- (1) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (2) Levelling.—Practice of surface and underground levelling, levelling by vertical angles, plotting sections.
- (3) Mensuration of earthwork.
- (4) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.
- (5) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (6) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visd voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

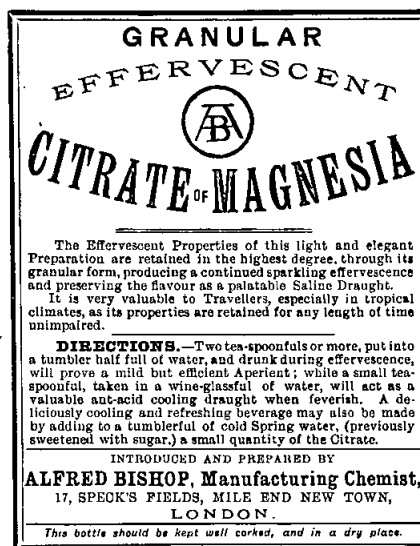

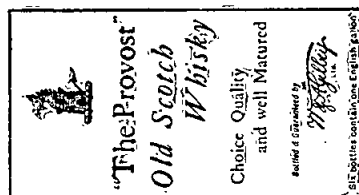

The births of 1,161 children, viz., 579 boys and 582 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. In the month of July, 1,051 births were registered, or 110 less than in the month under review. The births were 212 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 293 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 568, viz., 302 of males and 266 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 593, or 104 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in July by 5, but were below the average of August during the previous ten years by 87. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 128.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.61, and of deaths registered 1.28.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69.7° on the 21st, and the lowest was 34.1° on the 4th. The mean temperature of the month (51.1°) was two-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.3°) took place on the 4th, and the least range (6.2°) on the 10th; the mean daily range being 14.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.427 inches on the 18th, and the lowest was 29.295 inches on the 10th and 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.911 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Rain fell on 17 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.955 inches. The average rainfall in August during the previous ten years was 1.63 inches, or about a third of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 2 days during the month.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 42 per cent. in August, 1893; 29 per cent. in August, 1892; 41 per cent. in August, 1891; 41 per cent. in August, 1890; 36 per cent. in August, 1889; and 30 per cent. in August, 1888.

Fifty-four deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a male of no occupation, aged 75, died of syncope; a tailor, aged 75, of embolism; a labourer and a professor of music, each aged 75, of bronchitis; an accountant, aged 75, of cirrhosis of the liver; two females, each aged 75, of influenza; a female, aged 75, of apoplexy; two females, each aged 75, of heart disease; a female servant, aged 75, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia;

a butcher and a stonemason, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of kidney disease; a female, aged 77, of apoplexy; a female, aged 77, of valvular heart disease; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a tent maker, aged 78, of heart disease; a carpenter and two males of no occupation, each aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of apoplexy; a female, aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 78, of pneumonia; a miner, aged 79, of valvular heart disease; a gardener, aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of apoplexy; a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of sciatica; a female, aged 82, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 82, of pneumonia; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of cystitis; a gentleman, aged 84, of bronchitis; a female, aged 86, of cancer; a wheelwright, aged 86, of bronchitis; a female, aged 92, of pneumonia; a female, aged 96, of heart disease; a carpenter and a labourer, each aged 76, a carpenter, aged 77, a female, aged 78, a confectioner, aged 79, a female, aged 81, a female, aged 83, a labourer, a gardener, and a male of no occupation, each aged 84, a labourer, aged 85, a labourer and a female, each aged 87, and two females, aged 93 and 97 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-eight deaths were ascribed to violent causes during the month, of which twenty-seven were set down to accident, four to homicide, six to suicide, and one to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A shipwright, aged 40, a gatekeeper, aged 46, and a notary public, aged 61, were passed over by railway trains; a female child, aged 6, and a labourer, aged 28, by a lorry; a waiter, aged 35, and two labourers, aged 46 and 58 respectively, died of injuries resulting from falls; a jockey, aged 44, of injury to the brain, caused by his horse falling with him; a plasterer, aged 29, was accidentally shot; a boy and a girl, aged 4 and 7 years respectively, died of burns; a male child, aged 3, and a girl, aged 17, of scalds; a female infant, aged 9 months, and a woman, aged 33 years, died of irritant poison accidentally taken; a boy, aged 16, a publican, aged 56, and a carpenter, aged 74, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a baker, aged 46, in Hobson's Bay; two male infants, aged 7 hours and 1 day respectively, and a female infant, aged 3 hours, were overruled; a surveyor, aged 33, a contractor, aged 56, and a dealer, aged 62, were suffocated whilst in epileptic fits; and a hawker, aged 59, was suffocated by a piece of meat becoming impacted in his throat. The homicidal deaths were those of a newly-born male infant who was smothered; a boy, aged 2, whose throat was cut by his father; a gentleman, aged 49, who was killed by a gunshot wound; and a female, aged 22, who died of blood poisoning after an illegal operation to procure abortion—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a striker, aged 49, who shot himself; an engine-driver and a gentleman, aged 52 and 59 respectively, who cut their throats; a female, aged 30, and a wireworker, aged 68, who poisoned themselves, the former with prussic acid and the latter with chlorodyne; and a gold miner, aged 38, who drowned himself in the River Yarra. The execution was that of a lumper, aged 27, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol for the murder of his paramour at Port Melbourne.

One hundred and thirty-six deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—49 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 4 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 10 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 13 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 3 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 168, of which 87, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 81, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 106 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 17 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 400. Of these, 215, or 54 per cent., were males, and 185, or 46 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 31 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 25 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 9 were between fifty and fifty-five, 35 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 44 were between sixty-five and seventy, 34 were between seventy and seventy-five, 31 were between seventy-five and eighty, 14 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five, 1 was ninety-six, and 1 was ninety-seven years of age.

Deaths from miasmatic diseases rose from 22 in July to 48 in August. Under this head, deaths from influenza increased from 1 to 9, and deaths from whooping-cough from 10 to 30. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 6 to 4, whilst scarlet fever caused 1 death and diphtheria 4 deaths in both months. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths from cancer fell from 32 to 26, and deaths from phthisis from 75 to 69. Deaths from complaints of the respiratory system rose from 92 to 109, the increase being in those from bronchitis from 27 to 45, from pneumonia from 48 to 51, and from pleurisy from 8 to 10. From the beginning of the year to the end of August, 128 deaths were set down to typhoid fever and 34 to diphtheria, as against 107 and 17 deaths from those causes respectively in the same period of the previous year.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1889 to 1893, and the first eight months of 1894:—

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF WANNON.

BY-LAW No. 6.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers for the Shire of Wannon, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, do hereby make the By-law following (that is to say):—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

2. This By-law No. 6 shall apply to and have operation in the part or in the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Wannon Shire Council as follows (that is to say):—All that area comprised within the limits of the surveyed boundaries of the township of Coleraine.

3. This, by-law shall come into operation from and after the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. This Council's By-law No. 5 is hereby repealed.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is abolished.

6. Instead thereof, every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service.

7. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the council, and every occupier shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet where directed by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Coleraine Riding, Shire of Wannon.

8. Every closet must be constructed with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pan or pans, and shall be available for access for such removal when required.

9. No person shall be allowed to remove any night-soil unless duly authorized by this council.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall, once at least in every week between the hours of sunrise and sunset, allow each pan to be removed for cleansing purposes.

11. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such double-pan service (as specified in this by-law) and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

12. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BALLAN NEW CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Ballan New Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under 7 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and any grave in which it is intended to make a second interment must be sunk 7 feet, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

EXAMINATION FOR MUNICIPAL AUDITORS, ETC.— REGULATIONS AMENDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of September, 1894.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by order published in the *Government Gazette*, make regulations prescribing the place or places at and the manner in which the Municipal Auditors Board is to exercise the duties conferred upon it by the said Act, and the tests to which candidates must conform for the several certificates respectively which such Board is empowered to grant, and the fees payable by such candidates: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations as to the Examination for Municipal Auditors, &c., made in pursuance of the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and bearing date the 14th day of April, 1892, and, in lieu thereof, doth make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS AS TO THE EXAMINATION FOR MUNICIPAL AUDITORS, ETC.

- Examinations of persons desirous of obtaining certificates of competency or qualification to exercise the office of Municipal Auditor or Inspector of Municipal Accounts will be held in Melbourne once during each year at a place and time to be hereafter appointed.
- Every intending candidate must give at least twenty-one clear days' notice, in writing, to the secretary of the Board of his intention to present himself for examination, accompanied by satisfactory documentary evidence of good conduct and character.
- Every candidate for a certificate of competency must state distinctly in the notice prescribed in the foregoing regulation whether he desires to be examined for a first, second, or third class certificate, and must at the same time forward documentary evidence of—
 - Having had three years' experience in dealing with municipal accounts, either as a municipal clerk or as a Government or local auditor; or—
 - Of having been in practice as a public accountant for not less than two years, or of having held the position of principal accountant to a corporation, registered or incorporated public company, or in a Government department, or in public, mercantile, or professional employment not less than four years; or—
 - Of having had such other experience as the Board may deem sufficient to entitle him to admission to examination.
- No candidate will be admitted to examination for a certificate of competency under the age of 21 years.
- Every candidate for a certificate of qualification shall forward with the notice and evidence prescribed in Regulation No. 2, his diploma of the Incorporated Institute of Accountants, Victoria, or of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales, or of the Society of Accountants and Auditors (incorporated 1885).

6. Should the evidence supplied in compliance with the foregoing regulations be deemed satisfactory, the candidate, on receipt of notice to that effect, will be required to remit to the secretary of the Board the sum of £2 2s. as fee for examination.

7. Candidates for a certificate of competency will be examined in—

- Bookkeeping;
 - Auditing; and
 - The laws relating to local government in Victoria;
- And for a certificate of qualification in—
- The laws relating to local government in Victoria.

8. The examination will occupy the space of one day of six hours, that is, from Ten a.m. to One p.m., and from Two p.m. to Five p.m.

9. After the distribution of any set of questions candidates in attendance will not be allowed to leave the examination room until the expiration of half-an-hour from the time of commencement, and at the termination of that half-hour no candidate will be admitted.

10. In answering the questions set, one side only of each sheet of paper may be written upon. The different sheets are to be each signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, pinned together, and handed in punctually at the expiration of the time allowed.

11. Any candidate detected in the act of using books of reference or notes, or engaging in conversation with any other candidate during the progress of the examination, may be summarily dismissed from the room.

12. No candidate will be permitted to present himself for a certificate in more than one class at the same examination, but any person holding the 2nd and 3rd class certificate will be admitted to examination for the higher or highest certificate on payment of a further fee of £1 1s.

13. In all cases where documentary evidence is required of candidates, original certificates or testimonials shall be furnished, together with one copy of same for retention by the Board.

And the Honorable William Telford Webb, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Teachers Act 1893.

TEMPORARY UNCLASSIFIED SCHOOLS.— REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of September, 1894.

WHEREAS by the *Teachers Act 1893* (56 Vict. No. 1302) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for certain purposes therein specified, and generally for carrying out any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order rescind the Regulation relating to Temporary Unclassified Schools, made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:—

TEMPORARY UNCLASSIFIED SCHOOLS.

- In thinly-peopled districts a temporary unclassified school may be established in any locality where it is probable that an average attendance of ten scholars will be maintained; provided that there is no existing State school at which such scholars could attend, and provided that suitable school premises can be obtained at a reasonable rental, not exceeding £7 10s. per annum.
- The buildings which may be used or erected for temporary unclassified schools shall be such as contain not less than eighty cubic feet of space for every child in average attendance, and have sufficient means of warming, light, and ventilation, and shall be approved by the Minister.
- Any temporary half-time unclassified school which has not for six consecutive months maintained an average attendance of seven children, or any full-time unclassified school which has not for a like period maintained an average attendance of ten pupils, may be closed.
- If the average attendance at any temporary unclassified school for six consecutive months has been twenty or more, the Minister will direct that it become a classified school, provided that it appears from the number of children attending that such average attendance is likely to be maintained, and that suitable school accommodation for the attendance is available.
- When the average attendance at any classified State school for six consecutive months has been less than twenty, and is likely so to continue, and it is not desirable or practicable to make it a classified part-time school, the Minister will notify to the Classifiers that it is his intention to make such school a temporary unclassified school, and such order will take effect forthwith if there be no teacher in charge of the school, and, if there be a teacher, from the date of his transfer to a classified school, or of his electing to remain in the school.

6. Permits to teach in temporary unclassified schools will be granted to persons who possess the following qualifications:—
They must be not less than seventeen years of age if females, or eighteen years of age if males, of good character, sound health, and—

- (1) Hold the licence to teach or any higher certificate under the Education Department; or
- (2) Satisfy an inspector of schools that they are able to impart elementary instruction; and
- (a) Hold an approved certificate of qualification from the Committee of Council of Education, or from any recognised board or department of education in any British possession; or
- (b) Have passed in four subjects of the matriculation or any higher examination of a recognised university, of which subjects two shall have been English and arithmetic; or
- (c) Have passed a satisfactory examination held by the Department in reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, elementary science, and history, as specified below.

Reading.—To read fluently and with proper emphasis.

Writing.—To write any passage dictated, with correct spelling and punctuation, and with fair penmanship.

Arithmetic.—Notation, numeration, the simple and compound rules, bills of parcels, reduction, practice, proportion, interest, vulgar and decimal fractions.

Grammar.—Parsing, analysis, and the inflections.

Geography.—Easy questions on the map of the world generally; explanation of the lines marking latitude and longitude and the zones on a map of the world.

Elementary Science.—As required for the third and second classes of pupil teachers.

History.—As required for the third and second classes of pupil teachers.

7. When a vacancy occurs in a temporary unclassified school, the Minister will, if no teacher be recorded for transfer, appoint the person next entitled to employment as shown in the Employment Register under the *Teachers Act 1893* (No. 1302).

8. All such appointments, except those of pupil teachers who, by reason of completing their course, are on the register for employment in classified schools, will be temporary, and may be terminated by one month's notice on the part of either the Minister or the teacher, or by the Minister without notice in case of misconduct, inefficiency, or neglect of duty by the teacher.

9. The fixed salaries of teachers of temporary unclassified schools from the 1st July, 1893, will be as follow:—

- (a) Junior assistants in excess in classified schools having temporary charge of unclassified schools, and teachers with trained teachers' certificates obtained at examinations in 1892, 1893, or 1894, and teachers whose training course terminated in December, 1893, in consequence of the closing of the Training Institution, in charge of unclassified schools, males £80 per annum, females £64 per annum.
- (b) All other teachers, males £75 per annum, females £60 per annum.

In addition to the fixed salary, a sum equal to not more than one-half the amount of the fixed salary will be obtainable by way of results, to be determined as in the case of classified schools.

10. Teachers of temporary unclassified schools will be paid maintenance allowance for performing the services in connexion with the school buildings, &c., for which teachers of classified schools are paid a maintenance allowance.

And the Honorable Richard Baker, Her Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES OF THE KEW LITERARY INSTITUTE AND FREE LIBRARY.

(Incorporated under 54 Victoria, No. 1099.)

CONSTITUTION.

1. This institute shall be called "The Kew Literary Institute and Free Library."
2. Its objects shall be the promotion of health, temperance, and morality, the prevention of cruelty and vice, and other cognate objects of a philanthropic and humane nature; and the mental improvement and rational recreation of the members.
3. The means to be employed shall include a library of reference and circulation, a reading room, occasional lectures, and such other means as the committee may think advisable.

GOVERNMENT.

4. The institute shall be governed by a committee, consisting of a president, treasurer, secretary, and nine members, elected in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

MEMBERSHIP.

5. The institute shall consist of (a) ordinary, (b) associate, (c) life, and (d) honorary members.
 - (a) Ordinary members shall pay a subscription of Twenty shillings per annum, or Ten shillings half-yearly. Provided that any member of the household of an ordinary member may become an ordinary member on payment of half the ordinary rates of subscription; but any person becoming an ordinary member under this proviso shall be entitled to one vote only at general meetings.
 - (b) Associate members shall pay a subscription of Ten shillings per annum, or Five shillings half-yearly.
 - (c) Life members shall pay a subscription of not less than Ten pounds in one payment.
 - (d) Honorary members shall be persons who, by their exertions, have conferred signal benefit on the institute, and who shall, on the recommendation of the committee, be elected to the position at an annual general meeting.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

6. Subscriptions shall be payable yearly or half-yearly in advance, and shall become due on the 1st January or the 1st July. Any person becoming a member during a half-year shall pay, in addition to the subscription for a year or half-year as the case may be, a proportion of such subscription up to the 1st January or 1st July then next following. No person shall be entitled to any privileges as a member or as an associate member if his subscription is one month in arrear, provided notice of such arrear shall have been sent to him.

7. Every ordinary or life member shall be entitled to two votes, and every associate member shall be entitled to one vote, at general meetings of the institute.

8. No person shall be entitled to vote at any general meeting unless he shall have been a member for the previous six months, or shall have paid one year's subscription in advance.

9. Ordinary, life, and honorary members shall be entitled to borrow two books and one periodical from the library at one time, and associate members to borrow one book or a periodical at a time.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

10. In the month of January in each year there shall be an annual general meeting of the members of the institute. The date thereof shall be determined by the committee, notice of which shall be exhibited in the library for a period of fourteen days prior to the day of meeting, and a written or printed notice shall be forwarded to each member.

11. The committee shall place before the annual general meeting a report of the proceedings of the institute during the past year, together with a balance-sheet and audited financial statement; and upon such report being adopted by the meeting the same shall, if so directed, be printed, and a copy thereof posted to each subscriber.

12. The president, treasurer, and secretary, in the order named, and six members of committee, and one person to audit the accounts of the institute, shall be elected by ballot at the annual general meeting.

The names of candidates proposed for such offices, with those of their proposers and seconds, shall be forwarded to the secretary in writing, and a list of such nominations shall be exhibited in the library fourteen days previous to the annual general meeting.

The secretary shall not receive the nomination paper of any candidate whose subscription is unpaid at the date of nomination. Failing such nomination vacancies shall be filled up at the annual general meeting, but no person shall be so elected whose subscription is in arrear.

13. In December of each year the Borough Council of Kew shall have power to appoint three of its members to be members of the committee of the institute for the year commencing on the following 1st day of January.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF MEETINGS.

14. The president shall take the chair at each meeting. In his absence the meeting shall elect a chairman. The secretary shall enter the minutes of every meeting in a book provided for the purpose, which minutes shall be read at the succeeding meeting, when, if correct, they shall be confirmed by the chairman affixing his signature thereto.

15. The first business at any meeting shall be the reading and confirmation of such minutes of previous meetings as have not been already confirmed.

16. Fifteen shall be a quorum at a general meeting, and five at a meeting of the committee.

17. If, at any general or committee meeting, a quorum has not assembled within 30 minutes after the time appointed, the meeting may be adjourned to such time as the president or, in his absence, the majority of the members then present may appoint.

18. It shall be competent for any meeting not having completed the business for which it was called to adjourn.

19. All questions brought under discussion at any general or committee meeting shall be decided by the majority of members then present by a show of hands, unless otherwise provided.

20. Any motion made at a general or committee meeting shall be seconded before being taken into consideration, and shall be reduced to writing if required.

21. Whenever any amendment is moved upon any motion, no second amendment shall be taken into consideration until the first amendment is disposed of. If that amendment be carried it shall then be put as an original motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved. If the first amendment be negatived a further amendment may be moved to the original question, but only one amendment shall be submitted for discussion at one time.

SPECIAL MEETING.

22. It shall be competent for the committee, of their own motion, or upon the request of fifteen members, or upon their refusal, for any fifteen members of the institute, to direct the secretary at any time to call a special general meeting in the same manner as is provided in regard to the annual general meeting, and the notice shall state the object for which the same is to be called; and the secretary is hereby authorized and directed to call such meeting.

COMMITTEE.

23. The committee shall have the custody of the property of the institute, and the care, management, and superintendence of the same; the appointment, direction, and removal of all salaried officers; the due receipt and administration of the institute's funds; and the selection of books.

24. The committee shall meet on such days as they may from time to time appoint; but extraordinary meetings for special purposes may be called by any three members of the committee at any time. A circular, stating the object of the meeting, shall be sent to each member of the committee by the secretary, or by the three members calling the meeting, one clear day prior to the date of holding the same.

25. The committee may appoint sub-committees of their number for particular purposes; but no decision of such sub-committee shall be final or binding until adopted by the general committee.

26. Any member of the committee who shall fail to attend its meetings for three ordinary meetings consecutively shall, unless reasonable cause to the satisfaction of the committee be assigned for his absence, be held to have vacated his seat.

27. Should any vacancy occur in the committee it shall be competent for the remaining members to fill the same.

28. No member of the committee shall be allowed directly or indirectly to supply the institute with any article from which he derives a profit.

29. No resolution of the committee shall be altered or rescinded unless notice, in writing, shall have been given at a previous meeting, and a copy thereof shall have been forwarded by the secretary to the members of the committee with the notice convening the meeting at which it is to be considered.

FUNDS OF THE INSTITUTE.

30. The treasurer shall receive and collect all moneys on behalf of the institute, and shall furnish proper receipts for the same; and no receipt shall be given except out of a block-book duly marked so that the blocks may correspond with the receipts.

31. All moneys received from time to time by the treasurer shall, so soon as the same amount to the sum of Five pounds (£5), be paid by him into a bank (to be named by the committee) to the credit of the institute.

32. No payment shall be made on behalf of the institute exceeding One pound (£1) until the account has been submitted to the committee, approved of by it, and signed by the chairman.

33. All cheques drawn upon the institute's account at the bank shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the secretary.

34. The annual statement of the funds of the institute up to the 31st December in each year shall be made up by the treasurer, and be laid before the committee at their first meeting after that date.

SEAL.

35. The seal of the institute shall be in the custody of the treasurer, and shall only be affixed by him with the authority of the committee, and such affixing shall be attested by one member of the committee and the treasurer or secretary. The committee shall have power, by resolution, to provide for any contingency that may arise owing to either the secretary or treasurer, or both of them, being from any cause unable to carry out the requirements of this rule.

RULES, BY-LAWS, AND REGULATIONS.

36. No proposal to add to, amend, or rescind these rules shall be entertained, except at a special meeting duly convened for that purpose, according to Rule No. 22.

37. The committee shall have power from time to time to make, alter, or rescind by-laws and regulations for the due working of the library, and for the conduct of their business.

38. The committee shall have the power to decide any doubt or difficulty which may arise as to the meaning of any of the foregoing rules.
