## EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1893.

**W**ITH reference to the notice dated 8th inst., published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th inst., p. 1277, it is now notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1893, and following days, an Examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years on the 1st April, 1893.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

## Factories and Shops Act 1890.

**I**N compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. CRAIG, WILLIAMSON, AND THOMAS,

for a period of four weeks from the date hereof, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said work-rooms more than eighteen females for more than fifty-three hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

REGISTRATION DISTRICTS.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HETHERAS by the *Registration of Births Deaths and Marriages Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1137) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide Victoria into districts and assign Victoria and the said districts to the Registrar-General and Deputy Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he may think fit, and may define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts: And whereas it is expedient to define the limits of a new district, to be called the Surrey Hills Registration District, and also to define the limits of the Balwyn and Camberwell Registration Districts: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby define the limits and boundaries of the said districts in manner following, that is to say:-

**SURREY HILLS REGISTRATION DISTRICT.**

Commencing at the junction of Elgar and Riversdale roads; thence north by Elgar-road to Belmore-road; west by Belmore-road to Union-road; south by Union-road to Weybridge-street; west by Weybridge-street to Benson-street; south by Benson-street to Mont Albert-road; west by Mont Albert-road to Chatham-road; south by Chatham-road in a line to the Lilydale railway; easterly by the Lilydale railway to Stanley-terrace; south by Stanley-terrace to Canterbury-road; east by that road to Highfield-road; south by Highfield-road to the Riversdale-road; and west by the Riversdale-road to the commencing point.

**BALWYN REGISTRATION DISTRICT.**

Commencing at Burke-road on the south bank of the River Yarra; thence south along Burke-road to the Camberwell railway station; thence easterly along the Hawthorn and Lilydale railway to a point north of Logan-street; south to and by Logan-street to Prospect Hill-road; easterly by Prospect Hill-road to Highfield-road; north by Highfield-road to Canterbury-road; west by Canterbury-road to Stanley-terrace; north by Stanley-terrace to the railway; west by the railway to a point opposite to the south end of Chatham-road; north to and by Chatham-road to Mont Albert-road; east by Mont Albert-road to Benson-street; north by Benson-street to Weybridge-street; east by Weybridge-street to Union-road; thence north by Warrington and Belmore roads and a line continued in the direction of Warrington-road to the Koonung Koonung Creek; thence along the course of that creek to the River Yarra; and thence along the River Yarra to the point of commencement.

**CAMBERWELL REGISTRATION DISTRICT.**

Commencing at a point formed by the intersection of the eastern side of Burke-road with the southern side of the Melbourne and Lilydale railway line; thence easterly by that railway to a point due north of Logan-street; south to and by Logan-street to Mount Prospect-road; east by Mount Prospect-road to Highfield-road; southerly by the western side of Highfield-road to the northern side of Riversdale-road; westerly by the northern side of Riversdale-road to the eastern boundary of Crown portion 131; southerly by the eastern boundaries of Crown portion 131, allotment A of section 3, and Crown portion 132a to the southern side of Toorak or Norwood road; westerly by the southern side of Toorak or Norwood road to the western side of Summerhill-road; southerly by the western side of Summerhill-road to the northern side of Glen Iris-road or High-street; westerly by the northern side of the Glen Iris-road or High-street to the Koonungkoot Creek; north-westerly by that creek to the eastern side of Burke-road; and northerly by the eastern side of Burke-road to the commencing point.

## COOK STRAIT.—ENTRANCE TO QUEEN CHARLOTTE SOUND.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 2, of the 1st ult., it is hereby notified that Captain Fairchild, of the Government steamer *Hinemoa*, reports that he has carefully sounded the passage between Jackson's Head and Beacon Rock at the entrance to Queen Charlotte Sound, and that there is a narrow channel in the middle of the passage with 4½ fathoms at low water, but that a little nearer to Jackson's Head than mid-channel there are three rocks with only 3 fathoms on them, and that a little nearer to the beacon than mid-channel there are only 2½ fathoms. ## MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulations, viz.:

"287. Masters of steam-ships, pilots, and others in charge of vessels using the compass-adjusting buoys in Hobson's Bay must not use the propelling power of any such ship for swinging the ship round the central or other buoys moored off Sandridge Bend or the buoy moored off St. Kilda Shoal, but must either warp or employ a steam-tug to tow the ship round the above-named buoys."

This regulation shall be construed with and read as part of Part II. of the Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 30th day of November, 1891.

Regulation 99 of Part II. of the Regulations of the said Commissioners, dated the 30th day of November, 1891, is hereby repealed, and the following regulations shall be substituted therefor:

"99. No person shall soil, deface, mark or injure, or, without the consent of the Commissioners, write or paint or place any placard or other document upon any shed, waiting room, barricade, railing, fence, wharf, or wharf post, nor shall any person place or deposit any rubbish, refuse, matter, or article of any offensive character or likely to create a nuisance upon any of the piers, wharfs, or wharf roads, except at the places and in the manner pointed out by the Harbor-master."

"99A. No cart, car, lorry, or vehicle of any description shall be backed up against the wharfs, or be permitted to stand upon any wharf, unless while the same is being actively employed in loading or unloading goods, or in the transport of passengers to and from the wharfs or piers."

The preceding Regulations shall be read as part of Part II. of the Regulations of the Commissioners made the thirtieth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

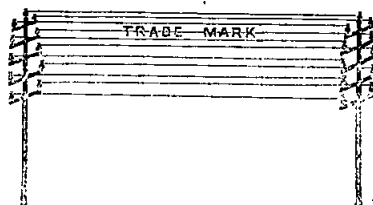

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PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE SHIRES OF CAULFIELD, MOORABBIN, AND OMEO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the respective Councils of the Shires of Caulfield, Moorabbin, and Omeo have requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Councils for the purpose of making streets within the said Shires respectively, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the Shires of Caulfield, Moorabbin, and Omeo aforesaid respectively, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

**MACORNA NORTH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of April, 1893.*

**W**HEREAS by section 222 of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

(a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any Trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office;

(b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat;

(c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and

(d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act and known as the Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Macorna North Irrigation Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or the "irrigation district," shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said Trust wherein the Trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said Trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners, two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such

commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year; and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—

If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said Trust shall be held on the 22nd day of May, 1893; and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the 22nd day of May in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said Trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said Trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.*—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the *Water Act 1830* or under the provisions of any Act amending the same, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

9. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be), shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.*—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded, in writing, to the Minister within eight days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make

such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the Trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the first day of April in each year the officers of the Trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the *Water Act 1830* or under the provisions of any Act amending the same, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

15. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners or joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—Third Schedule.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded, in writing, to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded, in writing, to the chairman of Trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded, in writing, to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. *Special meeting of Trust to be held to revise list.*—List to be certified.—In the month of April in each year a special meeting of the Trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of Trust commissioners to be held within one year from the twenty-second day of May then next, the said day inclusive.

20. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the Trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the Trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. *Notice of election.*—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named, and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall at the time when such nomination paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of

the returning officer the sum of Ten pounds, to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

22. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—*Notice of poll.*—*Hours of polling.*—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

24. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling a notice, in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

26. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

27. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

28. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. *Mode of voting.*—*Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers or exercise any further right of voting.

30. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. *What question may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

"Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of \_\_\_\_\_, being (here specify land as described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—*Returning officer to have casting vote.*—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of Trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the Trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the Trust.

36. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by Trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. *Appeal to Minister from determination of Trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question; and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies, or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election, are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. *Expenses of election to be paid by Trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.

41. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 414 of *The Water Act 1890*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is provided that any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land of the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein: And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from a majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set forth in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole; And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain lands situate in the parishes of Kerang, Tragowel, and Macorna, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of the proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district (as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) an Irrigation and Water District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the said Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of October, 1892, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

**W**HEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is enacted that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from the majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set out in the declaration of the Minister published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole.

And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions in the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly. And it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council approve of such proposed scheme, with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, he may by Order in Council constitute the proposed district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and appoint and create an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, to construct, maintain, and continue the works described in the Order.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain land situate within the parishes of Kerang, Tragowel, and Macorna, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district (as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) an Irrigation and Water

Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of October, 1892, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas, after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, on this 10th day of April, 1893, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Administrator of the Government in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister, might be adopted: And whereas, after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Administrator of the Government in Council has, by an Order in Council dated this 10th day of April, 1893, approved of the said proposed scheme:

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid, doth declare, order, and direct—

1. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted, as from the date of this Order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District," under the said *Water Act 1890*, and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described, in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.

2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted, as such limits and boundaries are set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme of the proposed works shall be the construction of a supply channel from the River Murray to the Kow Swamp, with head works; regulating works, at the outlet of the Kow Swamp Storage Basin; a channel thence towards the River Loddon, together with minor collateral works; and channels for the conveyance and distribution of water in the Trust district, and all secondary works connected therewith.

5. That the source from which the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain its supply of water is the Kow Swamp Storage Basin.

6. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on Trust works is Nineteen thousand two hundred and ninety-seven pounds sterling (£19,297).

7. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, by way of loan is Nineteen thousand two hundred and ninety-seven pounds sterling (£19,297); that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced; the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction, in accordance with section Three hundred and six of the said Act, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

8. The rate at which the Trust shall pay for water supplied from the National Works shall be a proportion of the total charges for interest and maintenance and management of such works equivalent to the proportion of the water from such works delivered to the Trust, and as far as can be at present ascertained about One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) per annum for a supply of one thousand and eighty (1,080) cubic feet per minute from 1st July to 30th November and six hundred and eighty (680) cubic feet per minute from 1st December to 30th April in each year.

9. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balance due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Nineteen thousand two hundred and ninety-seven pounds (£19,297) sterling, and no rate made by the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the pound (£1) upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

10. That the number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

11. That the maximum amount which may be paid out of a loan raised by the said Macorna North Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in defraying the preliminary costs and expenses of application for this Order, shall be Fifty pounds (£50).

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WARRANOOK CEMETERY.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Warranook Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and

from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within five (5) feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than four (4) feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

**WE**, William Marion Smith, Thomas Light Hamling, William George Leigh, and John Samers, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Racing and other purposes of recreation at Inglewood, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—  
 (1st). The stand enclosure.  
 (2nd). The remainder of the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, seats, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the 1st and 2nd divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for racing, shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every adult to the 1st division, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).

For the admission of every adult to the 2nd division, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.).

10. No person shall, after the 18th day of April, 1893, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portion of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

A. That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management of the reserve or the Committee or Stewards of the Inglewood Racing Club, or by those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards, on payment of a fee of One pound one shilling.

B. That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the reserve or the Committee or Stewards of the Inglewood Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, Committee, or Stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England in the diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Administrator of the Government, the same was allowed by him on the 10th day of April, 1893, and the following is the form in which such Statement of Trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of land.*—Two acres, county of Bourke, parish of North Melbourne, city of Melbourne, being part of section 39: Commencing at the intersection of the south-west side of Elizabeth-street and the north-west side of Latrobe-street; bounded thence by the last-named street bearing S. 62° W. four chains; thence by a line bearing N. 28° W. five chains; thence by A'Beckett-street bearing N. 62° E. four chains; and thence by Elizabeth-street aforesaid bearing S. 28° E. five chains to the point of commencement.

*Names of trustees.*—The Bishop of Melbourne; John Benn, Esquire, of Toorak; Henry Henty, Esquire, of Kew; William Croft, Esquire, of Melbourne; and William Edward Morris, registrar of the diocese of Melbourne, of the Diocesan Registry, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of

Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

17. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

18. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.

The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which

will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security will be calculated at Ten per cent. on the total amount of contract.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. 5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Supervisor of Maintenance, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised.

13. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. 3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1893, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1893, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1893.
4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

## REGULATION No. 1.

**A** REGULATION made by the Council of the City of St. Kilda, under the provisions of the *Police Offences Act 1890*, for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and foot-ways and public places of the city of St. Kilda, and for preventing any obstruction thereof respectively.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act of Parliament of Victoria, No. 1126, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of St. Kilda order as follows:—

1. All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, foot-ways, or any other public places of the city shall discontinue to do so immediately on being so required by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the foot-ways shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the foot-way.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

4. The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

5. No driver of any omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

6. The driver of any vehicle, of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose shall give notice of his intention so to do, if riding upon such vehicle, by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle, or interrupt or delay traffic, he shall, upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

7. Between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of any day no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public road-ways or foot-ways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such road-way or foot-way, whether from buildings in process of construction, demolition, or in any other manner.

# ROYAL VICTORIAN INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND.

Incorporated 1892.

THE following are the by-laws of The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind, adopted at a meeting of its subscribers, held in the Town Hall, Melbourne, on 12th September, 1892, after incorporation as required by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*

## BY-LAWS.

### Title.

1. The institution shall be called The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind.

### Objects.

2. The institution shall be conducted on general protestant principles, and its objects be to impart an education of a religious, general, and industrial character to the youthful blind of the colony of Victoria, with a view of making them good citizens and self-supporting. It is not, however, an asylum for the homeless or imbecile, or an hospital for the sick, and no responsibility as to the care of these can be undertaken by the board of management.

### Members and their Privileges.

3. Members shall consist of annual subscribers and life governors.

4. Every subscriber of £1 or upwards yearly shall, in the year for which such subscription is paid, be a member.

5. The following shall be entitled to life governorship, viz.:—  
Donors of £20 or upwards in one sum.

Hon. treasurers of any concert or entertainment given in aid of the funds of the institution, when the net profits of such concert or entertainment shall amount to £20 or upwards.

One executor or executrix of any will by which £20 or upwards is bequeathed to the funds of the institution.

The council of any city, town, borough, or shire, or any company, club, or other association contributing £20 or upwards may nominate one of its members for life governorship.

6. Every member or life governor shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

7. Every yearly subscription shall be payable in advance, and every yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of the first payment, but no first payment shall entitle any member or life governor to a vote at any general meeting held within one month from the date of such payment.

8. Except as hereinafter provided, all members and governors shall be eligible as members of the board of management.

### Meeting of Members.

9. An annual meeting of the members of the institution shall be held in Melbourne, in the month of July, at which a report of the proceedings of the previous year shall be presented, together with an audited account of receipts and disbursements, and at which the board of management, honorary officers, and auditors for the ensuing year shall be elected. Special meetings of the members may be called by resolution of the board of management, or on a requisition being made to them by not less than twenty members.

### Board of Management.

10. The board of management shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and nine members, who shall be elected from the members at the annual general meeting.

11. On the second Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the board of management shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. If any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, or addressed to the chairman of the board of management, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the board of management, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the board of management, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*, are required to go out of office.

12. The honorary officers as above specified shall hold office for one year, and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be eligible for re-election; and should vacancies occur during the year, the board of management shall fill such vacancies for the remainder of that year.

13. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the board of management, or in the profit thereof, or in work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such board, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the board shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter under the consideration of the board in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

14. The board of management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers, frame regulations for the management of the institution, the same not being repugnant to the general by-laws, present a report to the annual meetings of subscribers, and manage the institution generally.

15. The board of management shall meet for the transaction of business monthly. Four members of committee shall form a quorum. The meeting shall be held on the second Thursday of each month at four o'clock p.m.

16. The board of management shall, at their first meeting after every annual meeting of the members, elect from amongst themselves a house committee of three, and a finance committee of three. The president, vice-presidents, and the honorary treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all committees.

#### House Committee.

17. The house committee shall, under the direction of the board of management, deal with matters of detail or urgency, and shall meet from time to time as necessity may occur.

18. Two members shall form a quorum.

#### Finance Committee.

19. The finance committee shall consist of the treasurer for the time being and two other members of the board, and shall meet before the monthly board meeting to examine all accounts and recommend their payment if correct.

#### Honorary Treasurer.

20. The honorary treasurer shall supervise the finances of the institution, and shall cause its moneys to be deposited in such bank as the board of management may direct, to the credit of the institution. He shall pay all accounts passed by the board by cheque on the bank, which must be countersigned by the secretary. He shall also check the vouchers of such payments from time to time.

#### Auditors.

21. The annual meeting in July shall elect two gentlemen, not being members of the board of management, as auditors for the ensuing year.

22. The auditors shall make a quarterly examination of the books of the institution, and shall at the close of the year examine the annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual meeting of members.

#### Tenders for Supplies.

23. As far as possible all articles required for the use of the institution shall be supplied by contract. Tenders for supplies shall be invited at stated periods, particulars of which shall be duly recorded in the minute book.

#### Superintendent and Secretary.

24. The superintendent shall live in the institution, and shall not be absent except on necessary occasions. He shall have the entire management of the scholastic and domestic arrangements, and the immediate superintendence and general control of the entire establishment. He shall engage and dismiss all servants, direct and control all paid officers and teachers, and shall have power, in cases of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any such officers, pending the decision of the board of management, and if necessary to hire temporary substitutes for officers thus suspended.

25. He shall see that the house and grounds are kept in a state of cleanliness and order, shall have all minor repairs attended to at once, and shall inspect the food of the inmates, and see that it is properly prepared, and of good quality. He shall also superintend the industrial department, and shall keep an inventory of the property of the institution and be held responsible for the whole.

26. He shall order and receive the stores and supplies as furnished by contract from the tradesmen, and shall see that they are of proper quality and quantity, and shall not suffer any waste, or allow any provisions or other property to be taken from the premises.

27. He shall conduct the correspondence, clerical and financial business of the institution, and shall cause proper and detailed accounts of its business to be kept, with such accounts and books as shall show the state of the various industrial departments, and all details relating thereto, and such other books or forms as may be from time to time required by the board of management for the development of the institution.

28. He shall arrange for the inmates to attend Divine Service, either at the institution or at some neighbouring church, every Sunday, weather permitting.

#### Matron.

29. The matron shall live in the house, and shall not leave it without the consent of the superintendent, and shall attend to his directions; she shall have the superintendence of the female domestics and inmates, and enforce personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to order on their part; she shall see that the girls are properly washed and clothed; she shall daily inspect all beds, and see that they are properly made and kept clean; also superintend the proper cooking of the food.

#### Assistant Secretary.

30. The assistant secretary shall, in all matters, act under the direction of the superintendent, and take charge of the institution in his absence. He shall keep all books and accounts, and have charge of all moneys received at the institution, which he will bank daily to its credit.

#### Liabilities of Officers.

31. The superintendent, and other paid officers receiving moneys, shall be required to give a policy of a guarantee society or company as security for rendering a just and true account of all moneys received by them on behalf of the institution. The premium of such policy to be paid by the institution.

32. No officer shall be responsible for any moneys not actually received by him, or be in any way answerable for the accounts, receipts, neglects, or defaults of any other officer.

#### Common Seal.

33. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the office of the superintendent, and shall be guarded by two different locks, the key of one to be kept by the honorary treasurer, and the other by the superintendent, and must only be opened when both are present. It shall not be affixed to any deed, instruments, or writing, except by order of the board of management, at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

#### Subordinate Officers, Teachers, and other Employes.

34. The subordinate officers, teachers, &c., shall carry out such duties as may from time to time be specified in the regulations, a copy of which shall be signed by each officer on his or her appointment, and shall obey the orders of the superintendent, and report to him all cases of irregularity on the part of the inmates, and generally assist him in maintaining order and discipline in the institution.

#### Pupils.

25. The pupils shall consist of three classes, viz.—Free, assisted, and paying.

36. Applications for admission of pupils must be made on forms supplied by the institution, and no pupil may be admitted unless the said forms have been filled up to the satisfaction of the board of management and the hon. medical officers.

37. Pupils can be received only for the current year ending 31st December next after admission. In the preceding month of November in each year renewed application must be made by their parents or guardians, when they may be re-admitted for one year if approved by the board of management. Failing such application it shall be deemed that they decline the further aid of the institution.

38. No pupil shall be admitted under the age of seven or over fifteen years, but under special circumstances it shall be competent for the board of management by resolution to receive persons over the age of fifteen years as day pupils (non-resident) in the manufacturing department for a period not to exceed five years.

39. A guarantee must be given by the parents or guardians of pupils, before admission, that they will resume charge of them whenever required to do so, which guarantee must be renewed yearly on application for re-admission.

40. While in the institution pupils are to be under the absolute control of the board of management, and of their responsible officers, and be amenable to such discipline and punishment as may be considered necessary by them.

41. Pupils shall be retained only during good behaviour. Disorderly, disobedient, and unmanageable pupils, as well as those who are or may become mentally deficient, must make way for those likely to be benefited by the educational course.

42. In the case of all free pupils, the parents or guardians shall make a statutory declaration to the effect that owing to the poverty of their circumstances they are quite unable to contribute anything towards their support; and that such declaration shall be indorsed by two responsible persons in whom the board of management may have confidence.

43. In all cases of assisted inmates, the parents or guardians shall sign a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay more than the amount specified in the application papers, such declaration to be indorsed by two responsible persons in whom the board of management may have confidence.

44. In all cases of paying pupils, parents, or guardians shall give a guarantee for the quarterly payment in advance of the necessary fees.

45. In all cases, parents or guardians shall provide pupils with clothing as specified in list printed in annual report.

46. Any of the inmates disobeying the orders of the superintendent, matron, or other officers, or otherwise transgressing the regulations of the institution, shall be subject to punishment, to be administered by the superintendent, with a light cane in cases of boys under sixteen, or by seclusion for a period not to exceed eight hours in any one day in cases of female pupils. Pupils over sixteen shall be dealt with as may be approved by the board of management, and in the event of continued misconduct—intemperance, &c.—the offender shall be dismissed.
