### EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1893.

WITH reference to the notice dated 8th inst., published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th inst., p. 1277, it is now notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1893, and following days, an Examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years on the 1st April, 1893.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

### REGISTRATION OF FIRMS ACT 1892.

ANY person or persons carrying on business under a firm or trading name, which does not disclose the full or usual names of all the partners, or under any name which may be different to the name of the actual proprietor or proprietors of the business, and any person or firm still carrying on business under an old firm name where the original proprietor has ceased to be a partner, or where one or more of the old partners have died or retired, must register on or before 31st March, 1893.

Where the same person or persons are carrying on a business under one or more different firm or trading names each must be registered separately.

Any new firm or any person about to commence business under a firm or trading name must register before commencing business.

Any alteration in a firm or trading name and any change in the constitution of the firm must be registered within one month.

Penalty Five pounds, and for every subsequent conviction not exceeding Ten pounds. Any action by an unregistered firm may be stayed.

Further information can be obtained from the Registrar-General, Melbourne. Printed forms at all Courts of Petty Sessions, at which a copy of the Act can be seen.

## PUBLIC HEALTH.

Section 125 of Act 1098.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, notice is hereby given that it appears to the Board of Public Health that the shires hereinafter mentioned are affected by the dangerous infectious or contagious disease set opposite the names of each respectively, and the said Board doth therefore hereby require all medical practitioners, deputy registrars, school teachers, and members of the police force residing therein respectively, and the occupier or person in charge of any house in which any case of such disease may occur, to report such occurrence immediately on its coming to his or their knowledge by telegraph, or, in case there is no telegraphic communication, by letter, to the said Board and to the council of the municipality in which such house is situated; and the said Board doth prescribe that such notification shall be in the form following (that is to say):—

## Health Act 1890.

## SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

## By-Law No. 3.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Alexandra, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, doth hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 3 of the said Council (that is to say):—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in and within the boundaries of the township of Alexandra.

4. *Definitions*.—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises; “cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; “earth-closet” shall include a pan closet of any description; “street” shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage way, whether a thoroughfare or not; “council” shall mean the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Alexandra. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular; and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

5. No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

6. Every occupier and every other person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, or other material to be approved of by the council, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

9. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Four a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

10. Every occupier and every other person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on, or belonging to such premises.

11. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

12. When any nightman is licensed by the council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same, and no such occupier or person shall contract for the removal of the night-soil therefrom with any nightman or person who is not licensed in that behalf by the council.

13. All night-soil, blood, offal, offensive matter, or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Four a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the council (of which the proof shall be on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

15. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain or sewer.

16. The occupier of every house or tenement in the township of Alexandra in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the council the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council, for emptying and removing the contents of each pan, such sum to be paid by equal quarterly instalments, payable in advance on the first day of each quarter, dating from the levying of the above-mentioned rate, or on such other day or days as may be fixed by resolution of the council.

17. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for any such breach, or of Five pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law, or otherwise, to remedy such breach, and whether the council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

**R**EGULATIONS for the Distribution of the sum of Forty thousand pounds (£40,000) granted by Parliament for the year ending 30th June, 1893, for the giving of Bonuses for Dairy Produce and Fruits of best quality and in best order, exported to foreign markets.

*Fruits.*

The bonus payable on exported fruits shall be the same as that provided in the Bonus Regulations of 29th April, 1890, and all such fruits shall be exported in terms of the said regulations.

*Dairy Produce.*

A bonus may be paid upon all butter made in Victoria, of Victorian produce, whether by dairy farmers or at butter factories, exported during the year 1892-3, to such foreign ports as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture. The amount of such bonus per pound of butter exported shall be regulated by the price obtained on the sale of such butter in the country to which it is exported. Butter sold at 10d. and under 1s. per pound, the amount of the bonus shall be 1d. per pound; if sold at 1s. and over that sum per pound, the amount of bonus shall be 1½d. per pound.

No bonus shall be paid in respect of any butter exported, unless the same has been sold in the country to which it is exported by some agent approved by the Minister, nor unless account sales of such butter, and if required, statutory declarations, verifying such account sales, have been received by the Minister.

All expenses incurred in receiving and storing the butter, and in working the machinery for refrigerating, may be paid out of the said sum of Forty thousand pounds.

*Marine Act 1890.***REGULATIONS**

FOR THE

**LICENSING OF BOATS AND BOATMEN AND THE EQUIPMENT OF  
BOATS PLYING FOR HIRE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS.**

**W**HEREAS by Section 57 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may license boats plying for hire in any port, and also license watermen and boatmen plying within any port: And whereas by Section 59 of the said Act the said Board, with the consent of the Governor in Council, may from time to time make, alter, or repeal Regulations for the licensing of all boats plying for hire in any port, and for the licensing of watermen and boatmen plying within any port, and for affixing penalties to any breach of any regulation made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 16th day of September, 1892, make Regulations whereby every such boatman was required to hold a licence from the Board, and further provided that such boats should be licensed, and also be safe and fit for the carriage of passengers, and restricted as to the number of passengers to be carried therein: And whereas it is expedient to repeal such Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th day of October, 1892, and also to make amended Regulations in lieu thereof: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Administrator of the Government in Council, repeal the aforesaid Regulations, and doth make the following amended Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

These Regulations may be cited as “The Regulations for the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen and the Equipment of Boats,” and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1893.

**GENERAL.**

1. *Licence Fee.*—A fee of Two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the Board by the licensee with the application for the issue of any licence to be granted under these Regulations.

2. *Refusal of Licence.*—The Board may refuse to issue a licence under these Regulations without assigning any cause for such refusal.

3. *Cancellation of Licence.*—The Board may at any time cancel any licence issued under these Regulations without assigning any cause for such cancellation.

4. *Penalty.*—Any breach of these Regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. *Definitions.*—For the purposes of these Regulations the words following shall have the meanings set opposite to each:—

“Boatman” shall mean any person who may be engaged in the navigation or management of any boat which may be used for the conveyance of any passenger or passengers for hire or reward of any kind.

“Boat” shall mean any craft or vessel of any kind whatsoever which may be used for or engaged in the carriage of any passenger or passengers for hire or reward of any kind, and which, apart from these Regulations, would not be subject to the control of the Marine Board or the inspection and supervision of its officers, but shall not include any boat which for the time being is propelled by oars only.

**BOATS.**

6. *Boat to be Licensed.*—No boat shall ply for hire for the carriage of passengers, or shall be let out on hire within any port in Victoria outside the Port of Melbourne as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* unless such boat be duly licensed by the Board in the form prescribed in Schedule III. hereto, and in accordance with these Regulations.

7. *Application for Licence.*—Any person desiring to obtain a licence under these Regulations for any boat shall make application to the Secretary to the Board on the form set out in Schedule I. hereto.

8. *Inspection of Boat before Issue of Licence.*—Before any boat can be licensed the same must be inspected by such officer or person as the Board may appoint for the purpose, and such officer or person shall, if he considers any boat suitable for the purpose of carrying passengers, and properly equipped therefor, give his certificate accordingly in the form provided in Schedule II. to these Regulations.

9. *Inspection of Boat from time to time.*—Any officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose may, from time to time, inspect any boat licensed under these Regulations, and shall be afforded every facility by the owner or person in charge to make such inspection.

10. *Number of Passengers—How determined.*—Before being licensed, every boat shall be measured by an officer of the Board or person appointed for the purpose, and the number of adults which the said boat may carry shall be in the proportion of one to each 18 inches of sitting room, provided that such sitting room shall be clear of all interference with the proper working of the boat. For the purposes of this Regulation two (2) children under twelve years of age shall be reckoned as equal to one adult.

11. *Particulars to be Painted on Boat.*—Each boat licensed under these regulations shall be assigned a number by the Secretary, which number the owner of such boat shall cause to be painted upon the bows thereof in figures of not less than 4 inches in height; each boat shall also have the name thereof painted plainly on the outside of the stern, and on the inside thereof there shall be painted in letters or figures of not less than 2 inches in height the maximum number of passengers such boat is licensed to carry.

12. *Particulars—How to be painted.*—All such letters or figures shall be painted in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground.

13. *Certificate of Officer.*—No licence shall be issued until a certificate, as prescribed in Schedule II. hereto, has been forwarded to the Board by the proper officer that the requirements of these Regulations have been fully complied with.

14. *Crew.*—If any owner or person having charge of any boat shall permit such boat to be used in the conveyance of any passengers for hire or reward of any kind, without being in charge of a crew of duly licensed boatmen, of the number specified in the licence granted to such boat, he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Regulations, and punishable accordingly, and the licence for such boat may be cancelled.

15. *Exemption.*—The Regulation next preceding (No. 14) shall not apply in cases where a boat is specially engaged by one or more persons who is or are willing to undertake the whole charge and responsibility of the same; provided that no owner or other person in charge shall let any boat out for hire unless he is satisfied that the applicant or applicants is or are capable of navigating the said boat under sail. A book is also to be kept in which is to be recorded the name and address of the hirer.

16. *Complement of Passengers.*—If any person shall, with or without the knowledge or consent of the licensee, go on board any licensed boat having at the time its full complement of passengers, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these Regulations.

17. *Buoyancy, Equipments, &c.*—Every licensed boat, while plying for hire in the carriage of passengers, shall be fitted in such a manner that she shall have on board such material as will create an internal buoyancy sufficient to prevent the boat and passengers therein from sinking should any accident occur; and such buoyant material shall be in the proportion of not less than one-half cubic foot for each passenger such boat is licensed to carry; and such boat shall be properly equipped with a full complement of masts, sails, seats, and all other gear necessary to the safe navigation of the boat; and any owner, or person in charge of any boat, who allows her to be used without being provided or equipped as required by these regulations, shall be deemed guilty of a breach thereof, and punishable accordingly; provided that in any case in which in the opinion of the Board it may not be practicable for any such boat to be fitted with material to create internal buoyancy sufficient to prevent such boat and passengers therein from sinking should any accident occur, then every such boat in lieu thereof shall be equipped with an approved life-belt for every person licensed to be carried.

18. *Boat and Gear to be maintained in Good Order.*—Every licensed boat shall, while she continues to be licensed, be kept in good order and repair, both as regards hull and working gear, by the owner or person in charge thereof; and, if at any time the officer appointed by the Board to make an inspection of such boat shall report to the Board that this regulation has not been complied with, the licensee shall be immediately withdrawn and cancelled.

19. *Boat to be Ballasted.*—Every boat, when employed in the carriage of passengers for hire or reward, shall be ballasted to the satisfaction of the officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose, and such ballast shall be properly secured to prevent the same from shifting.

20. *Property of Passengers left in Boat.*—All goods and property left in any licensed boat shall be handed over by the person in charge thereof to the nearest officer of police as soon as practicable after such has been found.

21. *Care of Boats let out on Hire.*—The person or persons to whom a sailing boat is let on hire, shall be held responsible for such boat, and also for the observance of these Regulations, until such boat is taken back and returned to the owner or other person from whom hired.

22. *Change of Ownership.*—In all cases change of ownership of any boat licensed under these Regulations shall be immediately reported in writing to the Secretary to the Marine Board.

#### BOATMEN.

23. *Boatman to be Licensed.*—No person shall ply for hire as a boatman within the limits of any Victorian port outside of the port of Melbourne as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act* 1890 unless he be the holder of a licence issued by the Marine Board in the form prescribed in Schedule VI. hereto, which shall be produced on demand to any officer of Customs, of police, or of the Board, or to any passenger who may desire to see same.

24. *Application for Licence.*—Application for a licence to ply as a boatman must be made to the Secretary on the form prescribed in Schedule IV. hereto; and the applicant shall forward, with his application, written evidence, showing that he is a person of good character, and that he is competent to have charge of or be engaged on board any boat employed in the carriage of passengers. Should such evidence not be deemed by the Board satisfactory in these points the application will be refused.

25. *Competency of Applicant.*—Every applicant for a licence as boatman must, prior to the issue of a licence, be required to satisfy the officer of the Board or other person appointed by them for the purpose that he is competent to have charge of and navigate a boat used in the conveyance of passengers; and such officer shall give his certificate to the Board as to the efficiency of such applicant in the form prescribed in Schedule V. hereto; and, should such applicant fail to satisfy such officer, his application will be rejected.

26. *Boatman to furnish Regulations on Demand.*—Every licensed boatman shall carry a copy of these Regulations, or any additions to or amendments thereof, which will be furnished to such boatman by the Secretary on application, or on being supplied with the address of such boatman; and he shall produce the same when required to do so to any person hiring his boat.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this tenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

Goods forwarded from Melbourne, Williamstown, or Port Melbourne to Swan Hill, and conveyed thence by river or teams to any station on the Edwards River between Moulamein and the Wakool Junction, will be allowed the following Rebates on production of the usual certificate that they have been duly received at their destination, viz.:—Second Class, 16s. 3d.; Third Class, 36s.; Fourth Class, 55s. 8d.
9. Rate at Warrnambool—Between Station and Wharf, Outwards and Inwards Goods, 1s. 6d. per ton.
10. Vessels having discharged their cargoes elsewhere than at a Railway Pier, on seeking a berth to load at a Railway Pier to pay 6d. per ton register pier toll for the accommodation.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1246) it is amongst other things enacted that, pursuant to the provisions of the *Land Act 1890*, the Governor in Council may make regulations for carrying out the provisions of the said *Land Act 1891*: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :—

REGULATIONS.

WORKED-OUT AURIFEROUS LANDS.

1. The Regulations dated 13th June, 1892, and 22nd August, 1892, respectively relating to applications under section 22, *Land Act 1891*, are hereby rescinded except as to all matters done, rights acquired, and obligations incurred thereunder, and the Regulations following are made in lieu thereof :—

2. Every intending applicant for a licence under section 22 of the *Land Act 1891* shall, between the hours of Nine a.m. and Four p.m., place a conspicuous post, or a cairn of stones, at each corner of the allotment, and shall affix to each of such posts or cairns a notice in writing setting forth that he is an applicant for such allotment, the approximate area thereof, and his name and address, and from such post or cairn dig a trench at least two feet long, six inches wide, and four inches deep, in the direction of the containing sides. The applicant shall, before lodging his application for a licence, pay to the nearest Receiver of Revenue the sum of One pound for a certificate of registration, which the said Receiver shall thereupon hand to him, and such sum shall not in any case be refunded. All applicants who mark out the same allotment upon one and the same day shall be deemed to be equal so far as regards priority of marking out. An applicant for a licence who has paid with his application the sum of One pound for a certificate of registration shall, in the event of such licence not being granted by the Governor in Council, be permitted to lodge, during the period of one year from the date of such application, one or more applications, with each of which the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be paid.

3. After defining the boundaries as aforesaid the applicant shall, within one week, post or deliver to the District Land Officer his application, together with the certificate of registration, and such application shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule 45A hereto; and no application shall be accepted unless the said certificate be forwarded therewith; but at the hearing of such application the failure to comply with the provisions hereof respecting the time of delivering the application shall not be deemed to be a fatal objection where the applicant can prove the existence of some reasonable ground of excuse, which shall be recorded by the Land Officer upon the application. The Land Officer shall enter the applications as received in the book kept for the purpose. Applications received by the Land Officer upon one and the same day shall be deemed to be equal so far as regards priority of lodging application.

4. If the application be delivered to the Land Officer by the applicant personally, the Land Officer shall at the time make such inquiries, and obtain such personal statements from him, as may be necessary for dealing with the application, and shall make a record of the same, which shall be read over to and signed by the applicant, to be attached to the application; and attendance at the Local Land Board shall not be required of the

applicant in any case in which objections shall not have been lodged prior to such Board. The inquiries or personal statement may be made at any time prior to the sitting of the Local Land Board.

5. The Land Officer shall weekly insert in a newspaper circulating in the district in which the land applied for is situated a notice of all applications lodged at his office during the preceding week, and shall immediately on the receipt of the application also notify by post every person who, in his opinion, is interested in the application, and request that any objections thereto may be lodged at his office within fourteen days of the date of such notice.

6. The Land Officer shall, at a Local Land Board to be held at his office not less than fourteen days nor more than twenty-one days after the publication of the notice as aforesaid, deal with those applications to which he has received no objection.

7. Immediately upon the receipt of an objection to any application the Land Officer shall notify the applicant of the nature of the objection.

8. Applications to which objections shall have been lodged shall be dealt with at a Local Land Board, to be held at a time and place to be appointed by the Minister, and the Land Officer shall notify to every applicant and to every person who, in his opinion, is interested for or against the application, the time and the place of the meeting of the Local Land Board at which such application and the objections thereto will be heard; but no person shall be deemed to have any right to receive any such notice, and any objection to any such application may be taken by any person, and shall be considered at the hearing, although no notice thereof has been given. Except when specially ordered otherwise by the Minister, all such applications shall be brought before the Local Land Board sitting at the locality nearest which the land referred to is situated, and the applicants shall attend such Local Land Boards in their own proper persons.

9. After the consideration of the report of the Local Land Board, and approval of any application, the approved applicant shall be called upon to pay the fee for survey, and also the valuation (if any) for any improvements that may be upon the land.

10. Upon payment of such survey fee and valuation (if any) being reported, there shall be issued to the approved applicant, if desired by him, a permit to occupy the land to be indicated therein subject to survey and non-interference with any public right as to roads, mining, access to water, &c., upon payment of the fee for the occupation of the land, and also the fee for the preparation of the licence; but the land must not be fenced until the licence is issued. Such permit shall date from the first day of the month following the issue thereof.

11. Upon the completion of the survey and approval thereof by the District Surveyor, a licence in the form and subject to the conditions duly prescribed, or that may be ordered by the Governor in Council in any particular case, shall be prepared and issued. Such licence shall bear the date of the permit to occupy, and sums paid with respect to such permit shall be considered to have been paid in respect of the licence, and shall be credited thereto.

12. If any person whose application for a licence has been approved fail to pay the licence-fees, sums, and fees as hereinbefore directed, within one month of the date of the notice of approval, his application shall be liable to be deemed abandoned, and the area applied for shall be liable to be made available for selection.

13. Unless by the express direction of the Minister, all subsequent payments of licence-fees shall be made to the Receiver in whose district the land is situated; and no Receiver shall receive any moneys on account of licences unless advised from the Department of Lands and Survey so to do.

14. No person will be allowed to hold or obtain more than one licence for such lands, either by transfer, operation of law, or otherwise.

15. The licence-fee to be paid shall be at the rate of Five pounds per centum on the capital value of the land licensed, to be determined by the Board of Land and Works.

16. Licences to occupy worked-out auriferous Crown lands shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule 46A hereto.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the sixth and seventh conditions of this licence, any holder of a miner's right, or of a licence to search for metals and minerals, or of a gold mining or mineral lease shall have the right and shall be allowed to enter upon the land and search for gold, silver, copper, tin, antimony, coal, and other metals and minerals and mineral ores, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery within the area, without making compensation to the licensee for surface or other damage, unless the land so entered upon be improved by filling in holes, leveling, or planting of fruit trees or vines, in which case the person entering for mining purposes shall pay to the licensee such compensation for surface damage as may be mutually agreed upon. In the event of a disagreement the amount to be determined by arbitration under the provisions of the *Lands Compensation Act 1890*. Provided always that such portions of the land as shall be occupied by buildings shall be secure from such intrusion, unless with the consent of the licensee.

11. Notwithstanding anything contained in the sixth, seventh, and tenth conditions of this licence, this licence is on this further condition, that in the event of the Board of Land and Works, or any other body or person for the time being authorized by any Act of the Legislature of Victoria, to construct, maintain, or manage any railway or works in connexion therewith out of moneys appropriated by Parliament for that purpose at any time or times, taking possession and appropriating or using or prejudicially affecting the whole or any part of the land hereby licensed for the purposes of the execution, construction, completion, or extension of any such railway or for any works and conveniences in connexion therewith under or by virtue of the *Lands Compensation Act 1890*, or of any other Act or Acts for the time being in force authorizing the taking, acquiring, or using of any lands, tenements, or hereditaments for railway purposes, neither the licensee nor any person or persons claiming from under or through such licensee shall have any claim for or be paid any compensation whatever for or in respect of his, her, or their interest in any of the licensed land so taken, used, or prejudicially affected, or for any damage that may be sustained by him, her, or them by reason of the execution of the railway works or the severance of any land occupied by him, her, or them from any other land so occupied, or from any road, way, stream, water-course, or other convenience theretofore possessed or enjoyed by him, her, or them; nor shall he she or they have any claim to have constructed or maintained any gates, crossings, or other accommodation works under, over, or upon any railway that may be made through or adjacent to the land hereby licensed. Provided that with respect to any buildings, fences, fixtures, or other improvements upon any land in respect of which a notice to treat under the *Lands Compensation Act 1890* or other Act as aforesaid has been given the licensee or his assigns at any time before such land has been set out, ascertained, and taken possession of and finally appropriated for the purposes of the railway works or undertakings by the Board or other body or person as aforesaid may remove all or any of such buildings, fixtures, fences, or other improvements.

12. If the licensee shall during the currency of this licence fence and reside on, occupy as a place of business, or cultivate the land as specified in the previous conditions during the said period of seven years, and shall prove to the satisfaction of the Board (to be certified under its seal), by such evidence as the Board may require, that he has complied with the said conditions and with all other conditions of this licence, he shall be entitled at any time within twelve months after seven years from the commencement of this licence to demand and obtain from the Governor a Crown grant upon payment of for each acre or fractional part of an acre of the said allotment, or of such other sum (if any) not being less than one-eighth part greater nor more than double the sum of per acre or fractional part thereof as may be fixed by any Order in Council made in that behalf under and by virtue of the provisions of section 17 of the *Land Act 1891*; and every such grant shall be subject to such covenants, conditions, exceptions, and reservations as the Governor may direct.

13. This licence is on this further condition, that the land the subject of this licence shall during the currency hereof be deemed lands of the Crown within the meaning of Section 17 of the *Land Act 1891*, and that upon the making of any Order in Council under the provisions in the said section contained the enhanced licence-fee fixed by such Order in Council shall be payable in respect of the land hereby licensed, as though such licence-fee had been so fixed prior to the making of this licence.

And the Honorable John McIntyre, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders, exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and that, where, in consequence of the exercise of such power, any rights, liabilities, or matters require to be adjusted, the Governor in Council may, by any Order, settle and adjust the same: And whereas the Governor in Council, by an Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of May, 1892, severed a certain area from the Shire of Tambo and constituted the same a new municipality under the name and title of The Shire of Craignolong (now the Shire of Orbost), and in consequence of such severance it has become necessary to settle and adjust certain liabilities between the said Shires of Tambo and Orbost so far as relates to the repayment of a loan of £9,000 floated in 1888: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order as follows, that it is to say:—

That, in accordance with an agreement entered into between the councils of the said municipalities, the liability of the said Shire of Orbost on account of the balance of the said loan shall be £2,570.

That, on account of the balance of the said loan existing at the date of the Order first hereinbefore mentioned, a sum of £98 17s. shall be paid by the said Shire of Orbost to the said Shire of Tambo on or before the first day of October in each year in respect of sinking fund (until with payments of £201 3s. per annum to be made by the Shire of Tambo the amount accumulated be sufficient to liquidate the loan). And that on or before the first day of April and the first day of October in each year a sum of £64 5s. shall be paid by the said Shire of Orbost to the said Shire of Tambo in respect of interest until the loan be liquidated.

And the Honorable William Telford Webb, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from 27th March till 4th April (both dates inclusive), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on 4th April will be available till 4th May. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger (see exception). During the same period, tickets will also be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 82 Swanston-street, City, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (F. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Bendigo (J. Hemming) to Melbourne only. On tickets issued at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations and at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 82 Swanston-street, City, bearing dates from 27th March till 4th April inclusive, the journey may be commenced on any day during that period, and the tickets will be available for return till 4th May inclusive.

**Sydney Excursion Tickets.**—From 27th March till 1st April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £5 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for six calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s. first class, and 10s. second class, in addition to the above-mentioned fare. The journey cannot be broken on that line.

**Adelaide and Broken Hill Excursion Tickets.**—From 27th March to the 3rd April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets available by the express and ordinary trains will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide and Broken Hill at the following return fares, viz.:—Adelaide—First class, £4 4s. 6d.; second class, £2 10s. 8d. Broken Hill—First class, £7 2s. 6d.; second class, £4 6s. 11d. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

**Brisbane Excursion Tickets.**—From 27th March till 1st April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £10; second class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for six calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken at Sydney.

**Luggage.**—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and have the address so secured that it will not come off.

**Horses and Vehicles.**—From 29th March till 4th April (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

**Commercial Travellers' Samples.**—From 29th March till 4th April (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

**Parcels.**—On the 29th, 30th, and 31st March, and 1st and 3rd April, parcels must be at the Parcels office, at both Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations, 30 minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

**Goods Sheds Holidays.**—The 31st March and 3rd April will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignments of powder can ascertain from the station-master at Footscray West when explosives will be received in lieu of these dates. On 30th and 31st March and 1st and 3rd April, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Bendigo, and Ballarat, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcel rates are paid. Consignors of fruit and other perishable goods from Melbourne are requested to consult the Goods Superintendent concerning the despatch of their consignments.

**Seaside Excursions.**—The issue of these tickets at the principal stations will continue as already advertised. (See posters at stations.)



# EXTRA TRAINS AVAILABLE FOR EXCURSION AND ORDINARY PASSENGERS.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF GOORNONG.

**W**E, John Flaherty, Patrick Hallinan, William Rutherford, John Leahy, and James Mulcair, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Goornong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for the holding therein of fêtes or sports as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall cut down or remove from the reserve any live or dead timber.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the reserve.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days as the same may be set apart for fêtes or sports:—  
For admission of every adult, a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.)  
For admission of every saddle-horse, exclusive of the rider, a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.)  
For admission of every carriage, cart, or vehicle drawn by one horse, exclusive of passengers, a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)  
For the admission of every additional horse, Sixpence (6d.)  
Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

of Parliament thereby or theretofore repealed, of any portion or portions of Crown lands, as towns or townships: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, and made in pursuance of an Act passed in the Session of the Parliament of Victoria holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did declare and order that the areas therein defined should be considered Towns within the meaning of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby rescind the Proclamation aforesaid bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, so far only as it relates to the town of Castle Donnington, and do hereby define the boundaries of the township hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

**TOWNSHIP OF CASTLE DONNINGTON.**—County of Tatchera, parish of Castle Donnington: Commencing at a point on the left bank of the Murrumbidgee River where the south side of the road forming the south boundary of allotment 47 of section 13 abuts thereon; bounded thence by the said road bearing westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 4; thence by that allotment, bearing southerly twenty chains; thence by subdivisions H, G, and F of suburban allotment 7 bearing easterly fifteen chains, and by the last-mentioned subdivision, a line, allotment 8, a line, allotment 9, a line, allotment 10, a line, and allotment 14 of section A bearing southerly to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a road bearing easterly to the east side of the road forming the east boundary of allotment 7; thence by that road bearing southerly to the north-west angle of allotment 10; thence by the north boundary of that allotment and a line in continuation thereof bearing easterly to the Narraboor or Little Murray River; and thence by that river and the Murray River aforesaid northerly to the point of commencement.—(92.S.56784).

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of other Governments, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings of Diamond Drills; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.
