*Factories and Shops Act 1890.*

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

for a period of six weeks from the 1st May next, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than ten females for more than fifty-four hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

## FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

## ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

# AMENDED AND ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS

## FOR THE

# EXAMINATION OF ENGINEERS FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

WHEREAS by Section 59 of the *Marine Act* 1890 it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the conduct of examinations of persons desiring to obtain Certificates of Competency as engineers, as to the qualifications to be possessed by such persons, and for the issue of Certificates of Competency thereto:

And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 25th day of October, 1889, make such regulations as aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulations Nos. 11, 13, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, and sub-sections (a) and (b) of Regulation No. 34 of "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers" published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd day of November, 1889, and to make amended Regulations in lieu thereof, and also to make an additional Regulation.

Now, therefore, the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Administrator of the Government in Council, repeal the Regulations numbered as aforesaid from the date hereinafter specified, and doth make the following amended Regulations in lieu and to be read in substitution thereof, and doth also make the following additional Regulation, that is to say:—

Service in any  
port, river, or  
lake.

11. In addition to the time required to be served in a workshop as hereinafter provided, service performed in any port or on any river or lake in a steam-ship in which the aggregate piston area of the propelling engines proper amounts to at least 2,000 (two thousand) circular inches will be accepted towards qualifying a candidate to be examined for a Certificate of Competency as follows:—

Two months of such service, in a capacity not lower than that of Third Engineer, may be accepted as equivalent to one month of sea service, provided that,

For a Second Class Certificate, not less than three months of the qualifying service must be actual sea service, and that,

For a First Class Certificate, at least six months of the qualifying service must have been at sea in a grade not below that of Third Engineer, where an engineer of a lower grade is carried. During the last eighteen months of this service the candidate must have been in possession of a Second Class Engineer's Certificate of Competency.

Service in the  
coasting trade.

13. In order to make up for the time spent in port, service performed in any steam-ship trading between any ports on the coast of Victoria must amount to at least half as much again as that required by these Regulations, i.e., eighteen months' service in the Victorian coast trade will be accepted as equivalent to twelve months' service in any other trade. In all cases the length of service will be deemed to have commenced on the date of signing of the articles of agreement and to end on the date of discharge.

Third Class  
Certificates.

29. Third Class Engine-drivers' Certificates will be of three grades, and applicable for service respectively in the following classes of steam-ships, namely:—

Class (a). "River Steam-ships," being steam-ships not exceeding 15 tons gross registered tonnage, plying on any river or on any inland waters in the colony of Victoria.

Class (b). "River Steam-ships," being steam-ships of less than 100 nominal horse-power, plying on any river or on any inland waters in the colony of Victoria, not being salt water.

Class (c). "River and Bay Steam-ships," being steam-ships of less than 100 nominal horse-power, plying in any port or on any river, lake, or bay in the colony of Victoria.

Service qual-  
ifications.

30. Service which has been performed in steam-ships under 15 tons gross registered tonnage plying on any inland water or on any river will *not* be accepted as qualifying service for Certificates as Engine-drivers on steam-ships exceeding such tonnage; only such service as has been performed on steam-ships plying in the ports of Port Phillip, Melbourne, Geelong, Western Port, or Gippsland Lakes will be accepted as qualifying service for Certificates of Competency for Third Class Engine-drivers on "River and Bay Steam-ships."

31. (1) The holder of a Third-class Certificate restricted to service on "River Steam-ships" (Class a) not exceeding 15 tons gross registered tonnage, plying on inland waters, who is desirous of obtaining a Certificate applicable to "River Steam-ships" (Class b) of less than 100 nominal horse-power, may have his Certificate exchanged therefor on his producing satisfactory evidence of having served for a period of not less than three (3) months as leading fireman or assistant engineer on a "River Steam-ship" exceeding 15 tons gross registered tonnage, and on his showing to the satisfaction of the Board's Examiner that he has acquired practical knowledge and experience in the working of engines and boilers of such last-mentioned class of steam-ships.

(2) The holder of a Third-class Certificate restricted to service on "River Steam-ships" (Class a) not exceeding 15 tons gross registered tonnage, plying on inland waters, and desirous of obtaining a Certificate applicable to "River and Bay Steam-ships" (Class c) without restriction as to limits, may have his Certificate exchanged therefor on his producing satisfactory evidence of having served for a period of not less than nine (9) months as leading fireman or assistant engineer on a steam-ship plying in the ports of Port Phillip, Melbourne, Geelong, Western Port, or Gippsland Lakes, and on his showing to the satisfaction of the Board's Examiner that he has acquired a practical knowledge and experience in the working of engines and boilers of the class of steam-ships plying in any such ports.

(3) The holder of a Third-class Engine-driver's Certificate restricted to service on "River Steam-ships" of less than 100 nominal horse-power, desirous of obtaining a Certificate applicable to "River and Bay Steam-ships" without restriction as to limits, may have his Certificate exchanged therefor on his producing satisfactory evidence of having served for a period of not less than six (6) months as leading fireman or assistant engineer on a steam-ship plying in the ports of Port Phillip, Melbourne, Geelong, Western Port, or Gippsland Lakes, and on his showing to the satisfaction of the Board's Examiner that he has acquired practical knowledge and experience in the working of engines and boilers of the class of steam-ships plying in any such ports.

32. (1) A candidate for a Third-class Engine-driver's Certificate of any grade must be not less than 22 years of age :

- (a) A candidate for a certificate restricted to service in a river steam-ship not exceeding 15 tons gross registered tonnage must have served afloat three years as a fireman, or have performed such service which, in the opinion of the Board, is equal to the service first mentioned.
- (b) A candidate for a certificate applicable to a "River Steam-ship" or to a "River and Bay Steam-ship" of less than 100 nominal horse-power must have served afloat two years as a fireman, and one year as a leading fireman and assistant engineer, making three years' service, or such service as in the opinion of the Board is equal to the qualifying service first mentioned; provided that not less than six months of the qualifying service must have been service afloat in the engine-room.

(2) All candidates for Third-class Engine-drivers' Certificates must—

- (a) Produce satisfactory testimonials for the whole of the period of service.
- (b) Be able to explain the use of the principal parts of engines and boilers in general use on the waters for which he is desirous of being examined, including all valves, cocks, and connexions; also the salinometer.
- (c) Write a legible hand, and understand the first four rules of arithmetic.

33. Service performed with a Third-class Engine-driver's Certificate of any grade will not be accepted as qualifying service for First or Second Class Engineers' Certificates.

34. A candidate for a Second-class Engineer's Certificate must be not less than 21 years of age:

- (a) He must have served an apprenticeship to an engineer for three years at least, and prove that during the period of his apprenticeship he has been employed on the making and repairing of engines: or, if he has not served an apprenticeship, he must prove that for not less than three years he has been employed as a journeyman mechanic in some factory or workshop\* on the making or repairing of engines.† In either case he must also have served one year at sea in the engine-room as an engineer on regular watch. (See also Reg. 13); or
- (b) He must have served at least four years at sea in the engine-room as an engineer on regular watch. (See also Reg. 13.)

#### *Additional Regulation:*

34. (j) He must possess a creditable knowledge of the prominent facts relating to combustion, heat, and steam.

These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the first day of June, 1893, on which date Regulations Nos. 11, 13, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, and subsections (a) and (b) of Regulation No. 34, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

The foregoing amended and additional Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this twentieth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

**W**HEREAS by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say)—and doth order that the same shall take effect on and after the 1st day of January, 1893:—

**DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.****I.—GENERAL.**

1. A drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on the exportation therefrom of the goods mentioned in Schedules Nos. 1 and 2 hereunto attached, and at the rate therein respectively specified, provided that in no case the amount of drawback shall exceed the amount of duty paid on importation.

2. In order to entitle the exporter to claim any such drawback, he shall comply with the following conditions:—

Form A. (a) A notice in the Form A must be given to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, at least two working hours before packing, of the intention to pack.

(b) The usual export entry must be passed and security given by bond as provided by ss. 136 and 137 of the Act No. 1081 (or, if desired, the said entry and bond may be deposited with the Inspector of Drawbacks before the vessel by which the goods will eventually be shipped has been entered out, the name of the ship being subsequently filled in prior to shipment of the goods), accompanied by invoices, distinguishing—

Goods—Free;

„ Liable to ad valorem duty, specifying the rate of duty paid on importation;  
„ Boots and shoes, specifying the sizes and rates of duty paid on importation;  
„ Manufactured in Victoria from materials imported, and rate of duty paid on such material;

„ Liable to fixed duties, specifying the rates of duty paid on same;  
such invoices shall set forth legibly in respect to each specific class of articles the quantities, qualities, sizes, values, and general description of same, the actual cost price received, or to be received, from the purchaser of the goods, and in respect to boots and shoes the respective sizes, number of pairs, &c. In cases where the value for home use would give as drawback an amount greater than the duty paid, the exporters must take care to place on their entries and invoices the words “Drawback claimed on £—” (inserting a value which would give as drawback a sum not greater than the duty paid). The entry having been passed or deposited (as required above), and invoices in duplicate as required having been stamped, the said entries and invoices, together with the notice (Form A) must be presented to the proper officer of Customs, before whom or any justice of the peace such of the declarations contained in Form E hereto as will suit the circumstances of the case must be made and subscribed by the exporter or his duly authorized representative, and in case such goods shall be exported by a firm, by its duly authorized representative, or by a member of such firm.

In the case of fixed duty goods only, such of the declarations contained in Form E hereto as will suit the circumstances of the case can be used.

(c) The full amount of ad valorem duty paid upon importation may be allowed as drawback on the goods mentioned in Schedule No. 1, subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

1. The entry having been duly dealt with as hereinbefore provided (*vide* clauses 1 and 2), shall bear on its face the words “Full duty paid claimed as drawback,” and shall show thereon also the original invoice values (with 10 per cent. added thereto), and the rate of duty paid, and the declaration on back of said entry shall be in accordance with the Schedule hereto (Form E).

2. The original invoices produced at the time the import entry was passed, and which must bear the Customs stamp and Landing Waiter's initials as evidence of such production, shall be shown to the proper officer.

3. Statement of original invoice values, &c., as per Form D, must accompany the entries.

4. The goods for export on which drawback is claimed must be capable of easy identification by the officers of Customs with the original invoices, either by showing the maker's marks or numbers on such goods, or by being still in the original packages in which imported, or such other evidence as to the Collector of Customs shall seem satisfactory.

5. Export (or Purchaser's) invoices must accompany the entry (see Declaration, Form E).

6. Travellers' samples will not be allowed drawback under this clause.

Entries passed under clause (c) must bear on the face of same the following statement, viz.:—

Full duty paid claimed as drawback.

(d) Drawback will be allowed on travellers' samples subject to the conditions that the usual export entry and invoices have been passed and dealt with as directed in clauses (a) and (b), and that the appropriate declarations as provided in Form E have been duly made and subscribed.

Entries passed under clause (d) must bear on the face of the same the statement as follows:—

"Travellers' Samples."

(e) Every facility desired must be given to the officer to enable him to superintend the examination and packing of the said goods, and to take a correct account according to the invoice thereof.

(f) Upon the completion of the packing, the goods must be secured to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Drawbacks, and despatched in charge of a carrier duly licensed under the Customs laws into the Customs shed, or delivered to the custody of the export officer for shipment; or, if not so forthwith removed, they must be deposited in some secure room approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, under the lock of the Crown, until removal.

(g) If the exporter cannot specify the number of packages in the entry, such may be inserted, and the officer in charge is hereby required to see that such is inserted, prior to the removal of the packages.

(h) Such proof shall be given to the Inspector of Drawbacks as may be required that full duty was paid on importation.

(i) Words and expressions used in these regulations and the schedules hereto shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively in any Act relating to the Customs.

(j) The exporter may, in writing, authorize any of his clerks to pass drawback entries and make the required declarations on same, and also to certify to the correctness of the invoices and statements; provided such authority is previously lodged with and approved by the Collector of Customs. (See Act No. 1081, sec. 99.)

3. No drawback of duty will be due or payable unless the debenture (Form B or C) duly completed is received by the Collector of Customs, Melbourne or Geelong, as the case may be, nor until such debenture has been examined by the Jerquer and found correct by him, and been approved under the hand of such Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorized by him.

4. Debentures may be paid one week after the shipment of the goods, but nothing contained in these regulations shall be held to compel the Collector of Customs to pay any claim for drawback which he may consider it inadvisable from any cause whatever to allow.

5. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty shall pay to Her Majesty a charge of Two shillings per hour, or any portion of an hour, during the time an officer is employed under these regulations, and any other expense incurred, as certified by the Inspector of Drawbacks, and no debenture shall be passed for payment until such expenses shall have been paid.

6. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty at any appointed Victorian port on the River Murray must specify on the entry the name of the consignee and final destination of the goods, and at each port on the River Murray the officer in charge will attend at his office, on such day and at such hour as may be directed by public notice from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, to pass such goods for drawback in respect to which he may have received due notice.

Debentures under this regulation must be rendered to the Collector of Customs at Melbourne (see clause 3), who will, if they are correct, pay them at the Custom House, Melbourne, or remit the money to the claimant, less the cost of remittance.

7. No drawback of duty will be payable on goods except on packages re-packed in the presence of or inspected by an officer of Customs, who will in the latter case cause such to be examined as may be directed by the Inspector of Drawbacks, and certify on the entry, invoice, or statement, as the case may be, that such has been done, specifying whether the quantities, values, weights, &c., as the case may be, were correct or not on such examination.

8. The person before whom the declaration on the drawback debenture must be made shall be any justice of the peace or such other person or persons as may by law be authorized to take and witness declarations or affidavits; and all other declarations may be made before any such justice or other person or persons duly authorized by law or any officer of Victorian Customs.

9. The hours of business for drawback officers are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., closing on every Saturday at 12 noon. Should the exporters require an extension of time, an overtime application must be made to the Inspector of Drawbacks, on approval of which such extension will be allowed.

10. No drawback of duty will be allowed on second-hand goods subject to fixed rate of duty on importation.

11. Drawback of duty will be allowed upon second-hand goods liable to an ad valorem duty on importation (and enumerated in Schedule No. 1), but such drawback will be calculated only on the value of such goods at the time of export, such value to be specially approved by the Inspector of Drawbacks.

12. Should the Collector of Customs desire it, any goods may be re-opened or re-examined after having been passed by the drawback officer; and the unpacking or re-packing of such goods shall be conducted by or at the expense of the exporter.

13. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs is also hereby empowered, but subject to the provisions of the Act No. 1081, to cause any debenture to be passed for payment though these regulations may not have been strictly complied with.

18. When the packing of any goods entered for drawback has been completed the packages containing the same shall be sealed by the officer or officers superintending the operation before leaving the warehouse or place where the goods shall have been packed, and a distinctive mark or label shall be placed by them upon each package, by which it may be identified when received for shipment.

**W**HEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I., sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE PERMISSIVE OCCUPATION OF CERTAIN  
 ALLOTMENTS OF RECLAIMED LAND ON THE KOO-WEE-RUP  
 SWAMP SET ASIDE FOR ELECTED LABOURERS EMPLOYED BY  
 THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT IN CONNEXION WITH THE  
 RECLAMATION WORKS.

1. The area of any one of such allotments shall not exceed twenty acres, and no person shall be allowed to occupy more than one allotment.
2. The permissive occupation shall be for a period of three (3) years.
3. The occupant of any allotment may, if required by the Public Works Department, be employed every alternate week on the Swamp drainage works.
4. During the first year he must erect a habitable dwelling and cultivate at least an acre of the area, failing which the permit to occupy will be cancelled.
5. Before the end of the third year he must have reclaimed and cultivated at least one-fourth of the area occupied.
6. During the term of the permissive occupation a fee at the rate of Two shillings an acre per annum shall be charged, payable every six (6) months in advance.
7. No application to transfer during the first three years of the occupation will be entertained except in the event of death of the occupier, when his interest may, with the consent of the Minister, be transferred to any person who does not already possess any land.
8. On satisfactory proof being given that the above conditions have been fulfilled, a lease for 21 years will be issued under the provisions of Division 6 of the *Land Act 1890*.
9. Within the area named the rent under the lease shall be fixed by the Governor in Council.
10. Should any occupier not desire a lease he may, subject to the approval of the Board of Land and Works, after the completion of the third year of permissive occupation, transfer his holding to any person who does not already possess any land.

METHOD OF MAKING APPLICATION FOR LEASES AND LICENCES  
 UNDER SECTIONS 32, 42, 65, 67, 97, AND 99, LAND ACTS  
 1890-91, AND SECTION 22, LAND ACT 1891.

Sections 1 to 7 of Chapter V., except so far as regards the form and conditions of lease, sections 1 and 2 of Chapter VIII., and sections 1, 2, and 3 of Chapter XIV., of the Regulations dated 4th August, 1890, and sections 2 to 13 of the Regulations dated 20th March, 1893, are hereby rescinded, and the Regulations following are made in lieu thereof:—

1. Every intending applicant for a lease under section 97, or for a licence under sections 42 or 49 in unsurveyed country, or section 65, or for a licence for a site under section 99 of the *Land Acts 1890-1891*, or for a licence under section 22 of the *Land Act 1891*, shall affix to a post or other conspicuous object at or near each corner of the allotment a legible notice in writing

setting forth that he is an applicant for such allotment, the approximate area thereof, and his name and address, together with the date upon which he marked out the land.

All applicants who mark out the same allotment upon one and the same day shall be deemed to be equal as to the marking out.

2. After defining the boundaries as aforesaid, the applicant shall, within one week, post or deliver to the District Land Officer his application in the form prescribed, but at the hearing of such application the failure to comply with the provisions hereof respecting the time of posting or delivering the application shall not be deemed to be a fatal objection where the applicant can prove the existence of some reasonable ground of excuse, which shall be recorded by the Land Officer upon the application.

3. An applicant for a lease under section 32, or for a licence under section 42, for the whole or part of a grazing area, or under section 67, shall not be required to mark out the land applied for. The applicant shall post or deliver to the District Land Officer an application in the prescribed form, describing the land applied for.

4. The applicant shall, before lodging his application, pay to the nearest Receiver of Revenue the sum of One pound (except as provided in section 5 following) for a certificate of registration, which must accompany the application, and such sum shall not in any case, be refunded. But an applicant for a licence under section 42 out of a grazing area leasehold, or under sections 67 and 99, or for a lease under section 97, shall not be required to lodge a certificate of registration with such application.

5. An applicant for a lease or licence who shall have paid with his application the sum of One pound for a certificate of registration shall, in the event of his application not being granted by the Governor in Council, be permitted to lodge during the period of one year from the date of such application one or more applications with each of which the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) only shall be paid for a certificate of registration.

6. The Land Officer shall enter the applications as received in the book kept for the purpose. Applications received by the Land Officer upon one and the same day shall be deemed to be equal so far as regards lodgment.

7. If the application be delivered to the Land Officer by the applicant personally, the Land Officer shall at the time make such inquiries and obtain such personal statements from him as may be necessary for dealing with the application, and shall make a record of the same, which shall be read over to and signed by the applicant and by the Land Officer, to be attached to the application; and attendance at the Local Land Board shall not be required of such applicant in any case in which objections shall not have been lodged prior to the sitting of such Board. The inquiries or personal statement may be made at any time prior to the sitting of the Local Land Board.

8. The Land Officer shall, immediately on the receipt of the application, notify by post every person who, in his opinion, is interested in the application of the date when it will be considered, and shall weekly insert in a newspaper circulating in the district in which the land applied for is situated a notice of all applications lodged at his office during the preceding week and of the date of the Local Land Board at which such applications will be dealt with.

9. Immediately upon the receipt of an objection to any application the Land Officer shall notify the applicant of the nature of the objection.

10. The Land Officer shall, at a Local Land Board to be held at his office not less than seven days nor more than fourteen days after the publication of notice as aforesaid, deal with such applications, hear any objections thereto, and report thereon within 24 hours to the Minister.

11. Immediately on the application being recommended, the approved applicant shall be called upon to pay the fee for survey, and also the valuation (if any) for any improvements that may be upon the land.

12. Upon payment of such survey-fee and valuation (if any) being reported, there shall be issued to the approved applicant, if desired by him, a permit to occupy the land to be indicated therein subject to survey and non-interference with any public right as to railways, roads, mining, access to water, &c., upon payment of the rent or fee for the occupation of the land, and also the fee for the preparation of the lease or licence; but the land must not be fenced until after survey. Such occupation may commence from a date to be specified in the permit, and the rent or licence-fee shall be payable from such date.

13. Upon the completion of the survey ordered and approved by the District Surveyor, a lease or licence in the form and subject to the conditions duly prescribed, or that may be ordered by the Governor in Council in any particular case, shall be prepared and issued. Such lease or licence shall bear the date specified in the permit to occupy, and sums paid with respect to such permit shall be considered to have been paid in respect of the lease or licence, and shall be credited thereto.

14. If any person whose application for a lease or licence has been approved fail to pay the rent or licence-fees, sums, and fees as hereinbefore directed within one month of the date of the notice of approval, his application shall be deemed abandoned, and the area shall be available for selection.

15. All subsequent payments of rent or licence-fees shall be made to the Receiver authorized to receive the same; and no Receiver shall receive any moneys on account of leases or licences unless so advised by the Department of Lands and Survey.

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right-of-way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that subject as aforesaid such old road or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Ballarat East has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in that Town: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

One acre two rods eleven perches, county of Grant, town of Ballarat East: Commencing at the intersection of the north side of York-street and the west side of the Railway reserve; bounded thence by the said reserve bearing N. 3° 28' E. sixteen chains eighty-nine links and six-tenths; thence by Eureka-street bearing S. 81° 56' W. one chain two links; and thence by lines bearing respectively S. 3° 28' W. fourteen chains forty-seven links and four-tenths and S. 20° 48' E. two chains forty-three links and three-tenths to the point of commencement, in lieu of that portion of an existing road defined in the following description (that is to say):—

Drawback Rate.—Same as import rate when exported in original packages or repacked from the same in the presence of an officer.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 6th day of October, 1890, the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was divided into divisions for rating purposes and certain respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in such divisions were in and by such Order in Council fixed and determined: And whereas the said Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust has made application for the alteration of the boundaries of the aforesaid divisions for rating purposes and of the amounts of the rates in such said divisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, doth order as follows (that is to say):—

1. That the said Order in Council bearing date the 6th day of October, 1890, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th day of October, 1890, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. That in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be, and shall be cited as, the Order in Council dividing the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust into divisions for rating purposes and fixing the amounts of the respective ratings in each such division:—

BOUNDARIES OF DIVISIONS.

No. 1. The Township of Dimboola Division, comprising such portions of the Trust district as may be included within the boundaries following, viz.:—Commencing at the south-east corner of township reserve; thence north-westerly along the eastern boundary of said reserve to a point in a line with the northern boundary of suburban allotment 6; thence south-westerly across the one and a half chain road to the north-east angle of said allotment 6; thence along northern boundary of said allotment and of allotment 15 to the north-west angle of latter allotment; thence south-easterly along the boundary of the said reserve to the north-west angle of allotment 12; thence south-westerly along the northern boundary of allotment 31 to the right bank of the Wimmera River; thence south-easterly along the said bank of the river to its intersection with the northern boundary of the township reserve; thence south-westerly along this said boundary to the most western angle of said reserve; thence southerly and easterly along the boundary of the said reserve to its south-west corner; thence north-easterly along the southern boundary of the said reserve to the right bank of the Wimmera River; thence southerly and easterly along the said bank to its intersection with the western boundary of the Upper Regions pre-emptive right; thence north-westerly along the said boundary for four hundred and seventy-five links; thence north-easterly along the boundary of the said pre-emptive right to the Railway reserve; thence north-westerly for two thousand four hundred and sixty-six links along the eastern boundary of the latter reserve to the township boundary; thence north-easterly along the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

No. 2. The Township of Jung Jung Division, comprising such portions of the Trust district as may be included within the boundaries following, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of Crown allotment 116, parish of Jung Jung, and running east for a distance of twelve chains along the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence due north for a distance of twenty chains; thence due west for a distance of forty-two chains; thence due south for a distance of thirty-five chains; thence due east for a distance of thirty chains to the westerly boundary of allotment 8a, parish of Jung Jung; thence north along the said boundary to the starting point.

No. 3. The Natimuk Division, comprising such portions of the Trust district as may be included within the boundaries following, viz.:—Starting from the south-east angle of allotment No. 115b, parish of Natimuk; thence north along the eastern boundary of said allotment and continued on in a straight line to the intersection with the northern boundary of allotment 46; thence west along the northern boundary of said allotment to its intersection with the 147th meridian; thence south along this meridian to its intersection with the southern boundary of allotment 115b; thence east along this southern boundary to the starting point.

No. 4. The Wimmera Division, comprising such portion of the Trust district as may not be within the Dimboola and Jung Jung Township Divisions and the Natimuk Division, as hereinbefore defined.

And has directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the construction and maintenance of their works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied differentially as between such said divisions, and to determine that the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to

the cost and expenses of the works constructed wholly or in part for the benefit of such divisions respectively, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said divisions shall be—

The Township of Dimboola Division ...	Two shillings.
The Township of Jung Jung Division ...	Two shillings.

## REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE MOLIAGUL COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th day of August, 1890, the Managers of the Moliagul Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

## REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year:—For every head of large cattle, Three shillings per annum; for every head of small cattle, One shilling and sixpence per annum. Provided always that the full fee shall be paid for each half-year for every head of large or small cattle depasturing on the common during any portion of a half-year.
3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.
4. All stock remaining on the common fourteen (14) days after the period for which payment has been made shall be liable to be impounded without notice to the owner of such stock.
5. All persons desiring to depasture stock on the common shall apply to the managers, and shall deliver to them a written description of such stock, showing the numbers, sexes, colours, brands, and other conspicuous marks (if any), and if found entitled to depasture such stock on the common shall pay the fees for the current half-year. All unlicensed stock shall be deemed to be trespassers on the common.
6. The owners of stock depasturing on the common shall muster them at such places as may be appointed by the managers as often as the managers may deem necessary for the purpose of branding them, notice being given by the managers or herdsman at least four (4) clear days before such musters shall take place.
7. All stock not branded at the latest time appointed by the managers for branding shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall, except as hereinafter provided, be liable to be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.
8. Whenever the managers believe that any animal depasturing on the common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common, on receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice to do so from the managers or herdsman, and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing so to remove an animal so affected, it shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be dealt with accordingly.
9. Bulls or entire horses shall not be permitted to run on the common without the consent in writing of the managers.
10. All stock depastured on the common shall run at the owner's risk.
11. No stock trespassing on the common, and bearing the brand of an adjoining common, shall be impounded until after forty-eight (48) hours' notice has been given to the herdsman or managers thereof by the herdsman or managers of the former common.
12. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 4 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—

The stacks are to be two feet wide by five feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In case the firewood for Yarra Bend is required to be supplied at per ton weight, the contractor will be bound to weigh the wood upon the Asylum weighbridge. Each load to be tared separately. The weighbridge ticket to be rendered in support of the account.

Firewood, when ordered by weight, is not to be stacked by the contractor, but it must be deposited on such ground as may be pointed out.

4. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such supplies may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

5. As soon as the orders shall have been completed, the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

7. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge, will have the power to reject such articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.

9. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

Security will be required, either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect. Bank deposit-receipts to be in favour of the Secretary, Tender Board.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. #### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

3. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality.

4. Fresh beef and mutton to be supplied in such proportions of each as may be required.

Beef to be delivered in joints cut alternatively from the aitch-bone, sirloin, rump, fore-rib, middle rib, and chuck rib, as for ordinary household use, butlocks only when ordered. Neck, clod, and sticking piece, hock, flank, mouserround, shins, leg-of-mutton piece, and brisket will not be accepted.

Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, sides, or joints, as the quantity for delivery at the different stations admit. Heads to be cut off close to the body, and shanks cut off at the knee joints. Skirts will not be accepted except when delivered as part of a carcass or side. One-third of each indent, if so required, to be supplied as chops, steak, or beef sausages. The chops to be trimmed from undue proportion of fat or bone. The steak to be cut from the rump and of good household description. The sausages to be cut from beef and free from gristle or scraps. All meat to be of prime quality.

5. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractor to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to him, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

6. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

7. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the officer commanding, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.

10. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

11. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

13. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. 2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

12. him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Division II. of the *Land Act 1890* may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. 6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
