INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have compiled with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than-four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of vira voce or other examination if deemed necessary. deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony jin which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

4. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the district inspector for examination at any ordinary visit for inspection.

5. The names of sewing mistresses shall be arranged on the transfer list for transfer in the following order:—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted.
- (b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal district of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Water-works Trust shall have authority, to be called a Water-works District.
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed
 - (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust: and
 - (c) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit,

thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on
obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereimafter mentioned,
to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other
erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, has been delivered to the secretary, gatckeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

- 9. The hours for burials shall be—On weeks days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.
- 10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick brave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every cofin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

8. No person unless duly authorized, in writing, by the trustees, or the committee, or stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club shall enter upon any part of the first, second, eighth, or ninth of the divisions into which the said reserve is parcelled out or any buildings erected thereon.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the Land Act 1809, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Essendon (now called the town of Essendon), in respect of the Essendon Recreation Reserve, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used for the recreation and amusement of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therowith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from tinne to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Council for the time being of the borough of Essendon (now called the town of Essendon). And whereas by section 137 of the Land Act 1899 it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees; it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind any regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said esection:

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the town of Essendon do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Essendon Recreation Reserve:—

REGILATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be divided as follows :-

(1) The grand-stand, pavilion, members', and ladies' reserves.

Every person paying for admission to the third division or any part thereof, or to the grand-stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of same; and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
 5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports shall deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds which the Council may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Council may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall ahide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Council in reference to the reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.
 6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names, on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

therein.

9. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals without the consent in writing of the Council having been first obtained.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the Council having been first obtained. first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed therefrom notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

(a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive

(a) Being drink, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.

14. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the third division and grand-stand on such days (not exceeding twenty-one in any one year), as the Council shall determine, shall be as

(a) For admission of each person to the third division during any cricket or football match or sports such a sum as the Council shall determine not exceeding Sixpence.
(b) For admission of each person to the grand-stand such a sum as the Council shall determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

Provided always that the Council shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for, plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10. peace, and she exceeding £10.
