

Machine sewing to be not less than nine or more than eleven stitches to the inch, and fellings to be seven stitches to the inch. All garments for non-commissioned officers and rank and file must be supplied of such sizes as may be demanded on size rolls, and, in the case of tunics, jackets, jumpers, and trousers, must conform to the following scales of dimensions.

All caps and other garments not specified above must be made to such dimensions as may be ordered, and have size and numberon tickets, which are to be affixed on suitable and prominent places. THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the waterworks district of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1895, which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per

a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound per annum for each and every additional allotment by which a main passes.

4. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year, which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity-to be charged for half-yearly shall be 20,000 gallons.

5. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the let of January and the let of July, 1895.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

- 1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per
- 2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds annual value, a rate of: Two shillings in the pound sterling.
- 3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
- 4. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulation dealing with the supply of water within the said district:—

- 1. A supply of water within the san district:—

 1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers or for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.
- 2. The charges for water supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes solely shall, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:---
 - (a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
 - (b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
 - (c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding onequarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
 - (d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding halfan-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
 - (c) Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
 - (f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.
 - (g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.
- 3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.
- 4. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly, or as may be agreed upon.
- 5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away any such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated within the Urban District, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 7. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within the Trust District to have water from any public service-pipe in such district at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.
- 8. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons, and until it shall have been tested and approved by an officer of the Trust.
- 9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
- 10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.
- 11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.
- 12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch servicepipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve

- for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter under a panalty of Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.
- for each day after notice from the Trust.

 13. All service-pipes must be of the best galvanized iron, and not more than ½ inch diameter, except in cases where special permission, in writing, from the Trust or their engineer is given to increase the size. All pipes must be provided with proper couplings for jointing same, and all joints to be well screwed up and red lead applied to thread of screw. All screws to be properly cut. Connexious to cast-iron mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which three feet of lead pipe of full weight must be attached. Connexions with lead and iron pipes must be with brass union couplings and wiped joints.
- 14. Each service-pipe from cast-iron mains to be supplied with one brass high-pressure stop-cock at the building line; wooden box, with cover, to be placed over this to prevent dirt getting in. On service-pipes from wrought-iron sub-mains an additional stop-cock shall be affixed at the sub-main.
- 15. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
- 16. In no case will one service-pipe be allowed to serve two or more houses.
- 17. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten rounds.
- 18. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.
- 19. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- pounds.

 20. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

 21. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for
- 21. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds; and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.
- 22. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.
- 23. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful chargo imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to wasto, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the promises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.
- 24. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.
- 25. In the construction of these regulations the word "Trust" shall mean the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulations:—

Regulations for the making of a rate for the year 1895 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also for dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

- 1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all the rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of McIvor; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound sterling.
- 2. A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.
- 3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a standpipe, shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.
- 4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter but not exceeding half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.
- 5. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.
- 6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.
- 7. The foregoing rate is made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

 8. Such person as the Trust may appoint for the purpose is hereby authorized to collect and recover the rate and charges made under this regulation.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

- THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Act 1890, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—
- 1. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter which shall be supplied by this Trust at cost price, and when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper werking order by such person. The meter shall be placed so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.
- 2. The Trust may order meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meters to be provided and affixed at the expense of the consumers.
- 3. Persons failing to have repairs effected to service-pipes, meters, or other fittings, when ordered by the inspector for the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until the meter shall have been properly repaired.
- 4. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same.
- 5. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—
 - (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- iron.

 (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

 (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles,
- threaded, and capable of being screwed into emission, tees, &c.

 (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

 (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- the pipes.

 (6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

- 6. That any person removing water from a stand-pipe other than for domestic purposes shall be charged Sixpence a load for 250 gallons or under.
- 7. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to re-lay or re-fix the same, must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall be licensed by the Trust. The Trust shall have power of cancelling any such licence at any
- 8. Before any licensed person shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall give one day's notice of his intention so to do, and shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds; and in case he shall not immediately, after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.
- 9. All meters must be of approved manufacture, and equal in quality to a Siemens or Tylor's meter.
- 10. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
- 12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
- 13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the baths above the bottom thereof. The bath must be provided with a proper well-fitted and water-tight ground outlet plug or cock.
- 14. All water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.
- 15. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering footpaths or gardens, or stables or stalls, or trees or plants, or washing houses, walls, or carriages, or for any other similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.
- 16. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding
- 17. If any person throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 18. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct which, by notices in the Government Gazette, has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 19. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to provide such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the term of such notice.
- 20. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty rounds.
- 21. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Thirty pounds annual value, \$\frac{1}{2}\$-inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Thirty pounds annual value, \$\frac{1}{2}\$-inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

 22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

- 23. The officers of the Trust may at all reasonable hours enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.
- 24. In the foregoing regulation, wherever the word "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.
- 25. In the construction of these regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Heathcote Waterworks Trust.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

- 1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
- For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- 3. For all tenements in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- 4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.
- 5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). And the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons. Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre. For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1895, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1895, and the 1st day of July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1890, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1895, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works dothereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Water Act 1890, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 29th October, 1894, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1895, that is to say:—

- 1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1895 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban Districts.
- The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.
- 3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000
- 4. The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 28th day of November, 1894.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per amum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement in

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fitty shillings per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 250 gallons or under, Sixpence shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the recetion of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.
