REGISTRATION OF FIRMS ACT 1892.

ANY person or persons carrying on business under a firm or trading name, which does not disclose the full or usual names of all the partners, or under any name which may be different to the name of the actual proprietor or proprietors of the business, and any person or firm still carrying on business under an old firm name where the original proprietor has ceased to be a partner, or where one or more of the old partners have died or retired, must register on or before 31st March, 1893.

Where the same person or persons are carrying on a business under one or more different firm or trading names each must be registered separately.

Any new firm or any person about to commence business under a firm or trading name must register before commencing business.

Any alteration in a firm or trading name and any change in the constitution of the firm must be registered within one month.

Penalty Five pounds, and for every subsequent conviction not exceeding Ten pounds. Any action by an unregistered firm may be stayed.

Further information can be obtained from the Registrar-General, Melbourne. Printed forms at all Courts of Petty Sessions, at which a copy of the Act can be seen.

A shoal (James Shoal), with 12 fathoms of water on it, and 22 to 31 fathoms around, lies about 25 miles north-west of Acis Shoals, in approximately lat. 4° 0' N., long. 112° 18' E.

(2.) *Mallawallé Channel.—Buoys and Beacons.*

(c.) *Sandy Island*.—A beacon consisting of a framework tripod, painted red and black, and surmounted by a cage 35 feet high, has been erected on Sandy Island, with Sipindung Island bearing N. 59° W., distant 4½ miles. Approximate position, lat. 6° 49' 30" N., long. 117° 37' 10" E.

(d.) *Sipindung Island*.—A small red buoy, surmounted by a ball (6 feet above the sea), is moored with Sipindung Island, bearing N. 33° E., distant 1½ miles, or in approximately lat. 6° 50' 45" N., long. 117° 32' 35" E.

Caution.—A note has been placed on Admiralty chart, No. 1650, to the effect that "The route marked has been followed with safety, but in such reef strewn waters other dangers not charted may exist."

(3.) *Rock near South Banguay Channel.*

A coral head (Ten-foot Rock), 70 yards long, in an E.N.E. and W.S.W. direction, and 50 yards broad, with a least depth of 10 feet at low water spring tides, and 17 fathoms close around, lies near the fairway of South Banguay Channel, with Petrel Rock bearing N.N.E. ¾ E., distant about 7 cables, or in approximately lat. 7° 3' 50" N., long. 117° 6' 10" E.

(4.) *Rock off Lankayan Island.*

A coral patch (Kechil Rock), about 3 cables in extent, with 4½ fathoms water on it, and 19 to 21 fathoms around, lies with Lankayan Island bearing about S.W. ¾ W., distant 7 miles. Approximate position, lat. 6° 34' 40" N., long. 118° 1' E.

(5.) *Rock off Langaan Island.*

A coral patch (Johnston Rock), 4 cables long, in a N.N.W., and S.S.E. direction, and 2 cables broad, with 13 feet on it at low-water spring tides, and 18 fathoms around, lies with the south-east extreme of Langaan Island bearing S.W. ¾ W., distant 2½ miles. Approximate position, lat. 6° 13' 20" N., long. 118° 11' 15" E.

(6.) *Rock off Nymph Reef.*

A coral shoal (Royalist Rock), 4 cables long, in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction, with a least depth of 6 feet at low-water spring tides near its south-west end, and 18 fathoms around, lies with Nymph Reef bearing N.N.E., distant about 1½ miles. Approximate position, lat. 6° 42' 50" N., long. 118° 40" E.

(7.) *Sundy Bank.*

This bank previously known to exist, somewhat circular in shape and about 5 miles in extent, has depths of 9 to 47 fathoms on it, and deep water around. The shallowest part found (9 fathoms over coral) lies near its western edge in approximately lat. 5° 49' 30" N., long. 119° 9' E.

(8.) *Normanby Bank.*

This bank, about 5 miles long in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction, and 2½ miles broad, has depths of 6 to 50 fathoms on it, and deep water around. The shallowest part found (6 fathoms over coral) lies near its south-west end, in approximately lat. 5° 74' N., long. 119° 13' E. Soundings of 119 and 203 fathoms were obtained between this bank and Sunday Bank.

(9.) *Sentry Bank.*

This bank, the north edge of which has not been defined, but probably about 7 miles in extent, has depths of 7 to 50 fathoms on it, and deep water around. The shallowest spot found (7 fathoms) lies about one mile within its western edge in approximately lat. 5° 40' N., long. 119° 18' E.

(10.) *Coral Reef in the approach to Dent Haven.*

A narrow coral shoal (Hardy patch), 1½ cables long, in a north and south direction, with a least depth of 18 feet at low water spring tides, lies in the approach to Dent Haven, in approximately lat. 3° 15' 20" N., long. 110° 18' 20" E.

(11.) *Rock in the fairway of Sibuko or St. Lucia Bay.*

A coral head (Hand Rock), about 50 yards in extent, and awash low water spring tides, with 18 fathoms around, lies in the fairway of Sibuko Bay, in approximately lat. 4° 8' N., long. 118° 11' E. This rock should be marked F.D. (position doubtful).

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the conduct of examinations of persons desiring to obtain certificates of competency as masters and mates, as to the qualifications to be possessed by such persons, and for the issue of certificates of competency thereto:

And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 4th day of July, 1890, make such Regulations as aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulations Nos. 21 and 99 of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of July, 1890, and also to make amended Regulations in lieu thereof:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Administrator of the Government in Council, repeal the Regulations numbered as aforesaid from the date hereinafter specified, and doth make the following amended Regulations in lieu, and to be read in substitution, thereof:—

21. *Loss of sight.*—A person who has lost the sight of one eye will not be examined for a certificate of competency or for a certificate of a higher grade (if he be already the holder of a certificate), unless a special medical certificate and such other evidence as the Board in each case may deem necessary be produced by the candidate showing that the sight of the uninjured eye is satisfactory and complete, in which case, provided that the candidate is in all other respects eligible under the Regulations, the Board reserves to itself the option of allowing such candidate to be examined.

99. *Failure.*—If a candidate fails in seamanship in his examination for an ordinary certificate for foreign-going or home-trade ships, he may, if qualified, and upon payment of another fee and compliance with regulations, be examined for a certificate of competency for foreign-going or home-trade steam-ships, as the case may be, at any time after failure.

These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates," shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 15th day of February, 1893, on which date Regulations 21 and 99, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this twenty-seventh day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

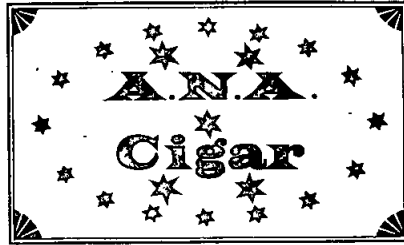

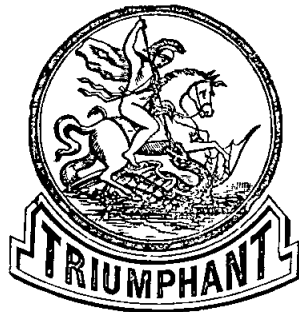

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. The births of 1,288 children, viz., 649 boys and 639 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. In the month of December, 1,266 births were registered, or 22 less than in the month under review. The births were 141 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 177 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 702, viz., 360 of males and 342 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 586, or 83 per cent. The deaths were less than those in December by 34, and below the average of January during the previous ten years by 116. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by as many as 343.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.62, and of deaths registered 1.43.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.5° on the 26th, and the lowest was 45.1° on the 25th. The mean temperature of the month (65.7°) was 9° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (39.3°) took place on the 15th, and the least range (8.4°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 21.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.216 inches on the 24th, and the lowest was 29.374 inches on the 9th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.779 inches) differed from the average by rather more than a tenth of an inch.

Rain fell on 4 days, the amount of rainfall being .194 inch. The average rainfall in January during the previous ten years was 2.18 inches, or about 2 inches more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 51 per cent., and females 49 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 50 per cent. to that mortality, as against 53 per cent. in January, 1892; 50 per cent. in January, 1891; 48 per cent. in January, 1890; 57 per cent. in January, 1889; 53 per cent. in January, 1888; and 53 per cent. in January, 1887.

Thirty deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a male of unknown occupation, aged 75, died of apoplexy; a bricklayer, aged 75, of brain disease; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of softening of the brain; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; a mariner, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; a gardener, aged 76, of liver disease; a carter, aged 76, was found drowned; a female, aged 77, died of rheumatism; a female,

aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of gastro-enteritis; a female, aged 78, of cancer of the œsophagus; a gentleman, aged 78, of apoplexy; a female, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 78, of ulceration of stomach; a whipmaker, aged 78, of intestinal obstruction; a female, aged 84, of dysentery; a labourer, aged 84, of apoplexy; a female, aged 84, of syncope; a female, aged 85, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 86, of fracture of the thigh; a female, aged 89, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 75, a doctor and a female, each aged 78, a gentleman, aged 80, a female, aged 82, a carrier, aged 83, a female, aged 87, and a weaver, aged 93, of old age.

Forty-nine deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 37 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 10 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A nightman, aged 25, a carter, aged 63, and a female, aged 73, were passed over by vehicles; a contractor and a labourer, each aged 25, by railway trains; a boy, aged 15, and a bricklayer, aged 22, by trams; a female child, aged 4, a seaman, aged 40, and a leather merchant, aged 48, died of injuries consequent on falls; a labourer, aged 24, was crushed in a lift; a quarryman, aged 25, died of injuries received in an explosion; a female, aged 54, of injury to head; and a female, aged 86, of fracture of thigh—how caused not stated; a female child, aged 2, died of burns; and a female child, aged 5, of scalds; a civil servant and a coachbuilder, aged 34 and 50 respectively, of sunstroke; a storeman, aged 40, was poisoned by swallowing liquid ammonia; three boys, aged 4, 11, and 13 respectively, a clerk, aged 25, two men of unknown occupation, each aged 50, a farmer, aged 63, and a carter, aged 76, were drowned in the River Yarra; a boy, aged 12, two seamen, aged 30 and 38 respectively, in the Saltwater River; a whip-thong maker, aged 32, in Hobson's Bay; a new-born female infant was suffocated at birth; a female infant, aged 8 hours, died of asphyxia neonatorum; a labourer, aged 40, of inhalation of chloroform properly administered; a bootmaker, aged 45, of an overdose of chloral and morphia taken to procure sleep; a labourer, aged 50, of asphyxia during a fit; a male infant, aged 3, of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born female infant, who was suffocated, and a boy, aged 13, who was killed by a fall from a cart, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the former and of manslaughter in the latter case. The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 27, a carpenter, aged 35, a sergeant of police, aged 40, an ex-constable of police, aged 55, and a squatter, aged 55, who shot themselves; a male of no occupation, aged 19, a female, aged 23, and a cook, aged 36, who cut their throats; and two females, aged 16 and 41 respectively, who poisoned themselves.

One hundred and eighteen deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 9 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 353, of which 166, or 47 per cent., were of males; and 187, or 53 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 286 were under one year of age, 46 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 349. Of these, 194, or 56 per cent., were males, and 155, or 44 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 21 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, 6 were between eighty and eighty-five, 4 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 1 was over ninety.

The increase which took place in December in deaths from diarrhoeal diseases was not sustained in January, such deaths having declined from 86 to 50; deaths from debility, atrophy, and inanition, moreover, fell from 86 to 75. 3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9.
