SHIRES OF ALBERTON AND WOORAYL.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the ratepayers in the portions of the Shires of Alberton and Woorayl

which are described in their petition, and they desire that the areas so described may be severed from the Shires of Alberton and Woorayl and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of South Gippsland."

Area described in petition:—

Commencing at the south-east corner of the parish of Welshpool at Lewis' Channel; thence north by the east boundary of the parish of Welshpool to the north-east corner of the parish; thence by the north boundaries of the parishes of Welshpool and Toora, the north-west corner of block 35A; thence in a straight line to Mount Fatigue; thence westerly by direct line to the north-east angle of block 61, parish of Mirboo South; thence west by the north boundary of blocks 61B and 61A, north-west by a road forming the south-west boundary of block 37, parish of Dumbalk, and west by a road to the south-west angle of block 98B; thence south-west by a road to the east boundary of the parish of Nerrena; thence south by that boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of Nerrena; thence westerly by the north boundary of the parish of Meeniyan to the River Tarwin; thence southerly by the River Tarwin to the north angle of block 36; thence easterly by a road forming the north boundary of blocks 36, 37, and 32 to the Great Southern Railway Line; thence south-easterly by the railway line to the east boundary of Meeniyan; thence by the east boundary of Meeniyan and Tarwin South to the north boundary of the parish of Waratah; thence east by that boundary to the sea-coast; thence easterly and north-easterly by Corner Inlet and Lewis' Channel to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the residents within the area sought to be severed have not had their wants satisfactorily attended to owing to the large area of the riding, bad roads, and expense and loss of time in getting any person from the neighbourhood to represent them at the Council meeting held at Alberton, which place is 50 or 60 miles from the west portion of the riding, &c.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said areas from the Shires of Alberton and Woorayl, and constitute them a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of South Gippsland."
