THE SURVEYORS' INSTITUTION.

ADMISSION TO MEMBERSHIP OF SURVEYORS HOLDING OFFICIAL APPOINTMENTS IN THE BRITISH COLONIES AND DEPENDENCIES.

SIR,—I am directed to send you the accompanying copies of a Memorandum by the Council of this Institution with reference to the admission to Membership of Surveyors holding official appointments in the British Colonies and Dependencies.

The Memorandum will explain itself, but I may point out that these arrangements apply exclusively to Official Surveyors and not to Surveyors engaged in private practice in the Colonies.

The Council of this Institution has, during the last 25 years, been most successful in its efforts to raise the status and improve the efficiency of Surveyors in the Mother Country, and is desirous of accomplishing similar results in the case of Colonial Surveyors, and of allowing them to participate in the privileges and advantages conferred by our charter, and bringing them under the influences which have proved so beneficial in this country.

With this object in view, the Council venture to express a hope that your Department may assist them in bringing the matter under the notice of influential persons in the Colonies.

MEMORANDUM OF THE COUNCIL OF THE INSTITUTION WITH REFERENCE TO THE ADMISSION OF COLONIAL MEMBERS.

Admission of Colonial Members.—Powers of Council under Charter and By-laws.

The Council of the Institution have, during the last twenty years, received many applications from Surveyors holding official appointments in the British Colonies and Dependencies to be elected Members of the Institution; but it is only recently that they have been in a position to entertain such applications for admission, without examination, under the following By-law, which became operative, by a special provision of the charter, at the end of the year 1891:—

"No person shall be eligible for election as a Fellow, unless he shall have passed the examination declared in the Rules of Examination to appertain to the Class of Fellows. Nevertheless it shall be in the power of the Council by a vote, in person or by proxy, of not less than three-fourths of the whole Council, to dispense with the aforesaid examination in favour of any candidate of exceptional standing as a Surveyor or of a candidate holding an official appointment as a Surveyor in any of the British Colonies or Dependencies who shall have passed such other examination as the Council may accept in lieu of the said examination."

Exemption of Colonial Members from Institution Examinations.

The Institution comprises about 2,500 Members of all Classes—Fellows, Professional Associates, Non-Professional Associates, and Students. Admission to every grade of Membership, except to the limited class of Non-Professional Associates, can only be obtained through the avenue of examination, an ordeal of an extremely searching character, and for which, in the nature of the case, Surveyors in the Colonies could not be expected to present themselves.

Objects in view.

Acting under the powers conferred by the charter and the by-law above quoted, and with a view to federating the profession throughout the Empire, and with a further view of affirming and defining the professional status of Colonial Surveyors, the Council of the Institution are prepared to entertain applications for admission to Membership, without examination, from Surveyors holding official appointments in the following British Colonies and Dependencies, where it is understood that candidates for such appointments are required, as a condition precedent, to pass an examination which can be accepted in lieu of the professional examinations of the Institution:—

Colonies to which the arrangement applies.

India.	Tasmania.
Victoria.	Canada.
New South Wales.	British Guiana.
Queensland.	West Indies.

The Council reserve to themselves the right of varying the list of such Colonies and Dependencies from time to time, should circumstances seem to render such a course desirable.

Conditions.

The following are the conditions under which applications for admission will be considered by the Council:—

1. A Colonial Surveyor will be considered eligible *ceteris paribus* if he shall have passed an examination qualifying him as an Authorized or Licensed Surveyor, or as an official, or Crown Surveyor, or Surveyor-General, in any of the foregoing Colonies or Dependencies.
2. All candidates will be required to furnish a detailed description of the examination or examinations passed by them in the Colonies, which description must be signed by the candidate, and, in the case of a subordinate officer countersigned by the Surveyor-General, or in the case of a Surveyor-General by the Colonial Secretary or other chief official, and will also be required to furnish testimonials as to personal character, *independently of the professional testimonials referred to.*
3. The diploma granted to a Colonial member will bear upon the face of it a notification that it applies solely to the Colonies, and is in no sense a diploma available for a Surveyor practising in the United Kingdom.
4. Each candidate will be required to sign a formal declaration to this effect, and an undertaking that the diploma shall be returned to the Council should the candidate, from any cause, cease to practise in the Colonies.
5. Each Colonial member will be required to deposit with the Secretary a standing order on a London agent for the annual payment of his subscription, and through whom papers relating to the Institution may be periodically transmitted.
6. Colonial members will pay a reduced entrance fee of Three guineas and a reduced annual subscription of Two guineas.
7. Candidates must be over 25 years of age.
8. Colonial members when elected will be regarded as subject to such provisions of the General By-laws as are applicable to their case, and will be required to sign a formal declaration to that effect, attached to the form of application.
9. All applications must be made on forms to be obtained of the Secretary of the Institution at the above address, and will be subject to all the provisions of the By-laws relating to approval by the Council and confirmation by the general body of members, and each case will be dealt with on its merits.

Privileges of Members.

The privileges of Colonial members will be identical with those of other members, and may be briefly summarized as follows:—

- (a) The right as a Fellow of the Surveyors' Institution to use the designatory letters F.S.I.
- (b) The right to receive copies of the "Transactions" of the Institution, published at frequent intervals during the Session, from November to May. Also copies of the "Professional Notes," published at intervals of two or three months throughout the year.
- (c) The right to a diploma of membership, subject, as in other cases, to a notification of its annual renewal.
- (d) The right, during temporary residence in England, to attend the meetings of the Institution, to use the library and rooms of the Institution, and to enjoy all the privileges of members resident in the United Kingdom; and
- (e) All voting rights, so far as they are exercisable by persons not residing in the United Kingdom.

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the conduct of examinations of persons desiring to obtain certificates of competency as masters and mates, as to the qualifications to be possessed by such persons, and for the issue of certificates of competency thereto:

And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 4th day of July, 1890, make such Regulations as aforesaid:
And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulations Nos. 21 and 99 of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of July, 1890, and also to make amended Regulations in lieu thereof:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Administrator of the Government in Council, repeal the Regulations numbered as aforesaid from the date hereinafter specified, and doth make the following amended Regulations in lieu, and to be read in substitution, thereof:—

21. *Loss of sight.*—A person who has lost the sight of one eye will not be examined for a certificate of competency or for a certificate of a higher grade (if he be already the holder of a certificate), unless a special medical certificate and such other evidence as the Board in each case may deem necessary be produced by the candidate showing that the sight of the uninjured eye is satisfactory and complete, in which case, provided that the candidate is in all other respects eligible under the Regulations, the Board reserves to itself the option of allowing such candidate to be examined.

99. *Failure.*—If a candidate fails in seamanship in his examination for an ordinary certificate for foreign-going or home-trade ships, he may, if qualified, and upon payment of another fee and compliance with regulations, be examined for a certificate of competency for foreign-going or home-trade steam-ships, as the case may be, at any time after failure.

These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 15th day of February, 1893, on which date Regulations 21 and 99, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this twenty-seventh day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

DRAWBACK REGULATIONS AMENDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of February, 1893.

WHEREAS by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby repeal the Schedules to the Regulations relating to Drawbacks heretofore made, and doth substitute therefor the subjoined Schedules, that is to say:—

SCHEDULE NO. 1.

IMPORTED ARTICLES upon which Duty has been paid at the rates herein set forth, and on which a Drawback will be allowed on the fair Market Value for home use at the rates specified, provided that such Drawback does not exceed the amount of Duty paid. To take effect on and after 1st January, 1893, except as to articles against which another date is inserted; on and after such date the rates so specified shall be allowed. In cases where rates of duty lower than those herein set forth were paid, the rates of Drawback enumerated in any Schedule issued previous to this date, and applicable to the case, will be allowed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE WINTON RACE-COURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Robert Warnock, James Brennan, William Lynch, John Hernan, and Thomas Hernan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Winton Race-course and Public Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the North-Western Vermin District has recommended a rate of Three shillings per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin district: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Three shillings per square mile to be the rate payable by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District aforesaid for the current year.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee of any vermin district may, in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate, to be called a "fencing rate," specifying the amount thereof to be paid by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district upon whose boundaries any vermin-proof wire-net fence has been erected by the Board of Land and Works, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the cost of the erection of such fence, or any portion thereof, and for the repair and maintenance of the same: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per mile of fencing to be the fencing rates payable under the provisions of Part II. of the Act aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual fencing rates per mile of fencing payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fences, that is to say:—

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

This notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any

mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station, and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, carrying mails each way.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. 15. 16. No application for the transfer of a contract will be entertained until a fee has been paid of Ten shillings on a contract not exceeding £50 per annum, and Twenty shillings on a contract above £50 per annum.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 7th day of March, 1893, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1893, to 30th June, 1896.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

VICTORIA JUBILEE PARK COMMITTEE.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fence or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names or letters on the fences, trees, or seats in the Park.
6. No person shall discharge fire-arms or roll or throw stones in the Park.
7. No person shall put any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs in the Park.
8. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, or other structure in the Park without the permission of the Council.
9. No person shall bathe in the river forming the southern boundary of the Park.
10. All horses taken into the Park shall be placed in such portion thereof as shall be set apart by the Councils for that purpose.
11. No person shall turn loose or allow to wander any horses or cattle in the Park.
12. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Park shall enter any plots or enclosures of young trees or shrubs.
13. No person shall light any fires in the said Park except at such place or places as shall be set apart by the Council for that purpose, and no person shall leave any such fire without first thoroughly extinguishing the same.
14. Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
