BY-LAW UNDER THE Health Act 1890.

No. 2. ·

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Avoca, in the name and on behalf of the President. Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 2, that is to say —

1st. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a night-cart duly licensed by the municipality.

2nd. No person shall deposit night-soil in any other place than that set apart for the purpose, and shall then only deposit it in the manner following, that is to say:—Cut a trench 4 feet wide and 2 feet deep, and on the night-soil being deposited therein to a depth not exceeding 9 inches immediately cover the same with clean earth to 6 inches above the surface.

3rd. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in that part of the Shire of Avoca contained within the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at a point where the production of Northstreet, in the township of Avoca, intersects the Avoca River; thence easterly by that street to Barnett-street; thence southerly by Barnett-street to Camp-street; thence westerly by Campstreet to Rutherford's Creek; thence northerly by that creek and the Avoca River to the commencing point.

4th. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he or she shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1894 on the annual shire valuation of the said urban district.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Water-works Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust area according to the municipal value of such properties, the minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

- S. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees and shrubs.
- 9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the council first obtained.

10. Any person committing in the park, or in any of the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the

- 1. Assaulting any person.
- 2. Being drunk.
- 3. Crossing or trespassing on the race course or playing ground during the time any race, cricket match, or other amusement is taking place, or when crossing or trespassing on the race-course or playing ground would be injurious to either of them.
- Using profane or obscene language.
- 5. Using abusive or insulting words.
- 6. Behaving improperly or riotously.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAWTHORN.

THE Council of the City of Hawthorn, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation purposes in the Municipal District of Hawthorn, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to -
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut or in any way damage the fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the reserve, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any littor.
- 5. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the reserve shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom and to prosecution for an offence regime these Regulations. an offence against these Regulations.

 6. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the council, shall bring into the reserve any horse or vehicle or any dog, unless the same beled by a chain or cord, or any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animal.

 7. No person shall ride a bicycle in the reserve, except by permission of the council.

 8. No person shall engage in cricket, football, lacrosse, or any other like game in the reserve without the authority, in writing, of the council, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

 9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the reserve any goods or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the council.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.
