PROHIBITION OF SUPPLY OF ARMS, AMMUNITION; AND EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

MY LORD,

I have the honour to forward herewith copy of a Regulation,
which I have passed, with the approval of the Secretary of
State, to replace the Arms Regulation of 1884.

Under this Regulation the amount of firearms and ammunition
permitted to be carried on board a British vessel is increased
when there are European passengers on board, and the carriage
as cargo of arms and ammunition consigned to, and intended
only for the use of, non-native persons, is declared to be one of
the "ordinary legal purposes" of a British vessel.

A REGULATION

(Made in the name of and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by
Her Majesty's Assistant High Commissioner for the Western
Pacific, under the provisions of the *Western Pacific Order in
Council of 1879*)

TO PROHIBIT THE SUPPLY OF ARMS, AMMUNITION, AND EXPLOSIVE
SUBSTANCES TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

H. S. Berkeley.

1. In this Regulation the expression "Western Pacific" means
and includes any of the following islands or places, namely:—

- (1) The Groups of Islands known as—
The Union Islands.
The Phoenix Islands.
The Ellice Islands.
The Gilbert Islands.
The Solomon Islands, not included in the German
Protectorate.
The Santa Cruz Islands.

- (2) All other islands in the Western Pacific Ocean (with the
exception of the Tongan and Samoan Islands) not
being within the limits of the colonies of Fiji,
Queensland, or New South Wales, and not being
within the jurisdiction of any civilized power.

The expression "the waters of the Western Pacific Islands"
means the waters within three miles of any of the
islands or places included in the Western Pacific
Islands.

The word "arms" means every kind of firearms and any part or parts of firearms.

The word "ammunition" means every kind of ammunition for firearms and any material for the preparation thereof.

The expression "explosive substance" means gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, gun-cotton, blasting powder, and every other substance used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion.

The word "native" shall mean and include any native of any island in the Pacific Ocean other than a person of European descent.

2. British vessels within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands shall not carry arms or ammunition. But this prohibition shall not be held to prevent or forbid the carriage by any such vessel for the protection of the same and of the persons therein, and otherwise for the ordinary lawful purposes of such vessel, of arms and ammunition in quantities not exceeding those herein specified, viz.:-

One rifle or shot-gun and one pistol for every member of the crew of such vessel, whose names shall be on the articles, and for every *bond fide* passenger (other than a native) on board such vessel.

One hundred rounds of ammunition for every such rifle, shot-gun, or pistol on board.

Cannons or swivel guns forming part of the ordinary equipment of any such vessel, together with one hundred rounds of ammunition for every such gun.

The carriage of arms and ammunition as cargo consigned to, and intended only for the use of, a person (other than a native) resident within the Western Pacific Islands, shall be deemed to be an ordinary lawful purpose of such vessel, provided always that the total amount of arms and ammunition carried on board such vessel shall not exceed the above specified quantities.

3. British subjects within the Western Pacific Islands shall not give, sell, or otherwise supply any arms, ammunition, or explosive substance to any native.

4. Any British subject who shall carry, or aid or abet the carriage of, any arms or ammunition in any British vessel within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands, except as permitted by this Regulation, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

5. Any British subject within the Western Pacific Islands who shall give, sell, or otherwise supply, or aid or assist in supplying, any arms, or any single firearm, or any ammunition or explosive substance, to any native shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

6. Any person guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to punishment as follows:-

(1) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labour, and with or without a fine not exceeding Ten pounds; or,

(2) A fine alone, not exceeding Ten pounds, without any imprisonment.

7. Regulation No. 1 of 1884, intituled "A Regulation to Prohibit the Supply of Arms, Ammunition, and Explosive Substances to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands" is hereby repealed; but any offence against such Regulation committed before the coming into force of this Regulation may be dealt with and shall be punishable as if such Regulation were still in force.

8. This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and may be cited as "The Arms Regulation, 1893."

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

HOSIERY FACTORY OF MR. SHIRLEY MILES, NOONE-STREET, CLIFTON HILL,

for a period of six weeks from the 11th May inst., upon the following express conditions, that is to say:

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than four females for more than fifty-eight hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

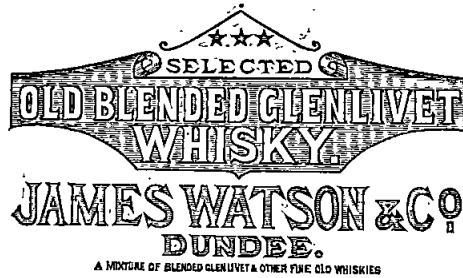

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of May, 1893.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. X. (Scholarships) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz:—

X.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

Scholarships awarded up to and inclusive of the year 1892 shall be continued in the manner and on the conditions herein-after mentioned:—

1. Each Scholarship will be of the annual value of £10, tenable for three years, upon the following conditions:—

- (a) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the Scholarship, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools:— Church of England Grammar School, St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, or Wesley College, all of Melbourne; or in the Church of England Grammar School of Geelong; or in one of such other schools as may be approved by the Minister; or in one of the Schools of Mines at Ballarat or Bendigo; or in an Agricultural College; or in a State School approved by the Minister.

(b) That the scholar show progress, as required in clause 5.

(c) That he shall continue to attend one of the above schools, and shall obtain at the end of each year a report from the authorities of the same.

If no report or an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

2. No Scholarship will be awarded to any candidate who fails to obtain a satisfactory proportion of the total number of marks.

3. Where a scholar does not reside within three miles of an approved place of education, the Minister may, at his discretion, allow him such sum as will cover the cost of transit to and fro, if the school is easily accessible by rail or coach; or may increase the Scholarship to one of Forty pounds, tenable upon the conditions mentioned in clause 1.

4. Students who gained Scholarships at the examination held in December, 1890, and whose Scholarships have been commuted, will be examined in December, 1891, when the best thirty will have the Scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months. Holders of such renewed Scholarships will be again examined in December, 1892, when the best fifteen will have the Scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months. But no commuted Scholarship shall be renewed to any competitor who fails to obtain at least 30 per cent. of the maximum number of marks obtainable.

5. Holders of Scholarships gained subsequently to December, 1890, will be required to attend an examination, to be held by the Department at the end of the first and second years of their tenure, and those who fail to pass satisfactorily will have their Scholarships withdrawn.

6. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

WHEREAS by the *Teachers Act 1893* (56 Vict. No. 1302), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for certain purposes therein specified, and generally for carrying out any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations relative to the appointment and transfer of Pupil Teachers, viz:—

REGULATIONS.

Pupil Teachers.

1. Candidates for appointment as Pupil Teachers must be not less than fourteen years of age, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of aptitude for teaching. Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates of good character, of sound constitution, and of freedom from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers; and (1) must have passed fully in such of the subjects prescribed for the Fourth Class or some higher class in the course of Free Instruction Regulation 1 as are examined in individually; or (2) must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne.

2. Where there is no applicant recorded for transfer and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy, the name of such candidate shall be entered on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

3. Where there is no applicant recorded for transfer and there are more qualified candidates than one, a competitive examination shall be held, the subjects of which shall be those specified in the programme of instruction for the Sixth Class of State schools as provided for by the regulations for the time being of the Education Department. In determining the order of merit of the candidates, consideration shall be given to the aptitude of the respective candidates for teaching as reported on by the district inspector. The examiner shall place the names of candidates in order of merit, and shall report to the Secretary of the Education Department, for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, the names of as many candidates as there are vacancies. The names of such candidates shall be entered in the Employment Register in the same order.

4. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the district inspector of schools for examination at any ordinary visit for inspection.

5. Pupil teachers' names shall be arranged on the Transfer List for transfer, in the following order:—

First.—Pupil teachers in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or who are in excess of the staff allowed under the Third Schedule of the *Teachers Act 1893*.

Second.—Pupil teachers recorded for transfer—

I. In the public interest.

II. On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.

III. For some other satisfactory reason such as removal of parents or guardians.

The births of 1,273 children, viz., 651 boys and 622 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. In the month of March, 1,353 births were registered, or 80 more than in the month under review. The births were 65 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 216 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 632, viz., 350 of males and 282 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 641, or 101 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 69, and were below the average of April during the previous ten years by 55. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been under that average by 215.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.68, and of deaths registered 1.33.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 77.5° on the 11th, and the lowest was 40.0° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (58.0°) was 0.9° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.5°) took place on the 10th, and the least range (3.3°) on the 13th. The mean daily range was 15.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.100 inches on the 20th, and the lowest was 29.558 inches on the 1st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.870 inches) was .22 inches less than the average.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.07 inches. The average rainfall in April during the previous ten years was 2.45 inches, or .38 of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on one day during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 41 per cent. to that mortality, as against 38 per cent. in April, 1892; 44 per cent. in April, 1891; 37 per cent. in April, 1890; 41 per cent. in April, 1889; 38 per cent. in April, 1888; and 39 per cent. in April, 1887.

Thirty-six deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of syncope; a missionary, aged 75, of pneumonia; a male of no occupation, aged 75, of dyspepsia; a labourer, aged 75, of nephritis; a labourer, aged 76, of anthrax; a female, aged 77, of uræmia; a female, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 78, of heart disease; a builder and a gentleman, each aged 78, of bronchitis; a groom, aged 79, of dysentery; a female, aged 80, of influenza; a female, aged 80, of fracture of the thigh—how caused not stated; a gardener, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 81, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 81, of pneumonia; a female, aged 82, of cancer; a gentleman and a female, each aged 82, of apoplexy; a female, aged 82, of cardiac dilatation; a painter and a female, each aged 83, of syncope; a female, aged 83, of heart failure; a storeman, aged 86, of cystitis; a female, aged 92, of diarrhoea; a lawyer, aged 92, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 93, of dysentery; a female, aged 75, a female, aged 76, a gentleman and a female, each aged 80, a gentleman, aged 82, a gentleman and a female, each aged 83, a female, aged 89, and a gentleman, aged 91, of old age.

Twenty-three deaths were set down to violence during the month, of which 17 were ascribed to accident, 4 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carriage cleaner, aged 35, was passed over by an engine; a builder, aged 68, by a vehicle; a seaman, aged 36, died of a kick from a horse; a labourer, aged 34, of fracture of the neck, resulting from a fall; an engine-driver and a painter, aged 24 and 41 respectively, of injuries received by machinery; a female, aged 80, of fracture of the femur; and an auctioneer, aged 45, of injury to the head—how caused not stated; a male infant, aged 7 days, of umbilical hæmorrhage; a female child, aged 12, was drowned in the River Yarra; three female children, aged 7, 10, and 12 respectively, in a quarry hole at Brunswick, and a bricklayer, aged 30, in a quarry hole at Richmond; a female infant, aged 2 months, was overlain; a female infant, aged 5 months, was suffocated by the upsetting of a perambulator; and a female, aged 35, was suffocated through her dress having been caught in a wire fence. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born male infants, a new-born female infant, and a male infant, aged 5 days, who were smothered, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a railway station-master, aged 29, who cut his throat, and a female, aged 34, who drowned herself.

One hundred and eleven deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—49 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Women's Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, and 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 258, of which 149, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 109, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 185 were under one year of age, 55 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 374. Of these, 201, or 54 per cent., were males, and 173, or 46 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 25 were between twenty and twenty-five, 32 were between twenty-five and thirty, 32 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between fifty-five and sixty, 30 were between sixty and sixty-five, 31 were between sixty-five and seventy, 26 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 23 were upwards of eighty.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

In April, as compared with the experience of the previous month, deaths from scarlet fever fell from 2 to 1, and deaths from diarrhoeal diseases from 39 to 32. On the other hand, deaths from influenza rose from 3 to 6, and deaths from diphtheria from 1 to 3. Typhoid fever and whooping-cough caused the same number of deaths in both months, viz., 21 of the former and 1 of the latter disease. Seven deaths from accidents of childbirth or metria were returned in March, and 6 in April, the former being in the proportion of 1 to 193 births, and the latter of 1 to 212 births.

2. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under seven years of age, to be provided. The body shall be taken direct to the cemetery, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse at a time.

3. Coffins to be sufficiently long, deep, and wide for the corpse to lie extended at full length, and to be fastened down with screws. The contractor shall provide two inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. In the event of a body being decomposed, or whenever it may be considered necessary by the member of the Police Force issuing the order for the burial, a coffin must be supplied sufficiently large to leave at least 2 inches between the body and the sides and top and bottom of the coffin, and this space must be filled up round the body with pine or phenyle sawdust by the contractor at his own expense; and in the event of any neglect in so providing or filling up the coffin it will be competent for the Tender Board to inflict a fine not exceeding £5 to be deducted as in Condition 9. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

4. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Cemetery Regulations.

5. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to the order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense, if any, incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. When burials are required to take place on Sunday, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities will be repaid to the contractor.

7. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided, but in the event of a minister of the denomination named in the order not being present, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. SHIRE OF BOROONDARA.

By-Law No. 12.

No carts or vehicles containing night-soil not produced within the shire shall pass through or along any street or road unless with the previous consent in writing of the president or, in his absence, of the secretary of the shire, and confirmed by the Council, and only by such route as may be specified in such consent.

3. No carts or vehicles used in the conveyance or transport of night-soil not produced within the shire shall, after discharging the night-soil conveyed or transported therein, pass through or along any street or road except between the hours of One and Six o'clock a.m., and then only by such route as may be specified in the consent in writing in the last preceding section mentioned.

4. Any person convicted of an offence against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, nor less than One pound, and shall upon subsequent conviction for the same offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than Five pounds.

3. That the baths shall be open for the use of the public daily from daylight until dark (or at such other times as the Council shall appoint), subject to the payment of the charges set forth in the schedule hereto appended, or of such other charges as the Council from time to time direct.

4. That the hours of bathing in the Mordialloc and Sandringham Baths shall be as follows:—Gentlemen, denoted by red flag, from daylight to 8.30 a.m., and from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., and from 5 p.m. until dark. Ladies, denoted by white flag, from 8.30 a.m. to 1 p.m., and from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. In the gentlemen's baths at Mentone, from daylight to dark. In the ladies' baths at Mentone, from daylight to dark.

5. That the time for bathing for each person shall not exceed forty minutes.

6. That no person shall use obscene language, or deface the walls or doors of the said baths by writing or drawing thereon, or commit any nuisance in the baths.

7. That no person shall smoke in the baths except in the apartments set apart for that purpose.

8. That no person shall be admitted to the baths who shall be under the influence of liquor, or who shall have been guilty of disorderly conduct in the said baths.

9. That no dogs shall be allowed within the precinct of the baths.

10. That every person offending against this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
