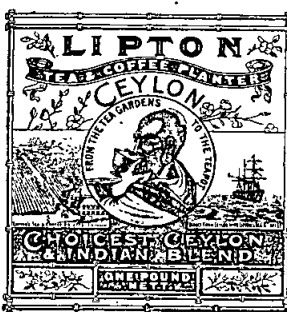

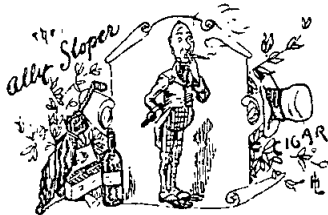

Section 125 of Act No. 1098.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

No. 1302) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for certain purposes therein specified and generally for carrying out any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, viz.:—

REGULATIONS.

Sewing Mistresses.

1. Candidates shall not be less than seventeen years of age, and, prior to appointment, must furnish satisfactory evidence as to good character and sound health, and must have passed a satisfactory examination in reading, writing (including dictation and composition), arithmetic, and geography, for the third class of State Schools, as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department, in all the kinds of needlework required from girls in State Schools, and in teaching such needlework and any of the other programme subjects for the first and second classes.

2. When there is no person recorded for transfer and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy, the name of such candidate shall be entered on the employment register for that vacancy.

3. When there is no person recorded for transfer and there are more qualified candidates than one, a competitive examination shall be held in the subjects for the third class of State Schools, as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department, and in the other subjects specified in 1. supra. The Examiner shall arrange the names of the candidates in their order of merit as determined by the examination, and report to the Secretary of the Education Department for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, who shall enter in the employment register in such order the names of the first two.

4. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the district inspector for examination at any ordinary visit for inspection.

5. The names of sewing mistresses shall be arranged on the transfer list for transfer in the following order:—

First.—Sewing mistresses in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or whose services have been discontinued through the operation of the provisions of the Third Schedule of the *Teachers Act 1893*.

Second.—Sewing mistresses recorded for transfer—

I.—In the public interest.

II.—On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.

III.—For some other satisfactory reason.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order (among other things) increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Trust: And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the 4th October, 1892, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, having authority as such Waterworks Trust within certain lands the limits whereof were in and by the said Order in Council and by subsequent Orders in Council duly proclaimed and defined: And whereas it is deemed necessary to diminish the district of the said Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order—

That the district of the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust shall be and the same is hereby diminished by the excision therefrom of the lands comprised within the following boundaries: Commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Warracknabeal, parish of Werrigar; thence northerly and westerly by the east and portion of the north boundaries of that township to the intersection of its north boundary with the west boundary on main three-chain road through Crown allotment 1, parish of Werrigar; thence northerly along the last-mentioned boundary fifteen chains; thence westerly by a line parallel to the north boundary of the township to the Yarriambiack Creek; thence in a general southerly direction by that creek to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 90c, parish of Werrigar; thence easterly by a line, the last-named boundary, and the south boundary of the township of Warracknabeal to the commencing point: All of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

And it is hereby further ordered that notwithstanding the decrease in the Trust district hereby made, the Commissioners of the Trust shall continue to consist of two members from each of the Shire Councils of the Shire Districts of Dunmunkle, St. Arnaud, Stavell, and Borung, one member from the Shire District of Kara Kara, and one other Commissioner.

And the Honorable James Hiers McColl, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Water Act 1890 (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the Government Gazette, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order in Council accordingly: And it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted.
- (b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal district of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed.
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust: and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a Waterworks District is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons not exceeding three in number to be the commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application by the Councillors for the North Riding of the Shire of Borung, for a loan to carry out certain works for supplying water to the township of Warracknabeal; and doth hereby order and appoint as follow:—

- 1. The construction of the said waterworks.
- 2. The Councillors for the North Riding of the Shire of Borung and three other persons to be the commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
- 3. That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Nine thousand pounds sterling (£9,000), for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

4 That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Warracknabeal, parish of Werrigar; thence northerly and westerly by the east and portion of the north boundaries of that township to the intersection of its north boundary with the west boundary of main three-chain road through Crown allotment 1, parish of Werrigar; thence northerly along the last-mentioned boundary fifteen chains; thence westerly by a line parallel to the north boundary of the township to the Yarriambiack Creek; thence in a general southerly direction by that creek to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 90c, parish of Werrigar; thence easterly by a line, the last-named boundary, and the south boundary of the township of Warracknabeal to the commencing point: All of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

- 5. That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of the erection of a pumping plant, also a wrought-iron tank; reticulation of the township of Warracknabeal; and the fencing in of the water storage on the Yarriambiack Creek.
- 6. That the name of the Trust shall be the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

CAULFIELD RACE-COURSE RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

WE, Andrew Spence Chirnside, Herbert Power, James Grice, Norman Wilson, James Richard Cowell, James McKean, Adrian Charles Akhurst, Charles Du Plan Lloyd, and Francis Sydney Stephen the younger, being nine of the trustees of the reserve for Racing, Recreation, and Public Park purposes, in the parish of Prahran, at Caulfield, known as the "Caulfield Race-course Reserve," do hereby, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Crown grant thereof, and by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, rescind clauses 2, 8, 13, and 16 of the Regulations made by the trustees on the 11th day of March, 1883, and do hereby make in lieu thereof, and in addition to the unrescinded clauses of such Regulations, the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein.

REGULATIONS.

1. The divisions into which the land vested in the trustees and their successors in office, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon is parcelled out and known, are as follow:—

- (1) The lawn, the grand stands, the saddling paddock, the members' stand, and carriage paddock and approaches.
- (2) The weighing yard, the stewards' room, the committee room, the committee stand, the stewards' stand, the judge's box and approaches.
- (3) The enclosures called the reserved paddocks, stands, and approaches.
- (4) The inner inclosure.
- (5) The outer inclosure.
- (6) The flat inclosure.
- (7) The training ground and approaches.
- (8) The inclosure called "the outer carriage paddock" and approaches.
- (9) The inclosure called "the bird cage."
- (10) The course proper and approaches.

2. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the trustees, or the committee, or stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of the trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to be a defaulter, or who has been warned off the course by the trustees, committee, or stewards, or any person authorized by them, shall enter upon the said reserve or any division or part thereof.

3. Any person committing on the said reserve, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be removed from such reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

- (1) Assaulting any other person.
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, during a race meeting, or when the horses are preparing or prepared to start or are running for any race.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7) Being found in any of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gate-keeper, servant, or other person having authority from the trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost or surrendered.
- (8) Obtaining admission to the said reserve or any division or part thereof when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.
- (9) Remaining on the said reserve or any division or part thereof after having been warned off any part of the said reserve.

4. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on the portions of the said fourth, fifth, sixth, and ninth divisions respectively set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (1st) That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, provided that the trustees, committee, or stewards or those authorized by them shall have full power at any time in their absolute discretion to revoke such registration.
- (2nd) That during the time he shall be in or upon the said division, carrying on his trade, business, or calling as specified as aforesaid, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

5. If the trustees, or the committee, or stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club at any time think it expedient, for the good order of the said reserve, that horses should not be run or trained on the whole or any particular part or parts thereof temporarily it shall be lawful for the said trustees, committee, or stewards or any of them from time to time for such period as they may think fit to prohibit all persons from using the said reserve or any particular part or parts thereof for the purpose of running or

training horses thereon, and to take such steps as they may think proper to close the said reserve or any part thereof in order to prevent horses entering on the said reserve or any particular part or parts thereof or being run or trained thereon.

6. No person shall bring any racehorse or racing pony upon the said reserve or any part thereof without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or the committee, or stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club or some person duly authorized, in writing, by such trustees, committee, or stewards.

7. No persons unless duly authorized, in writing, by the trustees, or the committee, or stewards of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club shall distribute or post or stick bills or placards or assist in distributing or posting or sticking same within or upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises erected on the said reserve.

8. No person unless duly authorized, in writing, by the trustees, or the committee, or stewards of the Victorian Amateur Turf Club shall enter upon any part of the first, second, eighth, or ninth of the divisions into which the said reserve is parcelled out or any buildings erected thereon.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

ESSENDON RECREATION RESERVE.— REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Essendon (now called the town of Essendon), in respect of the Essendon Recreation Reserve, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used for the recreation and amusement of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Council for the time being of the borough of Essendon (now called the town of Essendon). And whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind any regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section:

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the town of Essendon do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Essendon Recreation Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve shall be divided as follows:—
 - The grand-stand, pavilion, members', and ladies' reserves.
 - The playing ground.
 - The remainder of the reserve.
- All persons shall be admitted to the third division free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
- No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division except on production of a ticket duly authorizing such person in that behalf.
- Every person paying for admission to the third division or any part thereof, or to the grand-stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of same; and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
- Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports shall deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds which the Council may determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Council may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Council in reference to the reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

9. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals without the consent in writing of the Council having been first obtained.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the Council having been first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed therefrom notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

- Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- Being found in any part of the first, second, or third division of the reserve and not producing on demand or surrendering if required to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the part wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Council or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such part, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.
- Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third divisions when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

14. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the third division and grand-stand on such days (not exceeding twenty-one in any one year), as the Council shall determine, shall be as follows:—

- For admission of each person to the third division during any cricket or football match or sports such a sum as the Council shall determine not exceeding Sixpence.
- For admission of each person to the grand-stand such a sum as the Council shall determine, not exceeding Five shillings.

Provided always that the Council shall be at liberty to exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK IN THE TOWNSHIP OF ELMORE.

WE, John Bremner, William John Long, James Heaps, Henry Cotton, Samuel Henry Farrall, James Philipott Middleton, Alexander Milton, Andrew Scott, and John Fook, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park in the township of Elmore, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

- The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.

5. No person shall train or exercise horses or put goats or pigs in the park.

6. No person shall bring into the park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber on or from the Crown lands comprised in any water reserve, or situate within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of any river or creek, within the municipal district of the Shire of Melvor.—(93.Mc.44803.)
