PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Goulburn;*

THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday and Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale, and as a Bank Holiday at Allansford and Warrnambool;

FRIDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,
as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Borough of Clunes, and as a Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of Creswick, and at Kingston and Newlyn;

WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Malmesbury;

THURSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,
as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Merriang.

BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA. — PORTION OF STREET NOT REQUIRED FOR PUBLIC TRAFFIC.

WHEREAS the portion of street coloured red in the plan deposited in the Department of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, is within the borough of Wangaratta, and is part of a surveyed, reserved, and proclaimed street. And whereas it is alleged that the said portion of street is no longer required for public traffic, and the question whether the said portion of street is or is not required for public traffic has been referred to the council of the said borough and to the Honorable John McIntyre in his capacity as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering section 428 of the *Local Government Act 1890*.

Now therefore the said council and the said John McIntyre as such Minister as aforesaid, having taken the said question into their consideration, do, under the powers vested in them by this present instrument under the common seal of the borough of Wangaratta and the hand and seal of the said John McIntyre as such Minister as aforesaid, hereby decide that the said portion of street is no longer required for public traffic.
