QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name of and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by
Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under
the provisions of the *Pacific Order in Council of 1893*)

FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF PEACE AND GOOD ORDER IN SAMOA.

[L.S.]

John B. Thurston.

1. Any British subject who shall be guilty of sedition towards
the Government of Samoa shall be liable on conviction to a fine
not exceeding Ten pounds, or to imprisonment without hard
labour for not more than three months with or without a fine
not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. The expression "Government of Samoa" shall mean the
Government recognised as such in Samoa by the principal British
Consular Officer for the time being in Samoa.

3. The expression "Sedition towards the Government of
Samoa" shall embrace all practices, whether by word, deed, or
writing, having for their object to bring about in Samoa public
disturbance or civil war, and generally to promote public disorder
in the country.

4. If at the trial of any person under this Regulation it shall
appear that the offence charged is one which would, if this Regu-
lation had not been made, be punishable as criminal libel, or
otherwise, by English law or under any Order in Council issued
by Her Majesty and being in force in Samoa, or by any other
Regulation made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by
Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, the
Court may either proceed with the trial under this Regulation,
or may order that the charge under this Regulation be dismissed
and that the accused be put on his trial for criminal libel, or
otherwise as the case may be.

5. This Regulation shall come into operation on the first day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and may be cited as "The Sedition (Samoa) Regulation, 1893."

6. "The Sedition (Samoa) Regulation No. 1 of 1892" shall cease to have effect on the coming into operation of this Regulation.

AT THE COURT AT OSBORNE HOUSE, ISLE OF WIGHT, THE
18TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1892.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the *Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, and dated the eleventh day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to direct that on and after the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the Regulations contained in the Schedule thereto should, so far as regards British ships and boats, be substituted for the Regulations contained in the First Schedule to an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the fourteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine:

And whereas by two Orders in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated respectively the thirtieth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and the twenty-fourth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the eleventh day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, as regards British fishing vessels and boats:

And whereas by the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the eleventh day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, it is amongst other things provided as follows, namely:—

Article 9.—A pilot vessel, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall not carry the lights required for other vessels, but shall carry a white light at the masthead, visible all round the horizon, and shall also exhibit a flare-up light or flare-up lights at short intervals, which shall never exceed fifteen minutes.

A pilot vessel, when not engaged on her station on pilotage duty, shall carry lights similar to those of other ships.

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have, in pursuance of the said recited Act, jointly recommended to Her Majesty that the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the eleventh day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, should be further modified by adding to the said recited Article 9 thereof the provision contained in the Schedule hereto.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from the date of this Order the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the eleventh day of August, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, shall be further modified by the addition to the said recited Article 9 thereof of the provisions contained in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

A steam pilot vessel exclusively employed for the service of pilots licensed or certified by any pilotage authority or the committee of any pilotage district in the United Kingdom, when engaged on her station on pilotage duty and in British waters and not at anchor, shall, in addition to the lights required for all pilot boats, carry at a distance of eight feet below her white masthead light a red light visible all round the horizon and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least two miles, and also the coloured side lights required to be carried by vessels when under way.

When engaged on her station on pilotage duty and in British waters and at anchor she shall carry in addition to the light required for all pilot boats the red light above mentioned but not the coloured side lights.

When not engaged on her station on pilotage duty she shall carry the same lights as other steam vessels.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the *Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, and dated the 11th day of August, 1884, Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation

of the Admiralty and Board of Trade, was pleased to direct that on and after the 1st day of September, 1884, the Regulations contained in the Schedule thereto should, so far as regards British ships and boats, be substituted for the Regulations contained in the First Schedule to an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the 14th day of August, 1879:

And whereas by two Orders in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated respectively the 30th day of December, 1884, and the 24th day of June, 1885, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, as regards British fishing vessels and boats:

And whereas by another Order in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated the 18th day of August, 1892, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, as regards steam pilot vessels:

And whereas by the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, it is amongst other things provided as follows:—

Article 3.—A sea-going ship when under way shall carry—

- (a) On or in front of the foremast, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the breadth of the ship exceeds 20 feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth, a bright white light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles.
- (b) On the starboard side, a green light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.
- (c) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.
- (d) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

Article 15.—If two ships under steam are meeting end on, or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter her course to starboard, so that each may pass on the port side of the other.

This article only applies to cases where ships are meeting end on, or nearly end on, in such a manner as to involve risk of collision, and does not apply to two ships which must, if both keep on their respective courses, pass clear of each other.

The only cases to which it does apply are, when each of the two ships is end on, or nearly end on to the other; in other words, to cases in which by day each ship sees the masts of the other in a line, or nearly in a line, with her own; and by night to cases in which each ship is in such a position as to see both the side lights of the other.

It does not apply by day to cases in which a ship sees another ahead crossing her own course; or by night to cases where the red light of one ship is opposed to the red light of the other, or where the green light of one ship is opposed to the green light of the other; or where a red light without a green light, or a green light without a red light, is seen ahead, or where both green and red lights are seen anywhere but ahead.

And whereas there has been doubt or misapprehension concerning the effect of the said two articles, and whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to Her Majesty to make the following additions to the said Regulations for the purpose of explaining the said recited articles, and of removing the said doubt or misapprehension.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from the date of this Order the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, shall be further modified by the addition to the said recited Article 3 of the provisions contained in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

(e.) To ensure that the red and green side lights shall show an uniform light from right ahead of the ship to two points abaft the beam on the port and starboard sides respectively, and shall not show across the bow of the ship itself, the said lights must be fixed and the screens fitted so that the rays from the red and green lights shall cross the line of the ship's keel projected ahead of the ship at a reasonable distance ahead of the ship.

With regard to all vessels whose lights are inspected by the officers of the Board of Trade the red or green side light will not be deemed to be fixed and fitted in accordance with the Regulations unless it is so fixed and screened that a line drawn from the outside edge of the wick to the foremost end of the inboard screen of such light shall make an angle of four degrees, or as near thereto as may be practicable, with a line drawn parallel with the keel of the ship from the outside edge of the wick.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

Spherical trigonometry, as applied to land surveying;
Determination of latitude;
Determination of true meridian;
Determination of azimuth;
Barometric measurements of heights.
5. Levelling, &c.:
Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.
6. Drawing and Charting:
Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;
Drawing;
Hill shading;
Writing.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visu voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

MARQUIS HILL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

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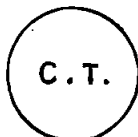

Except as regards the Metropolitan, Ballaarat, and Sandhurst (Bendigo) groups of licensing districts respectively, any person, his barrister, and solicitor or agent intending to make any application to, or to bring any business whatever before any half-yearly or quarterly sitting of a Licensing Court, shall give previous notice, in writing, of such intention to the clerk of such Licensing Court, so as to reach the said clerk seven days at least before the day appointed for such half-yearly or quarterly sitting.

2. The said clerk, if no such notice has been received, shall immediately inform the members of such court thereof, and thereupon the said members shall not attend.

3. Nothing herein contained shall affect any Annual Licensing Court or apply thereto.

In (j) and (k) the maximum fine is obligatory, and cannot be reduced or remitted without the sanction of the Commandant.

Applications for the remission of fines for non-effectiveness, accompanied by the recommendation of the Commanding Officer, must be made so as to reach Head-Quarters not later than the 25th June of each year, otherwise they will not be considered, and pay-sheets are not to be rendered to the Paymaster until a decision has been given in all cases submitted.

PART IX., SECTION IV.—INVESTIGATION OF CRIMES, ETC.

Add new para. 13—

13. In computing the amount of fines for drunkenness in the Permanent Military Forces, the following rules will be observed—(Note.—Fines in all cases will be additional to any other punishment which may be awarded):—

(I.) For the first and second instances of drunkenness during a soldier's service ... No fine

(II.) For the third and every subsequent instance—

(a) If within three months of the previous instance ... 15s.

(b) If over three months and within six months ... 10s.

(c) If over six months and within nine months ... 5s.

(d) If over nine months ... No fine

(III.) When a soldier is liable to a fine, and four preceding instances have been recorded against him within the previous twelve months, 5s. will be added to the fine laid down in Rule II.

(IV.) An act of absence without leave marked with the letter D (as described in para V.) will be recorded as an instance of drunkenness for the purpose of computing the amount of fine for a subsequent instance of drunkenness.

(V.) With a view to prevent soldiers evading the consequences of drunkenness by absenting themselves until they can return sober, Commanding Officers, in dealing with cases of absence, will decide, from their knowledge of the individual soldier's character and the attendant circumstance of each case, whether the absence is or is not to be considered as having arisen with this design. If they decide that it has so arisen, their decision is to be recorded at the time in the guard report and entered on the soldier's defaulter sheets with the letter D (in red ink) in the column headed "Cases of drunkenness;" such entries shall be reckoned as instances of drunkenness for computing the amount of fine.

They will furnish a report on the result of such inspection to the Naval or Military Commandant (as the case may be), forwarding with such report requisitions to cover any discrepancies which may be found to exist.

Any loss or damage which may be discovered during this examination, and which has arisen from any other cause than fair wear and tear, or which cannot be satisfactorily accounted for, will have to be made good at the expense of the Corps or person responsible for it.

After all requisitions have been approved and dealt with, the equipment ledgers and abstract books are to be balanced, and the state as shown in them is to be compared with the articles actually on hand. When this has been done the books must be certified by the Commanding Officers as correct, and forwarded to the Controller for verification with the Ordnance Store Book not later than the 31st July in the case of the Naval Forces, and the 15th February in the case of the Military Forces.

If at any time the Controller has reason to believe that the books of a Corps are not properly kept, he may report to the Secretary, who will take steps to have such books sent to the Ordnance Stores for examination.

To end of para. 169A add:—

"To protect the interior of shell for land service, filled or empty, from damp, it is necessary that the plugs should be periodically removed and lubricated with Price's grease.

"Filled and empty shell in store will be dealt with in this manner once a year; those exposed to the weather once every six months."

WHEREAS by the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of Part I. of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to and alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Naval Forces made on the 20th day of March, 1893 (that is to say):—

PART II., PERMANENT NAVAL FORCES.—SECTION IV., RETIREMENTS AND RESIGNATIONS.

After para. 4 add the following:—

Para. 4A.—Chief Warrant Officers who have served not less than ten years in such rank may be granted on the recommendation of the Commandant the honorary rank of Lieutenant on retirement.

PART III., NAVAL BRIGADE.—SECTION VI., DRILLS AND RETAINERS.

In para. 1, under heading "Untrained Men," the drills fixed for the 2nd quarter are altered to read as follow:—

2nd quarter, 13 drills ashore, 19½ hours (Easter cruise), 4 whole days afloat, 32 hours ... 51½ hours

The total number of hours for the year is altered from 139 to 155 hours.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MOOROOPNA CEMETERY.

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Eight a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made between the hours of Eight a.m. and Four p.m. at least eight working hours before the time fixed for burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE VILLAGE OF COOMA.

WE, William Baldwin, John Thomas Dougherty, George J. Lee, William Richard Down, George Poole, Charles John Poole, John Robinson, Hugh Johnstone, James F. Robinson, Arthur Robinson, and John Thomas Owens, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for public recreation in the village of Cooma, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or sheep.

6. No person without the authority in writing of the Engineer of the Trust shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

7. No person shall convey or leave rubbish of any kind in the reserve, nor wash or cleanse any animal, clothes, or other thing or bathe in the lake in the reserve.

8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the said Trust first obtained.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
