EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1895.

IT is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1895, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

1. No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received on or before the 31st May, 1895, an application on the prescribed form, accompanied by evidence on the points mentioned in Regulation 2, and by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined. Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than 1st May, 1895.

2. No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years on the 1st of April in the year in which the examination is to be held.
[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]
- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

REGULATIONS FOR PAYMENT OF BONUSES FOR DAIRY PRODUCE AND FRUITS TO 30th JUNE, 1895.

THE Governor in Council has approved the subjoined Regulations for the Distribution of the Sum of £10,000, granted by Parliament for the year ending on the 30th June, 1895, for the giving of Bonuses for Dairy Produce and Fruits of the best quality and in best order exported to Foreign Markets.

REGULATIONS

For the Distribution of the Sum of £10,000 for giving Bonuses for Dairy Produce, Fruits, and Honey of best quality and in best order exported to Foreign Markets, also for the Development of the Wine Industry, as also in connexion with the Shipment of Poultry and Meat, and to include expenses in connexion with any of the items named herein:—

Export of Butter.

All expenses incurred in receiving and storing butter for export, and in working the machinery for refrigerating, may be paid out of the said sum of Ten thousand pounds (£10,000).

Export of Cheese.

A bonus of Three pounds (£3) may be paid for each ton weight of cheese, and a proportionate amount for any lesser quantity over and above one ton weight of approved quality made in Victoria, of Victorian produce, exported on any date between the 1st July, 1894, and the 31st May, 1895, to such port outside the Australasian Colonies as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture, provided the price obtained on the sale of such cheese in the country to which it is exported is not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) for each one hundred and twelve pounds (112 lbs.) weight of cheese. The total amount to be paid to any one person, association, or company shall not exceed Three hundred pounds (£300), including previous payments. Payment shall be allowed only for the kind known as Cheddar cheese, and the payment shall be made to the manufacturer only. The cheese must be of first-class quality, made from full milk, solid, and of rich mellow flavour. No cheese shall be exported which is less than four or more than eight weeks old. No bonus shall be paid in respect of any cheese exported until it has been examined and approved by some person appointed for that purpose by the Minister. No bonus shall be paid in respect of any cheese exported unless the same has been sold in the country to which it is exported by some agent approved by the Minister, nor unless account sales of such cheese and, if required, statutory declarations verifying such account sales, have been received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 20th August, 1895. The cheese must be packed in wooden packages, both ends to be branded with the name of the factory, and marked "coloured" or "not coloured" according to the description of cheese therein. Two-thirds of the quantity of each consignment must contain no colouring matter, and the remaining one-third to be slightly, but not highly, coloured.

Export of Fruit.

A bonus not exceeding Two shillings (2s.) per case, of a size and construction to be approved by the Minister, may be paid upon all green fruits grown in Victoria and exported therefrom to such foreign ports as may be approved by the Minister. No payment shall, however, be made as bonus for export of fruit exceeding twenty-five per centum of the amount for which the fruit in respect of which it is payable is sold in the country to which it is exported. The Minister may, by order under his hand, fix the maximum amount of green fruit on the export of which during any period of twelve months a bonus will be paid; and the Minister may, by any such order, fix the maximum amount of bonus to be paid to any one person, association, or company. No fruit for the export of which it is intended to claim a bonus under these regulations shall be exported until it has been examined and approved by some person or persons appointed for that purpose by the Minister. No bonus shall be paid in respect of any fruit exported without such examination, nor in respect of any fruit not arriving at the port of consignment in a good and marketable condition. Account sales of the fruit so exported shall be obtained from the country to which the same has been exported, and shall be forwarded by the person claiming the bonus for export to the Minister not later than the 20th August, 1895, and shall be verified to the satisfaction of the Minister in such manner as he may think fit to require.

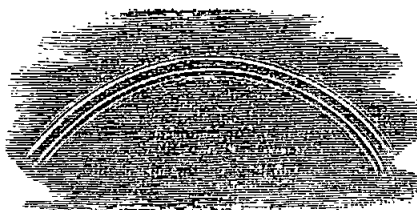

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards, situated within the waterworks district of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1895.

2. Upon properties of the municipal value of Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty-three pounds, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable in accordance with section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before-mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) from the works of the Trust, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum; otherwise by special agreement.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering,

or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using a hose for ornamental, garden, or other purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR THE YEAR 1895.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the waterworks district of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisive allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value, provided that no rate of less than Ten shillings shall be made.

4. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust this 29th day of October, 1894, and the seal of the Trust was hereunto affixed in the presence of—

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1895.—No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1895, which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments of land liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be One pound per annum for each and every additional allotment.

4. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1895.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.
