ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to make better provision for the acquisition of Lands required for the Construction of Lines of Railway and for other purposes."

"An Act to provide for the conversion into Victorian Government Inscribed Stock of certain Debentures redeemable in London, or to issue Stock for their Redemption."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PAYMENT OF RENEWAL PREMIUMS ON GUARANTEE POLICIES.

REGISTRATION OF FIRMS ACT 1892.

ANY person or persons carrying on business under a firm or trading name, which does not disclose the full or usual names of all the partners, or under any name which may be different to the name of the actual proprietor or proprietors of the business, and any person or firm still carrying on business under an old firm name where the original proprietor has ceased to be a partner, or where one or more of the old partners have died or retired, must register on or before 31st March, 1893.

Where the same person or persons are carrying on a business under one or more different firm or trading names each must be registered separately.

Any new firm or any person about to commence business under a firm or trading name must register before commencing business.

Any alteration in a firm or trading name and any change in the constitution of the firm must be registered within one month.

Penalty Five pounds, and for every subsequent conviction not exceeding Ten pounds. Any action by an unregistered firm may be stayed.

SHIRE OF ROMSEY.—PUBLIC HEALTH.

BY-LAW No. 3.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Romsey, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law No. 3 of the said shire for regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the area comprising the Romsey Waterworks Supply District, and shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be provided with a suitable pan. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

3. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan in such earth-closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

4. No one but the person authorized by the council shall be employed by the occupier of any house or premises for the removal of night-soil, and no other person shall remove same.

5. Every occupier of premises from which night-soil is removed shall pay to the council such annual charge as may be fixed by resolution of the council.

6. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any closet except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. (unless otherwise permitted in writing by the council), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized.

7. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

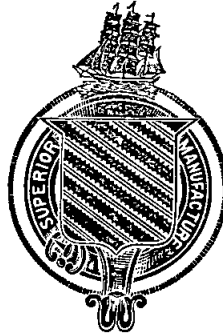

NOTE.—During the year 1892, the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 21,935, viz., 10,286 of males and 11,649 of females. The births, which numbered 37,842, were fewer by 663 than those in 1891; and the deaths, which numbered 15,907, were fewer by as many as 2,724 than those in 1891.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 62,258, but the recorded departures by sea numbered 69,214; the apparent loss by excess of emigration over immigration by sea being thus 6,956. Unrecorded departures, however, estimated at 6,021, being taken into account, the actual loss is found to have been nearly double this, viz., 12,284.

From the date of the census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 9,253, viz., 7,188 of males and 2,065 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of 1892 would have been 1,176,582, viz., 614,968 males and 561,614 females.

In 1892, the recorded arrivals from were more numerous than the recorded departures for Tasmania by 5,827, the United Kingdom by 174, and Foreign Countries by 368. On the other hand, the recorded departures for New South Wales and Queensland exceeded the recorded arrivals therefrom by 5,526, South Australia by 4,545, Western Australia by 1,714, and New Zealand and the South Seas by 847.

At the end of 1892, the estimated population of New South Wales was 1,191,050, the increase during the year being 25,750; the estimated population of South Australia (exclusive of the Northern Territory) was 331,721, the increase during the year being 10,993; the estimated population of Western Australia was 58,674, the increase during the year being 5,389; the estimated population of Tasmania was 153,144, the increase during the year being 525; and the estimated population of New Zealand (exclusive of 41,993 Maoris) was 650,433, the increase during the year being 10,378. No return has been received from Queensland.

As regards the Victorian estimate it should be stated that the figures of births and deaths during 1892, and consequently those of the population, will be slightly altered when the returns of the Deputy Registrars are finally examined.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Mines Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1120) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the regulations in the Thirty-third Schedule thereto contained and substitute others in lieu thereof for the carrying into effect of the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that such substituted regulations shall be deemed to be the regulations in the said Thirty-third Schedule, for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby alter the regulations in the Thirty-third Schedule to the Act aforesaid, in so far only as they relate to the form of lease to be issued under such regulations as set out in Appendix J thereto, by revoking the existing form of lease in the said Appendix J, and substituting therefor the form hereto subjoined, that is to say:—

THIS INDENTURE made the _____ day of _____ in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-_____ between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and _____ (hereinafter called the lessee) of the other part witnesseth that in consideration of the rent hereinafter reserved and of the covenants and provisions hereinafter contained Her Majesty doth by these presents grant and demise unto the lessee _____ her executors administrators and transferees all those mines of gold and silver in and under all that piece of land particularly described and delineated on the plan hereon indorsed or hereunto annexed and thereon indicated by yellow and green colours and containing more or less (hereinafter called "the said mine") for the purpose of mining for working and winning the said gold and silver with full power to the lessee _____ her executors administrators and transferees and (his and) their agents and workmen to dig pick make and use on the said land and mine hereby demised excavations pits shafts levels water-courses and other works necessary for working and winning the gold and silver in or under the said land and to take and appropriate the same during the term hereby granted And to make and construct on the land hereby demised races drains dams reservoirs roads and tramways And also to erect on the same land all buildings engines furnaces pumps machinery and things necessary for winning and obtaining the said gold and silver and for effectually carrying on the works of the said mine And also to erect on the land hereby demised such offices cottages and dwelling houses for the use of the persons and workmen employed in the said mine and works as the said lessee _____ her executors administrators and transferees shall think fit together with all and singular shafts levels drifts ways works fixtures erections liberties easements advantages and appurtenances which are now or at any time during the term hereby granted may be held occupied or enjoyed with the said mine and land hereby demised for the purpose of working the said gold and silver But nevertheless excepting and reserving from mining operations to the full depth of feet from the surface the whole of the land delineated and colored yellow on the said plan And also excepting and reserving _____ and further excepting _____ To hold the said mine land and premises hereby demised (subject nevertheless to such rights interests and authorities as may be lawfully subsisting therein at the date of these presents) unto the said lessee _____ her executors administrators and transferees from the date hereof for the term of _____ years next ensuing for the purpose of working and winning the said gold and silver and for no other purpose yielding and paying therefor yearly and every year during the said term unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors the yearly rent of _____ by equal quarterly payments of _____ on the _____ day of _____ the _____ day of _____ the _____ day of _____ and the _____ day of _____ in each year each payment to be made in advance the first payment to be made on the day of the date hereof and the succeeding payments respectively to be made on the same days in each succeeding year clear of all rates taxes and assessments to which the said land mine and premises are now or at any time during the said term may be subject or liable Provided always and it is hereby agreed that if the said quarterly rent shall be in arrear for twenty-one days after the same shall have become payable or if any other sum of money hereby covenanted to be paid shall be in arrear twenty-one days after the time appointed for payment thereof whether such rent or sum of money shall have been legally demanded or not any Bailiff of Crown lands may by himself or his agents enter upon the said land and seize and distrain all gold and rock or earth containing gold actually gotten and all machinery apparatus tools waggons carts carriages engines plant live and dead stock and all other goods chattels and effects whatsoever in upon and about the said land mine and premises and every distress then made may take away sell and dispose of as in cases of distress for rent reserved in common leases and out of the moneys arising thereby retain so much as shall be sufficient to satisfy the said arrears and other payments and which shall at

the time of such sale be unpaid and all expenses incurred by him or them and if any surplus the same to be paid to the said lessee h executors administrators or transferees. And the said lessee do hereby for himself his heirs executors administrators and transferees covenant with Her Majesty her heirs and successors in manner following that is to say:—

1. That the said lessee h executors administrators and transferees shall and will during the said term pay unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors the rent hereby reserved at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. And shall and will except when prevented by inevitable accident or during the execution of repairs make construct and work the said land mine and premises in the best and most effectual manner and without interruption. And shall and will diligently explore and search for gold and silver and work the said land mine and premises to the best advantage.

3. And shall and will employ in the construction of the works or in mining operations on or under the said land mine and premises during the first month of the said term and during the usual hours of labour able and competent workmen and miners at the least and during the remainder of the said term not less than such miners and workmen unless prevented by inevitable accident or during the execution of repairs.

4. And shall and will during the said term effectually drain the said mine and pump out all water likely to cause injury thereto or which would prevent or interfere with the working thereof and if the said mine shall be affected or liable to be affected by the same flow or body of water as any other mine or mines contiguous thereto shall and will contribute with the lessee or lessees or owner or owners of such other mine or mines a reasonable proportion of the machinery and labour necessary to free and keep free such mine or mines from water to a workable extent or if the said mine shall be kept free from water to a workable extent whether wholly or partially by means of the machinery and labour of a contiguous mine or mines then shall and will pay for and on behalf of the lessee or lessees owner or owners of such contiguous mine or mines a reasonable proportion of the expenses of such machinery and labour the Minister of Mines for the time being to depute some efficient person who shall have access to and inspection of all such mines to determine when the said mine is so freed or kept free wholly or partially from water and what are the reasonable proportions of the expenses aforesaid and to whom and when the same are to be paid such decision to be final and conclusive on all parties.

5. And shall and will make such provision for the disposal of the detritus dirt waste workings or refuse of the said mine so that the same shall not be an inconvenience nuisance or obstruction to any roads ways rivers creeks or private or Crown lands or in any manner occasion any public or private damage or inconvenience.

6. And shall and will make such provisions for decency and the observance of sanitary regulations as the Minister of Mines for the time being shall approve of or direct.

7. And shall and will erect and keep erected during the said term posts not less than two feet six inches high above the ground and painted white and red so as accurately to define the boundary-lines and angles of the said mine and land respectively and so that each post shall be visible from those nearest to it on each side.

8. And shall and will if required by the Minister of Mines erect and keep in repair a substantial wall or fence round each side of the shafts at any time during the said term open on any part of the said land or used for the purpose of the said mine so as effectually to prevent all accidental access thereto and when the Minister of Mines for the time being or other person authorized in that behalf shall consider any such shaft unnecessary and shall by certificate under his hand notify the same then shall and will effectually fill up and substantially enclose the same.

And shall and will as often as required so to do during the said term make and deliver to the Secretary for Mines for the time being or other officer appointed for that purpose all such true and proper plans and sections returns statistics and particulars made up to the last day of the preceding month of the workings and operations of the said mine as shall be in accordance with the rules and directions from time to time issued by the Minister of Mines or other officer authorized so to do the same to be accompanied with a statutory declaration of the truth and correctness thereof by the lessee of the said mine h executors administrators or transferees or such other person as the said Minister shall direct.

And shall and will during the said term make proper and reasonable compensation to the occupier or occupiers or lessee or lessees from the Crown of any adjoining land in respect of any damage which may be sustained by him or them by the working of the said mine or the carrying on the works thereof or by any other works connected therewith such compensation to be determined in manner provided by Part II. of the *Mines Act 1890*.

11. And further shall and will at all times during the said term keep and preserve the said mine and premises from all unnecessary injury or damage and also the levels drifts shafts water-courses roads ways works buildings erections and fixtures therein and thereon in good repair and condition except such of the matters and things last aforesaid as shall from time to time be considered by a mining surveyor or other proper officer to be unnecessary for the working of the said mine or any contiguous mine and in such state and condition shall and will at the end or other sooner determination of the said term deliver peaceable possession thereof and of all and singular the premises hereby demised to Her Majesty her heirs and successors or to the wardens or other officer authorized to receive possession thereof.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BERRINGAMA.

WE, Frederick Edward Mansell, William Henry Mildren, James Nugent, John Edward Whitehead, Edward George Thomas, and Donald James Coghill, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the township of Berrigama, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, flowers, or shrubs in the reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I, sec. 16) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may subdivide any county into parishes and townships, and by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, may define the boundaries of such parishes or townships, and may distinguish each by a name; and that after such Proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognised as a parish or township by the name so given as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the parish hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

PARISH OF LEONGATHA.—Counties of Buln Buln and Mornington: Commencing at a point on the right bank of Coalition Creek where the east side of the road forming the east boundary of part of allotment A², parish of Koorooman, abuts thereon; bounded thence south by the said road to the road forming the south boundary of allotment 64c, parish of Korumburra; thence west by that road thirty-two chains seventy-three links; thence south by a road forty-nine chains twenty-two links; thence east by a road thirty-four chains twenty-one links; thence south by a road ninety-three chains six links; thence westerly by a road one hundred and fifty-three chains eighty-three links; thence westerly by a road fifteen chains eighty-six links; thence northerly by a road one hundred and thirty-three chains twenty links; thence southerly and north-westerly by suburban allotment 7 to the south-west angle thereof; thence southerly by allotments 33b, 34a, 36a, and 37, parish of Kongwak, the east side of a road and allotments 40b and 42 to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence east by a road to the road to Anderson's Inlet; thence southerly and south-westerly by that road to the road forming the north boundary of allotments 56 and 57, parish of Drumdemara; thence easterly by that road and the north boundary of allotment 58a to the north-east angle of the said allotment; thence northerly by a road twenty-three chains fifty-six links; thence easterly and southerly by a road to the road forming the north boundary of allotment 64a; thence easterly by the last-mentioned road one hundred and one chains forty-six links; thence by a line bearing N. 0° 15' W. to the Tarwin River (west branch); thence westerly and northerly by that river to Coalition Creek aforesaid, and further northerly by that creek to the road from Mirboo North; thence south-westerly by that road to a point opposite the south angle of allotment 7, parish of Koorooman; thence north-westerly by a line, the last-mentioned allotment, allotment 8, and a line eighty-one chains; thence north-easterly by a road to the aforesaid creek; and thence westerly by that creek to the point of commencement. —(90.1.14734.)

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

1. A By-law of the City of Bendigo, No. 15, made under the *Local Government Act 1891*, for regulating the hours during which and conditions on which traction and locomotive engines and rollers impelled by steam or electricity may proceed over any road or street within the municipality of the City of Bendigo.
2. In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1891*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—
3. No locomotive traction engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity shall proceed through or along or be worked on any road or street within the city between the hours of Seven a.m. and midnight.
4. Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to extend to or be applicable to any tram cars, motors, or vehicles impelled through the streets by steam or electricity, or to the steam roller or any vehicle used by the Bendigo City Council, under or by virtue of any agreement now or hereafter to be made by the Council of the City of Bendigo with any person or persons, or any corporation.
5. No such locomotive traction engine or roller shall be used within the city unless duly licensed by the council of the said city.
6. Every such locomotive engine or traction engine shall be preceded, when at work, by a man at least one hundred yards in advance of such engine, who shall carry with him a red flag during the daylight, or lamp during darkness, to be used as a signal, and the engine shall be stopped at the request of any one riding or driving until they shall have safely passed, and when passing any horse or vehicle shall move to the near side of the road. The name and address of owner shall be painted or written in legible characters, and affixed or attached in some visible and conspicuous place on near side of engine.
7. No person shall act as a driver of any such locomotive traction engine or roller without having first obtained from the council of the said city a licence authorizing him so to act, and such person so licensed shall, when called upon by any person, produce his licence.
8. No steam whistle shall be used.
9. *Penalty.*—Any person offending against this By-law or any Regulation made or to be made as aforesaid, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £10.
