WHEREAS by Part VIII. of the Justices Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1105) it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be held on such days as the Governor in Council shall from time to time appoint: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order appoint that the next Court of General Sessions of the Peace be held at Castlemaine on the eighth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in lieu of the seventh day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the date previously fixed therefor.

And the Honorable Isaac Alfred Isaacs, Her Majesty's Solicitor-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
