## PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN THE TOWN OF NORTHCOTE.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Town of Northcote has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making a street within the said town, be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land reserved, used, or acquired for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate within the Town of Northcote aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

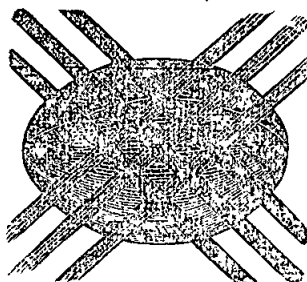

SHIRE OF GORDON.

By-LAW No. 5.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Gordon, made under the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Gordon, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Gordon, hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall apply to the townships of Boort and Pyramid Hill, in the Shire of Gordon. The township of Boort shall mean the area comprised within a radius of forty chains (40 chains) from the Boort Post and Telegraph Office. The township of Pyramid Hill shall mean the area comprised within a radius of forty chains (40 chains) from the Pyramid Hill Post and Telegraph Office.

2. Each and every permit granted by the council to any person whomsoever to move, use, or deposit night-soil upon land shall be and is hereby cancelled and withdrawn.

3. On and after the day of publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, the ordinary system in use up to that date of removal of night-soil from privy-pans within the said townships of Boort and Pyramid Hill shall be abolished, and from and after the said date of publication in the *Government Gazette* of this by-law every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service.

4. No person, unless duly authorized and licensed in this behalf by the Council of the Shire of Gordon, shall be employed to remove or empty any privy-pan used in or belonging to any closet or privy within the townships of Boort and Pyramid Hill.

5. The council shall provide double pans with tight-fitting lids, and no other pans than those so provided shall be used.

6. Once in each week the person contracted with by the council shall remove the pans in use and leave thoroughly cleansed ones in their places.

7. No occupier of any house or premises shall permit any closet door or trap to abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding 16 feet in width.

8. The council of the Shire of Gordon shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

9. If any person commit a breach of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

No person shall place, carry, or have in any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of the same, unless separated by an effective water-proof covering so that such fruit, vegetables, food, case, or receptacle shall not be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or be liable to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

**WHEREAS** by the Local Government Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Acts the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are inscribed on the municipal roll for the time being of the Shire of Woorayl has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th day of April, 1893, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Woorayl aforesaid, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into four separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of twelve members be elected accordingly.

# REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE MERTON TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Managers of the Merton Town Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Six shillings per annum; for every cow, heifer, ox, or steer, Four shillings per annum; for every sheep or goat, One shilling and sixpence per annum; progeny, under six months old, of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

4. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine (9) months shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission in writing of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast or animal which, in their opinion, would be dangerous to stock on the common.

5. The herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners, muster, during the last week of every quarter, all stock on the common, and shall, during the same week, take delivery of stock that may be placed on the common. And the managers shall, on payment of the prescribed fees on stock, of which the owners shall have furnished in writing the number and description, give a receipt for the same. And the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owners or persons in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar or a mixture of both.

6. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid within ten (10) days after the beginning of each quarter shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common and shall be liable to be impounded.

7. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to stock depasturing on the common, save as provided in clause nine (9).

9. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common or on being removed therefrom without the consent of the owners, notify them within three (3) days thereof; and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owners notice in writing within the time specified the former shall, should the stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall not exceed Five pounds (£5) for every horse, and Three pounds (£3) for every head of other large cattle.

10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is infected with any such disease he shall forthwith give notice thereof in writing to the owner or owners of such stock and to the managers of the common, and shall at once take steps to remove such stock therefrom, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owner or owners thereof may suffer.

11. Sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

12. The herdsman shall assist the owners of stock legally depasturing on the common to separate any that they may require to remove.

13. All carcasses found on the common which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing from the managers or the herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

The authorized representative of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria for the time being duly appointed under that Act shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts in the register of trustees under *The Victorian Wesleyan Methodists Act 1887*. Subject to such powers as aforesaid, but not in derogation thereof, the land, or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid, shall be held upon the trusts of "*The Wesleyan Methodist Model Deed of Victoria 1887*," enrolled in the office of the Registrar-General of Victoria under the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act.

2. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under seven years of age, to be provided. The body shall be taken direct to the cemetery, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse at a time.

3. Coffins to be sufficiently long, deep, and wide for the corpse to lie extended at full length, and to be fastened down with screws. The contractor shall provide two inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. In the event of a body being decomposed, or whenever it may be considered necessary by the member of the Police Force issuing the order for the burial, a coffin must be supplied sufficiently large to leave at least 2 inches between the body and the sides and top and bottom of the coffin, and this space must be filled up round the body with pine or phenyle sawdust by the contractor at his own expense; and in the event of any neglect in so providing or filling up the coffin it will be competent for the Tender Board to inflict a fine not exceeding £5 to be deducted as in Condition 9. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

4. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Cemetery Regulations.

5. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to the order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense, if any, incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. When burials are required to take place on Sunday, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities will be repaid to the contractor.

7. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided, but in the event of a minister of the denomination named in the order not being present, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
