2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay, by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

3. The Remount Depôts will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st November, 1895, to the end of the purchasing season.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, and, in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse and field artillery.

6. The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been fixed at £45 sterling, which will be paid in rupees at the Indian port of purchase at the exchange rate for demand bills on London as declared for the day on which payment is made in the ordinary course of business by the Bank of Bengal, Madras, or Bombay, according to the place of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, under such rules as may be made by the Director, Army Remount Department; but the averages fixed above are not to be exceeded on the whole number purchased in any class.







PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

PREPARATION OF ELECTORAL LISTS.
NOTICE.

IT is hereby notified that the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly must be prepared during the week ending the 1st December prox., and that persons who have not already enrolled may, if duly qualified, do so by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

2. Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

3. Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

4. Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, inasmuch as a penalty, on conviction, is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights when not qualified.

5. No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province; and no person

whose name is already on the new List of Ratepaying Electors, now being prepared, for any Division of an Electoral District, may obtain an Elector's Right for such District.

6. Foreigners, who desire to obtain Electors' Rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain from the Chief Secretary letters of naturalization before doing so, or before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors.

7. Deputy Electoral Registrars are further directed to make up their Lists and send them to the Electoral Registrars for their Divisions immediately after 1st December.

SHIRE OF BALLAN.

BY-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Ballan, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, hereby make the following By-law:—

1. This by-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the townships of Ballan, Egerton, and Gordon only.
3. The council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the said townships of Ballan, Egerton, and Gordon from the operation of this by-law.
4. The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises within the said townships of Ballan, Egerton, and Gordon shall cause every privy or closet in or upon or belonging to such premises to be furnished with a proper impervious pan or receptacle of galvanized iron or other material approved by the council, of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and of a size and pattern approved by the council.
5. Before the pan of any closet is allowed to become full, and at least once a fortnight, the contents thereof shall be removed to the night-soil depot by the contractor for the time being to the said shire.

6. Every occupier shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, cinders, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which shall be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be, immediately on such deposit, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

7. Every such occupier shall not employ any other persons save those authorized by the council for the removal of night-soil, and no other person shall remove any night-soil except in cases of exemption as aforesaid.

8. Every such occupier offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

BY-LAW No. 124.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law for fixing the amount of tolls to be paid on goods brought to or taken from any vessel using the piers, wharfs, and jetties vested in the Commissioners by lighter or other vessel, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith, and clause 56 of the By-law No. 89, clause 12 of By-law No. 120 relating to By-laws for Railway piers, at page 2717 of the *Government Gazette* for 1894, clause 3 of By-law No. 96, are hereby severally repealed.

1. The tolls to be paid in respect of the piers, wharfs, and jetties at Williamstown and Port Melbourne vested in the Commissioners on goods brought to or taken from any vessel using any such pier, wharf, or jetty by lighter or other vessel, shall be as follows:—

(a) Where such goods are taken to or brought from Melbourne *via* the River Yarra—

For every ton of general cargo	2s. per ton.
For every bale of wool	1s. per bale.
For every bale of leather	1s. per bale.

(b) In all cases other than the above—

For every ton of general cargo	4d. per ton.
For every bale of wool	2d. per bale.
For every bale of leather	2d. per bale.

2. The tolls to be paid in respect of piers, wharfs, and jetties vested in the Commissioners situated elsewhere than at Williamstown and Port Melbourne on goods brought to or taken from any vessel using such pier, wharf, or jetty by lighter or other vessel, shall be as follows:—

For every ton of general cargo	4d. per ton.
For every bale of wool	2d. per bale.
For every bale of leather	2d. per bale.

3. All tolls as aforesaid shall be primarily payable by the owner or other person for the time being entitled to the earnings of the lighter or other vessel bringing the goods to or taking the goods from the vessel using any such pier, wharf, or jetty as aforesaid; and in case of non-payment of such tolls by such owner or other person within fourteen days after demand from such owner or other person, the said tolls may be sued for and recovered by the Commissioners from the consignors or consignees of the said goods, or from the vessel to or from which such goods were taken or brought, at the election of the Commissioners.

**AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1895.**

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied (for domestic purposes only) by the said Trust within the Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For each vacant allotment of land rated separately by the Shire of Seymour of the municipal value of Ten pounds or under, a rate of Ten shillings shall be paid for the year; and of all vacant allotments so rated of more than Ten pounds municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be charged.

2. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

3. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of more than Sixteen pounds annual valuation, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation for the Shire of Seymour.

4. For every steam boiler supplied during 1895 with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Five pounds will be made.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1895, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND
WORKS.**

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Avoca Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on a loan of £15,630 granted by the Governor in Council to such Water Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loan in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf. And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notices that the said Water Trust District is supplied with water have been duly given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 10th March, 1885, a portion of the said Water Trust District was proclaimed an Urban District within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 22nd day of October, 1894, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban District should be made for the year 1895, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division IX. of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 22nd October, 1894, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban District for the year 1895, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual shire valuation of the said Urban District.

2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban District.

3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust's works, Three shillings and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

4. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 26th day of October, 1894.

**BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1895.**

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1895, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five (5) feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1895.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

**NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1895.**

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). And the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre. For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1895, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1895, and the 1st day of July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

THE SHIRE OF HEALESVILLE AND THE HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 112 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of its municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Waterworks Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Healesville is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire, that is to say, a sum of Sixty-seven pounds ten shillings sterling (£67 10s.) for the purpose of paying interest on moneys borrowed by the Healesville Waterworks Trust: His Excellency the Governor in Council has therefore consented to the Municipal Council of the said Shire of Healesville applying the said sum of Sixty-seven pounds ten shillings sterling (£67 10s.) from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter which shall be supplied by this Trust at cost price, and when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter shall be placed so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

2. The Trust may order meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meters to be provided and affixed at the expense of the consumers.

3. Persons failing to have repairs effected to service-pipes, meters, or other fittings, when ordered by the inspector for the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until the meter shall have been properly repaired.

4. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same.

5. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- (6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

6. That any person removing water from a stand-pipe other than for domestic purposes shall be charged Sixpence a load for 250 gallons or under.

7. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to re-lay or re-fix the same, must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall be licensed by the Trust. The Trust shall have power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

8. Before any licensed person shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall give one day's notice of his intention so to do, and shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds; and in case he shall not immediately, after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

9. All meters must be of approved manufacture, and equal in quality to a Siemens or Tylor's meter.

10. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the baths above the bottom thereof. The bath must be provided with a proper well-fitted and water-tight ground outlet plug or cock.

14. All water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

15. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering footpaths or gardens, or stables or stalls, or trees or plants, or washing houses, walls, or carriages, or for any other similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

16. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. If any person throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct which, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to provide such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the term of such notice.

20. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

21. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Thirty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Thirty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

23. The officers of the Trust may at all reasonable hours enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

24. In the foregoing regulation, wherever the word "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

25. In the construction of these regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Heathcote Waterworks Trust.

**HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1895.**

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

Regulations for the making of a rate for the year 1895 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also for dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all the rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Melvor; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound sterling.
2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.
3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.
4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter but not exceeding half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.
5. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged, for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.
6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.
7. The foregoing rate is made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.
8. Such person as the Trust may appoint for the purpose is hereby authorized to collect and recover the rate and charges made under this regulation.

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound per annum for each and every additional allotment by which a main passes.
4. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year, which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 20,000 gallons.
5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st of January and the 1st of July, 1895.
6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS 1895.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
 2. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds annual municipal value and not exceeding Fifteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound upon such municipal value.
 3. For every house or tenement above Fifteen pounds and under Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.
 4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.
 5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Three shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.
 6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
 7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
 8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed, and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
 9. For every water-trough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.
 10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.
 11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
- The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1895; provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be payable in advance, or as may be agreed upon.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

OMEQ WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1895 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less,	3,000 galls. per annum.
Do. $\frac{1}{4}$ " "	12,000 " "
Do. $\frac{1}{2}$ " "	16,000 " "
Do. $\frac{3}{4}$ " "	28,000 " "
Do. 1 " "	40,000 " "

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

(f) All properties through which the race runs situated above the reservoir shall be charged at the rate of five per centum on the amount of municipal valuation.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 2.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1895, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardens or for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may specially be agreed upon; and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the 1st day of January, 1895, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1895. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

In the event of a general strike occurring at the collieries, or in the event of war breaking out between Great Britain and any large maritime power, any contract entered into under these conditions after the expiry of one calendar month from notice being given may be suspended, such contract to come into full force and effect again ten (10) days after such cause of suspension shall be discontinued.

18. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of Welsh coal or Westport coal by the Defence Department for the use of torpedo boats, or by the purchase of coal by the Victorian Government from any mine or mines within the colony of Victoria for any of the Departments of the Public Service.

19. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

20. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 19 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of Five pounds in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, either in Government debentures or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. 3. 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used.
