REGULATIONS, ETC., MADE BY HER MAJESTY'S HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC.

THE following Despatch from Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosures, are published for general information.

MY LORD,

I have the honour to forward herewith copies of the following Regulations made under the authority of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893:—

No. 3 of 1893, Arms Amendment.
No. 4 of 1893, Liquor Prohibition.
No. 5 of 1893, Gilbert Group.

I also forward copies of a Rule of Court with regard to judgments against natives of the Gilbert Islands.

The effect of Regulations 3 and 4 is to extend the provisions of the Arms and Liquor Prohibition Regulations to all persons residing within the limits of the British Protectorates in the Western Pacific.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name of and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893)

TO PROHIBIT THE SUPPLY OF ARMS, AMMUNITION, AND EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

1. IN this Regulation the expression "Western Pacific" means and includes any of the following islands or places, namely:—

(1) The Groups of Islands known as—

The Union Islands.
The Phoenix Islands.
The Ellice Islands.
The Gilbert Islands.
The Solomon Islands, not included in the German Protectorate.
The Santa Cruz Islands.

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(2) All other islands within the limits of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893 (with the exception of the Tongan and Samoan Islands).

2. The expression "the waters of the Western Pacific Islands" means the waters within three miles of any of the islands or places included in the Western Pacific Islands.

The word "arms" means every kind of firearms and any part or parts of firearms.

The word "ammunition" means every kind of ammunition for firearms and any material for the preparation thereof.

The expression "explosive substance" means gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, gun-cotton, blasting powder, and every other substance used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion.

The word "native" shall mean and include any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean other than a person of European descent.

2. British vessels within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands and vessels within the territorial waters of such of the said islands as are for the time being British settlements, or under the protection of Her Majesty, shall not carry arms or ammunition. But this prohibition shall not be held to prevent or forbid the carriage by any such vessel for the protection of the same and of the persons therein, and otherwise for the ordinary lawful purposes of such vessel, of arms and ammunition in quantities not exceeding those herein specified, viz:—

One rifle or shot-gun and one pistol for every member of the crew of such vessel, whose names shall be on the articles, and for every *bona fide* passenger (other than a native) on board such vessel.

One hundred rounds of ammunition for every such rifle, shot-gun, or pistol on board.

Cannons or swivel guns forming part of the ordinary equipment of any such vessel, together with one hundred rounds of ammunition for every such gun.

The carriage of arms and ammunition as cargo consigned to, and intended only for the use of, a person (other than a native) resident within the Western Pacific Islands, shall be deemed to be an ordinary lawful purpose of such vessel, provided always that the total amount of arms and ammunition carried on board such vessel shall not exceed the above specified quantities.

3. Persons within the Western Pacific Islands subject to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court shall not give, sell, or otherwise supply any arms, ammunition, or explosive substance to any native.

4. Any person subject to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court who shall carry, or aid or abet the carriage of, any arms or ammunition in any British vessel within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands, except as permitted by this Regulation, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

5. Every person subject to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court who shall, within the Western Pacific Islands, give, sell, or otherwise supply, or aid or assist in supplying, any arms, or any single firearm, or any ammunition or explosive substance to any native, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

6. Any person guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to punishment as follows:—

- (1) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour, and with or without a fine not exceeding Ten pounds; or
- (2) A fine alone, not exceeding Ten pounds, without any imprisonment.

7. Regulation No. 1 of 1893, intituled "A Regulation to Prohibit the Supply of Arms, Ammunition, and Explosive Substances to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands" is hereby repealed; but any offence against such Regulation committed before the coming into force of this Regulation may be dealt with and shall be punishable as if such Regulation were still in force.

8. This Regulation may be cited as "The Arms Regulation Amendment Regulation, 1893."

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893)

TO PROHIBIT THE SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

[L.S.] John B. Thurston.

1. In this Regulation the expression "Western Pacific Islands" shall mean and include any of the following islands or places, namely:—

The Groups of Islands known as—
The Friendly Islands.
The Navigator's Islands.
The Union Islands.
The Phoenix Islands.
The Ellice Islands.
The Gilbert Islands.
The Solomon Islands.
The New Hebrides Islands.
The Santa Cruz Islands.

All other islands within the limits of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893.

"Native" shall mean and include in its reference any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean other than a person of European descent.

"Intoxicating liquor" shall include all spirituous compounds and all fermented liquors, and any mixture part whereof is spirituous or which contains fermented liquors, and any mixture or preparation containing any drug capable of producing intoxication.

2. Every person subject to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court who, within the Western Pacific Islands, sells or gives or otherwise supplies, either directly or indirectly, to any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands, any intoxicating liquor shall, on conviction thereof before the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner, be liable to punishment as follows:—

- (1) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour, and with or without a fine not exceeding Ten pounds; or,
- (2) A fine alone, not exceeding Ten pounds, without any imprisonment.

3. It shall not be an offence under this Regulation for any person to give to any native for any urgent cause or necessity, and without recompense or remuneration, any intoxicating liquor when such intoxicating liquor is given solely and purely for medicinal purposes; but it shall rest with the person giving such intoxicating liquor to prove to the satisfaction of the Court the existence of such urgent necessity, and, failing such proof, such person shall be liable to the punishment provided in section two hereof.

4. Regulation No. 4 of 1888, intituled "A Regulation to Prohibit the Supply of Intoxicating Liquors to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands" is hereby repealed; but any offence against such Regulation committed before the coming into force of this Regulation may be dealt with and shall be punishable as if such Regulation were still in force.

5. This Regulation may be cited as "The Liquor Regulation, 1893."

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name of and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893)

FOR THE BETTER ADMINISTRATION OF GOVERNMENT WITHIN THE PROTECTORATE ESTABLISHED BY HER MAJESTY IN THE GILBERT GROUP AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Interpretation.

1. In this Regulation the word "native" shall mean aboriginal native of any island in the Pacific, domiciled in the Gilbert Group, and not being a subject of any civilized Power.

"Recruit" shall mean recruit for the purpose of employment on land beyond the limits of the Protectorate established by Her Majesty in the Gilbert Group.

The term "Resident Commissioner" shall mean the British Resident Commissioner in the Gilbert Group.

PART I.

TO PROVIDE A REVENUE FOR THE PURPOSES OF ADMINISTRATION.

1. Whereas the Chiefs and Elders of the various Native Governments have agreed to levy a tax on natives for the purposes of the Administration of the Protectorate; and whereas such Chiefs and Elders have requested the High Commissioner to make Regulations providing for charges to be made for trading licences and for other taxes to be paid by non-native persons.

2. On and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, it shall be unlawful to trade in the Gilbert Group except under a licence obtained in the manner provided in this Regulation.

3. A sum of Six pounds shall be paid for every such licence.

4. Every trade licence shall determine on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which such licence came into force, and shall only apply to the island for which it is issued.

5. It shall be lawful for any person or firm holding a trade licence to trade either directly or through agents in any part of the island in respect of which such trade licence is issued. But if any person trading as an agent also trade on his own account it shall be necessary for him to obtain a trade licence on his own behalf in addition to the licence required by the person or firm for whom he acts as agent.

6. Trading on board vessels within the territorial waters of any island in the Gilbert Group shall be considered to be trading on such island.

7. A poll-tax of One pound shall be paid on the first day of January in every year by every non-native person, except an ordained minister of religion, resident in the Gilbert Group; and a like tax shall, after a residence of two months, be paid by every non-native person, except as aforesaid, who shall come into the said group between the said first day of January and the thirty-first day of December in any year.

8. Trade licences available for any island in the Gilbert Group may be obtained from the Resident Commissioner, or at the office in Fiji of the High Commissioner.

9. The Resident Commissioner shall appoint persons to receive the taxes provided for in this Regulation, and to issue trade licences available only in the islands in respect of which such persons may be appointed. Every such person receiving taxes shall at the earliest opportunity forward the amount received to the Resident Commissioner.

10. Any person trading, whether on his own account or as agent for some other person or firm, and every person employing an agent to trade for him without the necessary licence having been obtained, shall be liable to a fine of One hundred pounds.

11. Any person neglecting to pay the annual tax of One pound provided for in this Regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

PART II.

TO RESTRICT THE SALE OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

12. On and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises shall be unlawful throughout the Gilbert Group. Any person offending against this section, whether such person be buyer or seller, shall for each offence be liable to a fine of Twenty pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding one month.

PART III.

TO PREVENT THE SALE OF NATIVE LANDS.

13. The sale of land owned by natives to non-native persons shall be unlawful.

14. If any non-native person enter into a lease of land owned by a native, he shall forthwith submit such lease to the Resident Commissioner, who shall at a convenient opportunity make inquiry of the native lessor and of the native authorities of the island in which the land sought to be leased shall be situated. If it shall appear that the lease is for a period of more than twenty-one years, or that the land sought to be leased is not the

property of the proposed lessor, or that the lease has been unfairly obtained, or that the terms are manifestly to the disadvantage of the native lessor, or that there will not be left sufficient land to support the family of the lessor, or if the lease is otherwise contrary to sound public policy, the Resident Commissioner shall refuse to confirm such lease; otherwise the Resident Commissioner shall make a copy of such lease in a book to be kept for the purpose, and shall make an indorsement on the lease to the effect that the lease has been confirmed and registered, and shall make a charge of Ten shillings for every such registration of lease. The registration of the lease shall not be conclusive evidence of title as against a person not claiming through the vendor.

15. In the event of the refusal of the Resident Commissioner to confirm a lease, it shall be unlawful for the intended lessee or any person claiming under him to deal or attempt to deal with the land intended to be leased otherwise than as a tenant at will.

PART IV.

WITH REGARD TO EMIGRATION.

16. Any person engaged in or assisting in recruiting natives otherwise than in accordance with this Regulation shall be liable to a fine of One hundred pounds or six months' imprisonment or both.

17. Subject to the provisions of this Regulation it shall be lawful to recruit natives for any place within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of any British Possession: Provided that a licence for the purpose has been duly granted by the Government of such British Possession.

18. Natives may be recruited for places not being within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of a British Possession, provided that a licence has been obtained from the High Commissioner, or from any person authorized by the High Commissioner to issue such licences. Every such licence shall state the name of the vessel in which the native labourers are to be carried, the name of the master, the number that may be recruited, and the conditions regarding accommodation, water, and food supply, and the stock of medicines and medical appliances to be kept on board. The licence will be accompanied by a form of contract approved and certified by the High Commissioner, or by a person authorized by him for that purpose.

19. Any failure to comply with the conditions of the licence, and the making of any agreement not in accordance with the terms of the form of agreement provided for above, shall be deemed to be a breach of this Regulation.

20. It shall be unlawful to recruit any native apparently under the age of sixteen years without the consent of the parents or guardians of such native, or to recruit any married woman whose husband is not also recruited at the same time and for the same place.

21. The Resident Commissioner may at any time inspect any vessel engaged in recruiting natives, and may examine the stores, provisions, and water supply on board, and the labourers recruited. The Resident Commissioner may, if he think fit, order any labourer recruited to be put on shore and the contract to be cancelled. The Resident Commissioner may also order the vessel to take its final departure from the group from an island or anchorage to be named by him.

22. The Resident Commissioner may, in the event of the absence of an undue proportion of the adult males, or for any other reason which to him seems good, prohibit, either for a specified time or until further notice, recruiting natives at any island or islands specified. Such prohibition shall be reported forthwith to the High Commissioner, who may vary or rescind the same, and who will take such steps as may appear advisable to make such prohibition public. No person who, but for the provisions of this section, would be legally recruiting natives shall be liable to punishment for recruiting at an island at which recruiting is prohibited unless it is shown that such person had special notice of such prohibition. But any labourer so recruited shall, if still within the waters of the Gilbert Group, be landed as soon as the prohibition becomes known.

PART V.

WITH REGARD TO CURRENCY.

23. All taxes, fees, and fines shall be payable in coin of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

24. In all cases of contract or of debt coming before the Court, in which the cause of action shall have arisen in the Gilbert Group, the word "dollar" shall be deemed to mean "silver Mexican dollar" unless it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Court that another meaning was attached to it at the time that the contract was entered into or the debt incurred.

25. In the case of a contract by which dollars are expressed to be payable in English money, a dollar shall be deemed to be the equivalent of four English shillings.

PART VI.

WITH REGARD TO CONTRACTS MADE WITH NATIVES.

26. The High Commissioner's Court shall entertain no action brought against a native for money lent, goods supplied, work done, or for passages on board vessels, in the Gilbert Group, subsequently to the declaration of Her Majesty's Protectorate over the group.

27. This Regulation may be cited as "The Gilberts Regulation, 1893."

114. When a judgment or order for payment of money has been made against an aboriginal native of the Gilbert Group, and such judgment or order remains unsatisfied, an application for the sale of such native's lands shall not be entertained by the Court.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

The births of 1,307 children, viz., 661 boys and 646 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. In the month of September, 1,271 births were registered, or 36 less than in the month under review. The births were 98 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 183 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 549, viz., 327 of males and 222 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 758, or 138 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in September by 93, and were below the average of October during the previous ten years by 32. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below that average by 167.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.75, and of deaths registered 1.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 84.8° on the 8th, and the lowest was 41.8° on the 11th. The mean temperature of the month (57.3°) was four-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.8°) took place on the 26th, and the least range (4.6°) on the 10th. The mean daily range was 16.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.185 inches on the 11th, and the lowest was 29.282 inches on the 17th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.810 inches) was a fraction of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 12 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.418 inches. The average rainfall in October during the previous ten years was 2.62 inches, or four-fifths of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 60 per cent., and females 40 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 28 per cent. to that mortality, as against 26 per cent. in October, 1892; 27 per cent. in October, 1891; 31 per cent. in October, 1890; 40 per cent. in October, 1889; 35 per cent. in October, 1888; and 36 per cent. in October, 1887.

Forty-five deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a solicitor and a storekeeper, each aged 75, died of apoplexy; a builder and a sailor, each aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of influenza; a female, aged 75, of phthisis; a female, aged 75, of insanity; a labourer, aged 76, of influenza; a male of no occupation, aged 76, of diabetes; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of insanity; two females, each aged 76, of pericarditis; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; a gentleman and a female, each aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of Bright's disease; a male of no occupation, aged 79, of apoplexy; a gardener, aged 80, of hemiplegia; a cabinetmaker, aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of influenza; a gentleman, aged 81, of enlarged prostate; a female, aged 83, of apoplexy; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of pneumonia; a carter, aged 84, of phthisis; a missionary, aged 84, of senile gangrene; a chemist, aged 86, of pericarditis; a female, aged 85, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 86, of pleurisy; a gentleman, aged 87, of ulceration of œsophagus; a publican and a female, each aged 75, a builder and a male of no occupation, each aged 77, a gardener and two females, each aged 79, four females, aged 80, 81, 82, and 85 respectively, a tailor, aged 87, a female, aged 88, and a female, aged 95, of old age.

Thirty-two deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which twenty were set down to accident, five to homicide, and seven to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 28, was killed by a lorry passing over him; a merchant, aged 26, by a horse falling on him; a printer and a quarryman, aged 14 and 68 respectively, died of injuries consequent on falls; a manufacturing chemist, aged 43, of fracture of the skull and legs, the result of an explosion; a rabbitier, aged 56, of wounds—how received not stated; a male infant, aged 2, was scalded, and a female, aged 35, was burnt to death; a female, aged 47, died whilst under chloroform properly administered; a boy, aged 13, a male of unknown occupation, aged 35, a female, aged 40, a cordial maker, aged 45, and a waiter, aged 62, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a seaman, aged 41, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a boy, aged 13, and a carrier, aged 54, at Coburg; a female, aged 25 days, was overlain; a male of no occupation, was suffocated whilst in an epileptic fit; a male infant, aged 1 month, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and a female infant, aged 14 and 21 days respectively, who were found dead; a new-born male infant and a female infant, aged 1 month, who were smothered; and a new-born female infant, who died of hæmorrhage from untied navel cord, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a barman and a sergeant of police, aged 30 and 38 respectively, who shot themselves; a merchant, aged 38, who stabbed himself; a male of unknown occupation, age unknown, who drowned himself; a jeweller, aged 42, and a broker, aged 47, who poisoned themselves, the former with chlorodyne and the latter with prussic acid; and a female, aged 52, who hanged herself.

One hundred and sixteen deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—54 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, and 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 151, of which 99, or 66 per cent., were of males, and 52, or 34 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 94 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 398. Of these, 228, or 57 per cent., were males, and 170, or 43 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 35 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 47 were between sixty and sixty-five, 27 were between sixty-five and seventy, 27 were between seventy and seventy-five, 25 were between seventy-five and eighty, 20 were upwards of eighty, and of one the age was unspecified.

The total number of deaths in the Metropolitan district from the first outbreak of measles in May to the end of October, was 380, of which, however, only three deaths occurred in the month under notice. Comparing October with the previous month, deaths from measles fell from 31 to 3; deaths from whooping-cough, from 6 to 2; deaths from diphtheria, from 9 to 4; and deaths from typhoid fever, from 2 to nil; whilst scarlet fever caused one death in both months. On the other hand, deaths from influenza increased from 8 to 20. Seven persons committed suicide during the month, which is a number above the average. Since the commencement of the year 49 suicidal deaths have been registered, as against 44 such deaths in the first ten months of 1892, and 45 such deaths in the first ten months of 1891.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in the first ten months of 1893, and of the four previous years:—

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1894.

THE Commissioners of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, do hereby make the following regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1894.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

1. For every house, land, or tenement under Twelve pounds ten shillings sterling annual municipal value the sum of One pound five shillings sterling.

2. For every house, land, or tenement valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings and upwards, according to the annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house, land, or tenement is situated, a rate of Ten pounds per centum upon the amount of such valuation shall be charged.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons shall be charged.

4. For every public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged unless supplied by measurement.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1894, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1894.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Moorooona Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

CAMPASPE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

REGULATION No. 1.

1. The charges of the Trust in respect of a supply of water from its works for domestic and stock purposes and irrigation shall be as follows:—

- (a) For the filling of a tank or dam between the 1st of May and the 31st of October in each year of a capacity not exceeding five hundred (500) cubic yards, Ten shillings; over five hundred and not exceeding one thousand (1,000) cubic yards, Fifteen shillings; and exceeding one thousand (1,000) cubic yards, Twenty shillings.
- (b) For the filling of a tank or dam between the 1st of November and the 30th of April in each year of a capacity not exceeding five hundred (500) cubic yards, Twenty shillings; over five hundred and not exceeding one thousand (1,000) cubic yards, Twenty-five shillings; and exceeding one thousand (1,000) cubic yards, One pound ten shillings.

2. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water for irrigation shall be by gauges, of form and pattern approved by the Trust, and fixed under the direction and to the satisfaction of the officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

3. No check, irrigation outlet, or other outlet from any of the Trust's channels or works shall be constructed until the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such check and outlet has entered into an agreement with the Trust to pay for such check or outlet.

4. Every check or outlet required shall be constructed by the Trust, and the cost of such check or outlet shall be borne by the owner or occupier of the land.

5. Every outlet used for irrigation purposes shall have a proper gauge fixed therein to indicate the quantity of water passing through such outlet.

6. Any person who shall construct any check or outlet from the works of the Trust without the supervision of its authorized officer, or in any manner other than that authorized by such officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by gravitation from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes, which shall include the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, and gardens, unless a garden irrigation right is taken out shall be—for crops of all kinds and of fallow lands, for each watering fourpence per inch per acre or any fractional part of an acre, and two inches shall be deemed a watering; for the irrigation of grass land by gravitation water, Threepence per inch per acre or for any fractional part of an acre, two inches to be deemed a watering, shall be the charge or rate for each watering. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by pumping from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes, including the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, and gardens, unless a garden irrigation right be taken out, shall be for each watering Sixpence per inch per acre or any fractional part of an acre, and three inches shall be deemed a watering.

8. *Garden Irrigation Rights.*—The rate or price to be paid for the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, or gardens, "for each owner or occupier may take out a garden irrigation right" for the period from the 1st day of January to the 31st of December in each year, or for any portion of the said period, shall be for water delivered either by gravitation or by pumping—for the first or one acre or any fractional part of an acre, Sixpence per inch, and 40 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation; for the second acre or fractional part of an acre, Sixpence per inch, and

30 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation; and for each additional acre or fractional part of an acre, Sixpence per inch, and 20 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation.

9. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a lesser quantity of water than is equal to the value of One pound; and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

10. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him, whereupon and before the delivery of the water shall be proceeded with he shall pay to the secretary of the Trust, or other officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose, the sum of money to which the quantity of water to be delivered to him will amount at the rate or price set forth in clause 7 and 8 of this regulation.

11. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances, open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

12. Any person not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust who shall open any irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

13. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust or waste or defile the water contained therein, and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

14. All checks and outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such check or outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust, in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

15. In the event of the Trust being unable from failure of the works or from any other cause to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust will not be answerable for any damage which may have been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

16. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

17. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 20th day of October, 1893.

REGULATION MAKING A RATE FOR 1894.

For every house or tenement under Ten pounds sterling annual value, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount equal to Ten pounds per centum per annum, or Two shillings in the pound.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust the sum of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in cases of special agreement.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1894.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

**BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS
TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following:—

REGULATION NUMBERED 12.

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust district, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 1s. per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel above the annual value of £30, the sum of £6 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, 10s. per annum for the first horse kept, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. each per annum.

Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be 2s. per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be 20s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1894, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge at 2s. per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 12, was made and adopted by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this 10th day of November, 1893.

WHEREAS by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby add to the Drawback Regulations made on the 1st day of May, 1893, the following Regulations, and also the following addition to Schedule No. 2 to the Drawback Regulations made on the 6th day of February, 1893: And doth further order that such additional Regulations and such addition to Schedule No. 2 shall take effect from the 21st day of November, 1893, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR DRAWBACK OF DUTY ON MEAT PRESERVED
IN VICTORIA FROM IMPORTED SHEEP AND CATTLE.

Any person or company engaged in the preservation of meat in Victoria from imported sheep or cattle may, on compliance with the Regulations hereinafter set forth, be allowed such amount of drawback of duty on such preserved meat as is specified in Schedule 2 of the Drawback Regulations.

Any such person or company shall give at least two working hours' notice to the Collector of Customs of the intention to export, and pass the necessary export entry for any preserved meat intended for export, specifying whether beef or mutton, to be verified at the time of being passed by the following declaration made and subscribed before a Justice of the Peace or an Officer of Customs:—

I do hereby declare that I am (the exporter or exporters) (I am the duly authorized representative of (the exporter or the exporters)) (I am a member of the firm (the exporter or the exporters), of the preserved meats in this entry, that the particulars therein contained are true and correct, that the meats are to be exported for use and consumption outside the colony of Victoria, that drawback on same is claimed on the quantities, values, and rates as specified in said entry, and that the meats are not of less value for home use than the amount of drawback claimed.

And I further declare that the said meats were prepared from sheep (or cattle) which were properly cleared at the Customs, and duty paid thereon, and that no drawback or rebate has been claimed or paid on the said sheep or cattle, and that the amount of drawback claimed does not exceed the amount of duty paid.

Declared before me at Melbourne this day of 189

Officer of Customs.

This declaration must be made by the exporter, or, if the exporter be a company, by the secretary or other person duly authorized under the seal of the company to make such declaration. The entry should be sent by the collector to such drawback or other officer for verification as he may approve.

Any such person or company shall keep an account showing the number of imported sheep and cattle and the brands thereof which have been purchased by such person or company, the number slaughtered and preserved, with the dates of their purchase and their being slaughtered and preserved, and shall render an abstract of such account made up for every three months ending 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December respectively, duly verified by such person, or, in the case of a company by the chairman and secretary of such company, making and subscribing the following declaration before a Justice of the Peace or a Commissioner for taking Declarations and Affidavits:—

"I hereby declare that the above statement, showing that the number of imported sheep or cattle which have been purchased by me (or by company), the number slaughtered and preserved, and the date of their purchase and of their being slaughtered and preserved, is true and correct in every particular; and I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of Parliament of Victoria rendering persons making a false declaration punishable for wilful and corrupt perjury."

Declared at in the colony of Victoria, this day of One thousand eight hundred and ninety-

Before me—

A drawback may be paid on the actual quantity of such preserved meat exported by any such person or company provided always that the quantity on which such drawback may be allowed shall not exceed the proportion of 11 lbs. weight of preserved mutton exported for every imported sheep, nor 240 lbs. weight of preserved beef for each head of imported cattle, appearing in such return as having been slaughtered and preserved during the aforsaid period.

Any such person or company desirous of availing themselves of these regulations shall at all times furnish any information required by the Collector of Customs, or permit him, or any officer deputed by him, to have access to the books, invoices, or other documents relating to the purchase or slaughtering of sheep or cattle, and the preservation of meat, and shall afford every facility for enabling such Collector of Customs to check the claims which may be rendered by such person or company.

The claim for any drawback should be rendered for fixed periods as aforsaid.

The general regulations shall apply to the export of preserved meat so far as the particular circumstances of same will permit.

1. 2. Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average-mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1894, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country. Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Friday, 22nd December, 1893.

NOTE.—The fee for the period from 1st January, 1894, to 31st December, 1894, and fee of Five shillings for Licence, must accompany each Tender.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works up to Noon on Friday, the 22nd December, 1893, for the occupation, for grazing purposes only, of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 123 of the Land Act 1890 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Under section 7 of the Vermin Destruction Act 1890, all licensees under the section for which these licences will issue are liable for the destruction of rabbits within the boundaries of their licences.

Conditions:

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the Land Act 1890, except under the 123rd section thereof, under which the licence is issued, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the Land Act 1890, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his licence-fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Division II. of the Land Act 1890 may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the Government Gazette that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest in the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

4. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

5. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or to fence any portion thereof.

6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the Government Gazette, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

Special Conditions:

1. The period of occupation will be from 1st January, 1894, to 31st December, 1894.

2. The licence-fee must be paid in advance. Every driver who shall fail to comply with this by-law shall forfeit a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.

By-Law No. 10.

No person shall drive along any road within the Shire of Bacchus Marsh any traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity if its weight exceeds ten tons, or so that the same engine or roller shall push or haul over any road in the said shire any tender or other vehicle if the weight of such tender or other vehicle, including its loading, exceeds ten tons; or if the pressure per inch of width of tire which any one of its wheels exerts upon the road exceeds the pressure per inch of width of tire of the heaviest-laden wheel of the engine pushing or hauling it, or if the minimum width of tire of such tender or other vehicle be less than eight inches, or so that any part of the said engine or roller shall be or remain upon the same bay, span, or arch of any bridge or culvert within the said shire at the same time as the tender or other vehicle or any part thereof pushed or hauled by the said engine or roller, unless the joint weight of the whole train, including the engine, be less than ten tons.

And no traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity shall proceed along or over any road within the said Shire before the hour of Eight p.m. or after the hour of Six a.m.

Any person offending against this by-law shall for every such offence forfeit a sum of not less than Ten pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

To the Directors of the St. James Building Society.

Gentlemen,—The balance-sheet submitted to us for the half-year ending 30th September, 1893, is a correct extract from the society's books. We have examined the fire policies and securities and find the same to be in order.

In our previous report we commented upon the fact that "some very large advances have been made to individual borrowers upon the security of leasehold property"; these, we think, should be distinguished from the rest of the society's business in the balance-sheet, in order to place before your proprietors a correct view of the society's affairs; and we would direct your attention to the advisableness of making some approximate estimate as to the society's present position, as with a loss as the net result of the half-year's operations it is self-evident that the assets cannot have the value shown in the balance-sheet.
