SHIRE OF FERNTREE GULLY.—ORDER CONFIRMED.

SPECIAL ORDER TO PROCLAIM CERTAIN LAND TO BE A PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

WHEREAS by the provisions of Part XVI. of the Act No. 1112 it is enacted that the council of any municipality may by order direct that any land taken, purchased, or acquired by them be a public highway, the Council of the Shire of Ferntree Gully does hereby direct that the land hereunder described shall, after the publication of this order in the *Government Gazette*, be and continue a public highway in accordance with such Act.

CITY OF ST. KILDA.

BY-LAW No. 65.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the City of St. Kilda, made under the Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Health Act 1890, the Council of the Municipality of the City of St. Kilda, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

No person shall place, carry, or have in or on any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter, any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle shall be in contact, or liable to be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

Any person committing a breach of this by-law, shall, upon conviction for every such breach, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing by-law was duly made and passed by the Council of the City of St. Kilda upon the 27th day of February, 1893, and confirmed on the 10th day of April, 1893.

WHEREAS by section 150 of the Customs Act 1890 it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation (that is to say):—

In cases where, by the Duties of Customs Act 1892, the duty on any article or goods has been increased, it shall be competent for the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, in accordance with the provisions of section 150 of the Customs Act 1890, to allow drawback upon any article or goods specified in the schedules to the Drawback Regulations now in force and according to the rates specified in such schedules, although such article or goods may have been exported prior to 1st January, 1893, provided the proper officer has certified that the higher duty was paid on importation on such article or goods.

No. 1302) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for certain purposes therein specified and generally for carrying out any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, viz:—

REGULATIONS.

Section 18d, Teachers Act 1893 (No. 1302).

Monitors.

1. Monitors will be appointed as vacancies occur, and every such appointment will be temporary and will cease while the average attendance of the school in which the monitor is employed falls below the requirements of the Third Schedule of the Teachers Act 1893, and may be terminated at any time at the discretion of the Minister.

2. The salary for monitors will be at the rate of £12 per annum for males and £10 per annum for females.

3. The qualifications for appointment will be the same as those for the fourth class of pupil teachers. When there are more qualified candidates than one for any vacancy, a competitive examination, as prescribed for pupil teachers, shall be held to determine the candidate to be appointed.

4. Monitors shall be entitled to receive instruction with, and as provided for, pupil teachers, and may present themselves at the annual examinations in the literary work prescribed for the pupil teacher examinations. They will be allowed to present themselves for more than one class, but must pass in order the examination prescribed for each class.

Monitors.

Monitors will not be reckoned as scholars in any examination for payment by way of results under Regulation No. III. of the Regulations under the Education Act 1890, and their attendance at school must not be recorded in the school rolls.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.
