly.

Where any race indorsed on the plan hereon and therein coloured red shall intersect any road ordinarily used for the passage of wheeled vehicles whether such road shall have been proclaimed or not or any footway race or canal the licensee shall at his own expense construct good and substantial bridges footways roadways or aqueducts over the same the several works to be subject to the approval of an officer appointed by the Governor in Council and the licensee shall maintain all such works in good repair and shall if required by the Warden make or cause to be made at his own expense temporary roadways footways races or aqueducts in such manner as shall be by such Warden ordered during the time the permanent roadways footways or other works are in course of construction. Provided that if any such roads footways or other works shall be under the control of any municipal council road board or other local body then and in such case the several works to be constructed by the licensee shall be subject to the approval of an officer to be appointed by such municipal council road board or other local body.

The licensee shall divert the water to be used by virtue of this licence from the source of supply at the points for that purpose marked on the plan hereon indorsed and at no other points save with the consent in writing of the Minister of Mines and in such quantities from each of such points as are herein specified. If the licensee shall desire that the course of his race or any of the said points of diversion or conveyance should be altered he may apply to the Warden to consider the matter and if the Warden shall on consideration be of opinion that such alteration would having regard to the rights and interests of all other persons be proper the Warden shall transmit to the Minister of Mines a statement of such his opinion and of the alterations desired and the said Minister may allow the same either as stated or modified as he may think fit or disallow the same or the licensee may if he shall so desire and the said Minister shall express his consent thereto in writing surrender his licence and obtain a new licence with such alterations either as stated or modified as aforesaid.

If the Warden shall either from the report of a mining surveyor or from any other facts which may come to his knowledge be of opinion that any drain or drains should be constructed under a race or any flume or flumes over a race the Warden shall direct the same to be constructed by and at the expense of the licensee to the satisfaction of a mining surveyor subject however to the decision of the Minister of Mines in case the matter should be referred to him by the licensee.

If the Warden on the application of the holder of any claim intersected by any race indorsed on the plan hereon and therein coloured red shall be of opinion that such claim could be more effectually worked if a flume or flumes were substituted for the portion of the race intersecting such claim he may authorize such flume or flumes to be constructed by and at the expense of the holder of such claim.

The licensee shall fix and keep fixed and in proper order at each point of diversion from any source of supply of water for any race indorsed on the plan hereon and therein coloured red such gauge-box and of such form and dimensions having regard to the quantity of water which by this licence he is empowered to take from such source of supply as the Warden shall after obtaining the opinion of a mining surveyor in respect thereof think proper and direct subject however to the decision of the Minister of Mines in case the matter shall be referred to him by the licensee.

This licence shall be liable to be forfeited and may at any time be declared void by order of the Governor in Council in case any of the provisions herein named shall not be observed by the licensee or if any of the obligations lawfully imposed on him shall not be by him fulfilled or if any race indorsed on the plan hereon and therein coloured red shall without good cause be left without being *bona fide* used for a period of six months (an officer to be appointed by the Governor in Council to determine whether the same has been so left without being so used or not) or if any dam or any other of the works connected with such race shall become from imperfect construction or neglect dangerous to the public or in any way a nuisance or shall be suffered to remain out of repair for an unreasonable time (such officer as aforesaid to determine whether such works have so become dangerous or a nuisance or suffered to remain out of repair as aforesaid) or if the licensee divert water in greater quantities or from other points or sources than as specified in his licence or do not return or convey the water used by him as herein directed or shall interfere in any way other than is by any regulations made by the Governor in Council directed or allowed or under a licence with any tail water or water after the same shall have been used by him.

Any miners engaged in washing auriferous earth by means of a tub or cradle or both shall be permitted to use free of charge from the race held under the authority of this licence the water necessary for the same provided that no coarse tailings or silt produced by such operations shall be deposited in such race without the consent of the licensee. Nevertheless the licensee may refuse such permission if in the opinion of the Minister of Mines for the time being the privilege granted shall have been abused.

Subject to the reservations contained herein no water shall be sold by the licensee or used for any other purpose than for the working of mines in his occupation except upon such terms and conditions as shall from time to time be approved in writing by the Minister of Mines.

Nevertheless it shall be lawful for the licensee with the consent of the Minister of Mines from time to time to alter and vary the manner terms and conditions on and upon which such water shall be used or sold but no such alteration or variation shall take effect until the approval in writing of the Minister shall have been obtained.

The Governor in Council shall be entitled at any time to revoke this licence and resume possession of the land indorsed on the plan hereon and therein coloured red upon payment to the licensee or to the person then entitled to the benefit of this licence of the value of the outlay by the said licensee or such person upon or in respect of the race indorsed on the plan hereon and therein coloured red and such percentage thereon not exceeding Fifty pounds per cent. as shall be just having regard to the value and state of repair of such race and of the works connected therewith.

*Defences and Discipline Act 1890.***REGULATIONS FOR VOLUNTEER CADET CORPS.***At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of October, 1893.*

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations and orders respecting the enrolment and disbanding of any volunteer corps, the appointment, promotion, and rank of all volunteer officers, and the relative rank of such officers and of the officers of any military and naval force and officers holding any military or naval staff appointment in the service of the Government of Victoria, the requisites to require a volunteer to be deemed an effective, the constitution, assembling, and proceedings of courts of inquiry to hear, receive, and examine evidence relating to and to report on any matter connected with the government or discipline of the volunteer force, or of any corps thereof, or on any charge brought against a member of any such corps, the maintenance of discipline, the power of arrest, the payment and recovery of subscriptions, fines, and penalties, and the general government, discipline, and management of the volunteer force and the several corps thereof, and the persons appointed to the paid staff of or serving for pay in the said force, and may from time to time alter or repeal any such regulations and orders, and may call for such returns as may from time to time seem requisite: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal from the 1st day of November, 1893, all Rules and Regulations for Volunteer Cadet Corps previously made under the authority of the said Part of the said Act, save as to anything done, offences committed, penalties or punishments incurred, or proceedings instituted thereunder, and doth hereby make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, and, in accordance with the provisions of section 81 of the above in part recited Act, doth direct that the same shall apply to all Volunteer Cadet Corps enrolled within Victoria, that is to say:—

1. Cadet detachments may be established in schools where there are not less than 20 boys in any one school who are prepared to obtain the approved uniform, and are of the required age and height.

2. Detachments shall only be formed in schools where a teacher is qualified to act as officer in charge, or where the services of a Warrant or Non-commissioned Officer of the Permanent Staff are available for at least one hour a week.

3. No boy shall be enrolled under the age of 12 years in Colleges or Grammar Schools. In State Schools no boy shall be enrolled under the age of 12 years, unless he is 4ft. 6in. in height in his stockinged feet, and is also physically fit. All enrolments shall be approved by the Commanding Officer, and each boy must have the consent of his parents or guardians to become a member. No cadet shall remain a member of the corps after the age of 19 years.

4. The Cadet Corps shall be under the command of the Commandant, and shall be inspected at least once every six months by an officer detailed from Head-Quarters.

5. The Cadet Corps shall be under the general command of an officer duly appointed, who is designated the "Commanding Officer," hereinafter referred to as the Officer Commanding Cadets.

6. The detachments shall be drilled twice each week, each drill to be not less than half-an-hour, or once each week of one hour's duration, with arms.

7. The various detachments shall be formed into battalions in suitable localities.

8. The various detachments shall assemble for battalion drill not less than six times a year, two of which shall be half-yearly general inspections by the Officer Commanding Cadets or Staff Officer.

9. Arms and accoutrements shall be kept in the school, and be used only for drill purposes. The Head Master shall be held responsible for the preservation of all Government property issued to the Cadet Corps in his school, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

10. No cadet shall use the rifle issued to him for any other purpose than parades, drills, or target practices, in each case under command of an officer.

11. The course of training shall be as prescribed by orders issued from Head-Quarters.

12. Cadets must appear on all occasions either in the authorized uniform of the company or in purely civilian dress.

13. Officers may be appointed by the Governor in Council on the nomination of the Commandant. The Officer Commanding Cadets may, subject to the approval of the Commandant, also appoint acting subalterns. Officers of Cadet Corps (acting officers excepted) will rank with officers of Militia, as junior in their grades; but such rank will not entitle any officer of Cadet Corps to assume command over any officer of another branch of the service. The Officer Commanding Cadets shall appoint non-commissioned officers.

14. All applications for the formation of detachments must be forwarded by the Officer Commanding Cadets through the Commandant to the Minister for the approval of the Governor in Council.

15. Applications for enrolment must be sent for approval to the Officer Commanding Cadets, stating name and age of each boy. The Officer Commanding Cadets will be held responsible that the provisions of sections 3 and 31 are complied with.

16. Arms and stores issued by the Government shall be inspected by order of the Commandant at least every three months; and, where there is any evidence of neglect or wilful damage, the stores may be at once called in, and the person responsible for such damage be called upon to defray the cost of all repairs.

17. Every member shall deliver up to the appointed officer, in good order and condition, fair wear and tear alone excepted, any Government property which may have been issued to him.

18. The Non-commissioned Officers of the Cadet Corps shall be appointed from the ranks of the force, and shall have distinguishing badges to designate their rank.

19. In the case of any detachment being unfavorably reported on at the half-yearly inspection, the Commandant may debar such detachment from taking part in any rifle or other military competition till the next inspection.

20. Any detachment which is unfavorably reported on at two successive half-yearly inspections will be disbanded.

21. An officer must be present with the cadets at target practice, and must exercise the utmost vigilance to prevent accidents, observing that *each cadet handles his rifle with the care necessary to prevent the possibility of danger to himself or others*. (Where no officer is competent to undertake the work, it will be necessary to secure the services of a Warrant or Non-commissioned Officer of the Permanent Staff.) The ammunition must be retained *in the officer's own possession*, only the requisite number of rounds necessary for the practice being handed to each cadet, and at the conclusion of the practice every precaution must be taken that none remains in their hands. Arms and pouches must be examined before the practice commences, and at the conclusion of the firing at each range, and before leaving the Ranges. All cadets must be in uniform, and must be properly marched to and from the Ranges. The officer in charge will be held *personally responsible* that all target practices are carried out as laid down in the Standing Orders, Section VII., and that the necessary flags, discs, &c., are provided and in order for use.

22. The power in regard to ordinary promotions of non-commissioned officers, and to reductions to a lower grade or to the ranks, will be exercised by the Officer Commanding Cadets. The power of dismissal for misconduct, &c., will also be exercised by this officer, subject to the approval of the Commandant.

23. All correspondence relative to cadet detachments shall invariably be addressed to the Staff Officer.

24. Uniform—

The uniform of all detachments shall be of the same pattern, as approved by the Commandant. All cadets must wear the numeral of the battalion to which they belong on the shoulder straps, and a special school badge, not exceeding 1 inch square on each front side of the jacket, may be worn, if such be approved by the Officer Commanding Cadets.

25. Minimum establishment of company—

3 Lieutenants.
1 Colour-Sergeant.
3 Sergeants.
4 Corporals.
1 Bugler.
60 Cadets, of whom 4 may be Lance-Corporals, if required.

—
Total, 72 all ranks.

—
Proportionate numbers in detachments or companies allowed, officers and non-commissioned officers *pro rata*.

26. Cadets on leaving the detachments, provided they have also left school, may obtain from the Officer Commanding Cadets a certificate of discharge, specifying length of service and general conduct.

27. The officer in charge or (where there is no officer) Head Master of each school in which a detachment is formed will keep the Muster Roll Book of the prescribed form, and be responsible that such returns as are required by Head-Quarters be forwarded to the Officer Commanding Cadets.

28. The various battalions shall be commanded by officers approved of by the Commandant. Battalion Commanders, if of the rank of Captain, may be recommended for the rank of Major, after five years' service as such, by the Commandant. Where a battalion consists of at least four companies, the two senior Lieutenants, after three years' service, on passing the prescribed examinations, may be recommended for the rank of Captain.

29. Commissioned officers unable to maintain an effective detachment, or to remain actively connected with the Cadet Corps, may be placed upon the Unattached List of the Cadet Corps. Failing a return to active duty within two years their commissions may be cancelled.

30. All commissioned officers may be placed on the Retired List on reaching the age of 55 years, unless specially retained on active duty by the Commandant.

SENIOR CADET BATTALION.

31. Senior cadet detachments may be established in such places as may be recommended by the Officer Commanding Cadets, and must consist of not less than 20 members between the ages of 15 and 19 years of age. A room must be available in which the Government property issued to the detachment may be stored, and a guarantee must be obtained from some responsible person that he will be liable for its safe care and custody. The services of a qualified instructor as officer in charge must be obtained before the detachment can be recognised. No senior cadet must remain a member after the age of 20 years.

32. Senior cadets who have served not less than 12 months, are 17 years of age or upwards, and fulfil the regulations as regards height and physique may present themselves at the Recruits' Examination for enrolment in any corps of Militia, Mounted Rifles, or Rangers. Every candidate must produce a recommendation from the officer commanding his detachment as to general character, fitness for examination in drill, and certifying as to the above-mentioned requirements. Cadets so enlisted, if passed by the Inspecting Officer, will at once be taken on the strength of the corps joined, but will be required to undergo the course of musketry for recruits.

33. The uniform of all detachments shall be of the same pattern, to be approved by the Commandant.

34. When officers of the Senior Cadet Battalion are transferred to any other branch of the Military Forces their connexion with the Cadet Corps shall cease.

EFFECTIVE ALLOWANCE.

35. During the month of January in each year the following annual allowance will be paid, subject to the amount being voted by Parliament, viz.:—

In order that the above amounts may be claimed, the following conditions must be observed:—

OFFICERS.

(a) Each officer must provide his own uniform, of the approved pattern, and must have been appointed to his detachment three months previous to the 31st of December.

(b) The allowance to officers may be stopped or reduced at the discretion of the Commandant if, in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer, the battalion or detachment is not in a satisfactory state.

(c) Officers in command of detachments must keep a complete record of all drills and rifle practice of their detachments, to be produced at the official inspection, and provide the necessary books showing the payments received and the expenditure incurred by them on behalf of their detachments.

(d) No payments will be made to officers of detachments which have been disbanded during the periods above named, or to any officer unconnected with an effective detachment.

(e) In the event of an officer in command of a detachment being transferred or removed from a school in which a detachment exists, he shall render to his successor, as officer of the detachment, or, failing such being appointed, to the Principal or Head Master of the school, a true and correct account of all receipts and expenditure received and incurred up to date before being relieved of his responsibility.

(f) Every officer in command of a detachment, or, where no officer is appointed, the Principal or Head Master of the school, shall sign the approved document making himself personally responsible for the disbursement of the effective allowance. If he declines to do this, the corps will be disbanded.

CADETS.

36—

(a) The effective allowance will be paid for all cadets in uniform inspected by the Head-quarters Cadet Staff, or an officer appointed by the Commandant, between the 1st of July and the 31st of December.

(b) At the official inspection, a certificate from the officer in charge, or, in case of no officer being appointed, the Principal or Head Master of the school, must be produced, showing that each cadet has attended at least 12 detachment drills and 3 battalion parades during the current year, and has also gone through the musketry course for the same period, as directed by the Commandant.

(c) In detachments without an officer, no allowance will be made unless the detachment is instructed in drill and put through the musketry course by some competent person to be approved by the Commandant.

DETACHMENTS.

37. The allowance of £1 per detachment will not be paid unless at the official inspection at least 20 effective cadets are on the roll of the detachment. This allowance may be stopped or reduced by the Commandant if, in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer, the detachment is in an unsatisfactory state.

PAYMENTS.

38—

(a) The effective allowance for officers, cadets, and detachments, if approved by the Commandant, will be drawn by the officer commanding each detachment, or, failing such officer being in charge, by the Principal or Head Master of the school, and shall be applied to the supply and maintenance of uniform, expenses incidental to musketry practice, drills, camps, and exercises. On no account is any allowance to be given to a cadet.

(b) All claims for effective allowance must be rendered on the forms supplied from Head-Quarters, and before being paid must be countersigned by the Inspecting Officer and approved by the Commandant.

And the Honorable Robert Reid, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to adjust the conterminous boundaries of the City of Hawthorn and the Shire of Malvern: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, for the purpose of adjusting the conterminous boundaries of the said city and the said shire, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said city and the said shire respectively, in manner following, that is to say:—

HAWTHORN CITY.

Commencing at a point on the east bank of the Yarra Yarra River, being the centre of the road forming the northern boundary of portion 28, parish of Boroondara; bounded on the north by the centre of said road bearing east, south side of the said road forming the northern boundaries of portions 28, 29, 35, and 69, until it intersects the west boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a prolongation of the centre line of the before-mentioned road passing through portion 70 bearing east fifty-six chains twenty links to the eastern boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a line bearing east fifty links to the centre of a road (west side of said road forming the eastern boundaries of portions 70, 93, 94, 97, 98, 101, 102, 104a, 105a, 106a, and 108); thence following the centre of the said road south until it intersects the north bank of the Kooyongkoot or Gardiner's Creek; thence by the said north bank of the Kooyongkoot or Gardiner's Creek north-westerly to Tooronga-road; thence north-westerly to Toorak-road by the channel recently constructed and substituted for the Kooyongkoot or Gardiner's Creek; and thence further north-westerly by the said creek to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River; and thence by the north and east banks of the Yarra Yarra River to the commencing point.

MALVERN SHIRE.

Commencing at a point on the Yarra Yarra River where the Kooyong-road abuts thereon; thence easterly by the said river to the Kooyongkoot or Gardiner's Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to Toorak-road; thence south-easterly to Tooronga-road by the recently constructed channel (substituted for the Kooyongkoot or Gardiner's Creek); and thence further south-easterly by the said creek to the north-east angle of allotment 188, parish of Prahran; thence south by a road to the Dandenong-road; thence north-westerly by that road to the Kooyong-road aforesaid; and thence north by that road to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along any river, creek, or road, whether same is specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

RIDDELL'S CREEK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.

A Regulation of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust, made under the powers conferred by the "Water Act 1890," for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Romsey in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1894, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894.

The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1894, and the second portion of instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of July, 1894. Such person as the Commissioners of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover all rates and charges due to the said Trust.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.
2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.
3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables, the charges shall be Five shillings for every stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.
4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1894.
5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1894.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July:—

(1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the time being, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every one thousand gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the event of their being no such contract Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, or plastering, the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than one-quarter but not exceeding one-half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed by the Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust this 7th day of October, 1893, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

THE SHIRE OF DIMBOOLA AND THE LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 112 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of its municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Waterworks Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Dimboola is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire, that is to say, a sum of One hundred pounds (£100), for the purpose of paying interest on moneys borrowed by the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust: His Excellency the Governor in Council has therefore consented to the said sum of One hundred pounds (£100) being applied by the Municipal Council of the said Shire of Dimboola from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulations:—

No. 43.—URBAN DISTRICT OF DONALD.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Donald, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.
3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1894, commencing on the 1st of January, 1894, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1894, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

No. 44.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Murtoa, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.
3. For all tenements in the said Urban District, situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1894, commencing on the 1st of January, 1894, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1894, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. 43 and 44, were made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 17th day of October, 1893.

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 45.

Regulation for the making of a Rate for the year 1894 on all rateable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water under the provisions of the *Victorian Water Act*, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of March, 1886.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 17th day of October, 1892, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud Division, the Shire of Borung Division, the Shire of Kara Kara Division, the Shire of Dunnunkle Division, and the Shire of Stawell Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such several divisions, and that the proportion in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows (that is to say):—That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Borung Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Kara Kara Division, Nineteen pence; Shire of Dunnunkle Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Stawell Division, Fifteen pence.

And whereas the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, by Proclamation dated 28th June, 1886, proclaimed a certain area in and around the township of Murtoa to be an Urban District under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* (No. 778).

And whereas by further Proclamation, dated the 29th December, 1887, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria proclaimed a certain area in and around the township of Donald to be an Urban District under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887* (No. 946).

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said Urban Districts of Murtoa and Donald, according to the valuation existing on the 1st day of January, 1894, on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Borung, Kara Kara, Dunnunkle, and Stawell respectively (that is to say):—On rateable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Borung Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Kara Kara Division, a rate of Nineteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunnunkle Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Stawell Division, a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1894, commencing on the 1st of January, 1894, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1894, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1894.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates or such portion thereof as they may be appointed to demand and receive.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 45, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 17th day of October, 1893.

BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

Regulation for graduated rate by the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under the *Water Act 1890*.

WHEREAS the moneys received during the year 1892 by the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust were not sufficient to provide for the payment of the sums due by such Trust to the Board of Land and Works for the payment of the interest due upon the loan contracted by such Trust, and for all the other lawful expenses incurred by such Trust in the control and management of the said Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust:

And whereas it is anticipated that the moneys receivable by the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust during the year 1893 will not without a rate be sufficient to meet the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the said Trust of the year 1893, and it is therefore necessary to make a rate to meet as well the said deficiency in the revenue of the year 1892 as the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the year 1893:

And whereas by an Order made by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of August, 1892, the district of the said Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was divided into four divisions in the said Order:—

The Werribee Division,
The Parwan Division,
The Urban Division,
The Lower Parwan Division.

And whereas the said Order in Council directed that the respective rating in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said divisions shall be—

The Werribee Division	...	Three shillings.
The Parwan Division	...	One shilling.
The Urban Division	...	One shilling.
The Lower Parwan Division	...	Nil.

And whereas the Commissioners of the said Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust have, in accordance with the said recited Order in Council, determined, for the several purposes authorized in the said Act, to make the rate set out in the following Regulation, and have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, submitted such rate and regulation for the approval of the Governor in Council, who has, by Order in Council made on the 8th day of August, 1892, given his approval to the same, and such approval was published on the 12th day of August, 1892, in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

Now therefore the Commissioners of the said Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and for the several purposes authorized by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the Order in Council of the 8th day of August, 1892, do, upon this 27th day of May, 1893, make the Regulation to which the Governor in Council has given his approval by Order in Council as above recited by the Regulation following, that is to say:—

The rate hereinafter specified is that which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the aforesaid divisions shall pay in respect of the term of one year from the 1st day of January, 1893, to the 31st day of December, 1893, on all lands and tenements according to the municipal valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements during the said year, that is to say:—

On rateable property within the Werribee Division, a rate of Three shillings in the pound sterling of such valuation.
On rateable property within the Parwan Division, a rate of One Shilling in the pound sterling of such valuation.
On rateable property within the Urban Division, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the 1st day of July, 1893.

Such person or persons appointed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to collect and recover said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 27th day of May.

LANCEFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION No. 5.

THE Commissioners of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away any water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach.

4. When water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, viz., all pipes half-an-inch except where a special agreement is made.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carrier's stables, or for manufacturing purposes.

6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. Before any such licence being granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

8. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be round and free from all defects, and capable of a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

9. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least One million (1,000,000) gallons.

10. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

12. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fixed plugs. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

14. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any premises or of any land or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

15. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from an officer of the Trust that such pipes require repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

17. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of supplying or feeding the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

18. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

19. The service-pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main.

20. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

21. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or land, through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

23. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Lancefield Waterworks Trust.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.

No. 3.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1894 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be One pound per annum for each and every additional allotment.

4. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1894.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGU- LATION FOR 1894.—No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

(1) For every house or tenement, used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment; minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

(2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement by the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

(4) Any person who may or shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water shall be supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1894, commencing from the 1st January, as also the charges for every steam-boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable in one payment on 1st July, 1894.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on 1st day of January, 1894, and 1st July, 1894.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.
