Approximate position, lat. 5° 18' 2" N., long. 97° 23' 5" E.

2. A coral patch (Karang Tenga), with a least depth of 3 fathoms at low-water spring tides, lies with Diamant Punt bearing S. 77° E., and the trees of Pidada S. 15° W.

Approximate position, lat. 5° 17' 2" N., long. 97° 24' 4" E.

Under favourable circumstances the position of these reefs is indicated by ripples and a discolouration of the water.

Bearings true.

Note.—The fishermen of the locality say that there are still three sunken reefs close to Karang Tenga. The examination is therefore continued.

The births of 1,411 children, viz., 726 boys and 685 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. In the month of May, 1,369 births were registered, or 42 less than in the month under review. The births were 133 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 164 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 631, viz., 346 of males and 285 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 780, or 124 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in May by 113, and exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 47. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 89.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.97, and of deaths registered 1.33.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.3° on the 11th, and the lowest was 33.0° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (48.6°) was much lower than in the corresponding month of any of the previous ten years, except 1885, and as much as 2.4° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.5°) took place on the 11th, and the least range (4.3°) on the 2nd. The mean daily range was 11.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.453 inches on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.511 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.995 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.21 inches. The average rainfall in June during the previous ten years was 1.98 inch, or 1.23 inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 3 days during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 35 per cent. to that mortality, as against 27 per cent. in June, 1892; 34 per cent. in June, 1891; 33 per cent. in June, 1890; 37 per cent. in June, 1889; 34 per cent. in June, 1888; and 33 per cent. in June, 1887.

Forty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a labourer and a tailor, each aged 75, died of heart disease; a labourer, aged 75, of nephritis; a gentleman, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a labourer, aged 75, was passed over by a railway train; a female, aged 76, died of heart disease; a builder, aged 76, of bronchitis; a plasterer, aged 76, of inflammation of the lungs; a squatter, aged 76, of pleurisy; a female, aged 76, of enteritis; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of phthisis; a mariner, aged 77, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 78, of apoplexy; a farmer, aged 78, of paralysis; a female, aged 79, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 79, of insanity; a female, aged 79, of valvular heart disease; a sailor, aged 79, of asthma; a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female servant, aged 81, of valvular heart disease; a miner, aged 81, of pneumonia; a female and a contractor, each aged 82, of apoplexy; a pensioner, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 84, of hemiplegia; a gentleman, aged 90, of bronchitis; a seaman, aged 77, a female, aged 78, a female, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a clerk, aged 81, a female, aged 84, a draughtsman, an architect, and two females, each aged 85, a female, aged 87, a labourer and a female, each aged 88, three females, each aged 89, a male cook and a female, each aged 90, a labourer, aged 91, a female, aged 93, and a female, aged 95, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which twenty-one were set down to accident, three to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths.—A sauce-maker, aged 25, and a labourer, aged 75, were killed by railway trains; a carter and a manufacturer, aged 45 and 64 respectively, by trams; a groom, aged 66, by a kick from a horse; a female, aged 30, by her horse falling whilst hunting; a cableman, aged 42, by machinery; a female, aged 43, a seaman, aged 23, a civil engineer, aged 34, a labourer, aged 43, and a farmer, aged 44, died of injuries consequent on falls; a jockey, aged 19, of injury to head—how caused not stated; a labourer, aged 15, was shot; a female infant, aged 10 months, and a male child, aged 5, died of burns, and a male child, aged 3, of scalds; a female, aged 40, and a male of unknown occupation, aged 50, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a deck hand, aged 18, and a stoker, aged 23, were drowned in Hobson's Bay. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant and two new-born female infants, who were smothered, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a bootmaker, aged 50, who shot himself; and a labourer, aged 65, who hanged himself.

One hundred and twenty-nine deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—52 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 9 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 15 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 220, of which 121, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 99, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 134 were under one year of age, 48 were between one and two, 22 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 411. Of these, 225, or 55 per cent., were males, and 186, or 45 per cent., were females; 27 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 35 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 30 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 34 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 25 were between seventy and seventy-five, 22 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 27 were upwards of eighty.

Whereas in May only 2 deaths were caused by measles, as many as 42 deaths were set down to that complaint in June. In one case during the latter month, the measles was stated to have been complicated with diphtheria, and in all the other cases with either bronchitis or pneumonia. The effect of the cold weather experienced in June was, moreover, marked by a large increase in deaths from diseases of the respiratory system, viz., from 67 in May to 108. Deaths from typhoid fever increased from 11 in May to 17 in June, and deaths from scarlet fever from 1 to 2. In both May and June 1 death was set down to diphtheria, and 4 deaths to whooping-cough, whilst deaths from influenza fell from 3 in the former to 2 in the latter month.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions,

and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination :—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem, until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the Commissioners, at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the Commissioners for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station. Unless rebate sheets are rendered within two months of date on which wool is consigned, no claim will be recognised.

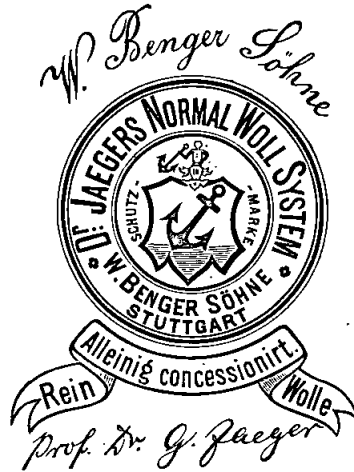

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF ANGORA.

 8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF SALE.

BY-LAW NO. XII.

A By-law of the Borough of Sale, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered twelve, for regulating crossings over footways and channels.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sale order as follows:-

1. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order:

2. If any land fronts to, adjoins, or abuts upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land, or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto, cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land desires that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and gives a notice, in writing, of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describes the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost, and under the inspection of such officer as the council appoint for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

3. Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing be made shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby, or by any such regulation in force in that behalf, required or provided.

4. Unless, within the period of seven days after the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid, the council gives notice to the person giving the same that (if the fact be so) such notice or the specification referred to therein and deposited is not in accordance with the provisions of such regulation as aforesaid, such notice and specification shall thereafter, so far only as affects the liability of such person to any penalty, be deemed to be in accordance therewith.

5. In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossings, there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing shall be either open or covered, as hereinafter described respectively, as the council or its officer authorized in that behalf shall in each case direct. An open crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall have on both sides a curb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part, and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned curb; and such curb shall approach to and join the street, curving in gentle curves outwards; and such crossing shall be of such width, and the surface thereof, so far as the footway extends, shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway as has been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall, with respect to the channel, be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same, or any part thereof.

6. In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is no such curbing as in the last preceding section mentioned, the crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as leaves a free passage for the water underneath the same, and shall be of such materials, form, length, size, strength, and fall as has been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf; and the surface of such crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall be so made good by paving, macadamizing, gravelling, or otherwise, that the necessary traffic by animals or vehicles over the same may not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossing may be as sound and commodious for the passage of persons using the footway as the other portions of such footway adjoining such crossing.

7. No person making any crossing shall be deemed guilty of an offence by reason only of some departure in making such crossing from the notice or specification relating thereto, unless the officer of the council appointed as hereinafter provided to inspect the making of the crossing has reported in writing such departure to the council within three days after the same has occurred, and unless such person, being served by the council within three days after such report with a notice so to do, for the space of seven clear days after such notice has failed to correct or supply such departure.

8. If any crossing has been made in any respect contrary to this by-law or any regulation in force hereunder, it shall be lawful for the council, if they see fit, to cause the same to be altered so as to conform hereto, and to such regulation respectively, and to recover, in manner in the *Local Government Act 1890* provided, the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing leads; but they shall not so recover in those cases of departure from the notice or specification which the council or their officer might respectively have given notice of or reported, but failed to give notice of or report respectively in manner and within the time provided in the preceding sections hereof.

9. If any private street or road meets at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there is no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the council, if they see fit, to make, in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf, a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinafter provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as bears to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

10. If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street or road, has been made before the coming into operation of this subdivision, but is in any respect not in accordance with any regulation made hereunder, the council may, if they see fit, cause the same to be altered so as to conform to such regulation; and if such crossing has been made contrary to any by-law in force at the time of making the same, the council may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

11. If any crossing be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same for seven days after notice from the council to that effect neglects properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing remains so unrepaired a sum of Forty shillings, and the council may, if they see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

12. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclination, or fall of the footway or channel, or otherwise in like manner.

No person shall drive along any road within the shire of Keilor any traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity if its weight exceeds ten tons, or so that the said engine or roller shall push or haul over any road in the said shire any tender or other vehicle if the weight of such tender or other vehicle, including its loading, exceeds ten tons, or if the pressure per inch of width of tire which any one of its wheels exerts upon the road exceeds the pressure per inch of width of tire of the heaviest laden wheel of the engine pushing or hauling it, or if the minimum width of tire of such tender or other vehicle be less than eight inches, or so that any part of the said engine or roller shall be or remain upon the same bay, span, or arch of any bridge or culvert within the said shire at the same time as the tender or other vehicle, or any part thereof, pushed or hauled by the said engine or roller, unless the joint weight of the whole train including the engine be less than ten tons.

And no traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity shall proceed along or over any road within the said shire before the hour of Six p.m. or after the hour of Six a.m.

Any person offending against this by-law shall for every such offence forfeit a sum of not less than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.
