PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder to be observed as Public Holidays at the respective places specified, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, 10TH MAY INSTANT, throughout the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly;

FRIDAY, 12TH MAY INSTANT, throughout the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga;

Tuesday, 16th, and Wednesday, 17th May instant, throughout the Borough of Portland, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day.
