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Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (51 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

for a period of three months from the 22nd inst., upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said mills more than six males under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each male under the age of sixteen so employed shall be paid for the extra work he is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such males under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such mills for the information of all concerned.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 1.

The following charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust.

1. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, 20,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter.

For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ inch diameter.

For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. No person shall connect any service-pipes or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified at his own expense provide a meter.

7. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, and the meter when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

8. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks (which shall be of high pressure and of strong hard brass) shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

9. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to refix or relay same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

13. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 6 of this regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

14. No pipe shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

15. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice in writing of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose.

16. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officer of the Trust.

18. Stand-pipe or hydrant water, supplied other than by rate, under section 120 of the *Water Act 1890*—For each load of 100 gallons or under, Threepence; and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons, Threepence; to be paid for at time of taking.

19. For the temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water, notify the Trust.

20. The use of water by hose or otherwise for garden purposes shall be absolutely prohibited between the hours of Seven a.m. and Five p.m.

21. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instrument, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied, or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such meter; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with said regulations and not otherwise.

23. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention to these regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully, or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

25. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the "Rochester Waterworks Trust."

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 2.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1894:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound (£1) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Fifteen pounds a rate of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.). On houses or tenements exceeding Fifteen pounds and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

3. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and upwards a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling.

4. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

5. A minimum rate of One pound and a maximum rate of Four pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.

6. Water supplied to the Government Departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January, 1894, and 1st July, 1894.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust this 21st day of December, 1893.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1894 IN THE URBAN
DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.—REGULATION No. 15.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district of Tungamah, as such district was proclaimed and defined on the 20th January, 1891.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than £2 10s. per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land, vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made, payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1894.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 15 was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890* this 4th day of December, 1893.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 4.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water District has for the purposes of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District) make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1894 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Fifteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Three pence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.

(k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.

(n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show-grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Nine pence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

5th. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he or she shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings.
