ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to reduce the Municipal Subsidy for the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three."
- "An Act to amend the law relating to Trustees."
- "An Act to amend the law in respect of the Sale and Purchase of Shares in Banking Companies."
- "An Act to authorize the construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Natimuk to Goroke."
- "An Act to authorize the construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Nathalia to Picola."
- "An Act to further amend the *Coal Mines Railway Construction Act 1891*."

PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

THURSDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Moorabbin and as a Bank Holiday at Drouin;

FRIDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Corryong and Drysdale;

WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of East Loddon and Shepparton, and at Queenscliff, and as a Bank Holiday at Maldon;

WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH, AND THURSDAY, THE 9TH, DAYS OF MARCH NEXT,

to be observed as Public Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, throughout the Borough of Port Fairy*;

FRIDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Arapiles*;

MONDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Kyabram;

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday at Echuca*;

THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Gisborne, and as a Bank Holiday at Colac;

FRIDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Bendigo, the Shires of Colac, Marong, and Yackandandah, and at Malmsbury*, and as a Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shire of Maffra, and at Bridgewater and Inglewood;

WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Daylesford and the Shire of Glenlyon, and as a Bank Holiday at Dunolly and Heidelberg;

THURSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Towong;

WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH, AND THURSDAY, THE 30TH, DAYS OF MARCH NEXT, to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Avoca.*
