REGULATIONS FOR THE ERECTION OF PRIVATE TELEPHONE LINES.

THE following Regulations for the Erection of Private Telephone Lines were approved of by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 26th September, 1893:—

### REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

In country districts a private person may be allowed to erect poles and wires for a telephone line mainly upon his own land, provided such line be used exclusively for his own private purposes, and be not run from a point in the vicinity of a telegraph office to another point in a like vicinity, upon payment in advance of a licence-fee to the Postmaster-General of £1 per mile per annum for the first four miles; after that, 10s. per mile or fraction thereof per annum; provided, nevertheless, that the licence-fee shall, in no case, exceed £7 per annum.

Where the line may cross or run along public roads or tracks, the height of the wire above the highest portion of the road or track shall not be less than 18 feet, and the poles carrying the wire at such places shall be of a substantial character, and be strutted or stayed, if necessary, to stand the strain of the wire.

All fittings upon such poles, such as brackets, pins, insulators, wire, &c., shall be of approved material and make.

The person wishing to erect the line must submit a plan and specification showing the route to be followed, especially marking where roads are to be crossed or entered upon, and describing the nature and dimensions of the materials to be used in the construction of the line, and any other particulars which may be required, upon receipt of which the Postmaster-General may direct an officer of the Post Office and Telegraph Department to examine such plan and specification and, if necessary, make an inspection of the route, the cost of such examination and inspection to be borne by the person wishing to erect the line; and should the report of such officer disclose that the line will not, in any way, interfere with or endanger any other line of telegraph, whether belonging to the Postmaster-General, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, or any private person, and that the material and method of erection described in the specification are satisfactory, the Postmaster-General, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, or any p

such inspection to be borne by the person who erected the line. If the work be not to the satisfaction of the inspecting officer, he shall issue instructions as to what is required, and on the defects being made good, a licence to use the line may be issued.

Should the person to whom permission has been granted to creet the line fail to make good the defects pointed out, the Postmaster-General may take such steps as he may deem necessary to remove the portions objected to, and the person seeking the licence to use the line shall be prohibited from so doing until the requirements of the Postmaster-General have been satisfactorily compiled with.

The Postmaster-General may direct an official inspection of such lines to be made periodically; and the officer making such inspection may direct the licensee to make such alterations or repairs as may to him appear necessary, and the licensee shall immediately carry out the same; and in the event of his failing to do so within a reasonable time, the officer shall report to that effect, and the licensee to use such line shall be cancelled.

The licensee shall be wholly responsible for the repairs and maintenance of the line, and he shall undertake to maintain the same in a thoroughly efficient manner, at his own cost; and any alterations, repairs, or other works which the Postmaster-General may, in the interests of public safety or convenience, order to be done, shall be charged to the licensee, and may be recovered by the ordinary process of law.

The licensee shall undertake that the line shall be used for his own private purposes only, and in no case shall he charge or accept a fee for the use of the line or for the transmission of any communication over the same; and in the event of it being proved that the has done so at any time, the licence may be cancelled, and he may be proceeded against for an infringement of the Post Office Act.

In the event of the licensee, line being found to interfers in

proved that he has done so at any time, the licence may be cancelled, and he may be proceeded against for an infringement of the Post Office Act.

In the event of the licensee's line being found to interfere in any way with the future erection of any lines by the Postmaster-General may direct the licensee's line to be altered, remaster-General may direct the licensee's line to be altered, removed, re-erected in another position, or otherwise dealt with as may be deemed necessary.

The licensee shall be solely responsible for any damage which may arise to life, limb, or property which may be caused by the poles, wire, or other portions of the line erected by the licensee.

Where the line is required to be erected partly on poles the property of the licensee, the latter shall pay at the rate of £4 per annum per mile over that distance for the portion erected on the Government poles, but the wire erected on such poles shall be erected and maintained by the Postmaster-General.

In cases where the licensee requires the line to be connected with a post and telegraph office for the purpose of transmitting and receiving telegrams, a fee of £5 5s. per annum will be charged in cities and large towns, and £2 2s. in small towns, in addition to the rates herein quoted. It must be understood that the usual telegraphic rates will be charged in addition to the above on all telegrams transmitted over the lines beyond the office connected, or for delivery from that office.

# TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

### SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

I T is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 1st December, 1892, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next. Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists. The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from the 27th November to the 1st December inclusive.

December inclusive.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is to frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

In all such cases where the municipal valuation exceeds Sixteen pounds a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid.

In every case where water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid; also, that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter, water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

No person shall drive or conduct any wheeled vehicle of whatever kind for the transport of passengers, timber, or merchandise of any description, or any piece of machinery, over or across any portion of any bridge within the shire of Orbost, evceeding in weight of vehicle and load thereon the amount of two tons for every pair of wheels coming in contact with the roadway and bearing the weight of such vehicle, unless by the written consent of the secretary or engineer for the time being of the Shire of Orbost, and subject to such conditions as may be stated in such written consent, and for the period of time limited thereby.

2. No person shall cause any sledge or vehicle without wheels to be drawn or driven or conveyed across or over any portion of any such bridge without the written assent of, and subject to the conditions and limitation as to time stated in the last section, I.

3. No person shall cause any injury to the abutments, floor, side rails, or any portion of any such bridge.

4. No person shall ridge or drive any horse or horses, vehicle, or cattle over any such bridge except at a walking pace.

If any person be found guilty by any bench of magistrates having jurisdiction of any wilful or negligent act of commission or misfeasance contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall, in addition to the damages thereby done, or the said surveyor or engineer's estimated cost of repairing or making good such damage, if such be under the amount of Twenty pounds, forfeit and pay as penalty for each such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, provided the total amount of such penalties do not exceed the sum of Twenty pounds.
