SPANISH TARIFF ADVANTAGES TO GREAT BRITAIN AND THE BRITISH COLONIES.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 25th July last, I have the honour to transmit to you, 10th July, 1894, for the information of the Colony under your Government, a translation of a Spanish law granting to Great Britain and the British Colonies the Tariff advantages granted to Switzerland, Sweden and Norway, and the Netherlands.

[Law.—Translation.]

DON ALFONSO XIII., by the grace of God and of the Constitution King of Spain, and in his name, and during his minority, the Queen-Regent of the Realm.

To all those whom these presents may come, know that the Cortes have decreed and we sanction what follows:—

Sole Article.—From the date of the publication of this Law, and whilst other Treaties are not put in force, the more reduced duties and the Tariff advantages resulting from the Commercial Agreements agreed upon with Switzerland, Sweden, Norway, and the Low Countries shall be applied to the products of the soil and of the industry of Germany; Austria-Hungary, Denmark, France, Great Britain and its Colonies, and Italy.

In order that these benefits shall be understood as subsisting, it will be indispensable for the nations to which they have been granted to apply to the products of the soil and of the industry of Spain their lowest Tariffs.

Therefore, we command all the Tribunals, Justices, Chiefs, Governors, and other authorities, civil, military, and ecclesiastical, of whatever class or dignity, to observe it and cause it to be observed, to fulfil and execute it in all its parts.

- (3) The Council of each of the municipalities composing the Western Shires Group,

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. First-class Return Fare between Prince's-bridge and Blackburn, 1s. 4½d.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Cement, Plaster, Iron (Rod and Bar), Boiler Plates, Hoop Iron, Iron Standards, Slates, Steel (Bar, Rod, and Plate), and Softwood, in lots of 4 tons and upwards, to be charged "B" Class Rate, Melbourne to Albury.
Cotton, Woollen, and Silk Goods, Carpets, Rugs, and Woollen Mats to be charged 2nd Class Rate, Melbourne to Albury.
2. The rate from Melbourne to Albury for Goods rated in Class 2, plus 20 per cent., is not to exceed 3rd Class Rate, i.e., 96s. 10d. per ton.
3. Leather from Stratford to Melbourne to be charged 24s. 5d. per ton, 1st Class minimum.
4. Firewood (Redgum, Box, and Ironbark excepted) from all stations to Geelong and South Geelong to be charged 5d. per ton less than Classification Rates; minimum rate not to be less than 2s. per ton.

13. Stations on the Coleraine line are also to have the benefit of the Special "Class 3" Rate to Hamilton from the Western Ports.
14. Goods for Dunkeld are to have the benefit of the Special Rates for Classes "C," 1, 2, and 3, from the Western Ports to Hamilton, in the same way as those for stations on the Coleraine line.
15. Bone Dust, colonially manufactured, to be charged as Artificial Manure.
16. Shale.—An allowance of 6d. per ton will be made on every ton over six, loaded in ordinary trucks, from Melbourne to Bendigo.

24. Coir Rope and Coir Fibre, *ex* vessels at the Piers, to be charged Single Rate.
25. Glucose, in truck loads of 6 tons, to be charged "C" Class Rate.

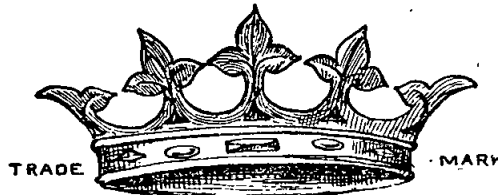
