4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1895, commencing on the 1st of January, 1895, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1895, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.—

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 48.

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1894 on all rateable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water under the provisions of the Victorian Water Act, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of 12th March, 1886.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 17th day of October, 1892, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud Division, the Shire of Borung Division, the Shire of Kara Kara Division, the Shire of Dunnmunkle Division, and the Shire of Stawell Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such several divisions, and that the proportion in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say:—That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be:—Shire of St. Arnaud Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Borung Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Kara Kara Division, Nineteen pence; Shire of Dunnmunkle Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Stawell Division, Fifteen pence.

And whereas the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, by Proclamation dated 28th June, 1886, proclaimed a certain area in and around the Township of Murtoa to be an Urban District under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* (No. 778).

And whereas by further Proclamation dated the 29th December, 1887, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria proclaimed a certain area in and around the Township of Donald to be an Urban District under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887* (No. 946).

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said Urban Districts of Murtoa and Donald, according to the valuation on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Borung, Kara Kara, Dunnmunkle, and Stawell respectively, that is to say:—On rateable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Borung Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Kara Kara Division, a rate of Nineteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunnmunkle Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Stawell Division, a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1895, commencing on the 1st of January, 1895, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1895, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates or such portion thereof as they may be appointed to demand and receive.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 3.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1895:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-one pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of T shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual value of the same shall be payable.

4. A minimum rate of One pound and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.

5. On every horse-trough, a charge of One pound per annum.

6. Water supplied to the Government departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January, 1895, and 1st July, 1895.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust this 15th day of October, 1894.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities of the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges herein specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July:—

(1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the time being, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the event of their being no such contract Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, or plastering, the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile but not exceeding one-half of a mile from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

BY-LAW No. 1A.

For providing against individual householders contracting privately for the removal of night-soil with any person other than a person duly authorized in that behalf by the Council of the Shire.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood in respect of the Darling Gardens, in the said City of Collingwood, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for public gardens for the recreation of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therewith; under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Collingwood.

And whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Collingwood do hereby make the Regulation following in respect of the said Darling Gardens:—

REGULATION.

The undermentioned gentleman shall be a member of the Committee of Management to exercise control over the said Darling Gardens:—

John Hooper,
in the room of John Spaven, who has ceased to hold office as a Councillor of the said City of Collingwood.

[Provided nevertheless that the said John Hooper shall hold office as a member of the Committee of Management of the said Darling Gardens for so long only as he may continue to be a Councillor of the said City of Collingwood.]

BY-LAW No. 3 of the Shire of McIvor, made under the provisions of Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, as amended by Section 46 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, for the purpose of regulating and defining the conditions upon which traction engines impelled by steam or electricity may proceed along the roads within the shire.

1. No traction engine shall travel within the shire boundaries without having the true name and full address of the owner painted on such engine in a conspicuous place, and so that the word "owner" shall appear between the name and address.

2. No traction engine shall travel over any road within the shire after dark or before daylight unless such engine shall be preceded by some person by at least one hundred yards, which person shall carry a lamp, and shall give notice that such engine is travelling on such road.

3. No traction engine shall travel on any road within the shire with badly packed stuffing boxes or leaky valves, or otherwise in bad order, and the driver shall not permit steam to be blown off unless through accident to the engine or unavoidable circumstance which necessitates the stoppage of such engine.

4. No traction engine shall travel on road within the shire with less than two men engaged thereon, one of whom shall be the driver and in charge of such engine, and the other of whom shall steer such engine and render assistance to horses and vehicles passing when necessary.

5. The width of tires of waggons which shall be drawn by traction engines within the shire shall be as follows:—

Waggons carrying 5 tons weight or under, three inches.

Waggons over 5 tons and less than 8, four inches.

Waggons carrying any weight exceeding 8 tons, five inches.

6. The person in charge of any traction engine shall stop such engine, or, where practicable, take or move such engine to one side of the road upon which such engine shall be travelling, when called upon to do so by persons travelling thereon on horseback, or with vehicles or otherwise, where horses are frightened, except in the following places, namely:—(a) Where the engine at such time or times is in such a position as to have the front wheels much lower than the hind wheels. (b) Where the man in charge would be endangering the engine boiler by so doing. (c) When such engine shall be crossing a bridge. (d) Where such engine is proceeding up a steep hill. (e) Where the person in charge would not be able, if he then stopped, to start such engine again; and in all such places the person in charge shall send his assistant to, and such assistant shall render all such help as may then be required to persons, horses, and vehicles then passing and travelling.

7. The person in charge of any traction engine shall forthwith fill up or cause to be filled up any hole caused by such engine or waggon, or vehicles drawn by it on any road along which the same shall have travelled, or otherwise, where such road shall be damaged, shall repair such road in a proper manner, so as to render the same fit for vehicular traffic.

8. The owner of any traction engine shall be liable to pay for any damage caused to any bridge or culvert by his engine.

9. No person shall permit a traction engine whilst travelling to stop upon a bridge or culvert.

10. In the event of any traction engine breaking the decking or otherwise damaging a bridge or culvert, the owner or person in charge thereof shall forthwith, before leaving the bridge or culvert, place an obstruction or notice in a conspicuous position on or near the damaged portion, and shall send notices within forty-eight hours to the president and secretary, or president and engineer of the shire; notices shall particularize the bridge or culvert so damaged and the nature of such damage.

11. The owner of, or persons travelling with or in charge of any traction engine within the shire, shall do so at his or their own risk, and the owner shall be responsible for any damage done or caused through or by any traction engine whilst travelling aforesaid.

12. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. The person in charge of any traction engine, whether stationary or travelling on any road within the shire, shall, between sundown and sunrise, cause a lamp to be fixed thereon in a prominent position, and keep such lamp brightly burning between the periods aforesaid.
