2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2. be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

THE Board of Examiners hereby gives notice that the next examination will commence on Wednesday, the 3rd October, 1894.

Candidates must lodge their applications with the Secretary to the Board not later than the 12th September; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined,

and will be required to pass in each of the six following subjects:—

- (1) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (2) Levelling.—Practice of surface and underground levelling, levelling by vertical angles, plotting sections.
- (3) Mensuration of earthwork.
- (4) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.
- (5) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (6) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *ex aequo* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

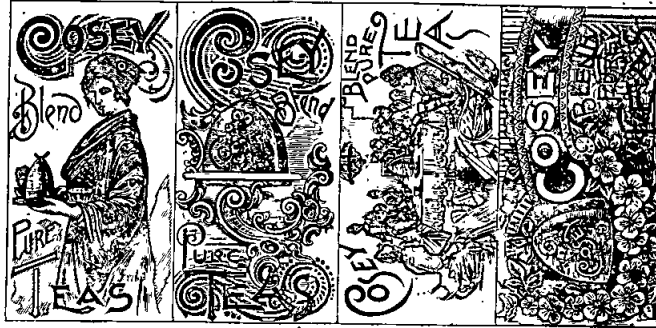

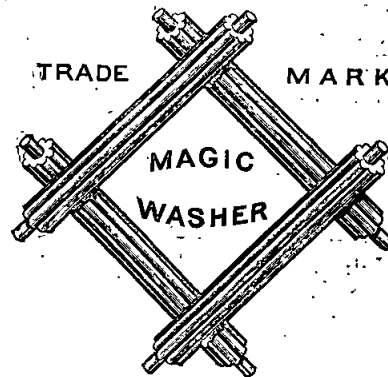

KERANG EAST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

RULES for the regulation of the water supply:—

1. For the better distribution of water the area is to be divided into sections. Section 1 shall include all land watered by the No. 1 branch channel, including the whole of Dunhill's selection. About 1,486 acres, to receive one head of water. No. 2 section to include all land watered by the No. 2 distributary channel as far as the Kerang East School, and including P. Johnston's selection. About 4,182 acres, to receive two heads of water. No. 3 section to include all land watered by the No. 2 distributary channel, commencing at the Kerang East School. About 4,332 acres, to receive two heads of water. Section 4 to include all lands watered by the No. 2A distributary as far as the north boundary of J. W. Hall's selection. About 2,089 acres, to have one head of water. Section 5 to include all land watered by the No. 2A distributary, commencing at J. W. Hall's selection. About 1,824 acres, to receive one head of water. Section 6 to include all land watered by the main channel, commencing at the No. 2 distributary offtake, and from thence as far as the Nine-mile flume. About 1,636 acres, to receive one head of water. Section 7 to include all land watered by the main channel, commencing at Nine-mile flume. About 1,177 acres, to receive one head of water.

2. Applications for water must be made in writing. Applicants to be served according to priority.

3. If the demand for water be more than the channels can supply, the area to be watered to be limited to 30 acres for crop, and 40 acres for grass, per 320-acre block.

4. Water will not be supplied to any applicant if proper provision be not made to secure it. Any water used on the land to be paid for.

5. If an applicant be not ready to take the water when his turn comes, or refuses to do so, all applications shall be attended to before his; but applicants can arrange for alterations amongst themselves.

6. All nets or traps for the destruction of fish found in the Trust's channels will be destroyed, and any persons found using the same will be prosecuted.

7. Two Commissioners of the Trust shall take it in turns monthly to inspect the Trust property and works.

8. In the event of any channel breaking, no landholder in the section above the break that is not then being supplied shall receive any water until the break is repaired.

9. No person will in the future be allowed to cut the channel banks for the purpose of irrigating their land.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, this 9th day of January, 1894.
