

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the City of St. Kilda, made under the Health Act ISVO.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Health Act 1850, the Council of the Municipality of the City of St. Kilda, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

Meet as follows, that is to say:—

No person shall place, carry, or have in or on any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter, any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or, such case or receptacle shall be in contact, or liable to be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.
