### PENALTIES FOR FISHING PEARL SHELLS, ETC., IN THE TERRITORIAL WATERS OF NETHERLANDS- INDIA.

THE following Despatch from the Consul-General for the  
Netherlands to His Excellency the Governor, with its  
Enclosure, is published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

MY LORD,

The Governor-General of Netherlands-India sends me a copy  
of his decree of the 5th of October, 1893, fixing penalties for  
fishing pearl shells, mother-of-pearl shells, and trijang in the  
territorial waters of Netherlands-India by persons not belonging  
to the indigenous population without a proper licence.

On account of the proximity of Australian and Netherlands-  
Indian waters, the Governor-General desires me to make the pro-  
visions of his decree known in these colonies, and in compliance  
with his Order I have the honour herewith to forward to you an  
English translation of the decree, and ask you to be good enough  
to communicate it to your Government for general information.

### No. 261. PEARL FISHERY.—PENALTY FOR FISHING PEARL SHELLS, MOTHER-OF-PEARL SHELLS, AND TRIPANG IN THE TERRITORIAL WATERS OF NETHERLANDS-INDIA BY PERSONS NOT BELONGING TO THE INDIGENOUS POPULATION WITHOUT A LICENCE.

THE Governor-General of Netherlands-India, with the advice of  
the Council, &c., &c., &c., has been pleased to decree as  
follows:—

1. Whosoever not belonging to the indigenous population of  
Netherlands-India shall be the captain or substitute of the  
captain of any vessel fishing pearl shell, mother-of-pearl shell, or  
tripang in the territorial waters of Netherlands-India without  
permit of the Governor-General shall be liable to a fine of not  
less than Ten and not exceeding a Thousand guilders, or to be  
imprisoned for a term of not less than six days and not exceeding  
two years in the case of Europeans, and to a similar fine or  
forced labour without chain of not less than six days and not  
exceeding two years in the case of natives.

The tools and instruments used in fishing and the above-  
mentioned produces of the sea obtained against the provisions of  
this decree may be seized and forfeited at the discretion of the  
court.

In default of payment of the fine and law costs, payment  
shall be enforced by attachment and distress of the vessel.

2. For the purpose of this decree "fishing pearl shells, mother-  
of-pearl shells, and tripang" shall mean every way of obtaining  
those produces from the sea, irrespective of the means, tools, or  
instruments employed.

3. If a vessel not owned and manned by persons belonging to the indigenous population is met with in territorial waters of Netherlands-India without the permit mentioned in the first section of this decree, and having on board pearl shells, mother-of-pearl shells, or tripping, or tools or instruments for fishing same, the captain or his substitute shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this decree safe counterproof.

4. The commanders of Her Majesty's men-of-war, of the ships of the Government's navy, and of advice boats, and those under their orders commissioned by them for that purpose are authorized to trace offences against this decree. They have power to search vessels within the territorial waters of Netherlands-India which they suspect of committing or preparing actions against the provisions of this decree.

## PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1892* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of St. Arnaud which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of St. Arnaud, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Wirmbirchip."

Area described in petition:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment No. 11, parish of Corack; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the Lake Buloke Common to a road at the north-east angle of allotment 4A, parish of Corack; thence west by the said road to the south-west corner of allotment 75A; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 41; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 42; thence northerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 7, parish of Watchem; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 63; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 51; thence west by a road and by the line of that road produced to its intersection with the west boundary of the parish of Warmur; thence northerly by the west boundaries of the parishes of Watchem and Warmur, and a line in continuation thereof, to the northern boundary of mallee block 55A; thence east to its north-east angle; thence south and east by blocks 54A and 54B to the north-east angle of the parish of Jil Jil; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Jil Jil, Whirily, Karyrie, Narraport, and Corack to the south-east angle of allotment 12, parish of Corack; thence south by a road to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the shire as at present constituted is of great extent, and portions thereof are so far from the centre of local government that their interests are practically unrepresented; that the rapid increase and extension of settlement in the northern portion of the Central Riding, and more particularly in the mallee country, have, during the last few years, completely altered the relative numbers of the inhabitants and amounts of rateable property in the various portions of the shire, with the result that their interests are no longer identical with those of the remainder of the shire, &c.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of St. Arnaud, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Wirmbirchip," such municipality to be subdivided into three ridings.

## THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations, videlicet:-

96A. Subject as hereinafter mentioned, and so long as any of the berths herein referred to are not at any time appropriated for the exclusive accommodation of any particular person in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, there shall be paid to the commissioners in respect of the use by any vessel of any of the berths in the River Yarra Yarra known as berth No. 4, Queen's Wharf, berth No. 3, Prince's Wharf, berth No. 8, South Wharf, the Crane berth, Prince's Wharf, berth No. 16, South Wharf, and berth G, or such other unoccupied berth at the Coal Wharf, the sum of One halfpenny for every ton of the net register tonnage of such vessel for each day or part of a day that such vessel uses the whole or any part of any of the said berths; but the total sum to be paid for each day or part of a day that any vessel uses or occupies any of the said berths shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds, nor be less than Five shillings.

96B. Nothing herein contained shall apply to any vessel using the said Crane berth solely and exclusively for the purposes of and in accordance with Clause No. 128 of Part II. of the regulations of the commissioners made on the 30th day of November, 1891.

96C. The owner, master, or agent of every vessel which shall use or occupy any of the said Coal berths shall, before the vessel leaves the said berth, remove or cause to be removed from the wharf adjoining the said berth all coals or goods discharged upon the said wharf from the said vessel; and if any part of such coal or goods be not so removed, the said owner, master, or agent shall pay to the commissioners One farthing for every ton of the net register tonnage of such vessel for each day or part of a day that the said coal or goods are so left on the said wharf, but the said charge shall not be more than One pound or less than Five shillings per day. Nothing in this clause contained shall affect any power, right, or remedy of the commissioners or the Harbor-master to remove the said goods from the wharf, or any other liability either of the owner, master, or agent of the ship, or of the owner of the said goods, for not removing the same.

96D. These regulations shall be read and construed together with Part II. of the regulations made by the commissioners on the 30th day of November, 1891.

The new light will be exhibited from the column on which the present apparatus is placed; it will be visible over the anchorage, and from 14 miles seaward in clear weather, from N. 56° E. through West to S. 36° W. magnetic.

- The eclipse will occur every half-minute.

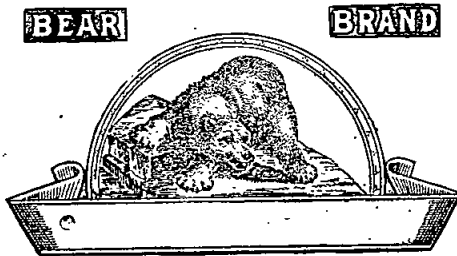

## BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 6.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following Regulation for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply by the Trust within the Urban Division, and for other purposes, during the calendar year 1894:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands, houses, and tenements situate in the Urban Division of the Trust area shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such lands, houses, or tenements situate on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied by water by reticulation from such pipes, for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1894, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates:—

- On every house, tenement, or lands a rate of Sixpence for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.
- For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping or any other purpose, a maximum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- For water supplied by the said Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (e) of section 1 of this Regulation), One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- For water supplied to Government departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, boating clubs, show-yards, cattle-yards, and recreation reserves, shall be charged by measurement at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 30,000 gallons per annum.
- Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except when in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary.

2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this regulation shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1894, and on the 1st day of July, 1894 (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this regulation, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

## BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 7.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. Where several houses or parts of houses in streets, courts, alleys, or rights-of-way in the separate occupation of several persons are supplied by one common pipe the several owners or occupiers of such houses or parts of houses in every such street, court, alley, or right-of-way shall be liable for the payment of the same rates for the supply of water as they would have been liable for if each of such several houses or parts of houses had been supplied with water from the works of the Trust by a separate pipe.

2. The Trust shall not be liable to any penalty or damages for not supplying water if the want of such supply arises from unavoidable cause or accident.

3. Every person who shall have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Trust, and in the event of any repairs thereto being required notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to the Trust. If any person who has

provided any meter so aforesaid shall fail to give the notice hereinbefore mentioned of any repairs required for such meter, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling. All meters must pass the Melbourne Water Supply test.

4. If any person who, under the provision herein contained, ought to provide any meter, neglect or refuse, after having been required by the Trust so to do, to provide such meter, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues.

5. The Trust may cause meters to be provided and fixed in any case where they may consider it necessary at the expense of the consumer, who shall keep and maintain the same in good working order; and the water supplied shall be charged for at a rate and charge to be annually made or by special arrangement, as the Trust shall determine.

6. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same shall be capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons and unless the same is approved, in writing, by the duly authorized officer of the Trust. If any meter should cease registering, or be found or reported to be out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it shall have been repaired and re-fixed either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous half-year or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

7. No person shall remove or alter the position of any meter when fixed without the written consent of the duly authorized officer of the Trust.

8. Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of the duly authorized officer of the Trust and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto. A meter shall not be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe or other pipe of the Trust unless permitted by a memorandum, in writing, under the hand of a duly authorized officer of the Trust. A meter shall not be continued to be used if it is found on being tested by the Trust's officer to be inaccurate.

9. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order, after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

10. If any plumber or other person fix or re-fix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the Trust without having first obtained a certificate from the Trust that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

11. If any person remove or alter the position of or in any way interfere with any meter without giving such notice as aforesaid, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the Trust, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Five pounds sterling for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

12. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

13. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes. The Trust may supply any person with water for domestic or for domestic and for other than domestic purposes by measure at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

14. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

15. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling.

16. Licences to affix and lay on, alter, or repair service-pipes to tap mains and sub-mains, and to do and execute generally the plumbing and other work necessary for laying on and maintaining water services, may be granted to persons who shall satisfy the Trust of their competency to perform such plumbing and other work upon payment of an annual fee of One pound sterling.

17. It shall not be compulsory on the Trust to grant a licence to every or any applicant who shall prove his competency.

18. In all and every case a licensee shall be responsible for the acts, errors, and omissions of his employees, and the Trust shall have the power to cancel the licence of any person at any time.

19. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be

liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

20. Applications to tap mains and sub-mains must, in every case, be accompanied by the proportion of rate due from time of tapping to 30th of June or 31st of December of one year as required.

21. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds sterling for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.

22. Wrought galvanized iron piping of approved quality and lead piping of the following weights only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Ordinary connexions with mains and sub-mains must be made with approved brass stop-cock ferrules and an approved length of lead piping. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with approved brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints, and in no case will bolt or copper bit joints be allowed either in the interior or exterior of any building. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap. One service-pipe only to each house, tenement, or land will be permitted.

23. No service-pipe of a larger bore than one half-inch will be permitted unless by the special consent of the Trust.

24. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust in the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any) and, if none, the owner shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds sterling for each day such offence is continued after notice thereof from the Trust.

25. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, and in the event of continuing such offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds sterling for each day the offence is continued after notice thereof from the Trust.

26. To prevent overflow, all water-troughs and cisterns must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, which shall at all times be maintained in good working order.

27. All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes of the Trust.

28. In every bath the inlets must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly water-tight ground outlet plug or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessel will not be permitted except where the supply is taken by measure.

29. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

30. The officers of the Trust may at all reasonable hours enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

31. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of this regulation, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything under this regulations which ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

The following regulations shall be observed by all persons in connexion with the laying of services, &c.:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., shall be sound and free from all defects, and all ends of pipes, bends, &c., shall be

properly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c. All delivery cocks shall be high pressure, and of the best quality in workmanship. All jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks shall be made with red lead and flax.

(2) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than 10 inches. After service-pipes have been laid, the trench or trenches shall be properly filled in and thoroughly rammed, and any subsidence therein which may appear within three months shall be immediately made good by the owner or occupier of the premises supplied by such service-pipe. No trench made for the purpose of receiving, altering, repairing, or extending a service-pipe shall be left open after sunset.

(3) Every person, previous to being licensed to lay services, shall deposit with the Trust Secretary the sum of Ten pounds sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the regulations and conditions contained in this regulation; and in the case of non-observance or non-performance of any such stipulations and conditions at any time by such licensed person, the Trust shall be entitled to declare his deposit absolutely forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become and be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person shall at once be struck off the roll of licensed plumbers. On the surrender of licence to the Trust, the Ten pounds sterling deposit (if not forfeited) shall be refunded.

(4) No private services whatsoever shall be laid or extensions made by any licensed person, unless he has ascertained at the Trust's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the proper officers of the Trust to have such work executed.

(5) Within twenty-four hours after the completion of each service, the licensed person by whom such service shall have been laid shall report at the office of the Trust the completion of such service.

(6) If at any time any such licensed person wilfully acts contrary to any of the provisions of this regulation either by himself or his workman, or refuses to communicate any needful or proper information required by him in regard to any work connected with the works of the Trust done by him or his workmen, or under his superintendance or upon his responsibility, his name may be erased by the Trust from the list of licensed plumbers.

(7) Each licensed person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him or his workmen in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and maintained in that condition (sound and water-tight) for a period of three months after such service-pipe has been completed.

(8) Each licensed person shall be held responsible to the Trust for any injury occasioned by him or his workmen to the streets and mains or any property of the Trust, or to private services already laid and connected with the Trust's water supply, and full compensation for such injury, including cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such licensed person to the Trust within twenty-four hours of the time such injury was occasioned.

In the construction of this regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1894 on the annual shire valuation of the said urban district.

2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban district.

3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust works, Three shillings and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

4. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1894.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

4. Such rates shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 1st day of January, 1894, and the 1st day of July, 1894.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1894.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the waterworks district of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure, such rates to be paid half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year:—

- (1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, the sum of Twenty shillings.
- (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation, the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling.
- (3) The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisinal allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound of the municipal valuation of such allotment, provided that no rate of less than Ten shillings shall be made.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per one thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For water supplied by hydrant or stand-pipe, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under Sixpence.
- (3) For a temporary supply, during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, in the event of no contract, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount paid for such work.

3. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly or as may be agreed upon.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1894.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates. And where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). And the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre. For every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1894, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1894, and the 1st day of July, 1894.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

  6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.
  7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.
  8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1894, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1894, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1894, and shall be payable the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

  - (a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
  - (b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—
 

Gardens and lawns, ½ acre and less,	8,000 galls. per annum.
Do. " "	12,000 " "
Do. " "	16,000 " "
Do. " "	28,000 " "
Do. " "	40,000 " "
  - (c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.
  - (d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons, or fraction of 100 gallons, after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.
  - (e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.
  - (f) All properties through which the race runs situated above the reservoir shall be charged at the rate of five per centum on the amount of municipal valuation.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 5th December, 1893, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said urban districts should be made for the year 1894, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act:

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 5th December, 1893, in that behalf, make the following regulation in respect of the said urban districts for the year 1894, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1894 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said urban districts.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban districts.
3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
4. The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1894.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the 13th day of December, 1893.

*Water Act 1890.*—Part II., Division 9.  
THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS  
TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, pursuant to the provisions of the above Act.

1. Water will, subject to the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, Part II., be supplied within the district of the Trust for purposes other than domestic solely by measurement through a meter.

The maximum charge for water so supplied shall, subject to clause 7 of these Regulations, be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon between the Trust and the person requesting the supply, provided that the minimum charge shall be as follows:—

- (a) For irrigation, Ten shillings per annum.
- (b) For carriers and livery stables, Two shillings and sixpence per stall, or in open sheds Two shillings and sixpence per five feet of accommodation, per annum.
- (c) For a trough in a paddock, Two pounds per annum.
- (d) For steam-engine, Ten shillings per inch cylinder diameter, per annum.
- (e) For siphon, One pound per annum.

The Trust year begins on the 1st day of January in each year, and all payments and charges on tenements having no water-meter shall be payable half-yearly in advance; and where water-meters are affixed payments shall be made at the end of each quarter, namely, 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

2. (a) On and from the 1st of January, 1894, the supply of water to lands or tenements not having meters affixed to the service-pipes as hereinafter provided shall be for domestic purposes solely. And all persons who shall use water of the Trust so supplied for domestic purposes for purposes other than domestic solely shall be prosecuted according to law.

(b) All persons requiring water for other than domestic purposes solely on and after the said 1st day of January, 1894, shall deliver to the Trust engineer personally a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto, and upon acceptance by the secretary of such notice the person delivering the same shall be deemed to have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure.

(c) Every person having delivered such notice, if the same be accepted by the secretary, shall be entitled forthwith to use water for the purposes in the said notice set forth, and the quantity of water used before a meter be affixed shall be ascertained by the average consumption during such number of days following the fixing of the meter as the secretary may deem right.

(d) No meter or apparatus for measuring water shall be deemed to be a meter within the meaning of clause 1 of this Regulation, unless the pattern or type be of a kind approved of by the Trust.

(e) All meters shall be affixed in such position as the engineer or secretary to the Trust may direct, and the keys shall be kept by such engineer or secretary.

(f) When a meter shall be out of repair, the water consumed during the period of disrepair shall be ascertained according to the consumption during such number of days following repair as the secretary may think right.

(g) No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-engine without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

3. (a) Any person who shall waste or misuse, or allow to be wasted or misused, the water supplied to him by the Trust, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(b) A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include watering horses in stables, or hosing down or washing horses or vehicles.

(c) Unless a meter shall be affixed to the service-pipe, no person shall have fitted to the pipes or apparatus through which he receives the water of the Trust any tap with a thread union or other attachment for the purpose of attaching thereto hose.

(d) No person shall have fitted to any bath supplied by water from the Trust any overflow pipe.

(e) The bore of any pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust otherwise than by measure shall not exceed one-half of an inch in diameter, except with the consent of the Trust.

4. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his pipes and other apparatus in repair; and if any pipes or apparatus become out of repair the Trust may, by notice, require the same to be placed in proper order, or it may by its employes enter on the premises whereon repairs may be required, and repair or replace, or refit and cleanse, such of the pipes or apparatus as may so require to be dealt with, and the costs, charges, and expenses of so doing shall be paid by the owner or occupier of such premises; and in default of payment, in addition to any penalties incurred, the Trust may recover the amount of such costs, charges, and expenses from the owner or occupier of such premises in any court of competent jurisdiction, as money paid for the owner or occupier, as the case may be; and in such proceeding the Trust may proceed against the owner or occupier individually or as co-defendants.

5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust shall not allow any other person to use such water unless by special authority of the Trust; any person who shall use without such authority the water supplied to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. The Trust will upon the application of an intending consumer supply to him a meter at cost price for cash on delivery, or on

time payment, on the following terms:—One pound cash deposit and the balance bearing interest at 10 per cent. per annum by annual payments of One pound.

7. Any person having agreed to be supplied with water by measure may take the water supplied for domestic purposes through the meter service on the following terms:—He shall be entitled to a supply per annum for domestic purposes at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, until at such rate the charge for the quantity consumed would equal the current water rate on the tenement; and thereafter all the water consumed shall be deemed to be taken for the purposes for which water is supplied to such consumers by measure.

8. In laying down future services, or in extending existing services, the intending consumer shall not be entitled to avail himself of the provisions of clause No. 7 without the consent of the Trust, to be refused or accorded at the discretion of the Trust, and on such terms as the Trust may decide.

9. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations, he shall, where not otherwise expressly provided, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and if such breach shall continue after notice by the Trust he shall incur a further penalty not exceeding Three pounds for every day that such breach continues.

If any person acts in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay when due or on demand any rates or charges, the water may be cut off by stop-valve, or cutting through the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may determine.

In acting under or giving effect to the foregoing Regulations, the secretary, instructed by resolution of the Trust, may do, and in his name sign, for the Trust all things and documents required to be done or executed by the Trust; and in construing the Regulations "The Trust" means "The Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust," the singular imports the plural, the masculine imports the feminine, and persons imports a corporation.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1894.—No. 4.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the waterworks district of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1894, which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound per annum for each and every additional allotment by which a main passes.

4. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be twenty thousand gallons.

5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and the 1st of July, 1894.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1894.—No. 9.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1830*, make the following Regulation, viz.:-

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1894. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance in four equal instalments on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.
2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under, according to the last municipal valuation of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, according to the last municipal valuation of such house or tenement, in addition to the Twenty-five shillings named in the last clause, a sum of Four pounds per centum for every pound annual value from Twenty-six pounds to One hundred pounds inclusive, and a sum of Three pounds per centum for every pound annual value from One hundred pounds upwards.
4. On every cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water, a charge of Seven pounds Ten shillings per annum; on every flour-mill, a charge of Fifteen pounds per annum; and on every livery stable, a charge of Seven pounds Ten shillings per annum.
5. On every steam engine, a charge of Twenty shillings, not to include any steam-engine working any factory or mill named in clause 4.
6. On every hotel, a charge of Five pounds per centum on the annual valuation up to One hundred and fifty pounds; and for every pound annual value from One hundred and fifty pounds upwards a charge of Three pounds per centum.
7. On every horse-trough, a charge of Ten shillings.
8. The charge for every private house shall include one-quarter acre of land. Should any larger quantity of cultivated land be attached to a private house an extra charge of Ten shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre shall be paid.
9. For water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold, in addition to the ordinary charge for domestic purposes, an extra charge of Fifty shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre shall be paid.

CASES WHERE WATER IS NOT LAID ON.

10. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., not supplied with water, a charge of Two pounds Ten shillings per centum on the annual valuation of same shall be paid.
11. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement a charge of Two pounds Ten shillings per centum on the annual value of the same, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and Sixpence.

METERS.

12. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the amount shall not in any case be less than the charges hereinbefore made.
13. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons.
14. Any person who shall, between the hours of Seven a.m. and Six p.m. use the water of the Trust for the purpose of watering the ground, trees, or plants by means of hose, pipe, or drain (except with the written authority of the Trust) shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds for the first offence, and for any subsequent such offence to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for every day on which such offence is repeated or continued after notice of the offence from the said Trust.
15. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
16. Any owner or occupier of property wishing the water cut off, by giving due notice, shall be charged at the minimum rate, as provided for in clauses 10 and 11, after the expiration of the current quarter.
17. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.
18. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.
19. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
20. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving at least twelve hours' notice, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

21. That in every case where rates and charges are six months in arrears the water shall be cut off until such arrears are paid.
22. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.
23. In the construction of this Regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.
24. The foregoing Regulation was duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the 30th day of October, 1893, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto this 27th day of November, 1893.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purpose of the *Water Act 1830*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:-

RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district:-

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
  2. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds annual municipal value and not exceeding Fifteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound upon such municipal value.
  3. For every house or tenement above Fifteen pounds and under Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.
  4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.
  5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Three shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.
  6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
  7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
  8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed, and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
  9. For every water-trough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.
  10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.
  11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
- The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1894; provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be payable in advance, or as may be agreed upon.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 1st day of September.
2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of £13 10s. and under, the annual minimum sum of 10s. per annum.
3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of £13 10s., the annual sum of Ninepence in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.
4. Warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of Ninepence in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.
5. A rate of Sixpence in the pound shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.
6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic and other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons; the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.
7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.
8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.
12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, waterblasts, turbines, waterwheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

**REGULATION No. 14.**

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Four per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property. Provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Eleven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to Four per cent. per annum on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land. Provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.
7. For every water trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 20,000 gallons.
8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre and proportionally, according to the foregoing scale, for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery and bait, hotel, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

9. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
10. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
  12. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
  13. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
  14. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
- That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1894, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Commissioners by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables, or for manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation, or for water-power or fountains, fish-ponds, or for any ornamental or other purpose not provided for in this by-law (irrigation shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for carrying water to the roots of plants). No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house, or walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter, under a penalty of Twenty pounds.
2. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
3. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
4. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.
5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
6. That water for flushing drains be supplied to the Dandenong Shire Council at an annual sum of Thirty-five pounds, and that the turn-cock of the Trust do the necessary watering.
7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or service-pipe therefrom, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make any such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality and lead piping of the following dimensions and weight only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

8. No service of a larger bore than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.
9. Galvanized-iron piping of approved quality will only be allowed for external and internal services, except with the written consent of the Commissioners.
10. The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows:—For 3-in. and 4-in pipes,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. tapping; for 5-in., 6-in., 7-in., 1-in. tapping.
11. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his pipes and other apparatus in repair, and if any pipes or apparatus become out of repair the Trust may by notice require the same to be placed in proper order, and in the event of failing to comply with such notice the Trust, or any person acting on its behalf, may cut off the supply until the requisite repairs have been effected.
12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
13. If any meter should cease registering, or become out of order, the Trust shall estimate the charge for water consumed during the time it is undergoing repairs, by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.
14. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the

meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

15. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.
16. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
17. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that no more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.
18. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.
19. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow, such taps to be approved by the Engineer for the time being.
20. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering or irrigation of private gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises so supplied, if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.
21. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid monthly, or as may be agreed upon.
22. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter under special agreement, the supply shall be through a separate service-pipe from the main pipe to each tenement unless otherwise agreed upon of the following diameter according to the assessed annual value of the premises supplied as follows:—
23. For premises assessed at or under Thirty pounds, ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) half-inch pipe; for premises assessed at more than Thirty pounds per annum, ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) three-quarter-inch pipe. No service of a larger bore than ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) three-quarter-inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the Commissioners.
24. No house shall have any connexion with the pipes or fittings of any other premises, whether on the same or separate allotments, except by consent of the Commissioners.
25. Every person who shall have agreed with the Commissioners for a supply of water by measure, or who shall be called upon by the Commissioners to affix a water meter, shall, at his own expense, provide such meter and keep and maintain the same in good working order and condition to the satisfaction of any officer or agent of the Commissioners, and in the event of any repairs being required notice in writing shall be immediately given to the Commissioners, and the registration on the dial of the meter of the quantity of water supposed to have been used shall be taken. Before such meter is removed or such repairs are effected every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give twelve hours' notice at the least to that effect to the Commissioners.
26. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be fixed on each water service between main and building line.
27. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust; and they shall be at all times under the control of an officer of the Trust.
28. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations and not otherwise.
29. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing regulations, he shall where not otherwise expressly provided incur a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and if such breach shall continue after notice by the Trust he shall incur a further penalty not exceeding Three pounds for every day that such breach continues.
30. In construction of these rules and regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Dandenong Waterworks Trust.

**SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.**

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at £16 (Sixteen pounds) and upwards, situated within the waterworks district of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1894.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than £16 (Sixteen pounds sterling) on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned separately from any building the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand gallons.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in said year 1894, excepting those by measure, which shall be payable monthly.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 14th November, 1893.

**YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATION FOR 1894.**

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for the water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards, situated within the waterworks district of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1894.

2. Upon properties of the municipal value of Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty-three pounds, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate, within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) from the works of the Trust, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum, otherwise by special agreement.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred gallons or under Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using a hose for ornamental or garden purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

**VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.**

**CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.**

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from 20th December, 1893, till 3rd January, 1894 (both days inclusive, Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on 3rd January will be available till 3rd February. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till the next day, and on lines where there is not a daily train service the ticket will be available till the next day on which the train runs. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. #### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF MERTON.

WE, Duncan McIntyre, Martin Egan, Charles King, Donald Fraser, and William Drought, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Merton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or rolls, or throw stones in the reserve.
  5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
  6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
  7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first ascertained.
  8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**ALTERATION OF GENERAL RULES FOR THE PORTS  
IN VICTORIA.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following alterations in the General Rules for the Ports in Victoria, that is to say—

Clause 24 of the "General Rules and Orders for Ports and Harbors in Victoria" is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—

24. *Special place of anchorage for foreign ships of war or transports in time of peace.*—All foreign ships of war or transports arriving in Victoria shall occupy a special anchorage, viz.:—An anchorage situate near the western entrance to the South Channel, Port Phillip Bay, and about six (6) cables to the westward of the chequered buoys on Nicholson's Knoll.

Foreign ships of war or transports on entering the port of Port Phillip shall proceed to such anchorage, unless otherwise notified by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

Commanding officers in charge of foreign war ships or transports who may be desirous of proceeding to any other anchorage in Victoria shall make application, in writing, to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, who may grant permission to any such warship or transport to occupy any other anchorage should he deem it advisable to do so; but no person will be allowed to land near or approach the vicinity of any of the forts.

Foreign ships, whether of war or transport, shall not land armed parties. Unarmed parties may, however, be landed for drill or exercise upon permission being previously obtained from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

Clause 82 of the "General Rules and Orders for Ports and Harbors in Victoria" is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—

82. *Anchorage of Boats conveying Explosives.*—Lighters or boats other than those in Port Phillip conveying explosives to or from any vessel or magazine shall not remain at anchor, except as provided for in the *Explosives Act 1890*; but, if unable to discharge all the explosives with which they may be laden into the magazine or vessel in which such explosives are intended to be discharged, as the case may be, between the hours of Seven a.m. and Five p.m. or Seven a.m. and Four p.m. respectively, they shall return and anchor within the limits prescribed for the anchorage of vessels having on board more than twenty pounds of gunpowder under the *Explosives Act 1890*.

82A. Lighters and boats in Port Phillip conveying explosives to or from any vessel in Port Phillip or magazine shall not remain at anchor, except as provided for in the *Explosives Act 1890*; but, if unable to discharge all the explosives with which they may be laden into the magazine or vessel in which such explosives are intended to be discharged, as the case may be, between the hours of Seven a.m. and Five p.m. or Seven a.m. and Four p.m. respectively, they shall proceed to the mooring place for floating magazines, lighters, or boats, situate between Point Cook and Laverton, in 18 feet of water; but, if such mooring place cannot be reached by reason of adverse wind, weather, or other unforeseen cause, such lighters and boats containing explosives in transit may moor temporarily to the southward of a line drawn from the south side of the St. Kilda Pier to the Time-ball Tower, Williamstown, the east and west boundary of such temporary anchorage being marked by two cask buoys painted red and moored in 16 feet of water.

**PORT OF GIPPSLAND LAKES.**

The definition of the limits and boundaries of the Port of Gippsland Lakes given in the Proclamation dated the 15th December, 1890, is hereby repealed, and the following definition is substituted therefor:—

The Port of Gippsland Lakes shall consist of Lakes Wellington, Victoria, King, Reeve, and Bunga (or Black Lake), and all inlets, rivers, and bays contained northward of a line bearing N. 62° E. and S. 62° W., running across the outer end of the Eastern pier forming the entrance to the Gippsland Lakes.

**NAVIGATION OF THE NEW CHANNEL, POINT HENRY, AND THE SOUTH CHANNEL, GEELONG.**

Clause 49 of the "General Rules and Orders for Ports and Harbors in Victoria" is hereby repealed and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—

Persons in charge of steam-ships navigating the waters of the New Channel, Point Henry, or the South Channel, Geelong, shall cause the speed of such steam-ships to be so reduced that it shall not exceed the rate of five nautical miles per hour, and no sailing vessel shall enter either of the above channels whilst any other vessel is proceeding through such channel in an opposite direction.

**ADDITIONAL GENERAL RULE FOR THE PORTS IN VICTORIA.**

*Landing and Removing Combustibles and Dangerous Goods.*

61A. *Combustibles not to lie on wharfs, &c.*—No lime, tar, pitch, resin, spirituous liquors, turpentine, aquafortis, oil of vitriol, kerosene, inflammable acids of all descriptions, or other combustible thing shall be placed or allowed to remain on any wharf or on the deck of any vessel, unless the same is under the protection of a watchman; and the owner of such lime, tar, pitch, resin, aquafortis, oil of vitriol, spirituous liquors, turpentine or kerosene, or other combustible thing must remove the same to a place of safety within two hours after being required to do so by the Pier-master. In the case of goods left on any wharf, the owner of such goods shall be liable to the penalties in respect of every such breach of this regulation as aforesaid; and in case of goods left on the deck of any vessel, the master or owner of such vessel shall be liable to the penalties in respect thereof.

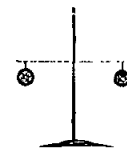
61B. *Dangerous goods.*—No gasoline, benzine, naphtha, petroleum, kerosene, turpentine, casks containing oils, castor oil in cases, inflammable acids of all descriptions, vitriol in packages of any description, kegs or casks of white lead and casks of all kinds of paints, bales of kapok, bales of cotton waste, bales of old rags, green skins, or hides, iron in bar or bundles, casks of hardware, casks of cement or whitening, bags of bark, cases, kegs, or casks of nails or hardware, galvanized fencing wire, bundles or bales of fibre, wooden doors, windows, sashes, or any kind of woodenware shall be placed in any transit shed without the permission of the Pier-master.

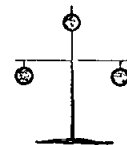

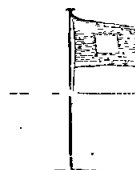

KALPIENUNG ("Seven-Mile Tank Reserve").—One hundred and ninety-two acres, more or less, county of Tatchera, parish of Kalpienung, being the site temporarily reserved for Water Supply purposes by Order of the 26th September, 1893, and the portion of the permanent reserve along the Tyrrell Creek comprised within the boundaries of the said site, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th September, 1893, page 3358.—(93. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
