PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale, and at Port Fairy and Warragul;

FRIDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Poowong;

MONDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Township of Kyabram*;

TUESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Lancefield;

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of McIvor,* as a Public Holiday and Bank Holiday at Geelong, and as a Bank Holiday at Boort, Heathcote, and Swan Hill;

WEDNESDAY, THE 15TH, FRIDAY, THE 17TH, AND WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND* DAYS OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Huntly;

THURSDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Romsey, and as a Bank Holiday at Becac;

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Horsham, Talbot, and Wangaratta, the United Shire of Beechworth, and the Shires of Avon, Broadford*, Kilmore*, North Ovens, Oxley, Pyalong*, Seymour, and Woorayl; as a Public Holiday and Bank Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Malmsbury* and Rutherglen; and as a Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale, the Shires of Glenelg and Yarrawonga, and at Donald, Horsham, Kilmore, Leongatha, Mansfield, Mirboo North, Omeo, Shepparton, Terang, Wodonga, Wycheproof, and Yackandandah;

TUESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Nathalia;

WEDNESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Dunolly and the East Riding of the Shire of Melton;

THURSDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Morwell;

WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Buln Buln and Lilydale, and as a Bank Holiday at Maryborough;

WEDNESDAY, THE 29TH, AND THURSDAY, THE 30TH DAYS OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Borough of Maryborough* and the Shire of Bet Bet,* and Public Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, on each day, throughout the Shire of Tullaroop.*
